Japan to declassify two Netaji files by end of this year: Minister

New Delhi, Apr 26
Minister of State for Home Shri Kiren Rijiju told the Lok Sabha today that Japan is going to declassify two files relating to Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose by the end of this year. Replying to supplementaries in the question hour, he said Japan has five files on Netaji. The ones going to be declassified this year are very crucial. They may unravel the mystery of Netaji's disappearance in 1945. The Minister said, the Japanese Government has



not committed to declassify the other three files so far. But the Indian Embassy in Tokyo is in touch with the Japanese authorities to get them declassified as well.

Panic button on mobile a game changer: Maneka Gandhi

New Delhi, Apr 26
Women and Child Development Minister, Smti Maneka Gandhi today said that Government's decision to make it mandatory for the cell phone manufacturers to sell mobile phones with an additional feature of panic button will be a game changer in dealing with issues like women's security. She said, her Ministry is working on an app through which this button will alert 10 people around who are closest till the police comes. The Minister's reaction came shortly after the Centre announced that all mobile handsets sold in India from January 2017 will have to feature a panic button that will allow women in distress to seek help. In addition, from January 2018, all mobile phones must have an inbuilt GPS to identify the handset user's location. Smti Gandhi had recently launched the Raksha app and now the decision to make a panic button mandatory in the phones sold in India is expected to bolster women's safety in the country.

LG to inaugurate 'Andaman Bazaar' at ITF Ground today

Port Blair, Apr 26
A unique buyer seller meet called 'Andaman Bazaar' shall start at ITF Ground tomorrow (Apr 27), from 3 pm onwards, and shall remain open till 30th April, 2016 from 3 pm to 9 pm. The Lt. Governor, A&N Islands, Lt. Gen AK Singh (Retd.) shall be the chief guest of the inaugural ceremony to be held from 6 to 7 pm on Apr 27 and would interact with the members of SHGs, Artisans & Farmers on the occasion. This event is being organized by Industries Department, Andaman & Nicobar Administration in association with NABARD. Other Collaborating partners are Departments of Agriculture, Art & Culture, Tourism and Andaman Nicobar Islands State Co-operative Bank Ltd.

basic facilities in the college. The Member of Parliament mentioned that 50% of the seats of NIT Puducherry belong to the students of Andaman & Nicobar Islands also. The selection of these students is done through combined merits of both AIEEE & CBSE for these 2 UTs, and Isles' students selected for NIT Puducherry are Island toppers, filtered by merit, he said in his letter. Accordingly, the Member

of Parliament has requested the HRD Minister for her immediate intervention in the matter to solve the problems of the students, viz. lack of classrooms, shortage of projectors, condition of the laboratories, interruption in power supply, drinking water, hostel conditions, toilet & transport facilities etc, that they have been facing since 2010, a communication from the Office of the MP said here today.

BJP State President attends National Level Meeting of UTs

Presents various issues relating to development of A&N Islands

Port Blair, Apr 26
The State President of Bharatiya Janata Party, A&N Islands, Shri Vishal Jolly attended the National Level Meeting of UTs held at New Delhi under the Chairmanship of National President, Shri Amit Shah on Apr 21. In the meeting, various issues relating to development of Andaman and Nicobar Islands were put forth by the BJP State President. Dr Jitendra Singh, MoS, PMO and Shri Kiren Rijiju, MoS Home also attended the meeting. Raising the issues of the A&N Islands, Shri Vishal Jolly, in the governance sector, suggested for a

Legislative Council for A&N Islands. The system of Council, if brought back with executive powers for its members, will provide the Islanders a democratic platform which will ensure their participation in governance of the Islands. Hence, BJP should take the lead and introduce Legislative Council for people's participation and better governance of the Island territory, he submitted. For development of shipping sector, Shri Jolly suggested a trans-shipment Port at Campbell Bay, Great Nicobar. A trans-shipment Port with all allied

services at Campbell Bay, Great Nicobar, southernmost tip of India will go a long way in harnessing the benefit from the maritime trade along Malacca Strait hardly 100 kms away, he said in his memorandum. He also suggested for separate Shipping Corporation for ANI. The Andaman and Nicobar Islands have the second largest fleet of about 85 ships after Shipping Corporation of India. It consists of 1200-pax Mainland bound ships as well as small vessels plying within the Islands, he said. Shri Jolly also mentioned

a fully equipped Dockyard would go a long way in the maintenance of existing vessels as well as a support system for the trans-shipment port too. Similarly, he also highlighted the need for a ship-wrecking yard for the Isles, which would contribute to the economy of the Isles and stop pollution as well. In the tourism sector, Shri Jolly suggested for Online Portal for Yachts/Cruise Liners. A good number of yacht and cruise liners that intend to reach our shores, however due to lengthy and distributed clearance procedures, miniscule of

the yacht and cruise liners ultimately visit the Islands. Not to mention a major chunk of it goes to other locations like Phuket. With introduction of a Single-window Online Portal for online application and issuance of permits for Yacht and Cruise Liners, the process could be made visitor friendly, which will help in increasing tourism possibilities, he wrote. He also suggested for Visa on Arrival Facility for Tourists at Port Blair. With the introduction of Visa on Arrival for Tourists at Port Blair airport as well as Seaport at par with the

