Port Blair, May 25 In the wake of cyclonic weather conditions prevailing over the Islands for the past few days, the District Administration is on alert to avert any untoward incident. Further, to mitigate the same, State Disaster Management Control Room is monitoring the situation round the clock. District Administration is on the forefront in redressing the grievances at the earliest. Revenue field staff is taking stock of the situation in their



respective areas. Fallen trees are being cleared with the help of staff of PBMC, APWD, Electricity and other line Departments. Electric poles are being reinstalled and it is ensured that there is no power break in any areas. Vehicles are kept standby for meeting any eventuality or addressing any grievance. Disaster management kits have been handed over to all Panchayats in advance to provide quick relief and rescue operation in case of disaster. People have also been moved from low lying areas. **PBMC's pre monsoon efforts prevent flooding in city areas**

Port Blair, May 25 Due to sustained efforts of Port Blair Municipal Council (PBMC) since the last two months, it has been observed that this year, Port Blair city has seen minimal flooding despite very heavy rainfall due to onset of monsoon and cyclone 'Yaas'. Elaborating on the arrangement made before the monsoon to tackle flooding, the Secretary (PBMC) said, "Urban flooding is a major problem which



occurs every year. This year, we had started clearing out the drains almost 2 months before the arrival of monsoon and as a result, we were prepared this time". This year, areas like Mohanpura, STS Workshop Area, LIC building etc. which used to be inundated within minutes of rainfall were seen to be without any water logging even in the midst of heavy cyclonic rainfall. # 3,661 persons in the age group of 18-44 years vaccinated in Isles

## Total of 1, 21, 991 doses of vaccines administered

Port Blair, May 25  
The vaccination drive is continuing and so far a total of 3,661 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years were vaccinated in A&N Islands so far. As per the data received, altogether, 396 persons in the age group of 18 to 44 years were vaccinated in South Andaman while 284 persons were vaccinated in North & Middle Andaman. Similarly, in Nicobar District, 60 people were vaccinated in this age group.

Meanwhile, a total of 416 doses of COVISHIELD vaccines were administered to above 18 years by the health teams in South Andaman today. In North & Middle Andaman it was 294 and Nicobar District it was 70. With this, a total of 1, 21, 991 doses of



vaccines have been administered so far in A&N Islands. Meanwhile, the online registration for the vaccination is done through CoWIN portal and Aarogya Setu App. Online registration is mandatory and no on-site registration will be done and people has been advised to reach the centres as per the time schedule provided to the beneficiaries through the App. In South Andaman, the vaccination is being done at JNRM Vaccination Centre between 9.30 am and 12.30 pm. The general public have been requested to follow COVID Appropriate Behavior while going for vaccination. The vaccination for the beneficiaries of 45+ who are yet to receive their 1st Dose is also continuing and for them the facility of on-site registration is available. The left over beneficiaries (45+) have been requested to get themselves vaccinated, a press release from DHS said.

area to take stock of availability as well as price behaviour of vegetables and fruits. The aim behind this enforcement was to protect the consumer of their rights in the wake of imposition of lockdown in South Andaman District to contain the spread of COVID-19 pandemic. The inspection revealed that the rates of vegetables are under control barring few commodities which has been sorted out upon intervention by the Department.

Meanwhile, to keep a check on artificial price rise in vegetables, the vegetable vendors have been directed to display the price of vegetables in the display board in a conspicuous manner at their premises and share the prevailing rate of vegetables on weekly basis with the Department for timely intervention, as and when required. The shopkeepers have also been asked to refrain themselves from indulging in any unfair trade practices such as hoarding, black marketing, exorbitant pricing etc. They have also been urged to maintain strict COVID appropriate behaviours like adequate social distancing, washing their hands regularly, wearing face mask, ensuring proper hygiene etc.

areas and are given accommodation in APWD quarters and Anganwadi centers. Food and ration is being prepared and given to the rescued people. Tarpaulins are distributed to people in affected areas as a relief measure. Medical team is assisting and attending all those who require medical attention.

