



## Union Home Minister reviews preparation for cyclone 'Yaas' with Chief Ministers of three States and Lt. Governor of A&N Islands

### HM assures concerned States & Union Territory of A&N Islands of all cooperation of Central Government and its agencies

New Delhi, May 24 (PIB)

Union Home Minister, Shri Amit Shah held a review meeting, through video conferencing today, with the Chief Ministers of Odisha, West Bengal and Andhra Pradesh and the Lt. Governor of the Andaman & Nicobar Islands, to assess their preparedness and that of Central Ministries and agencies concerned, to deal with the situation arising out of Cyclone 'Yaas', which is forming in the Bay of Bengal. This follows yesterday's high level review meeting by the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi.

Shri Amit Shah specifically reviewed and re-iterated to the States/ UT Administrations to make adequate power backup arrangements in all COVID-19 hospitals, labs, vaccine cold chains and other medical facilities. Further, he advised them to ensure adequate stocks of all essential medicines and supplies in hospitals, keeping in view likely disruption of movement of vehicles. For health facilities, including temporary hospitals, likely to be affected by the cyclone, the Union Home Minister advised them to make adequate arrangements for securing them from losses and for evacuation of patients in advance, if necessary. The Union Home Minister said advance action



taken in this regard on the Western coast ensured that there was no adverse impact on any medical facility.

The Union Home Minister also reviewed the impact of the cyclone on oxygen generation plants located in the States of West Bengal, Odisha and Andhra Pradesh. He advised them to make advance planning for keeping a buffer stock of oxygen for two days and movement of oxygen tankers to allocated States, so that in case of any disruption, supply to allocated States is not impacted. Shri Amit Shah also asked the State Governments to ensure the safety of oxygen generation plants. He also emphasized the need to make necessary arrangements for safety of power plants to ensure uninterrupted power supply to hospitals and health facilities.

The safety of all shipping and fishing vessels, and all ports and oil installations in the area was

also reviewed during the meeting. In this regard, the Union Home Minister also reviewed the preparedness of the concerned States and UT to ensure that all fishermen are brought back to shore and the timely evacuation of people from low lying and vulnerable areas. He advised them to disseminate messages in local languages over mobile phones, television, social media and through village panchayats, with a view to educate and motivate people. As practiced by Odisha, volunteers, such as Home Guards, NCC and civil defence may also be mobilized in helping in the evacuation of people, Shri Amit Shah said.

The Union Home Minister stressed on the need to ensure safety of power and telecommunication services and their timely restoration. He advised the State Governments and the Union Territory to make advance planning and pre-position required manpower, equipment and material at vulnerable locations. He also emphasised on the need to look after the safety of power lines during the cyclone, and to promptly restore any damage that occurs. Further he said that timely pruning of heavy trees, will help in damage mitigation. Shri Amit Shah also advised the

## COVID-19: "We shall overcome..."

### "I nearly touched death"; says Padmashree Naresh Lal recollecting his bouncing back to life

### Deeply indebted to A&N Administration for timely medical assistance at Delhi

Port Blair, May 24

No two cases of COVID-19 seems to be identical, some patients recovered have short Hospital stays whilst others battle for weeks. Padmashree Naresh Chander Lal, known for his role in promoting cleanliness and awareness campaign in the city as the brand Ambassador of Swatchh Bharat A&N Islands, shared his ordeal in the war against the deadly virus. Literally, life has been nothing short of a miracle for him, having survived a tough battle



which he hardly wants to recollect. In an exclusive interview to the 'Daily Telegrams' he spoke about his contracting corona virus at New Delhi and the pivotal role of the Andaman and Nicobar Administration in saving his life, which he candidly felt would

have been in jeopardy at a time when Delhi was already facing crisis of beds in hospitals and shortage of oxygen.

Narrating the tale, from the day, he left the Island shores to Delhi, in a nutshell, he firstly said, "I am deeply indebted to A&N Administration for

their timely help in arranging a bed with oxygen in Sir Ganga Ram Multi Specialty Hospital, Delhi at a critical time when he had to be shifted to a hospital as he was breathing with great difficulty. His family members were not getting beds for him and all the hospitals in the vicinity were showing full. His helpless family members tweeted about his health and Administration took note of it. The Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Jitendra Narain immediately asked

Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman, Shri Suneel Anchipaka to look into and finally with the intervention of A&N Administration, he got a bed with oxygen at sir Ganga Ram Hospital otherwise... (pause) with a choking voice... God knows what would have happened", said Shri Naresh.

