PM to inaugurate global conference on Consumer Protection today

New Delhi, Oct 25
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi will inaugurate a global conference on consumer protection in New Delhi tomorrow (Oct 26). This is the first time that an international conference on consumer protection is being organised by India for countries of the region which account for a majority of the global consumers and share common challenges and experiences. The conference will deliberate upon steps taken by Asian countries to implement the UN guidelines on consumer protection as well as



challenges faced by consumers of financial services and e-commerce. The two day Conference will have six working

Stakeholder Participation in Consumer Protection, Protection of Online Consumers, Stakeholders participation, Protection of vulnerable Groups of Consumers and Consumer empowerment through education. Experts from different Countries and India will be presenting their papers and views. Twenty two countries from East, South and South-East Asia are participating in the international conference. These include China, South Korea, Singapore, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka.

GPF interest at the rate of 7.8%

New Delhi, Oct 25
The Government of India has announced that during the Financial Year 2017-18, accumulations at the credit of subscribers to the General Provident Fund (GPF) and other similar funds shall carry interest at the rate of 7.8% with effect from 1st October, 2017 to 31st December, 2017. This rate will be in force w.e.f 1st October, 2017.

Gujarat Assembly election to be held on December 9 and 14

New Delhi, Oct 25
Gujarat will go to polls in two phases on December 9th and 14th for 182 assembly seats. Announcing this, the Chief Election Commissioner, Shri A K Joti said 89 seats will go to polls in the first phase and the rest 93 in the second phase. He said 4.33 crore

electorates will exercise their right at 50128 polling stations. Notification for the first phase will be issued on 14th of November while 20th November will be the date of notification for the second phase. Counting will be held on 18th December along with Himachal Pradesh, which

goes to poll on 9th of next month. Shri Joti said EVMS with VVPAT will be used at all polling stations. He said 182 polling stations will be managed by women only. Model code of conduct has come into force with immediate effect. The term of the Gujarat Assembly ends on 22nd January next year.

1 crore jobs to be created under Bharatmala project: Minister

New Delhi, Oct 25
Surface Transport and Shipping Minister Shri Nitin Gadkari today said under Bharatmala project one crore jobs will be created as this is the biggest infrastructure project of the country. Addressing a press conference in New Delhi, Shri Gadkari said tribal and border areas and economically backward districts have been especially considered and it will give major fillip to



infrastructure in the country. He said 44 economic corridors are being created with thrust on job creation. The Minister

said 35 logistic parks are being developed with two multimedia hubs being set up in Nagpur and Varanasi. Shri Gadkari said, 550

districts will be covered under Bharatmala project as against earlier 300 districts. He also highlighted 185 choke points identified to decongest corridors. The Minister said multimodal freight movement via seven waterway terminals on river Brahmaputra are being planned. He also said 28 ring roads are being planned and express highways being constructed.

Telecom Dept simplifies Aadhaar linking process; No need to visit service provider's stores

New Delhi, Oct 25
Department of Telecommunications today issued new rules to simplify the process for linking of Aadhaar card with mobile number. As per the new rules, there will be three new methods to link the registered mobile number with Aadhaar. They are OTP (One Time Password), App based and the IVRS facility. These new methods will help

subscribers to get their mobile number linked to Aadhaar without visiting the stores of the telecom companies. For the ease of senior citizens and the people with disability and chronic illness, DoT has also recommended for the re-verification at their doorstep.

Releasing the new rules, Communication Minister Shri Manoj Sinha said, the Aadhaar number system was designed to allow all residents of the country access to government services and important information that they may need from time to time. Department of Telecommunications had given instructions to the telecom service providers to provide iris or fingerprint based authentication of Aadhaar.

The Port Blair Municipal Council will launch a special drive from 1st November 2017, to impose fine on those persons who litter on public places or fail to keep their premises neat & clean.

In a press release received here, the Secretary, PBMC has clarified that the Solid Waste (Handling & Management) Bye-Laws, 2017 provide that no person shall dump, deposit, discharge, spill or release waste, and no person shall place or cause to be placed rubbish or offensive matter on a public street. No person shall, while driving a



vehicle, or while being conveyed in a vehicle, throw or deposit waste on any public road or on any private premises within the municipal area and no driver of a vehicle shall allow or permit any passenger in such vehicle to throw or deposit such waste in a like manner. There are many other provisions with regard to maintaining cleanliness and hygiene in the city.