Behaviour to protect themselves as well as other members of the family.

The Secretary also mentioned that today 1 flight with 68 passengers arrived and during the RAT Test conducted on these passengers, none were found positive. Similarly, during the RAT test conducted on 19 passengers bound for inter Island, tested at Ferrargunj also no cases of COVID-19 have been reported. Altogether, 416 beneficiaries were vaccinated today, out of which 396 were in the age group 18-44 years while the remaining were above 45+.

The Director, Health Services, Dr. Omkar Singh stated that Administration has about 1025 oxygen concentrators. He said, consignment of about 270 oxygen concentrators arrived on May 23 while another 230 will be reaching Port Blair shortly. He further mentioned that in addition to existing 1025 concentrators, about 1000 more oxygen concentrators will be procured. As of now, sufficient stock of oxygen cylinders and concentrators are available, he said adding that concentrators are also provided to individual based on the recommendation of Doctors. He also clarified that no case of Black Fungus (mucormycosis) has been reported from Isles. About vaccination drive, he said, on daily basis vaccination are administered to 18+ age group and another 10,000 doses of vaccine will reach Port Blair in a couple days. He said the registration for vaccine is only done through CoWIN portal and no on-site registration is done

The Director, ANIMS, Dr. AK Mandal said that as per data available, 76 persons are admitted in GB Pant Hospital. 11 new COVID patients were admitted today while 14 patients were discharged. He said 65 patients are on Oxygen support and 6 are on ventilators.

The Director, IP&T, Shri Alok Kumar and the Deputy Director, G.B. Pant Hospital, Shri Amitabha De also attended the press conference.

## Containment operations in Containment Area of Chouldari (Part) declared over Surveillance to continue for ILI/SARI

Port Blair, May 25  
The area in and around Chouldari (Part) was declared as a Containment Zone in order to prevent the spread of COVID-19 on May 1. As per the Updated Containment Plan for Large Outbreaks of Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 issued by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, the containment operation shall be over 14 days from the discharge of last confirmed case (following negative tests as per discharge policy) from the designated health facility i.e. when the follow up of hospital contacts will be complete.

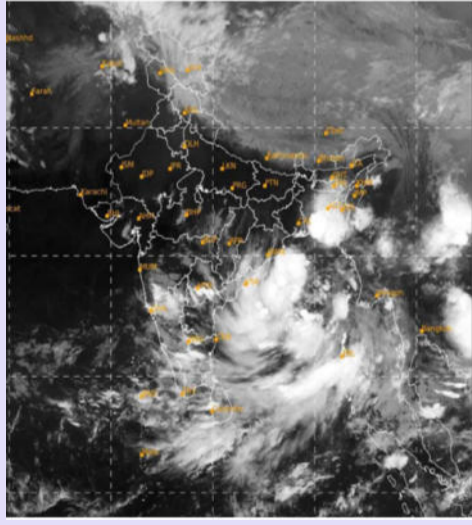
Containment Area restrictions are fulfilled in the case of Chouldari (Part). Further, the medical screening of all the residents of the area has already been done and samples of symptomatic persons were collected which were reported negative. In view of the above, the containment operations in the Containment Area of Chouldari (Part) have been declared over. However, the surveillance will continue for ILI/SARI.

## Thunderstorm, gusty winds with heavy rain likely to occur over A&N Islands

Heavy rain (7-11cm) is likely to occur at one or two places over A&N Islands on May 26 and 27 2021. Thunderstorm with wind speed reaching 50-60 km gusting to 70 kmph is also likely to occur over Andaman & Nicobar Islands. On May 28 & 29, heavy rain (7-11cm) is likely to occur at one or two places over A&N Islands. Thunderstorm with lightning and gusty wind (speed reaching 40-50 kmph) is likely to occur at one or two places over A&N Islands.



