Govt. issues guidelines regarding celebration of I-Day on 15th August amidst COVID-19

New Delhi, July 24

Government has issued detailed guidelines regarding celebration of Independence Day on 15th August amidst COVID-19.

In a letter written to the Chief Secretaries of all States and Union Territories, Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has informed that the Independence Day celebrations should be held in a way befitting the occasion.

However, in its clear



direction to the States, District and Panchayat authorities, MHA has instructed not to allow

large congregations keeping in mind mandatory physical distancing norms.

It said, digital technology should be used to maximise people participation.

Following the precautionary steps as suggested by the Home Ministry Guidelines, Independence Day celebrations at the Red Fort this year, will consist of the Prime Minister's speech, Guard of honour, hoisting of National Flag, National Anthem and release of Tricolour balloons.

The guidelines also suggest inviting COVID warriors such as doctors, health workers,

Ministry of Shipping waives waterways usage charges to promote Inland water transport Eco-friendly & cheaper mode of transport will promote ease of doing business: Minister

New Delhi, July 24 (PIB)

Ministry of Shipping has decided to waive waterway usage charges with immediate effect considering the Government of India's vision to promote inland waterways as a supplementary, eco-friendly and cheaper mode of transport. The charges are waived initially for three years.

The Union Minister

of State for Shipping (I/C), Shri Mansukh Mandaviya said that currently only 2% of total cargo traffic moves through waterways. Decision of waiving waterway charges will attract the industries to use the national waterways for their logistical needs. As the mode of transport is eco-friendly and cheaper, it will not only

reduce the burden on other transport modes but also promote the ease of doing business, the Minister added.

Water usage charge was applicable on use of all the national waterways by vessels. It was a hindrance in administration of traffic movement and collection of traffic data. Presently, Inland Waterways (Contd. on last page)

Govt. imposes restrictions on public procurement from countries sharing land border with India on security ground



New Delhi, July 24

Government has imposed restrictions on public procurement from the countries which share a land border with India to strengthen the defence and national security. The Department of Expenditure in a detailed Order said the Government has amended the General Financial Rules 2017 to enable imposition of restrictions on bidders from countries which share a land border with India on grounds of defence of India, or matters directly or indirectly related thereto including national

security.

As per the order, any bidder from such countries sharing a land border with India will be eligible to bid in any procurement whether of goods, services including consultancy services and non-consultancy services or works including turnkey projects only if the bidder is registered with the competent authority.

The competent authority for registration will be the Registration Committee constituted by the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, DPIIT. Political (Contd. on last page)

Creating holistic & comprehensive health eco-system A&N Islands selected for implementation of National Digital Health Mission in First Phase Implementation of NDHM will result in efficiency, effectiveness & transparency in overall healthcare service delivery



Port Blair, July 24

India being home to second-largest population of internet subscribers and one of the world's largest and fastest-growing digital economy, desires to achieve Universal Health Coverage by launching the National Digital Health Mission (NDHM) under the guidance of the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoH&FW), Govt. of India. NDHM envisages a holistic and comprehensive health eco-system that will enable the creation of a robust public digital infrastructure and digitally empower individuals, doctors and health facilities. It will facilitate electronic signatures, make paperless registrations and payments, and provide

opportunities to deploy systems to streamline healthcare information.

The Andaman and Nicobar Islands has been selected as one of the six Union Territories where NDHM shall be implemented in First Phase. The aim of the mission is to provide the following services:-

- Unique Health ID will be created of all individuals to provide ease of access to seek healthcare anywhere in the country.
- A comprehensive central repository of all health care providers/ practitioners (HCPs), to provide a common platform will be created.
- The facility registry will be created which consist of one record and a unique identifier for each healthcare facility in the country- hospitals, clinics, diagnostic centres, pharmacies etc.
- The Personal Health Record (PHR) will be a longitudinal record for each individual on the system, comprising all health data, lab reports, treatment details, discharge summaries etc. related to one episode or a set of episodes, across one or multiple facilities.

