## No efforts left in terms of search for missing aircraft AN-32: CINCAN

Port Blair, July 25  
All the strength in terms of assets has been introduced and no effort has been left in terms of the search, which is still continuing for the missing Indian Air Force AN-32 aircraft, said the Commander-in Chief, A&N Command, Vice Admiral Bimal Verma while briefing the media persons about the search & rescue operations being carried out in a massive scale for the missing IAF plane since last Friday.



Addressing the scribes at a press conference at Command Headquarters, the CINCAN stated that extensive coordinated Search And Rescue (SAR) operations by Indian Navy, IAF and ICG Ships and aircrafts for the missing IAF AN-32 aircraft (AF 330) which commenced on 22nd July, 2016 is still continuing. Currently, a total of 13 IN Ships (11 off Chennai with 5 integral helicopters and 2 in the west of A&N Islands) and 4 ICG Ships (2 Off Chennai and 2 west of A&N Islands) are engaged in the surface SAR operations. The surface search is concentrated in a 120x120 nm area covering the last known position of the missing IAF AN-32 aircraft. Vice Admiral Bimal Verma further informed that the surface search by ships is being augmented by IN, IAF and ICG Shore based aircraft (09 IN, 04 ICG and 04 IAF). These aircrafts are

Another wrestler Sandeep Tulsu Yadav fails dope test ahead of Rio Olympics

Sonepat, Jul 25  
A day after India's Rio Olympics-bound wrestler Narsingh Yadav tested positive for a banned steroid, another Indian Greco-Roman wrestler, Sandeep Tulsu Yadav, has failed a dope test conducted by the National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA). After tested positive, he is likely to miss the bus for the Rio 2016 Game. Sandeep Tulsu is Narsingh Yadav's sparing partner. As per reports, Sandeep tested positive for the same substance as the Rio Olympics-bound wrestler. Sandeep had won a bronze at the 2013 World Championship in the 66 kg category. Earlier, NADA conducted a



random dope test on Narsingh Yadav at the SAI's regional centre in Sonepat. The report of his two sample tests came out positive. Wrestling Federation of India president Brij Bhushan Saran has said they believe Narsingh Yadav is innocent. Narsingh has complained that something was mixed in his food when it was being cooked. He said, the Federation want Narsingh to get justice. He went on to say that they have sought a chance from the international body, FILA.

Antigua test: India beat West Indies by innings and 92 runs

Antigua, Jul 25  
India beat West Indies by an innings and 92 runs in the first cricket Test in Antigua last night to take a 1-0 lead in the four-match series. After putting West Indies to follow-on, India managed to bowl out the hosts for 231 in the second innings. The bowlers were led by R Ashwin, who took 7 for 83, while Amit Mishra, Umesh Yadav and Ishant Sharma picked up a wicket each. For West Indies, Marlon Samuels (50) and Carlos Brathwaite, 51 not out scored half-centuries and Devender Bishoo (45) delayed



the India win. The second Test is scheduled to begin from July 30.

All seven Russian tennis players cleared to compete at Rio Olympics

London, Jul 25  
All seven Russian tennis players have been cleared to compete at the Rio Olympics. International Tennis Federation (ITF) said yesterday that the seven Russian tennis players who have been nominated to compete in Rio have been subject to a rigorous anti-doping testing programme outside Russia. International Olympic Committee, IOC, yesterday decided not to impose a blanket



ban on Russia competing at the Rio Games, leaving decisions on the participation of athletes to individual sports federations.

Speaking about growth in Tourism sector, he said, according to the barometer of World Tourism Organization, tourism growth in Asian countries is tremendous and as per the latest information, Sri Lanka has witnessed 20% growth while India has witnessed 12% growth and the A&N Islands are directly or indirectly contributing towards the growth.

Pertaining to A&N Islands, Prof. Kulshreshtha remarked that the Islands have immense scope and varieties of tourism activities can be initiated while Human Resource Development needs to be strengthened. He also urged all association members of ITHC to be ambassadors of these Islands and help promote Andaman & Nicobar Islands tourism in all their activities.

In his key note address, Prof. Dr. SP Bansal, said the 11th convention of ITHC is being held in Port Blair which was earlier scheduled to be held at Bangladesh. He briefed about the activities of ITHC and their efforts in coordinating with SAARC countries for promoting tourism activities and stated that every year ITHC organises such convention in different parts of the globe.

Prof. Bansal reiterated that with this convention being held here today, ITHC has given a new tagline for Andaman tourism viz. 'Andaman: A Heaven for Tourism'.
