## MP urges Govt to intervene about company allegedly involved in ponzi scheme in Isles

Port Blair, Mar 25 The Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray has requested the Home Minister, GoI for intervention in the case of M/s Roofers Group of Company who are allegedly, involved in running a Ponzi Scheme. A press release received here from the MP's Office says, this company is registered under the companies Act, 1956 Kolkata Corporate Identity Number: U45400wb2009plc140341. The said firm started its

business in the Islands during 2010 and later spread its branches through the territory. As per information, the firm collected around 25 crores in the year 2010, around 50 crores in the year 2011 and 150 crores in 2012. The complaints were filed by Islanders at PS Mayabunder and PS Aberdeen against the above said company. The company is reported to be controlled by three persons, one of whom, Shri Hirak Nath South, CMD Roofers Group is in Judicial

Custody at Baleshwar, Odisha. In the Islands, the operations of the firm was handled by three persons, namely Shri Ajit Baroi, Shri Joshua and Shri Ranjan Halder (the first two being employees of PBMC). More than 7000 agents were recruited by the firm in the Islands and deposits exceeding 150 crores from unsuspecting Islanders. Many of the Islanders have deposited their hard earned money in the scheme such as their retirement dues, by mortgaging properties etc.

With the disappearance of the firm, the unsuspecting and innocent Islanders have been left in a lurch and have been running from pillar to post to get back their investments. Considering the scale of Islanders affected by the alleged fraud, the Member of Parliament has given his opinion that the state may have to play a leading role in providing some assistance to the affected parties as well as to prevent such instance from happening in the future. Senior principal scientist Shri Ajit Kumar Shasany said, they have proved scientifically that L-Menthol can kill the colon cancer cell line without affecting the normal cell line. ## Implementation of PMAY- Gramin; to achieve Housing for All by 2022

New Delhi, Mar 25 The Union Cabinet, chaired by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has given its approval for the implementation of the rural housing scheme of Pradhan Mantri Awaas Yojana - Gramin. Under the scheme, financial assistance is provided for construction of pucca house to all houseless and households living in dilapidated houses. The expenditure involved in implementing the project

in a span of 3 years from 2016-17 to 2018-19 is Rs.81975 crore. It is proposed that one crore households would be provided assistance for construction of pucca house under the project during the period from 2016-17 to 2018-19. The scheme would be implemented in rural areas throughout India except Delhi and Chandigarh. The cost of houses would be shared between Centre and States.

## Brussels attacks: EAM thanks Netherlands govt for helping Indian citizens

New Delhi, Mar 25 External Affairs Minister Smti Sushma Swaraj has thanked the Netherlands government for their help in transferring Indian citizens from Brussels to Amsterdam after the terror attack. In a tweet, Smti Swaraj said, India was able to transfer 525 Indians to Amsterdam

despite passengers not having Schengen Visa. The Minister also appreciated Indian Ambassador in The Hague, Mr J.S.Mukul and his team saying that they have done a remarkable job in coordination and evacuation of Indian nationals.

## DA to Central Government released

New Delhi, Mar 25 The Union Cabinet, chaired by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, has approved the release of an additional instalment of Dearness Allowance (DA) to Central Government employees and Dearness Relief (DR) to Pensioners w.e.f. 01.01.2016. This represents an increase of 6 percent over the existing rate of 119 percent of the Basic Pay/Pension, to compensate for price rise. This will benefit about 50 lakh Government employees and 58 lakh

pensioners. The increase is in accordance with the accepted formula, which is based on the recommendations of the 6th Central Pay Commission (CPC). The combined impact on the exchequer on account of both Dearness Allowance and Dearness Relief would be of Rs. 6796.50 crore per annum and Rs. 7929.24 crore respectively, in the financial year 2016-17 (for a period of 14 months from January, 2016 to February, 2017).

**Team's ability to stay calm led to India's win over B'desh last night: Dhoni**

New Delhi, Mar 25  
Indian captain MS Dhoni said the team's ability to stay calm under intense pressure and manage the chaotic situation with a cool head paved the way for their nerve-wracking win over Bangladesh last night in the ICC World T-20. The prospect of securing a semifinal berth at stake, India survived a mighty scare to snatch victory from the jaws of defeat in front of a packed crowd at the Chinnaswamy Stadium, helping them to the second position in the group.