The implementation of NDHM will result in a tremendous improvement in the efficiency, effectiveness, and transparency of the overall healthcare service delivery. The health care professionals across disciplines will have better access to patient's medical history (with the necessary consent) for prescribing more appropriate and effective health interventions. Patients will be able to securely store and access their medical records (such as prescriptions, diagnostic reports, discharge summaries), and share them with health care providers, to ensure

appropriate treatment and follow-up. They will also have access to more accurate information on health facilities and providers. NDHM will empower individuals with accurate information to enable informed decision making and enhance accountability of the healthcare providers. The researchers will greatly benefit from the availability of such aggregated information, as they will be able to study and evaluate the effectiveness of various programmes and interventions, a press release from Principal Secretary (Health) said.

Skilling rural youth through Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana UT Administration plans to provide skill development training & placement to 3000 candidates up to 2022

In light of the COVID-19 pandemic which lead to an unprecedented disruption of the economy and the employment scenario in the nation, the Govt. of India has taken various path breaking initiatives to support the rural economy. One such scheme is the Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY) under which the Department of Rural Development, GoI is aiming to provide sustainable income opportunities for the rural poor youth through placement linked skill development programme.

The scheme is being implemented in the UT of Andaman & Nicobar Islands with the aim to skill rural youth who are poor and to provide them not only with jobs but also enabling them to earn regular monthly wages at or above the minimum wages. Further, under the



Sagarmala-convergence by the Ministry of Shipping, Govt. of India, the eligible rural youth of the Islands shall be trained and placed for the holistic development of the Coastal Regions, by involving coastal community.

The salient features of DDU-GKY are as under:-
 ❖ Target group:- Rural poor youth in age of 18-35 and upper age limit for 45 years in case of Women candidates, Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs), PwDs, Transgenders and other special groups.

clearance from the External Affairs Ministry and security clearance from the Home Ministry will also be mandatory.

The order also takes into its ambit Public Sector Banks and Financial Institutions, Autonomous Bodies, Central Public Sector Enterprises and Public Private Partnership Projects receiving financial support from the Government or its undertakings. The Central Government has also written to State Chief Secretaries for the implementation of this Order in procurement by them and their undertakings. The Finance Minister said the relaxation has been provided in certain limited cases, including for procurement of medical supplies for containment of COVID-19 global pandemic till December this year.

The Ministry said the new provisions will apply to all new tenders. In respect of tenders already invited, if the first stage of evaluation of qualifications has not been completed, bidders who are not registered under the new Order will be treated as not qualified.

If this stage has been crossed, ordinarily the tenders will be cancelled and the process started de novo. The Order will also apply to other forms of public procurement. The Ministry said it does not apply to procurement by the private sector. (Source: india.gov.in)

trained & 3% persons with disabilities.

❖ Identification of poor: From a household covered under auto inclusion parameters as per SECC, 2011, from a family member of a SHG, from household of Antyodaya Anna Yojana/BPL PDS Card, from MGNREGA worker household with atleast 15 days work in the previous calendar year, from a household of RSBY (Rashtriya Swasthya Bima Yojana) card, even if such youth are not covered in any list, it is expected that they will be identified during the Participatory Identification of Poor (PIP).

❖ The course comprises of trade specific skills, soft skills, basic spoken English and IT awareness.

❖ For non-residential training, the Project Implementing Agencies (PIAs) will be given cost for food and to and fro journey for the candidates.

❖ For residential training, boarding and lodging facility will be provided by the Project Implementing Agencies (PIAs).

❖ Post placement support will be provided by the PIAs

❖ Migration Support Centre (MSC) shall be provided for candidates in UT and outside the UT for alumni support, accommodation, counseling services, coordination with local Civil and Police Administration.

❖ All trained candidates shall be tracked by PIAs for a period of 12 months.

The UT has planned to provide skill development training alongwith placement to 3000 candidates up to 2022 (1500 under DDU-GKY scheme + 1500 under convergence with Sagarmala Project of Ministry of Shipping, GoI). The Expression of Interest (EoI) has also been invited from the interested Project Implementing Agencies. Mobilization of rural youth of all three Districts is being done through media, distribution of pamphlets and banners etc. to orient about the features and benefits of the scheme. The rural youth of these Islands have been urged to avail the benefits of the scheme for betterment of their livelihood, a press release from the Directorate of Rural Development said.

Authority of India (IWAI) levies the waterway usage charges at a rate of Rs 0.02 per gross registered tonnage (GRT) per kilometer for plying of Inland cargo vessels and Rs. 0.05 per gross registered tonnage (GRT) per kilometer for plying of Cruise vessels on national waterways.