As per the Bye-Laws, in case of any contravention of these Byelaws, fine ranging from Rs. 500/- to

Unthinkable scoreline! India thrash USA 22-0 in Sultan of Johor Cup



Johor Bahru, Oct 25
Playing their first tournament as junior world champions, Indian hockey colts thrashed United States 22-0 to register their third consecutive win at the seventh Sultan of Johor Cup in Johor Bahru. The India-USA fixture in hockey is one of the most lopsided matchups, even in senior tournaments. Today's result was reminiscent of senior

team's 24-1 thrashing in the 1932 Los Angeles Olympics. In 1956 Games, India humbled USA 16-0. Pratap Lakra opened the scoring as early as the second minute, then Harmanjit Singh scored five goals. Abhishek and Dilpreet Singh scored three goals each. 10 Indian players found their names on the scoresheet against a hapless USA side. India beat Japan 3-2 in the

tournament opener Sunday, then beat hosts Malaysia 2-1 in the second match on Monday. India will play Australia tomorrow. Then, India play their last pool game on Saturday against Great Britain in the six-team tournament. The Indian team finished runners-up the last time they took part in the tournament in 2015.

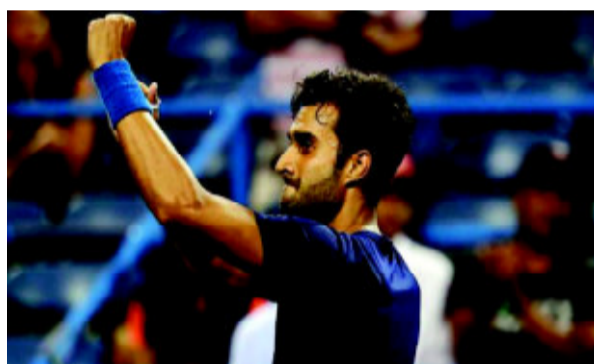

New Delhi, Oct 25
Yuki Bhambri asserted his superiority over Ti Chen yet again as the top Indian eased into the singles quarter-finals of the Vietnam Open while his compatriot Prajnesh Gunneswaran advanced to the second round in the Ho Chi Minh City Challenger event. Yuki, now ranked 142, outclassed his opponent from Chinese Taipei 6-3 6-1 in the second round of the \$50,000 hard court event while Prajnesh dispatched Australia's Marc Polmans 6-4 6-2 in his opener. Carrying forward his unbeaten record against Chen, Yuki recorded his fourth straight win over the Taipei player in as many meetings on the Pro Circuit. He first beat him in Shanghai in 2014. Every year since then, Yuki has beaten the 34-year-old at least once in a season. He next faces the Australian eighth seed John Millman, who dispatched Frenchman Antoine Escoffier 6-1 6-4. Prajnesh will lock horns with top American Taylor Fritz,



who knocked out India's Vijay Sundar Prashanth. Among other Indians who made early exit from the singles event were Sumit Nagal and Saketh Myneni. In the doubles, Myneni and Prashanth upset fourth seeded Peter Polansky and Akira Santillan 6-7(4) 6-2 10-8 to progress to the quarterfinals.

US Open champion Prannoy, who had reached the quarterfinals at Odense, sent packing Denmark Open finalist Korea's 37-year-old veteran Lee Hyun Il 21-15 21-17, while Praneeth made amends for his opening round exit last week with a 21-13 21-23 21-19 win over Thailand's Khosit Phetpradab. Praneeth, however, will look to take some tips from Prannoy for his next match as he is likely to take on three-time Olympic silver medallist and current

World No. 7 Lee Chong Wei of Malaysia. Prannoy, who has beaten the Malaysian twice this season, will face Denmark's Hans-Kristian Solberg Vittinghus next. Mixed doubles pair of Pranaav Jerry Chopra and N Sikki Reddy suffered a 15-21 12-21 loss to fourth seeded Indonesians Tontowi Ahmad and Liliyana Natsir. Up against an experienced opponent, whom he had lost to twice in very close games, Prannoy gave ample display of his new found prowess as he tore through the opening game, without giving any chance to Lee. In the second game, Prannoy lead 8-5 and even though Lee held a slender 11-10 lead at

the break, the Indian jumped ahead to 13-11. Lee clawed back with two points before Prannoy moved ahead to comfortably seal the issue. Praneeth, on the other hand, had to go through the grind as his unheralded opponent sprang a surprise to take the second game after the Indian had pocketed the first game having broken off at 7-7. In the second game, Praneeth blew a 15-6 lead as 35th ranked Khosil managed to force the match into the decider. Praneeth held a 11-8 lead in the third game, only to see it vaporise as Khosil turned the tables, reaching 19-16. But the Indian regained her poise and reeled off five points to seal the deciding game.

Laws shall be imposed for each occasion of offence. In case repetition of the offence, the fine amount will be doubled.
All Sanitary Inspectors/Sr. Sanitary Inspectors and the Sanitary Officer, all Junior Engineers/Assistant Engineers/Executive Engineers and the Superintending Engineer, all Building Inspectors and the Building Officer of PBMC have been authorized to impose & collect fines from any persons found violating the by-laws. In past few months, a considerable number of persons have been fined for littering at public places. The PBMC Secretary has expressed hope that in view of the excellent civic sense and co-operation of general public in maintaining the city clean and green, there will be rare need to impose fines even during the special drive, the release added.