## 2,921 registered beneficiaries in the age group of 18 to 44 years vaccinated so far in Isles

### Total of 1,21,211 doses of vaccines administered

The vaccination drive is continuing and so far a total of 2,921 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years were vaccinated in A&N Islands so far. As per the data received, altogether, 328 persons in the age group of 18 to 44 years were vaccinated in South Andaman while 61 persons were vaccinated in Car Nicobar today. A total of 410 doses of COVISHIELD vaccines were administered to the eligible beneficiaries by the health teams in



South Andaman today, taking the total number of doses of vaccines administered so far to 1,21,211. As per the District wise figure of administering of COVISHIELD doses, about, 338 persons above 18+ were administered the

vaccine in South Andaman while, 72 were vaccinated in Nicobar District today. Meanwhile, the online registration for the vaccination is done through CoWIN portal and Aarogya Setu App. Online registration is

State Governments and the Union Territory to be in touch with the India Meteorological Department for their advance warnings and updated forecasts.

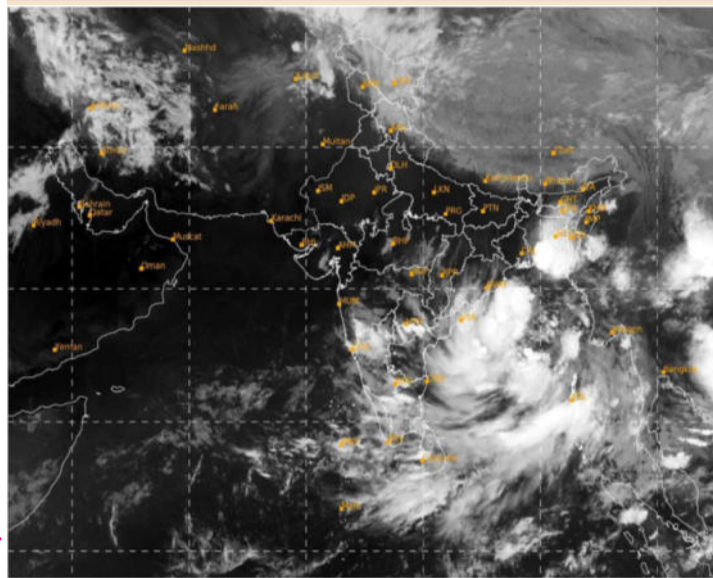
Shri Amit Shah assured the States and the Union Territory of all cooperation of the Central Government and its agencies, and directed senior officers for the same. He said that maximum resources, both Government and private, should be utilized to tackle the situation. The Union Home Minister reiterated that under the leadership of Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, India will be able to successfully handle the impending cyclone.

Shri Amit Shah said that a 24x7 Control Room is functioning in the MHA, which can be contacted at any time for any assistance by the States and the Union Territory. He said the Indian Coast Guard, the Navy, the Army and Air Force units have also been put on standby and surveillance aircraft and helicopters are carrying out aerial sorties.

The Chief Minister of Odisha thanked the Central Government for convening the meeting and for extending assistance to the State Government in its preparedness efforts. He assured that all necessary steps have been taken by the Odisha Government to handle and manage the cyclone. The Chief Minister of West Bengal also assured that necessary steps are being taken to ensure that there is minimal loss of life and property due to the impending cyclone, and that the State Government is fully prepared. The Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh thanked the Central Government and assured that necessary precautions are being taken. The Lt. Governor of the Andaman & Nicobar Islands informed the Union Home Minister that the cyclone would have little or negligible impact on the Islands.

Chief Secretaries and other Senior Officers of the concerned States and UT also attended the meeting.

