Manila, Oct 24  
India has said that terrorism and radicalisation pose a serious security challenge to all countries and a strong collective action is required to fight the menace.

Speaking at the 4th ASEAN Defence Ministers' meeting in Philippines, Defence Minister Smti Nirjala Sitharaman said, the global strategic and security situation was constantly



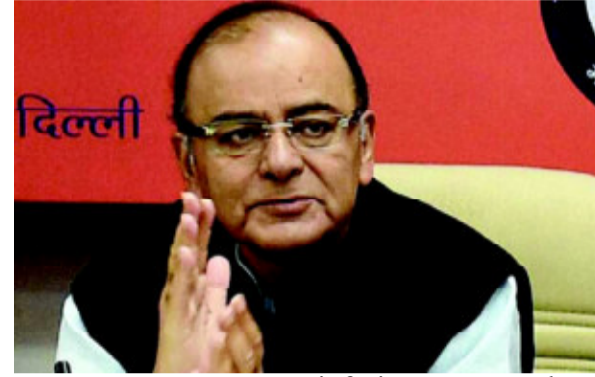
evolving and had thrown up fresh and serious challenges. She said, India has taken resolute measures to fight the scourge of terrorism from

across its borders. The Minister said, India fully recognize the role of joint mechanisms with the partner countries and the role of international and regional forums in fighting terrorism.

## Cabinet approves bank capitalisation plan of Rs 2.11 lakh crores

New Delhi, Oct 24  
Cabinet has approved a capitalisation plan of 2 lakh 11 thousand crores rupees for public sectors banks. Addressing a press conference in New Delhi this evening, Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley said, the huge spending on infrastructure announced today will give a fillip to private sector investment. He said, once the banks are strengthened, appetite for their stock will improve.



Shri Jaitley said, Public Sector Banks will catalyse private investments and there is a need to increase public investment. He said, various capital

infusion measures have been taken by the government to ensure health of Public Sector Banks. He said, it was decided that a bold step needs to be taken by the government to recapitalise banks. Finance Minister said, the fundamentals of the national economy continue to be strong. He said, India has remained world's fastest growing economy for the last three years. Shri Jaitley said, structural reforms have short-term impacts but it will help in the medium and long-term. He said, government has decided on the steps necessary to sustain the growth momentum.

The government today waived off penalty on delayed filing of initial Goods and Services Tax (GST) returns for the months of August and September.

In a tweet, Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley said, the decision to waive off late fee on filing of GST-3B for last two months has been taken to facilitate taxpayers. He said, the late fee which has been already

Soumeshwar Rao was the chief guest while Dr. Shiv Shankar Singh, Senior Consultant, Medical Specialist, G.B. Pant Hospital was the main speaker.

**Under pressure India face rare series defeat at home**

Pune, Oct 24  
An under-pressure India will face their stiffest test in recent times when they try to bounce back in the three-match ODI series against a refreshed New Zealand in the must-win second game on Wednesday. It is not often that India find themselves in a 'save the series situation', having won the last six bilateral engagements. Not many had also expected New Zealand to topple India in the series-opener at the Wankhede but the visitors, playing their first match since the Champions Trophy, did it in emphatic style. It took a record breaking 200-run stand from Ross Taylor and Tom Latham to get the better of their formidable opponents, putting New Zealand on the cusp of a rare series win in India.

The way they played spinners Yuzvendra Chahal and Kuldeep Yadav was commendable, considering the Australians struggled against the same combination in the preceding series. The hosts, no doubt, were off-colour at Wankhede but the Virat Kohli-led side is expected to come back hard at the Black Caps on Wednesday. Kohli led from the front on Sunday with his 31st ODI ton but did not get the support from his team. India head coach Ravi Shastri too would want the rest of the side to step up. Dinesh Karthik, batting at number five, played a decent knock in his comeback game, stitching a 73-run stand with captain Kohli before throwing his wicket away. He is expected to make the playing eleven, leaving little

possibility of Manish Pandey getting a game. More than 20 overs were left when MS Dhoni walked in to bat but he too could not capitalise after making 25 off 42 balls. Latham and Taylor stitched a special stand at the Wankhede after openers Martin Guptill and Colin Munro squandered promising starts. And they would not want to repeat that again. The Kiwis missed a second spinner and would be tempted to play Ish Sodhi tomorrow along with Mitchell Santner, who bowled effectively, in place of medium pacer Colin De Grandhome, who went for runs. The pace trio of Adam Milne, Boult and Tim Southee will again shoulder the responsibility to take wickets at the top.

