Health Minister launches Rotavirus vaccine as part of Universal Immunization Programme

New Delhi, Mar 26
 "We have achieved a new milestone towards expanding the coverage of full immunization in the country aimed at reducing child mortality". Shri J P Nadda, Union Minister for Health and Family Welfare stated this at the national launch of the Rotavirus vaccine as part of the Universal Immunization Programme (UIP) of the country, here today. Terming this as a historic moment and an exemplary step in India's immunization programme, the Union Health Minister added that the Government is committed to reducing morbidity and mortality in children. Strengthening routine immunization is an essential investment in India's children and will ensure a healthy future of the country, he noted. Noting that Rotavirus is one of the leading causes of severe diarrhoea and death among children less than five years of age, and that every year nearly 80,000 to one lakh children die in the country due to Rotavirus diarrhoea, and about 9 lakh children are admitted to hospital due to episodes of severe diarrhoea with 32.7 lakh cases of OPD, Shri Nadda stated that introduction of Rotavirus vaccine will enable us to directly address the problem of diarrheal deaths. The vaccine is being introduced initially in four states i.e. Andhra Pradesh, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh and Odisha and

LG attends cultural evening at Pondicherry University, Brookshabad Exhorts students to contribute towards disaster management; underlines need for better preparedness

Port Blair, March 26
 The Lt Governor, Lt Gen AK Singh (Retd) has underlined the need for effective Disaster Management. Though we cannot prevent a disaster; but with better preparedness, we can certainly minimize the damages, he said while addressing the students at the Pondicherry University campus at Brookshabad here this evening.



The Pondicherry University organized a colorful cultural programme titled 'Anekaragam Fest-2016' in its campus today in which students of the college presented variety programmes including songs and dances, much to the delight of the audience on the occasion. The Lt. Governor, Lt. Gen. A K Singh (Retd.) as the chief guest inaugurated the cultural evening by lighting the traditional oil lamp. Addressing the gathering after the cultural programme, the Lt. Governor complimented the participants for their energetic performance.

Speaking about the Pondicherry University, the Lt. Governor informed the gathering about his association with the University not only in Brookshabad Campus in Port Blair, but also in Puducherry Campus, where he delivered a talk on 'National Security' and interacted with the faculty members and students. Referring to the core subjects offered by Pondicherry University here at Brookshabad Campus, the Lt. Governor said that both the subjects viz. Disaster Management and Ocean Studies & Marine Biology are very relevant in A&N Islands. Turning to Disaster Management, the Lt. Governor mentioned that there could not be a more suitable place to study the subject than Andaman and Nicobar Islands. He highlighted about Islands scenario with regard to Disaster Management and said we are subjected to over 90 to 100 tremors annually, in and around Andamans including the South East Asian belt, out of which 30 are of over 4.5 on the Richter scale. Any tremor which is more than 8 on the Richter scale can actually theoretically generate a Tsunami, he said. Citing the example of the 2004 Tsunami, the Lt.



Governor said that not only in Andaman & Nicobar Islands but also all over the country, Disaster Management is becoming a very topical and urgent necessity. Though we cannot prevent a disaster but with better preparedness, we can minimize the damage, he said, calling upon the students passing out from such institutions to contribute their mite towards disaster management. Mentioning about the large scale exercise that was carried out by the A&N Administration to gauge the preparedness of the Islands pertaining to Disaster Management, the Lt. Governor said, the A&N Administration have developed quite a lot of expertise on this subject and acknowledged that he (Contd. on last page)

TRAI asks DoT to put comprehensive communications network at Andaman, Lakshadweep

New Delhi, Mar 26
 Telecom Regulatory Authority of India has asked the Department of Telecommunications to roll out comprehensive communications network at Andaman and Nicobar Islands and Lakshadweep. TRAI said that even if the cost is higher than estimated, a comprehensive network must be rolled out as these islands are of immense strategic importance. In July 2014, the telecom regulator had recommended a comprehensive plan for improving telecom services in these Islands with an outlay of about Rs. 2,900 crore. The regulator said it has been almost 20 months since the recommendations were made, now costs and need for replacement of infrastructure may vary with time. India, who were the overwhelming favourites going into the tournament, have been far from convincing in the three games they have played so far. The inaugural edition champions began their campaign with a 47-run crushing defeat against New Zealand before bouncing back with a six-wicket win over arch-rivals Pakistan. But the home side would have found themselves in a precarious situation if it was not for a self destructive

is reasonably satisfied with the disaster preparedness of the Islands. The Lt. Governor also requested the Head of the Faculty to encourage greater interaction between the theory and practical aspects of the subjects being taught to the students. The Lt. As far as the Ocean Studies & Marine Biology is concerned, these Islands are the best place as 25% of Coastline and 30% of India's EEZ is in and around A&N Islands, the Lt Governor said adding that we have a large amount of Marine Species here and the students studying this subject should be able to contribute for the development of Marine Commerce and Marine Engineering in these Islands.

The Lt Governor said that in Education sectors these Islands have made great strides. "In last two years we opened a Medical College, Andaman College, Community College and skill Centers. Now, the Administration is striving hard to start a Law College with a small batch of 30 students from July this year. Apart from this, professional colleges with four streams have also been planned and efforts are on to start the colleges with Management stream this year", the Lt Governor added.

With so many initiatives in the education sector, the Lt Governor stated, the time is now ripe to apply for our own Central University. He asked the Principal Secretary, Education to put in motion the whole process of demanding a University for these Islands.

The Lt Governor also complimented the organizers for giving an appropriate name to this multicolored and multicultural programme 'Anekaragam', which reflects the beauty of India. He also invited the students and faculty members to visit Raj Niwas to have a glimpse of the surrounding of Raj Niwas and its beautiful gardens.