Fisherman Warning: Due to strong to vigorous South-West Monsoon over Andaman sea and South Bay of Bengal, wind speed is likely to exceed 45 kmph. Fishermen have been advised not to venture

into the sea till further information. Local cautionary signal III has been kept hoisted at Port Blair Port.

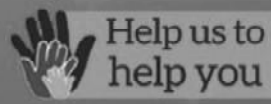

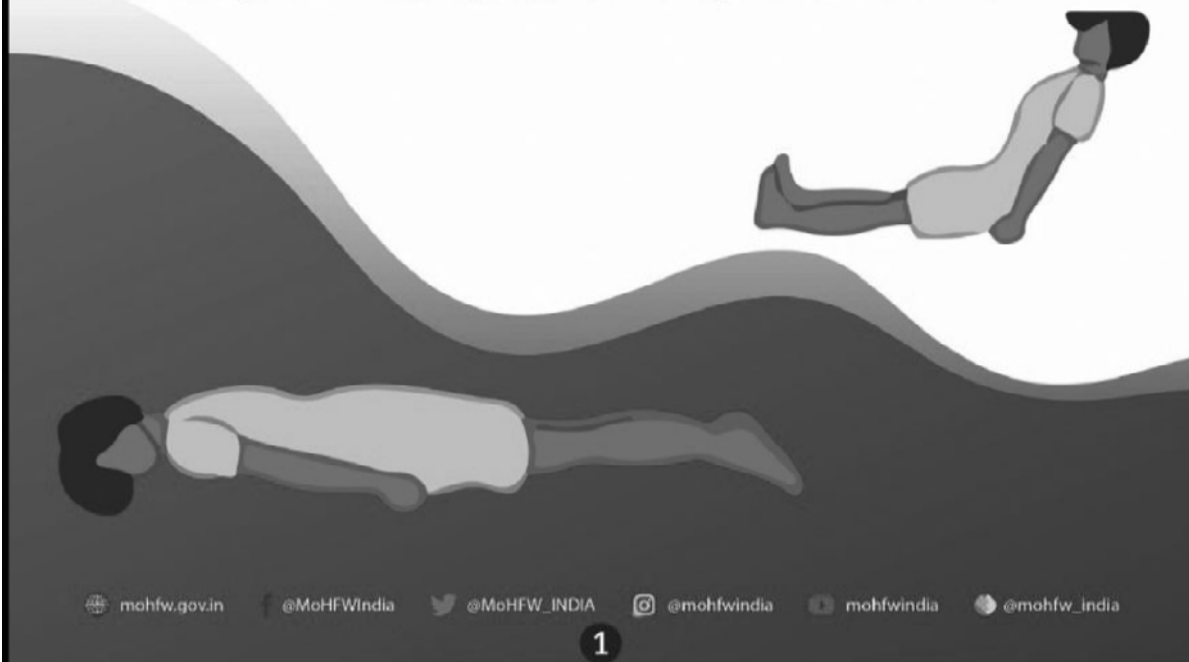

# COVID-19 Proning for Self care

- PRONING is the process of turning a patient with precise, safe motions, from their back onto their abdomen (stomach), so the individual is lying face down.
- Proning is a medically accepted position to improve breathing comfort and oxygenation.
- It is extremely beneficial in COVID-19 patients with compromised breathing comfort, especially during home isolation.

## For Self-Proning:

- You will need 4-5 Pillows.
- Regular alterations in lying position
- Best is to not spend more than 30 minutes in each position

1. 30 minutes – 2 hours: laying on your belly



4. 30 minutes – 2 hours: lying on your left side



2. 30 minutes – 2 hours: laying on your right side



Then back to Position 1. Lying on your belly!