**Thunderstorm, gusty winds with heavy rain likely to occur over A&N Islands**



Port Blair May 24

Heavy rain (7-11cm) is likely to occur at one or two places over A&N Islands on May 25, 2021. Thunderstorm with wind speed reaching 45-55 km gusting to 65 kmph is also likely to occur over Andaman & Nicobar Islands. On May 26 & 27, thunderstorm with lightning and gusty wind (speed reaching 40-50 kmph) is likely to occur at one or two places over A&N

Islands. On May 28, thunderstorm with lightning and gusty wind (speed reaching 40-50 kmph) is likely to occur at one or two places over A&N Islands. Fisherman Warning: Due to strong to vigorous South-West Monsoon over Andaman sea and South Bay of Bengal, wind speed is likely to exceed 45 kmph. Fishermen have been advised not to venture into the sea till further

Padmashree Naresh began his episode by disclosing that he left Port Blair on April 5 for Delhi along with his family and adhered to all the COVID protocols while travelling to Delhi as well as during their stay in Delhi. When asked about how he might have contracted COVID, he said, he made the biggest mistake of visiting Taj Mahal, Agra on April 12. There, no one was wearing masks and nobody adhered to social distancing despite large number of hoardings and banners asking people to maintain COVID protocols. He was in mask but others were not and social distancing was not followed there. A couple of days after his visit to this place, he got fever on April 17 and immediately, consulted a doctor, who gave medicine. After taking medicine, he felt better but his oxygen level suddenly came down to 65 and the doctor advised immediate hospitalization. For hospitalization, his family members searched for hospitals but in vain, Shri Naresh mentioned.

But finally with the help of former Chief Secretary, Shri Chetan B Sanghi and Delhi's Health Secretary, Shri Vikram Dev Dutt they got accommodation in Santhome Hospital where oxygen was provided to him and after the oxygen level improved to 90, he was discharged, as he had no fever and other symptoms. As soon as he came back home, his oxygen level again came down to 73, which was an alarming signal, he said.

In the meantime, the A&N Administration had made arrangement at Sir Ganga Ram Hospital one of the best Hospital in Delhi on April 26 and his proper treatment started. Padmashree Naresh mentioned that from April 26 to April 30, he was in sub-conscious state and was in full oxygen support. He was provided better care in this hospital by the doctors and paramedical staff. The Chairman of the Hospital, Shri Devender Singh Rana, who is also a Padmashree, was a very kind hearted person always enquired about his health condition on a daily basis. He said staying in COVID Isolation Ward was very painful as he could not see his family members. However, he got some courage and confidence when the Hospital authorities allowed his son and daughter to visit him with proper PPE kit. In the hospital, doctors asked me to do prone for maintaining oxygen level which was very helpful. He said during his hospitalization, the A&N Administration was in constant touch with Hospital authorities and enquired about his health status.

I was shifted to non-COVID ward on May 2 and on May 5, finally I was discharged from the Hospital after recovery. He also expressed gratitude to the Member of Parliament, Shri Kuldeep Rai Sharma who also helped him by arranging an oxygen cylinder during his stay at home in Delhi.

In his message to the people suffering from COVID, Shri Naresh said one should not lose self confidence in such conditions and have faith in doctors. One should take timely medicine and take proper meals. Cautioning the people, he urged the people to not to take COVID lightly and avoid visiting crowded places. "I visited such a place and got COVID, but the trauma, I have undergone due to this, is an eye opener for me and appeal to the people to follow COVID Appropriate behavior in letter and spirit", he said. Lackadaisical attitude to COVID protocol will land you in trouble and prevention is better than cure.

Shri Naresh who came out from the jaws of death welcomed the decision of the A&N Administration to go for lockdown, which he said, is very much important to contain the transmission of the virus in the Islands.

He expressed gratitude to Shri Kuldeep Singh Thakur, Joint Resident Commissioner, Delhi for making all necessary arrangement in connection with his treatment. He also conveyed his gratitude to the Hospital Authority and specially Dr. Atul Kakar for treatment and also Shri Gandhi, Admission Head, Sir Ganga Ram Hospital.

**Over 21 crore 80 lakh vaccine doses given to States, UTS by centre so far**

New Delhi, May 24

The Centre has provided over 21 crore 80 lakh vaccine doses to the States and Union Territories so far. This has been given both through the free of cost category and through the direct State procurement category. Of this, the total consumption including wastages is over 20 crore doses. More than 1.80 crore COVID-19 Vaccine doses are still available with the

States and Union Territories. The Health Ministry said, over 48 lakh vaccine doses are in the pipeline and will be sent to the States and Union Territories within the next three days. As part of the nationwide vaccination drive, the Central Government has been supporting the States and Union Territories by providing them COVID Vaccines free

of cost. In addition, it has also been facilitating direct procurement of vaccines by the States and Union Territories. Vaccination is an integral pillar of the comprehensive strategy for containment and management of the pandemic, along with Test, Track, Treat and COVID Appropriate Behaviour. (Source: india.gov.in)

cyclonic weather all the flights were cancelled today. During the RAT conducted on 18 passengers at Ferrargunj, none of them were found positive. He said, 410 people were vaccinated today.