**Ronaldo joins Messi as five-time winner of FIFA player award**

London, Oct 24  
Cristiano Ronaldo has caught up with Lionel Messi to become a five-time winner of FIFA's best player award. The Real Madrid forward was crowned player of the year on yesterday at the FIFA Best ceremony at the London Palladium theater attended by runner-up Messi and third-placed Neymar. A second successive honor for Ronaldo was expected after a season in which the Portuguese eclipsed his award counterparts in the trophy stakes. As well as Spanish league and Spanish Super Cup success, Ronaldo scored twice in the Champions League final against Juventus to win European soccer's elite competition for the third time in four seasons.



Ronaldo's coach at Madrid, Zinedine Zidane, was crowned coach of the year. FIFA has shifted its award ceremony from its usual January slot to October so players are judged across a season based on the typical European schedule rather than the calendar year. The women's award honored the Netherlands' success at the European Championship in August. Lieke Martens, who scored in the final win over Denmark, won the player's award and Sarina Wiegman collected the coaching accolade. The Puskas Award for best goal went to Arsenal striker Olivier Giroud for a scorpion-style kick. The Puskas Award-winning goal from an overhead back-heeled strike came on New Year's Day in Arsenal's 2-0 victory over Crystal Palace in the English Premier League.

**Jitu, Heena strike gold in air pistol mixed team event**

New Delhi, Oct 24  
Jitu Rai and Heena Sidhu gave India their first gold medal of the ISSF World Cup Final in New Delhi, clinching the top honours in the 10m air pistol mixed team event on the opening day of competitions. Rai, a Commonwealth and Asian Games gold-medallist, and Sidhu, former Commonwealth Games gold-winner, picked up their third gold together in the mixed team event, being held officially for the first time at an ISSF World Cup.



The mixed team competitions were organised as test events in the World Cups held earlier this year and will be making their Olympic debut in the Tokyo 2020 Games. France secured the silver medal, while China settled for the bronze medal in the event.

**Pyeongchang 2018 Games torch lit in ancient Olympia**

Greece, Oct 24  
The torch for the Pyeongchang 2018 Winter Olympics was lit in ancient Olympia on Tuesday using the backup flame from the dress rehearsal due to rainy weather, kicking off the countdown for the first winter Games in Asia outside Japan. The run-up to the February 9-25 Olympics has been overshadowed by the escalating crisis on the Korean peninsula triggered by North Korea's nuclear and ballistic

missile tests. The torch was lit using Monday's dress rehearsal flame as clouds and light rain during the ceremony did not allow for the high priestess, played by actress Katerina Lechou, to use the concave reflector and light it using the sun's rays. "Our dream of hosting the Olympic winter Games has now become a reality. Korea is only the second Asian nation to have the honour of hosting the

winter Games," Games chief Lee Hee-beom said. "We want the international community to understand that we are committed to hosting a safe and secure Olympic winter Games." The short ceremony inside the stadium used during the ancient Greek Olympics, was also attended by South Korean Prime Minister Lee Nak-yeon. "The Olympic Games are sacred and universal," IOC president Thomas Bach said.

**Kidambi Srikanth felicitated by Indian embassy in Paris**

Paris, Oct 24  
Kidambi Srikanth was felicitated by the Indian embassy in Paris as the Denmark Open Super Series Premier winner reached the French capital for the French Open, starting on Wednesday. Srikanth, on Sunday, became only the second Indian to win the men's singles title in Denmark after Prakash Padukone won the tournament in 1980. The 24-year-old destroyed Korean veteran Lee Hyun Il 21-10, 21-5 in the final to lift the coveted trophy. On Monday evening, the Indian embassy organised an event to felicitate Indian shuttlers and the event was attended by the likes of Srikanth, PV Sindhu, Ashwini Ponappa, N Sikki Reddy, B Sai Praneeth, HS Prannoy, Satwik Rankireddy, Chirag Shetty and Pranaav Jerry Chopra. Saina Nehwal opted to give the event a miss. The president of the French Badminton Federation Florent



CHayet presented Srikanth with a bouquet felicitating the Indian for his achievements this year, which includes three Super Series title in Indonesia, Australia and Denmark. Back at home, The Badminton Association of India announced a cash reward of Rs 5 Lakh for Srikanth, in view of his Denmark Open victory.

"We are very proud of what Srikanth has achieved in the Danish Open. Our boys are on a roll and I can only see them winning more laurels for the country," BAI President Himanta Biswa Sarma said. Srikanth, Sindhu and Saina will lead India's charge in the singles category at the French Open.

for delayed filing of 3B returns. As per the data, around 56 lakh GSTR-3B returns were filed for July, 51 lakh for August and over 42 lakh for September. Preliminary returns GSTR-3B for a month is filed on the 20th day of the next month after paying due taxes.