The decision is estimated to increase the inland waterway traffic movement to 110MMT in 2022-23 from 72MMT in 2019-20. It will benefit the economic activities and development in the region.

Allotment of Professional/Technical/Non-Technical Courses at Mainland Institutions for the academic session 2020-2021

It is for information of all concerned that as per the seat distribution criteria/formula enumerated by the Ministry of Home Affairs, following are the tentative procedure for allotment of reserved seats for the students of Andaman and Nicobar Islands in the Professional/ Technical/Non-Technical courses at Mainland Institutions during 2020-2021 :-

(i) Criteria for allotment of seats to various categories fixed by the Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, New Delhi's Order No.U-14040/5/96/ANL, dated 30th May, 1996 is as under:-

Category-I	Tribals	20%
Category-II	Deputationist and Central Government Employees with transfer liability to serve outside the Union Territory provided the candidates in this category have studied the last two years in the islands and passed the qualifying examination from a school in the Islands.	10%
Category-III	Settlers who were settled prior to 1942 and those who were settled under various rehabilitation schemes introduced after re-occupation of the Islands. The seats in this category will be allocated as under:- (a) Pre-1942 Settlers 1/3rd (b) Others Settlers 1/3rd (c) Seat to be allocated on the 1/3rd basis of combined merit of (a) & (b) above	50%
Category-IV	Other locals who do not fall under (I) (II) or (III) above and such Central Government Employees having no Transfer liability to serve outside the Union Territory, provided all have had 10 years education in the islands.	20%
Category-V	General merit quota open to all the residents of A&N Islands irrespective of any classification. This will be subject to condition that the candidates in this category have studied the last two years in the Islands and passed the qualifying examination from a school in the islands.	Unutilized seats of Category s I,II,III & IV above.

PwD : 5% seats are reserved for PwD candidates on interlocking reservation basis i.e. horizontal reservation cuts across vertical reservation (various categories of students in A & N Islands). Since the PwD candidates have to be placed in the appropriate category viz. Category-I, Category-II, Category III A, Category-III B and Category-IV.

Note :- The reservation of 10% seats to the students belonging to Economically Weaker Sections and the above referred seat allotment distribution criteria are subject to change depending upon communication to be received from the Ministry of Home Affairs.

(ii) ONLINE applications will be invited from eligible candidates by giving wide publicity through Local Newspapers/All India Radio/ Website of A&N Administration for considering allotment of reserved seats in Colleges/Institutions at Mainland.

(iii) The candidates should submit their application ONLINE at <http://collegeadmission.andaman.gov.in>.

(iv) Candidates have two options; either they fill the Admission Application Form through Common Service Center (CSC) or through internet by accessing the portal via URL <http://collegeadmission.andaman.gov.in>.

(v) If the candidates are applying through CSC, they are advised to pay the charges/fees at CSC Counter for filling up the application forms based on the criteria as stated below:

1. Filling in Application Form at Rs 10/-
2. Scanning & Uploading documents/testimonials including photograph in Colour format at Rs. 10/- per document and Black & White Format at Rs. 10/- per document.
3. Print out of Acknowledgement Slip: @10/-
4. The candidates MUST bring the acknowledgment slip (with the seal of CSC if applied through CSC), Original Documents with self-attested photocopy of documents during the counselling session of their opted courses.

(vi) The ONLINE application will be accepted from 24.07.2020 to 14.08.2020 upto 5.00 pm.

(vii) Candidates should fill their ONLINE application form very carefully and no changes will be considered after submission of the application under any circumstances.

(viii) The Candidates those who have passed +2 exam from the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) or Other State Board are requested that before filing their ONLINE application, they may approach the Deputy Secretary (Hr. 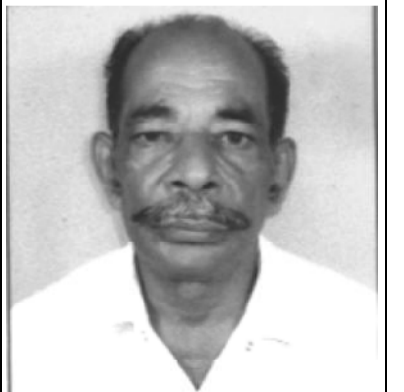