The Deputy Director, Dr. Amitabh De said that as per data available, 84 persons are admitted in GB Pant Hospital, out of which 2 are new admission. 3 patients were discharged today. He said 72 persons are on oxygen and 6 are on ventilator. He said that no new COVID patients were admitted at COVID Care Centers and 6 have been discharged. The total number of corona positive patients in CCCs has come down to 47. In Wimberlygunj COVID Care Centre no new cases were admitted today while 4 are in the Centre.

The Director, IP&T, Shri Alok Kumar also attended the press conference.

**Partial phase of Lunar eclipse to be visible in India on Wednesday**

New Delhi, May 24

A partial phase of Lunar eclipse will be visible in India on Wednesday. According to the India Meteorological Department, IMD, a total eclipse of the Moon will occur on 26th May. It said, from India, just after moonrise, ending of the partial phase of the eclipse will be visible for a short span of time from north eastern parts of India except Sikkim, some parts of West Bengal, Odisha and Andaman and Nicobar Islands.



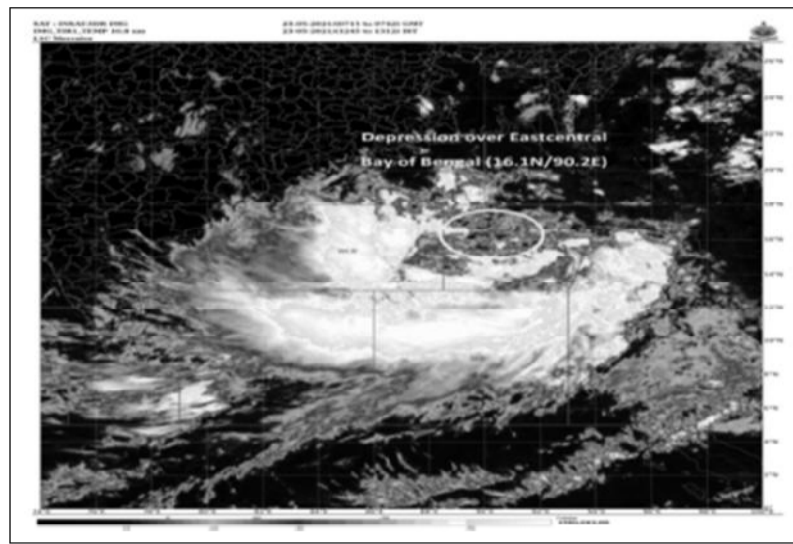
The Science and Technology Ministry said, the eclipse will be visible in the region covering South America, North America, Asia, Australia, Antarctica, the Pacific Ocean and the Indian Ocean. Lunar

eclipse occurs on a full moon day when the Earth comes in between the Sun and the Moon and when all the three objects are aligned. The next lunar eclipse will be visible from India on 19th November this year.

## Cyclone 'Yaas' likely to make landfall between Paradip and Sagar Island on Wednesday morning

New Delhi, May 24

The Cyclonic Storm 'Yaas' is very likely to move slowly north-northwestwards, intensify further into a Severe Cyclonic Storm during the next 12 hours and into a Very Severe Cyclonic Storm during the subsequent 24 hours. It would continue to intensify further and reach Northwest Bay of Bengal near north Odisha and West Bengal coasts by early morning on Wednesday. It is very likely to cross north Odisha-West Bengal coasts between Paradip and Sagar islands around Wednesday noon as a Very Severe Cyclonic Storm.



