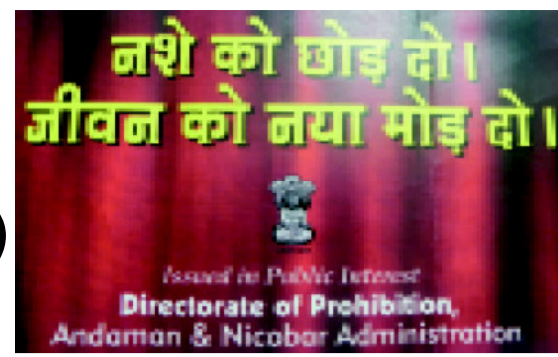

PM to share his thoughts in 'Mann Ki Baat' on All India Radio today

New Delhi, Feb 25 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi will share his thoughts on a number of themes and issues in 'Mann Ki Baat' programme of All India Radio at 11 AM tomorrow (Feb 26). It will be the 29th episode of the monthly radio series. The programme will be broadcast on the entire network of All India Radio and Doordarshan. It will immediately be followed by the regional versions. The programme



will also be streamed on the YouTube channels of the Prime Minister's Office, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting and DD News.

In the last edition of the programme, Shri Modi had asked students and parents to take examinations as a festival and not be under stress.

Economic activity to pick up in Q4 due to faster remonetisation: RBI Governor

New Delhi, Feb 25 RBI Governor Dr Urjit Patel expects that economic activity will pick up in this last quarter because of faster remonetisation and return of discretionary consumer demand. In a statement made during the Monetary Policy Committee meeting earlier this month, Dr. Patel further said that data from corporate sector also suggests that sales growth may have improved. As per the Minutes of the meeting

made public on Wednesday, Dr. Patel had said that shifting of monetary policy stance from accommodative to neutral will provide sufficient flexibility to move the policy rate in either direction.

In his statement, MPC Member and RBI Deputy Governor Shri Viral V Acharya had said that it is important to guard the Indian macro-economy from global headwinds and have a reasonably good chance of attaining the 5 percent target for headline inflation by end of March 2017.

634 drugs suspected to be non-compliant with ceiling price: NPPA

New Delhi, Feb 25 Six hundred and 34 drugs of various strengths produced by firms are suspected to be non-compliant with ceiling prices as notified by National Pharmaceutical Pricing Authority (NPPA). In its notification, the regulator said that it has issued the list after analysing the market data of various medicines in December last year. The list of cases of suspected

non-compliance of notified ceiling prices issued by NPPA included medicines manufactured by leading pharmaceutical firms in India.

NPPA has been entrusted with the task of fixation and revision of prices of pharma products, enforcement of provisions of the Drugs Prices Control Order and monitoring of prices of controlled and decontrolled drugs.

India to be fastest growing economy among G-20 nations: Moody's

New York, Feb 25 International rating agency Moody's Investors Service has predicted that India will be the fastest growing economy among G-20 countries clocking a 7.1 per cent growth in year 2017. In the report titled 'Modest Acceleration in the Global Economy, Moody said, Indian economy will be the fastest growing among the G-20 nations, though it

slowed down in the fourth quarter of 2016 because of the demonetisation. Moody also said, the continuing cyclical recovery in global economic activity with growth in G-20 countries picking up modestly to 3 per cent in 2017 and 2018 from 2.6 per cent in 2016. The rating agency also said, that there is a high risk

Over 5 crore Indians suffered from depression in 2015: WHO

New Delhi, Feb 25 A World Health Organisation (WHO) study said, that over five crore Indians have suffered from depression in year 2015. The WHO in its new global health estimates on depression for 2015 said, while over five crore

Indians suffered from depression, over three crore others suffered from anxiety disorders.

The report said, over two-thirds of global suicides were in low and middle-income countries like India in 2015. The WHO document said, that 322

million people are living with depression worldwide and nearly half of them live in South East Asian and Western Pacific region. The total estimated number of people living with depression increased by 18.4 per cent between 2005 and 2015.

Astronomers find 7 Earth-size planets

New Delhi, Feb 25

Astronomers have found a nearby solar system with seven Earth-sized planets, three of which circle their parent star at the right distance for liquid surface water, raising the prospect of life, research published recently showed. The star, known as TRAPPIST-1, is a small, dim celestial body in the constellation Aquarius.

It is located about 40 light years away from Earth. Researchers said the proximity of the system, combined with the proportionally large size of its planets compared to the small star, make it a good target for follow-up studies.

They hope to scan the planets' atmospheres for possible chemical fingerprints of life. TRAPPIST-1 is named for the Transiting Planets And Planetesimals Small Telescope (TRAPPIST) in Chile. The latest discovery is from

ISSF World Cup : Pooja Ghatkar Clinches Bronze in 10m Air Rifle Event

New Delhi, Feb 25
 Hosts India have opened their account with a Bronze medal in the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) World Cup. On Day One of competitions at the Karni Singh Shooting Range in New Delhi today, Pooja Ghatkar overcame technical issues to clinch the women's 10 metre air rifle bronze. The former Asian champion shot 228.8 in the final to finish third.
 For the 27-year-old Ghatkar, it is her maiden World Cup medal, after two final appearances in the past. China's Mengyao Shi won the gold medal with 252.1 while setting a new world record in the event. Her Chinese compatriot Dong Lijie bagged the silver with a score of 248.9. In Men's 10 metre air rifle final, Deepak Kumar finished fifth with



a score of 185.4. Another Indian, Ravi Kumar, was placed eighth with 122.0. The event was won by China's Wong Buhan with a World Record score of 249.5. Peter Sidi of Hungary took the Silver, while Atsushi Shimada bagged the Bronze.
