## Centre will review its strategy against Left Wing Extremism: Home Minister

Raipur, Apr 25  
Union Home Minister Shri Rajnath Singh has said, the Centre will take a high-level meeting on eighth of next month to review its strategy against Left Wing Extremism. Talking to reporters in Raipur this morning, he said the strategy will be revised if needed, in the wake of repeated incidents of Maoists violence. Condemning yesterday's attack on CRPF in Sukma in which 25 Jawans lost their lives, he said it was a cold-blooded murder by Maoists. He referred to Maoists as the biggest enemies of tribals and poor, and said, Naxals don't want development of these people. Earlier, Union Home Minister



paid homage to 25 CRPF personnel who were martyred in an ambush by Naxals in Sukma district of Chhattisgarh. Shri Singh then held a meeting with the Chief Minister and other senior officials of the state. At least 25 CRPF personnel were killed and seven wounded in Chhattisgarh's Sukma district yesterday. Nearly 100-strong CRPF patrol providing security for road construction work came under fierce gunfire from Maoists, inflicting heavy casualties on the security personnel. The Naxalites mounted the assault in Kalapathar area of south Bastar region, one of the worst-hit by Left-wing extremism in the country.

## Most acts of terror across world have some Pakistan links: Finance Minister

New York, Apr 25  
Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley has said that most acts of terrorism across the world will have some links to Pakistan and blamed Islamabad for the strained Indo-Pak ties. Speaking in New York, yesterday, at the Council on Foreign Relations, a prominent think tank, the Minister said that most acts of terrorism across the world will have some footprint or the other as far as our neighbor is concerned. Shri Jaitley was referring to a number of terror attacks which are linked to Pakistan. Afghanistan often blames Pakistan-based terror groups for



carrying out attacks in the war-torn country. Shri Jaitley said India made many efforts to improve the ties with Pakistan over the last few years but every time there was a negative reaction. The Minister said, India's relationship with all its smaller neighbours has significantly improved. He said whether it is Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Myanmar or Nepal, we have an excellent relationship with them.

## CBSE scraps marks moderation policy

New Delhi, Apr 25  
The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) has scrapped the moderation policy under which grace marks are given to students in exams for difficult questions. The decision was taken at the Board's high-level meeting. The move comes after the CBSE had in December last year requested the HRD Ministry to help develop a consensus among all state boards on completely removing the policy which is considered as the reason behind inflated scores in board exam results. Under the policy, examinees are awarded up to 15 per cent extra marks in certain papers if the questions are deemed to be difficult. However, the practice of awarding grace marks will continue to ensure that a student clears an exam if he or she needs a few marks to do so. If the states also decide to adopt the policy, then the soaring cut-offs for admission to colleges are likely to go down.

The MP further said that cash compensation with interest for the ATI Mazdoors will be provided soon. The Govt has sanctioned Rs 20 crore to check soil erosion. He also said that the Home Minister During his visit, has informed that a Committee will be constituted to look into the issue of excess and submerged land. Creation of a polytechnic in Diglipur besides distributorship of LPG in Southern Group of Islands and also in N&M Andaman have been sanctioned, he said.

help A&N Islands achieve a cent percent Aadhar coverage.

Speaking on the occasion, the Deputy Director General, UIDAI, Shri MVS Remi Reddy, through a power point presentation threw light on implementation of Aadhar enabled service delivery, benefits that have been realized, efficiency, transparency and effective delivery of service through Aadhar based to the beneficiaries. He also explained about various steps of Aadhar enabled service delivery, seeding of Aadhar, importance of validation of Aadhar number to avoid duplication, linking of Aadhar number with bank accounts for DBT and the various tools available. He urged the A&N Administration to speed up the process of achieving 100 % Aadhar seeding. He also highlighted about AUA/ KUA for facilitating verification of Aadhar seeding and other authentication services, user agency credentials, delivery of DBT of government welfare programmes through APB (Aadhar Payment Bridge), AEPS (Aadhar Enabled Payment Services) at the door steps of the beneficiaries. He exhorted the Dept. of CS&CA to implement on pilot basis the AePDS and Aadhar based attendance system to see the efficiency, implementation of APB for disbursement of pension, scholarships and MGNREGA wages. He also explained about Child Enrolment Client Lite for enrolments of new born babies to children of age below 5 years at the birth place itself.

In his introductory speech, the Secretary, Dept. of CS&CA, Shri Sandip J.Jacques said Aadhar is a strategic policy tool for social and financial inclusion, public sector delivery reforms, for managing fiscal budget, while it increases convenience and promotes hassle free people centric governance. The Aadhar identity platform is one of the key pillars of the 'Digital India', he added. He informed that in A&N Islands presently 99% of Aadhar enrollment has been accomplished and 97% Aadhar generation has been done so far. To further speed up Aadhar seeding and generation of Aadhar, multiple registrars have been constituted. He said the Dept. of CS&CA has been designated as State Registrar and efforts are on to ensure 100% coverage to enable Aadhar based service delivery.

The inaugural session concluded with the vote of thanks proposed by the Special Secretary (IT), A&N Administration Shri Utpal Sharma.

This was followed by a technical session wherein resource persons from Regional Office, Hyderabad threw light on the potential of Aadhar in enabling real time efficient and transparent delivery of services using online, anytime, anywhere authentication. Shri Bhaskar Rao highlighted about Aadhar seeding, importance of verification of seeding while Shri Y.Srinivas Rao explained about Aadhar authentication services, Aadhar Authentication types, Applications using Aadhar, Biometric Authentication etc. Shri Gridhar threw light on the status, search, enrollment clients (UCL, CBL) and the way forward.

The participants also raised queries related to Aadhar implementation, seeding of bank accounts which were answered by the experts.

Through a video presentation, the experts also shared experiences of Aadhar based service delivery in PDS, MGNREGA, pension in Andhra Pradesh and other success stories based on Aadhar authentication seeding.