Today, the Cyclonic Storm moved north-northwest of Port Blair, 530 km south-southeast of Paradip, 630 km south-southeast of Balasore and 620 km south-southeast of Digha. (Source: india.gov.in)

## India witnesses continuous decline in active cases of COVID-19 and further improvement in recovery from infection in past 22 days



New Delhi, May 24

The Union Health Ministry has said that the country is witnessing continuous decline in the number of active cases of COVID-19 and further improvement in the recovery from the infection in the past 22 days. Addressing the media, Joint Secretary in the Health Ministry Lav Aggarwal said that the number of Active cases has now come down to 10.17 per cent from the level of 17.13 per cent while the recovery rate has improved to 88.7 per cent from the level of 81.7 per cent on 3rd May. He informed that in the last 14 days, the country has reported a decline of 10 lakh active cases and now it stood at

the level of 27.2 lakh.

He added that there are 27 States in the country where the recovered cases are more than the daily reported cases. He said, the number of districts reporting more than 100 cases has also come down from 531 to 431 districts. Mr Aggarwal added that the number of testing of COVID samples has been increased by 2.6 times in the last 15 weeks and yesterday the highest ever 21.23 lakh tests were conducted.

During the briefing, Director, AIIMS New Delhi Dr Randeep Guleria said, labeling the same fungus with names of different colors can create confusion. He said,

Mucormycosis or fungal infection is not a communicable disease, unlike COVID. He said, 90 to 95 per cent of patients getting infected with this kind of fungal infection are found to have been either diabetic or taking steroids. He said, as the recovery rate is increasing, there is also a need to develop multidisciplinary post COVID clinics for the rehabilitation and management of post COVID patients as they may continue with some symptoms for few weeks after the recovery. In reply to a question, Dr Guleria said that there is no indication that the third wave of COVID will infect children severely. (Source: india.gov.in)

In the last 24 hours over 3 lakh 2 thousand people recovered from COVID-19 infection. Till now, over 2 crore 37 lakh 28 thousand people have recovered. The recovery rate now stands at 88.30 per cent. Four thousand four hundred 54 deaths were reported in the last 24 hours. The death toll due to Coronavirus pandemic has reached 3 lakh 3 thousand 720.

There are over 27 lakh active cases in the country.

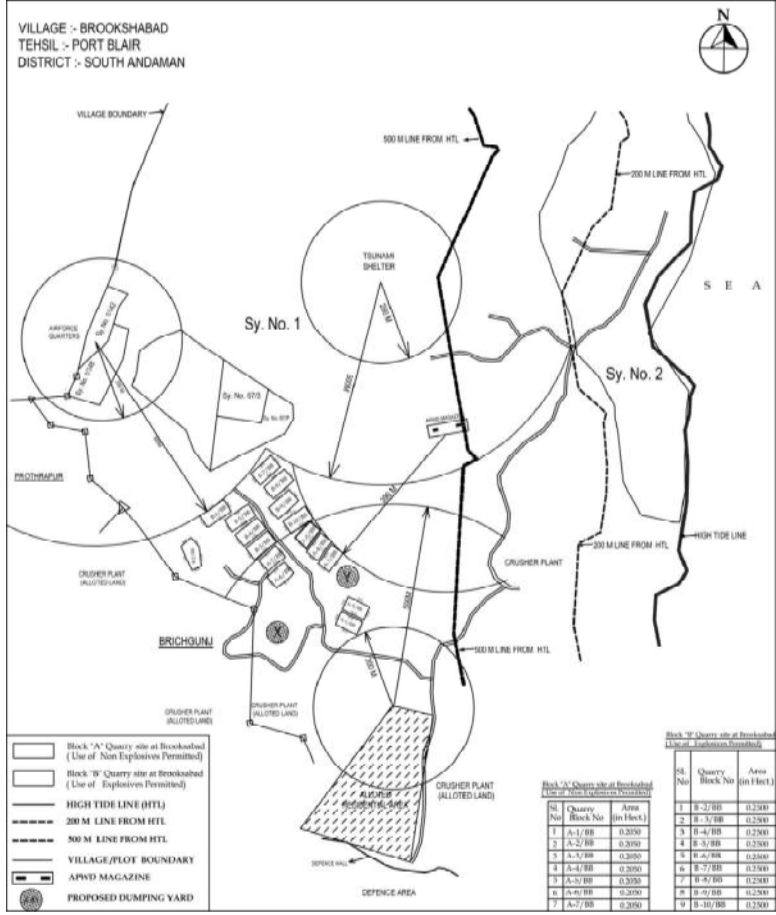