3. 30 minutes – 2 hours: sitting up

## Caution:

- Avoid proning for an hour after meals
- Maintain proning for only as much times as easily tolerable
- One may prone for up to 16 hours a day, in multiple cycles, as felt comfortable
- Pillows may be adjusted slightly to alter pressure areas and for comfort
- Keep a track of any pressure sores or injuries, especially, around bony prominences

## IMPORTANCE OF PRONE LYING

- Prone positioning improves ventilation, keeps alveolar units open and breathing easy.
- Proning is required only when the patient feels difficulty in breathing and the SpO2 decreases below 94 (less than 94).
- Regular monitoring of SpO2, along with other signs like temperature, blood pressure and blood sugar, is important during home isolation.
- Missing out on hypoxia (compromised Oxygen circulation) may lead to worsening of complications.
- Timely proning and maintaining good ventilation could save many lives.

## POSITIONING OF PILLOW

- One pillow below the neck
- One or two pillows below the chest through upper thighs
- Two pillows below the shins

## Avoid Proning in conditions like:

- Pregnancy
- Deep venous thrombosis (Treated in less than 48 hours)
- Major cardiac conditions
- Unstable spine, femur, or pelvic fractures

## Non-self pronating patients (in emergency):

Five-step method to place a patient in the prone position using a regular bed, flat sheet, and family members

- Using a flat sheet, pull the patient to one side of the bed.
- Place the flat sheet around the arm that will pull through (the side you are turning toward).
- A second flat sheet is placed on the bed and tucked under the patient. This sheet will pull through as you are turning the patient.
- Using the sheet, turn the patient over and position the patient prone. The arm and sheet will pull across the bed.
- Pull and center the patient. Discard the sheet that was used to place the patient in the supine position. Straighten lines and tubes.

