Caroline Wozniacki beats Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova to claim second straight Pan Pacific title

Tokyo, Sept 24
Caroline Wozniacki ended her string of final failures by beating Russia's Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova 6-0 7-5 in Tokyo on Sunday to win her second straight Pan Pacific Open title.
The former world number one, who has now won the event three times, was contesting her seventh final of the season after losing the previous six.
The 27-year-old Dane, seeded third, burst out of the gate behind a strong service game with two aces in a 21-minute first-set rout, looking fresh after her straight-sets triumph over world number



one Garbine Muguruza the previous day. By contrast, Pavlyuchenkova's gruelling three-set semi-final win over Angelique Kerber appeared to have taken its toll and she struggled with accuracy, registering three double faults in the set.

Rafael Nadal, Roger Federer claim first doubles win at Laver Cup

Prague, Sept 24
Rafael Nadal and Roger Federer took Team Europe to within two wins of lifting the Laver Cup on Saturday after they played doubles together for the first time, but ruled out a full-time partnership on the tour. The world's highest ranking duo handed Team Europe, skippered by Bjorn Borg, a 9-3 lead over Team World, captained by John McEnroe, after two days of action in Prague. After Nadal and Federer had won their singles rubbers, all eyes at Prague's sold-out O2 Arena were then on the two legends who played on the same side of the net for the first time in careers which have stretched the best part

of two decades. They started the doubles against Sam Querrey and Jack Sock on a high, earning a break in the first set to win 6-4. They visibly enjoyed the experience, with Federer laughing off a massive air shot halfway through the set. However, they were in far more serious mood in the second set as both lost their serve, allowing the American pair to level with a 6-1 win. Much to their relief, the world's top two players, with 35 Grand Slam singles titles between them, regained their composure in time to sweep their rivals 10/5 in a super tie-break. But they both denied planning a future as a doubles pair, saying it was



"not a good idea."

Fire precautionary measures while erecting pandals during Durga Puja

Port Blair, Sept 24
In order to avoid any untoward incident during Durga Puja Celebration, the Fire Service has released precautionary measures to be adopted for construction of pandals for strict implementation by the puja committees for erecting pandals. Some of the important precautionary measures are mentioned as under :-

1. No Pandal shall be made beyond 45 mtrs. from main road.
2. No Pandal shall be erected underneath high tension electrical line.
3. The Pandal shall not be made within 15 meters from any electrical installations or any hazardous substances / places / stores etc. which may cause fire.
4. The Exit and Entry of the Pandal shall be 5 mtrs. wide with 8 mtr.

arrangements shall be provided. Detailed precautionary measures have been uploaded on A&N Police's website <http://andaman.gov.in>. All Puja Committees are hereby requested to adhere to the measures as stipulated for fool proof fire safety arrangements. is fighting against poverty, but Pakistan is fighting against India through spreading terror. Speaking in Hindi for the second consecutive year at the annual UNGA session, Smti Swaraj said, India has risen despite being the principal destination of Pakistan's nefarious export of terrorism. Viktor Axelsen wins first Japan Open title

Tokyo, Sept 24
World champion Viktor Axelsen of Denmark beat Malaysia's Lee Chong Wei on Sunday to clinch his first Japan Open title. Axelsen, who defeated two-time Olympic champion Lin Dan of China to bag the world title in Glasgow last month, edged out Lee 21-14, 19-21, 21-14 in the men's singles final.
Lee, who has won the Japan Open six times including last year, narrowly took the second game but the Dane put in a brilliant performance to triumph in the third.
In the women's singles Carolina Marin of Spain, last year's Olympic gold medallist, overwhelmed He Bingjiao of China 23-21, 21-12.
Japan's Rio Olympics gold



medallists Ayaka Takahashi and Misaki Matsutomo beat South Korea's Kim Ha-Na and Kong Hee-Yong 21-18, 21-16 in the women's doubles final, to the delight of local fans at the Tokyo Metropolitan Gymnasium. But Japanese male duo Takuto Inoue and Yuki Kaneko

suffered a 21-12, 21-15 defeat at the hands of Indonesians Marcus Fernaldi Gideon and Kevin Sanjaya Sukumuljo in the men's doubles final. In the mixed doubles, Chinese pair Wang Yiyu and Huang Dongping overpowered Takuro Hoki and Sayaka Hirota of Japan 21-13, 21-8.
