PM chairs high level meeting with States/UTs to review status and preparedness of COVID-19 response and management Modalities of COVID-19 vaccine delivery, distribution and administration discussed

New Delhi, Nov. 24 (PIB)
 Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi chaired a high-level meeting with Chief Ministers/ Lt Governor's of States/UTs today via video conferencing, to review the status and preparedness of COVID-19 response and management, with special emphasis on eight high focus States. The modalities of COVID-19 vaccine delivery, distribution and administration were also discussed during the meeting.
 Prime Minister remarked that the country has faced the pandemic through concerted efforts and in terms of both recovery rate and fatality rate, the situation in India is better than most other countries. He talked about the expansion of the testing and treatment network, and noted that special emphasis of the PM CARES fund has been to make available oxygen. He said that efforts are on to make medical colleges and district hospitals self-sufficient in terms of oxygen



generation, and informed that the process for establishing more than 160 new oxygen plants is underway. Stating that it is important to understand how the people have reacted to the pandemic, the Prime Minister noted that it can be broken down to four stages. The first was of fear, when people reacted in panic. The second stage saw cropping up of doubts about the virus, when several people tried to hide that they had been afflicted by it. The third stage was of acceptance, when people

became more serious about the virus and displayed greater alertness. In the fourth stage, with increasing recovery rate, people have developed a false notion of security from the virus, thus leading to rise in instances of negligence. Prime Minister emphasized that it is of utmost importance to increase awareness about the seriousness of the virus in this fourth stage. He noted that the trend of increase in spread of the pandemic in countries where its impact was earlier lessening is being seen in some States as well, which necessitates greater alacrity and caution by the Administration.
 Prime Minister noted that it is important to increase RT-PCR tests, ensure better monitoring of patients especially those in home isolation, better equip health centres at village and community level and keep running awareness campaigns for safety from the virus. He said that our target should

Strengthening community towards disaster preparedness in A&N Islands Disaster Management Kits distributed to all 70 Gram Panchayats & 7 Tribal Councils Capacity building training being imparted to volunteers

 Acknowledging that the Communities are the first responders to tackle any disaster situation in the first front, the Directorate of Disaster Management A&N Administration has strengthened the capacities of the communities by conducting various preparedness activities such as capacity building programmes, trainings, workshops, familiarization exercise for creating disaster awareness in all most all the Gram Panchayats and Tribal Villages spread over A&N Islands.



Under Community Based Disaster Risk Management Programme (CBDRM), Gram Panchayat Disaster Management Plans identified the Community Disaster Response Volunteer Force (CDRVF) in each village and Tribal Council as the first responders to cope with the disaster with their own available resources until the outside help reaches the affected area.

At present, more than 1000 community level volunteers are enrolled with different Gram Panchayats and Tribal Councils and the capacity building training for these volunteers are in progress. For equipping the CDRVF to combat the unforeseen disaster to mitigate the disaster catastrophe during golden hours, the Department has procured 77 Disaster Management Kits for all the 70 Gram Panchayats and 07 Tribal Councils.

'Funding the Unfunded'. In A&N Islands, about 2391 persons have availed loan under PMMY as on date. PMMY is provided under three categories. Under Shishu (covering loans upto Rs. 50,000), about 1009 persons have availed the loan. Similarly, under

Kishor (covering loans above Rs. 50,001/- and upto Rs. 5 lacs), about 1575 persons have been benefitted under the scheme while under Tarun (covering loans above Rs. 5 lacs and upto Rs. 10 lacs), about 347 persons have been sanctioned loan amount in A&N Islands.

be to bring down Fatality Rate below 1%. Prime Minister reassured that the Government is keeping a close watch on the development of vaccines and is in contact with Indian developers and manufacturers, along with global regulators, Governments of other countries, multilateral institutions and international companies. He added that it will be ensured that the vaccine for citizens will meet all necessary scientific criteria. He underlined that just like the focus in the fight against COVID has been on saving each and every life, the priority will be to ensure that the vaccine reaches everyone. Governments at all levels will have to work together to ensure that the vaccination drive is smooth, systematic and sustained.

Prime Minister noted that the priority of vaccination is being decided in consultation with the States. The requirements of additional cold chain storages has also been discussed with the States. He asked the Chief Ministers to ensure regular monitoring of State Level Steering Committee and State & District Level Task Force to ensure better results. Prime Minister forewarned that past experience tells us several myths and rumours are spread around vaccines. Rumours about side effects of the vaccine may be spread. He emphasized that such attempts need to be tackled through spreading greater awareness.