This may need modification with emerging evidence

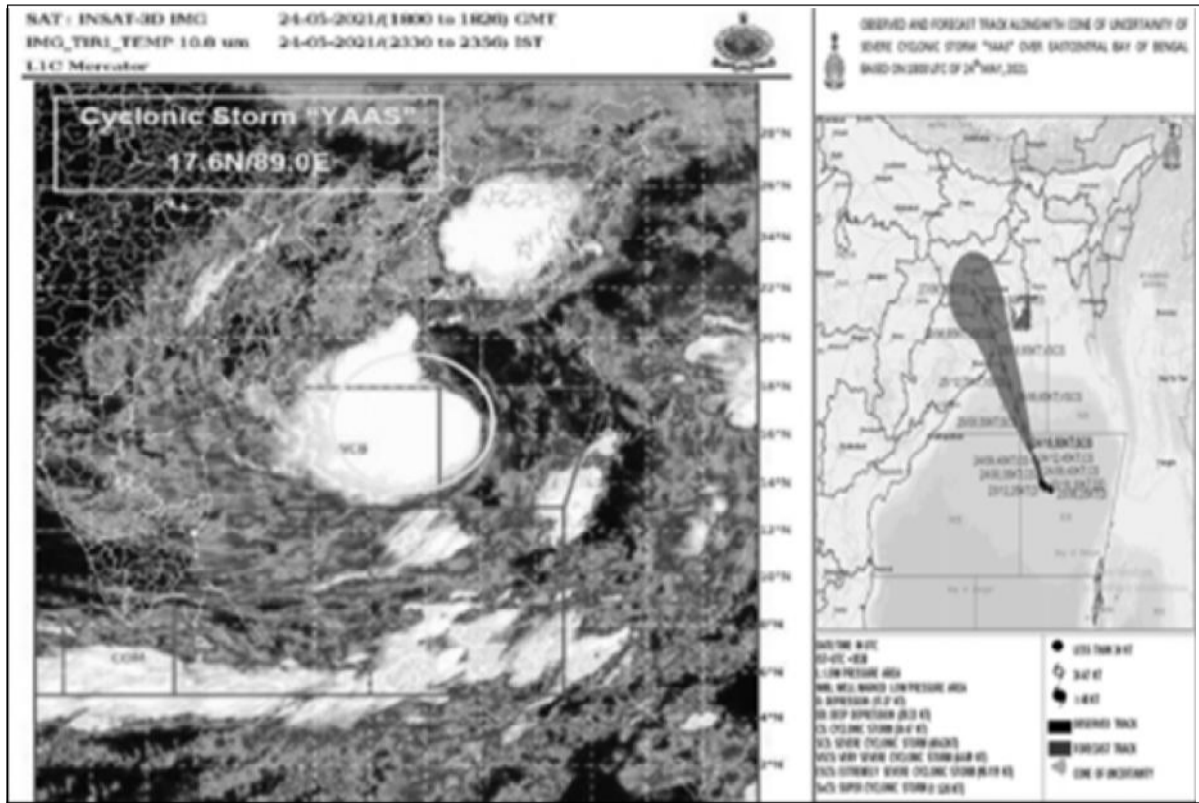

# Cyclonic storm 'YAAS' likely to intensify into very severe cyclonic storm in next 12 hours



New Delhi, May 25  
The severe cyclonic storm YAAS over the Bay of Bengal may intensify further into a very severe cyclonic storm. According to the Indian Meteorological department, Yaas will cross north Odisha coast between Dhamra and Balasore by noon tomorrow as a very severe cyclonic storm with wind speed from 155 to 165 kms per hour gusting up to 185 kms per hour. Due to the

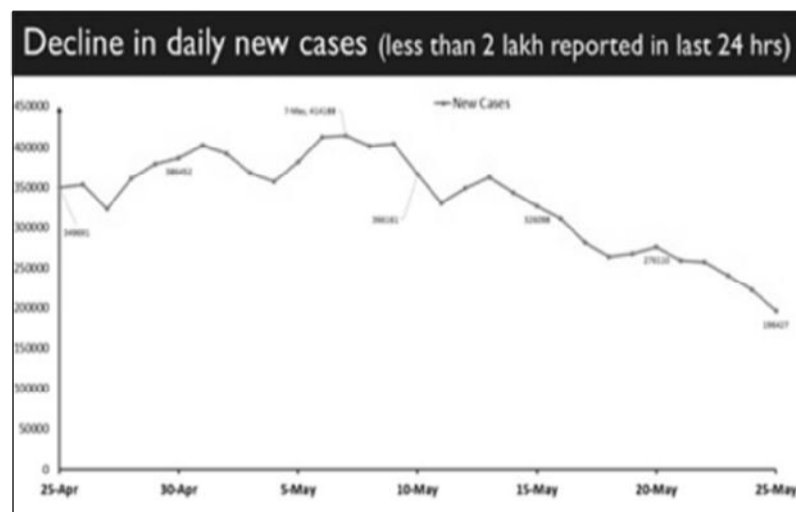
cyclonic impact, several parts of Odisha have been experiencing wind and rainfall of varying degrees. The Weather Department has issued red warning for heavy to very heavy and extremely heavy rainfall for the four highly vulnerable districts like Bhadrak, Balasore, Jagatsinghpur and Kendrapada. Meanwhile the Odisha Government is fully prepared to mitigate the impact of the

cyclone. A number of rescue, relief and restoration teams have been deployed in the high-impact zone. The state government has cancelled all leaves of its employees and holidays till the end of this month. Till 10 in the morning today, about 50 to 60 thousand people from the low lying and storm surge areas and also from vulnerable pockets have been evacuated to the cyclone shelters. # India continues to register decrease in active cases of COVID-19

New Delhi, May 25  
The nation continues to march strongly on its path of COVID recovery with gradual decrease in the total number of active cases. For the 12th consecutive day today, the number of patients discharged has outnumbered the number of new cases.