Post match MS Dhoni hailed the younger players in the side for stepping up and performing in key roles. He specifically gave credit to Hardik Pandya and Jasprit Bumrah, who looked nervous at the start after a misfield.

**World T-20: Australia beat Pakistan by 21 runs**

Mohali, Mar 25  
Australia defeated Pakistan by 21 runs in the World T-20 cricket match played in Mohali today. Opting to bat, Australia scored 193 for 4 in the stipulated 20 overs. In reply, Pakistan could score 172 for 8.

Smith scored an unbeaten 61 while S.R Watson remained not out on 44. James Faulkner's five wicket haul ensured a smooth victory for Australia. Wahab Riaz and Imad Wasim of Pakistan shared two wickets each while Khalid Latif top scored with 46. This was a vital match for both Australia and Pakistan. Australian victory has now ensured that they do not need to worry about net run rate ahead of their clash with India on Sunday at Mohali. Pakistan now stands eliminated from 2nd semi-final slot of the W20 tournament.

**Australian all-rounder Shane Watson retires from international cricket**

Mohali, Mar 25  
In a surprise development, Australian all-rounder Shane Watson on Thursday declared that he will call time on his 14-year-old international cricket career at the end of his team's campaign in the ongoing ICC World Twenty20. The 34-year-old has already retired from Test cricket. Watson, who made his international debut with an ODI against South Africa at Centurion exactly on this day 14 years ago, said he took the difficult decision after a week of pondering. In a statement, he said, he feels it is the right time to retire from all international cricket. Watson scored 3,731 runs in 59 Tests and 5,757 runs in 190 ODIs besides taking 75 and 168 wickets in the two formats respectively. In 56 T20s so far, Watson



has scored 1400 runs and grabbed 46 wickets. Watson was also a regular at the Indian Premier League. In fact at this year's auction, Watson was bought for a whopping Rs 9.5 crore by the Royal Challengers Bangalore. His last ODI appearance was in September when Australia played England at the Lord's. Watson is a World Cup winning member of the 50-over team which triumphed in 2007 and 2015. He has also played in all six World T20s and was named the player of the tournament in the 2012 edition.

**Dutch soccer legend Johan Cruyff dies**



Barcelona, Mar 25  
The Dutch footballing legend Johan Cruyff has died after a battle with cancer. A short statement on his official website read: "On March 24 2016 Johan Cruyff (68) died peacefully in Barcelona, surrounded by his family after a hard fought battle with cancer." The former Ajax and Barcelona star is considered one of the greatest players of all time, having led the famed Netherlands team of the 1970s, exponents of 'Total Football', to the 1974 World Cup final. The Dutchman, who on three occasions was voted the world player of the year winning three Ballon d'Ors. He was also considered an exceptional manager, winning four Spanish titles and the European Cup in charge of Barcelona in the early 1990s, while his coaching philosophy and style of play influenced countless generations including Arsene Wenger and Pep Guardiola.

The Member of Parliament also suggested that, the following course of action to be taken:

- Wide publicity may be given for information of general public to stay away from such schemes so that they do not lose their hard earned money. The public may be made aware to question the promoters of such scheme about their registration with SEBI or RBI. SBI could take a lead in clarifying doubts when any person approaches it about a scheme and claims to be registered with SEBI or RBI.
- Look into the aspect of approaching SEBI for taking action against the firm for getting back the money and to return it to the investors.
- In the Sharadha Chit Fund Scam of West Bengal, the Hon'ble Calcutta High Court had constituted a one man Commission to enquire into the Scam by the company and other similar companies and to entertain applications by the people affected by such ponzi schemes in order to provide relief to the investors. The order of the Hon'ble High Court and actions taken by the State Government may be obtained from West Bengal so that similar steps can be taken by the Administration too for providing some relief to the innocent investors from the Island Territory.
- It may also be noted that the Company has 2.02 hectares of land recorded in its favour at Brichgunj village in Port Blair Tehsil bearing Survey No.63, 272 and 273. The Administration may also look into the aspect of taking over of these lands by the authorities by way of attachment or otherwise in realizing atleast some dues.
- Departmental action for the two promoters of the Scheme who are employed in PBMC may also be initiated as they too appear to be complicit in the operations of the firm in the Islands (beside the Criminal case already under way). In any case, these officials prima facie appear to have violated the Service Rules by engaging in such activity. In pursuant to that, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray, Member of Parliament through this press note further requested the A & N Administration to take immediate necessary action in the regard, the release from the Office of the MP said.