Govt. blocks 43 mobile apps from accessing by users in India
MEITY issues orders for blocking apps under IT Act

New Delhi, Nov. 24 (PIB) Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, Government of India today issued an order under section 69A of the Information Technology Act blocking access to 43 mobile apps. This action was taken based on the inputs regarding these apps for engaging in activities which are prejudicial to sovereignty and integrity of India, defence of India, security of state and public order. Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology has issued the order for blocking the access of these apps by users in India based on the comprehensive reports received from Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Center, Ministry of Home Affairs. Earlier on 29th June, 2020 the Government of India had blocked access to 59 mobile apps and on 2nd September, 2020, 118 more apps were banned under section 69A of the Information Technology Act. Government is committed to protect the interests of citizens and sovereignty and integrity of India on all fronts and it shall take all possible steps to ensure that. Central Crime Station hits hard on drug peddlers; 4 arrested & 20 kgs ganja seized

Port Blair, Nov. 24 Central Crime Station in its continuous efforts and crackdown against illegal Narcotics in A&N Islands, has arrested 4 drug peddlers in 3 different raids on Nov. 21. A credible information was received by Insp. Mahesh Kr. Yadav, SHO, PS Central Crime Station from an informer that one person namely Uttam Biswas, R/o West Bengal will be arriving at Port Blair from Kolkata by private airlines and on the direction of Dy. SP (CID), a raiding team comprising Insp. Mohd Elias, In-charge PS CCS was constituted and sent to VSI Airport, Lamba Line. The raiding team zeroed-in on the accused Uttam Biswas near the parking of VSI Airport and recovered 13.620 kgs ganja from his possession. Later on, Smti Archana Gain was also arrested in the said matter. On another information, the raiding team conducted a raid at the Private Bus Stand, Mohanpura and recovered 1.60 Kg. Ganja from the possession of the accused Gopal Biswas. In yet another raid headed by SI T. Dilla Rao alongwith SI Santosh R. Shenoy, arrested one lady Smti Laxmibala Das and recovered 4.650 kgs ganja from her possession. All the above accused persons were arrested under NDPS Act. accessories in the Disaster Management Kit includes (Safety Helmet, Life Jacket, Cotton Rope (50 mtrs.-10mm), P.P. rope (50 mtrs.-10mm), Tents (Including Poles & Accessories), Fire Extinguisher, Mega Phone, Buckets with lid, Water Tank (500 Ltrs.), Blanket, Tarpauline, Stretcher, Gumboot, Cotton Hand Glove, Manual Siren, Solar Lantern with panel, First Aid Kit, Three Cell Torch with battery, Emergency Light (Rechargeable), Battery Operated Radio (Transistor), Classic Metal Whistle, Basic Hand Tool Set (screw driver, Hammer, Electric Tester, Slip Joint Pliers, Small Hand Saw), Two Man Hand Saw, Pickaxe with Handle, Spade with handle, Crow Bar, Belcha with Handle, Large Axe with Handle, Rain Coat, GI Trunk (for storage) and distributed to 70 Gram Panchayats and 07 Tribal Council of A&N Islands to equip their respective CDRVF constituted under CBDRM Programme in these Islands. The entire logistical exercise of procurement and transportation of the kits was undertaken by the Department despite the logistical challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic. In view of this, Cattle Holding Farm, Dollygunj has introduced hybrid Super Napier plant that has unique characteristics to adopt as animal feedstock by the livestock owners. Super Napier is a Hybrid Napier fodder grass that produces a lot of high-protein forage and has 16% to 18% proteins with high yield prospective. This grass is called as 'King of Napier Grass' and best suited to high rainfall areas. It is also drought-tolerant and can grow well in drier areas. It can be grown with fodder trees along field boundaries or along contour lines or terrace risers to help control erosion, and can be intercropped with crops such as legumes and fodder trees, or as a pure stand. Super Napier seeds grow very fast and can be propagated very easily. It can be grown on variety of soils as it has deep roots, so is fairly drought-resistant. The tender, young leaves and stems are very palatable for livestock and in turn more growth is expected. This grass is susceptible to overgrazing. Crop may be harvested 40-50 days after planting stem cut/slips. Interested farmers can collect cuttings/ slips from Departmental Cattle Holding Farm or Fodder Farm at Dollygunj for developing fodder plots as home grown fodder source for their cattle, a press release from SVO, Cattle Holding Farm, Dollygunj said.

Thunderstorm with lightning likely to occur in Isles

Port Blair, Nov. 24 238880 (Tele-Fax), Thunderstorm with lightning is likely to occur at one or two places over Andaman & Nicobar Island on Nov. 27. Meanwhile, heavy rain (7-11) cm is likely to occur at one or two places over Nicobar on Nov. 28. Distant Cautionary Signal at Port Blair Port has been kept hoisted.