The cumulative share of active COVID cases now comprises nearly 9.60 per cent of the total reported cases. The Health Ministry has informed that currently over 25 lakh people are reported to be



suffering from the viral hospitalised or are under home pandemic and are either isolation. (Source: india.gov.in)

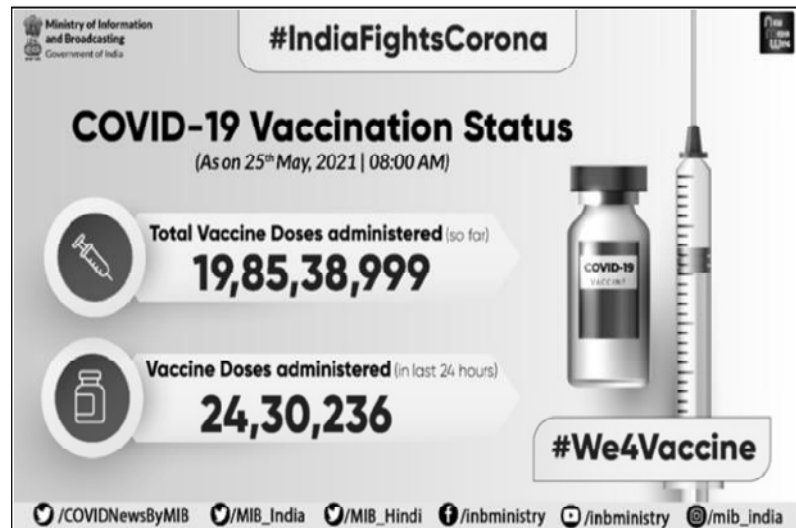
# More than 19 crore 85 lakh COVID-19 vaccine doses administered in country so far

New Delhi, May 25  
India has inched closer to another milestone of administering nearly 20 crore COVID-19 vaccine doses as nearly 24 lakh 30 thousand doses were given in the last 24 hours. Due to the emphasis on vaccination of people in the age group of 18 to 44 years, more than 19 crore 85 lakh doses have been administered in the country so far.

In the last 24 hours, around 12 lakh 55 thousand people in the age group of 18 to 44 years were given their first shot of the COVID vaccines. The Union Health Ministry has informed that so far over 1 crore 18 lakh beneficiaries in the age group of 18 to 44 years have been given the first dose of the vaccine. Bihar, Rajasthan and Uttar

Pradesh have so far administered the first dose of the COVID vaccine to more than 10 lakh beneficiaries in the age group of 18 to 44 years. The Centre is continuously reviewing and monitoring the vaccination programme at the highest level as a tool to protect the most vulnerable population

groups in the country from COVID-19. The liberalised and accelerated Phase-3 Strategy of Covid-19 vaccination has come into force from the 1st of this month under which people in the age group of 18 to 44 years are also being vaccinated. (Source: india.gov.in)



# National COVID-19 recovery rate improves to 89.26 per cent

New Delhi, May 25  
In the past 24 hours, over 3 lakh 26 thousand COVID patients successfully recovered from the disease. In the same time span 1 lakh 96 thousand 427 fresh cases were recorded nationwide. In the same time span 1 lakh 96 thousand 427 fresh cases were recorded nationwide. The recovery rate in the country has further improved to stand at 89.26 per cent. The number of daily cases have slipped below the 2 lakh mark after nearly 40 days.

The Ministry added that so far, over 2 crore 40 lakh people have recovered from the COVID-19 infection in the country. Ten States including Maharashtra, Karnataka, Chhattisgarh, Delhi, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat and Kerala continue to be the major



hotspots of the viral pandemic. Nearly 75 per cent of the new cases are reported from these 10 states. The Health Ministry has informed that three thousand 511 COVID related deaths were reported in the last 24 hours taking the cumulative toll to 3 lakh 7 thousand 231. With a special focus on the 5-point principle of 'Test, Track, Treat, Isolate & Vaccinate', the number of

cumulative COVID-19 tests reported by the Indian Council of Medical Research, ICMR has surpassed the figure of 33 crore 25 lakh. The apex medical research body has informed that in the past 24 hours another milestone in terms of daily testing was achieved with more than 20 lakh 58 thousand samples being tested across the country.
