## Gold-related schemes to be

### launched on the eve of Diwali: PM

New Delhi, Oct 25  
On the eve of Diwali, the Government will launch important gold-related schemes, including the Gold Monetisation, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi announced today, expressing confidence that it will give a new direction to the economic development.

Besides the Gold Monetisation Scheme, the government will also launch 'Sovereign Gold Bonds' and gold coins with Ashok Chakra, he said in his monthly radio programme 'Mann Ki Baat'.

"In the last Budget, we had announced an important scheme. In our country, gold has become a part of our social life. Gold is treated as a means of economic security, a help during the time of crisis. It is traditionally believed so.

"I don't think anybody can reduce the love of people for gold. But to keep gold in the form of dead money does not augur well in this age. Gold can become strength, an economic strength. Gold can become the country's economic property and every Indian should

contribute to this," he said. He said he was happy to announce that as per the promise made in the Budget, the Government is going to launch "some important schemes" during this Diwali festival, prior to 'Dhanteras' when gold is purchased by people. Diwali is on November 11.

"We have brought Gold Monetisation Scheme. Under this, you can deposit your gold in a bank and bank will pay interest to you for that like on your cash," Shri Modi said.

## Streamlining tourism facilities

### CS holds meeting to mitigate problems of tourists visiting Neil Island

Port Blair, Oct 25  
In order to streamline and cope up with increased tourists flow to Neil Island, Chief Secretary, A & N Administration convened a meeting yesterday which was attended DGP, Secretary (Shipping), Secretary (Tourism), other Senior Officials of Administration and other stakeholders namely Shri Vinod, President, AATO, Tour Operators, Private Boat Operators (Makruzz and Green Ocean), ACCI members.

Recalling the incident that happened on 23.10.2015 at Neil Island, in which certain unruly elements illegally obstructed the departure of DSS vessels from Neil Island Jetty, Chief Secretary informed that stern legal action will be initiated against those who took law into their hands and warned that, in future, such activities will not be tolerated. He also directed concerned Deptts

(Police, Revenue, and Tourism) to depute responsible Officers at Neil Island to handle such situations in future.

The Chief Secretary has appealed to all stakeholders to chip in and cooperate with the Administration to solve this problem of return tickets for tourists visiting Neil Island, so that Tourism Sector, which is main engine of economic growth of these Islands, is not adversely affected.

The Chief Secretary has desired that following measures be taken immediately to mitigate the problems of tourists:

\* DSS to start issuing return tickets for tourists visiting Neil Island from DSS Counter at Port Blair from 28.10.2015

\* From 28.10.2015 onwards, tourists with confirmed exit ticket from Neil Island will only be allowed to get down at Neil Island Jetty.

\* DSS, as a temporary measure, will operate a vessel (75/100 pax. capacity) in Port Blair - Neil Island sector. This boat will depart Port Blair at 1 pm and

depart Neil Island at 3.30pm.

\* Private Boat Green Ocean will operate an additional trip to Havelock from 26.10.2015

\* Overflow of local islanders in Port Blair - Havelock sector will be catered to by the private sector boats namely Makruzz & Green Ocean during this period, a communication from the Director (Tourism) said here today.

**India-Pakistan series impossible in current circumstances: Anurag Thakur**

New Delhi, Oct 25

Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) Secretary Anurag Thakur today said the atmosphere between India and Pakistan is not conducive for cricket right now and stressed on the importance of creating a good environment before resumption of the proposed bilateral series. "The atmosphere right now is not conducive for cricket to be played between the two countries. Pakistan government should talk to Indian government first. That will be a great help for building the conducive atmosphere," said Thakur on the sidelines of a cricket match between Parliamentarians and Celebrities. "And then you don't require so much effort for talks to happen between two cricketing boards," he added. READ: Pakistan threaten to pull out of ICC World T20 2016 in India. PCB chairman Shaharyar Khan was in India last week to discuss the proposed India-Pak bilateral cricket series in December but Shiv Sena workers stormed the BCCI headquarters in Mumbai last

**Amla breaks Virat Kohli's record, becomes fastest to reach 6000 ODI runs**

New Delhi, Oct 25 He may have failed yet again with the bat in the ODI series against India, but Hashim Amla did managed to achieve a personal milestone during his brief stay at the crease in the 5th ODI.

The South African opener became the fastest batsman to go past 6000 runs in ODIs. In doing so, the right hander broke the record set by Virat Kohli. Kohli reached the 6000-run mark in 136 innings, while Amla got to it in just 123 outings. Needing 15 runs to achieve the landmark before the start of match, the 32-year-old pulled a short delivery from Mohit Sharma for a boundary through midwicket. Amla got off to a brisk start at the Wankhede Stadium on Sunday, only to be dismissed by Sharma for 23 off 13 balls.

**Lahiri falls to seventh, Jeev drops to 24th in Hong Kong**

Hong Kong, Oct 25 The Indian charge never happened on the final day as Anirban Lahiri and Jeev Milkha Singh, who had a chance to challenge for top honours failed to do so on the final day of the UBS Hong Kong Open here on Sunday. Lahiri, lying sole third on Saturday, admitted 'running out of gas' and ended with a rare over-par round of 71 and totalled 10-under 270 to finish tied-seventh. Jeev, who needed a top-2 finish to secure his card for 2016, had a worse struggle with two-over 74 and finished at six-under 274 in tied 24th place after being tied-fourth overnight.

**Ireland qualify for 2016 Olympics hockey after a century**

Dublin, Oct 25 The Irish men's hockey team has qualified for the Olympic Games after a gap of more than 100 years, the International Hockey Federation (FIH) confirmed on Sunday. It marks the first time in over 100 years since an Irish hockey team participated in an Olympic Games, with their men picking up the silver medal in the inaugural Olympic hockey event which took place in London in 1908. Ireland qualified after Australia defeated New Zealand 3-2 in the Oceania Cup final, which took place earlier in the day. After Australia were declared Oceania continental champions, a further qualification spot opened for the team ranked highest among the non-qualifiers in the Hockey World League (HWL) Semi-Finals, which Ireland secured. Ireland finished fifth at the HWL Semi-Final in Antwerp, Belgium, earlier this summer and became the eleventh team to qualify for Rio 2016 Summer Games. They join Oceania champions Australia, India who qualified as Asian Games champions, Argentina as Pan Am Games champions, the Netherlands as European champions and Germany, Belgium, Great Britain, Canada and Spain through the HWL Semi-Finals. Former Olympic champions Pakistan have not qualified.
