Prime Minister launches Smart City Mission into implementation mode Says the Mission is a people's movement for urban transformation and is succeeding

Pune, June 25
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today launched the flagship Smart City Mission into implementation mode with launch of 14 projects of Pune's Smart City Plan, exactly a year after he set off the mission by releasing the Mission Guidelines. Speaking on the occasion to a packed audience in the 5,000 capacity Shiv Chhatrpati Sports Complex in Pune, Prime Minister said that Smart City Mission is now succeeding as a people's movement as envisaged. He expressed satisfaction over citizen participation in preparation of smart city plans of various cities with over 25 lakh people giving serious suggestions on MyGov.in. Shri Modi clarified that the central government did not select the smart cities but it was the citizens who enabled their selection in the 'City Challenge Competition'. He asserted that if people were empowered and involved for participatory development, country will progress fast. Shri Narendra Modi said that an era of competition



has been ushered in for improving conditions in urban areas and urged the citizens to rise to the challenge for bettering the conditions in respective cities and towns. Stating that he has recently reviewed the progress of Smart City Mission over the last one year, Prime Minister expresses satisfaction over enthusiastic and large scale participation of people in formulation of comprehensive smart city plans, the way the City Challenge Competition was held for selection of cities, formulation of projects there under and their launch today. He complimented the team led by Minister of Urban Development Shri M.Venkaiah Naidu. During his 35 minute address, Prime Minister elaborated on the concept of smart cities and the advantages that follow from it. Shri Modi stressed that it should not be seen as a fancy concept since the mission is meant for ensuring availability of all basic services to the people though necessary infrastructure including houses for urban poor in a comprehensive manner. He referred to extensive use of digital technology in the smart city plans for improving the quality of governance and public services. Asserting that urbanization mitigates poverty and empowers the poor, Shri Modi said that it should be seen as an opportunity instead of a problem. Prime Minister stressed that if people were empowered and involved in participatory development, the country would develop fast. Noting that an era of competition among cities and towns has come to prevail, he urged the citizens to rise to the challenge for improvement of respective urban areas. Indian economy able to face eventuality of Britain's exit from EU: Govt

New Delhi, Jun 25
Commerce Minister Smti Nirmala Sitharaman has said India is in a position to face the eventuality of Britain's exit from the European Union. Talking to reporters in New Delhi on Friday, she said the first impact would be



visible on currency volatility as there is a possibility of devaluation

of the pound and euro. She said the impact of volatility of the currency might have an immediate impact on country's exporters. The Minister said the government will however have to keep watching currency based volatility, both in the short and the medium term and also look at the impact on overall trade. Commerce Secretary Ms Rita Teotia said India will have to rework the proposed free trade agreement with the single-currency bloc in view of Brexit.

8 CRPF personnel martyred

CBSE to conduct NEET-II on July 24
New Delhi, Jun 25
The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) has said it will conduct the National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test-II (NEET-II) for admission to medical and dental colleges on 24th of July, as scheduled. In a statement in New

Delhi on Friday, the CBSE said, as per the Supreme Court orders on NEET and the Ordinance promulgated by the government, the exam will be conducted on the scheduled date. The process of online application for the NEET which was opened on 25th of last month, ended today. The Board has advised the candidates to check the NEET website for latest updates and information so that they can immediately take necessary action as per the instructions uploaded on the website.

First flight of BrahMos air to ground missile from Sukhoi-30 aircraft successful

New Delhi, Jun 25
BrahMos Aerospace today successfully demonstrated the integration of the world's most formidable supersonic cruise missile system BRAHMOS on the frontline strike fighter aircraft of the Indian Air Force Sukhoi-30. With today's successful flight, the Brahmos air version programme now inches closer towards actual test firing when a 2.5-ton BRAHMOS air-to-ground missile will be fired from the Sukhoi-30 in the coming months. This technological feat will go down in the history as first in the World



combination of supersonic cruise missile with a long range fighter aircraft. The powerful missile will enable the IAF to penetrate deep inside the enemy territory to deliver a deadly blow to their vital installations from stand-off ranges. The Sukhoi-BRAHMOS combination will carry out air combat operations within and beyond visibility range and will provide the IAF with the capability of attacking targets protected by powerful air defence assets.

Kazakhstan, Jun 25 "Sprint Queen" Dutee Chand clocked 11.30 seconds in Women's 100 metres to seal her place in the upcoming Summer Olympics to be held in Rio de Janeiro. With her latest timing, the 20-year-old athlete from Jajpur district in Odisha has finally succeeded in clearing the current Olympic qualification mark of 11.32 by a couple of hundredths of a second. Dutee had missed the same by a whisker with a timing of 11.33



seconds at the Federation Cup National Athletics meet held in New Delhi in the last week of April.

2nd ODI: Hales, Roy power England to beat Sri Lanka by 10 wkts

Edgbaston, Jun 25 Blistering hundreds by Jason Roy and Alex Hales hauled England to a crushing 10-wicket win over Sri Lanka in the second One-day International at Edgbaston. England, set a modest 255 for victory, finished on 256 without loss as they won with more than 15 overs to spare to go 1-run up in the five-match series following Tuesday's tied opener at Trent Bridge. Roy, named man-of-the-match after also completing two run-outs, was 112 unbeaten at the finish and Hales 133 not out, both batsmen recording their



highest scores at this level. Their unbroken stand surpassed England's record ODI partnership of 250 set by Andrew Strauss and Jonathan Trott for the second wicket against Bangladesh at Edgbaston in 2010. England's total was also the highest scored by any side winning an ODI by 10 wickets, topping the 236 scored by New Zealand against Zimbabwe at Harare last year.