New jetty at Teresa Island constructed by ALHW put into use

The construction of jetty at Bengali Village (Teresa) in Nancowrie group of Islands) is complete and has paved way for berthing of speed boats. A good number of tribal populations have been benefitted from completion of this project. The project has been executed by the Andaman

Lakshadweep Harbour Works and the fund amounting Rs. 23.59 crores for the work was provided by A & N Administration under State Sector Plan Scheme of Port Management Board, sources from the Engineering Wing of ALHW informed. The new jetty, which is having a solid approach of 15m length, a piled

approach of 300 m length & a 50mtr long berthing head, can facilitate berthing of 75/100pax speed boats (40mtrs long), having a draught of 3mtr. The Bengali Village (Teresa), situated in the Nancowry group of Island used to have a Jetty which got completely submerged/damaged in the earthquake followed by Tsunami in December, 2004.

Transporters urged not to load excess cargo in trucks while transshipment through vehicle ferry vessel

Port Blair, Apr 26
The vehicle ferry services provided by the vessels of DSS in the creeks of ATR not only plays an integral part in smooth movement of passengers and their vehicles but also in the transshipment of vehicles carrying essential cargo and other materials to North & Middle Andaman from Port Blair. The cargos to these areas are generally being transhipped through big trucks, and these trucks are often found to be over loaded than its prescribed limit. These overloaded loaded trucks while transshipment through

vehicle ferry vessel, often results in breakdown of machineries and ramp of vehicle ferry vessel due to excessive load, thereby resulting in disruption of connectivity services provided by the vehicle ferry vessels. As the vehicle ferry vessels are designed for a certain load carrying capacity only and transshipment of heavily loaded trucks beyond the prescribed capacity not only results in breakdown of vehicle ferry vessel but also jeopardizes passenger safety, which is a matter of concern. In view of this situation, and to circumvent the

avoidable disruption of vehicle ferry service due to transshipment of heavily loaded trucks, the Directorate of Shipping Services has decided to impose restriction on transshipment of heavily loaded trucks, in the vehicle ferry vessels, operating in the ATR, with immediately effect. All transporters have been requested to cooperate and not to load excess cargo in their respective trucks while transshipment through the vehicle ferry vessel, so as to avoid any last minute disappointment and inconvenience, a communication from the Dy. Director (SS) said here today.

Free medical treatment of acid attack victims All hospitals directed to ensure strict compliance of Supreme Court's order

Port Blair, Apr 26
All the hospitals of the Islands, public or private, whether run by the Central Govt., local bodies or any other person, have been directed to ensure strict compliance of the Supreme Court's order for free medical treatment of acid attack victims, which includes not only provision of physical treatment to the victim of acid attack but also availability of medicines, bed food and reconstructive surgeries in the hospital concerned.

According to the Supreme Court's order, the private hospitals are also brought on board in this regard. No hospitals/clinic should refuse treatment citing lack of specialized facilities. First-aid must be administered to the victim and after stabilization; the victim/patient could be shifted to a specialized facility for further treatment, wherever required.

Serious action will be taken against hospitals/clinic for refusal to treat victims of acid attacks and other crimes in contravention of the provision of Section 357 C of the code of Criminal procedure, 1973, a communication from the Chairman/ADM (SA), Enforcement Committee, District Registering Authority, South Andaman said.

International Cricket Council suspends Cricket Association of Nepal

Dubai, Apr 26
The International Cricket Council (ICC) has suspended the Cricket Association of Nepal (CAN) due to government interference in the board that has created a "vacuum of cricket leadership". The ICC took the decision in a board meeting held at its Headquarters in Dubai on Sunday. "In light of the ongoing court case involving the Cricket Association of Nepal and the Ad hoc Committee established by the Nepalese National Sports Council, which has led to a vacuum of cricket

leadership in Nepal, the Board suspended the Membership of CAN for breach of Article 2.9 of the ICC's Articles of Association, which prohibits government interference and requires free and fair elections," the ICC said in a statement on Monday. The governing body of world cricket said the membership of CAN will remain suspended until it "becomes free of government interference and is properly structured to begin exploiting the tremendous cricket talent and opportunities that exist in Nepal". However, the ICC

decided that Nepal cricket teams would continue to feature in ICC events. Nepal cricket has been mired in crisis after the National Sports Council had formed an ad-hoc committee to run the CAN in December. This followed after Chatur Bahudur Chand was elected as CAN's president without the support of NSC, which is the country's supreme governing body of sports. Subsequently, the Chand-led faction moved the court challenging the NSC's decision, which is still pending.

Berlin, Apr 26
German medallists at the Rio Olympics will be rewarded to promote the development of talent, the German Sports Aid (DSA) foundation has announced. According to DSA, the Olympic champion will receive 20,000 euros (\$22,556) as prize money, runner-ups 15,000 (\$16,917) and bronze medalists 10,000 (\$11,278), while finalists will have bonus from 5,000 (\$5,639) for the fourth place to 1,500 euros (\$1,691) for eighth place finishers, reports Xinhua. The reward will be used for the Paralympic Games in Rio, from September 7 to 18, and is the same as the one used for the 2014 Winter Olympics in Sochi. The only

exception in Rio are the German men's and women's football teams who will receive a team bonus of 720,000 euros (\$8,12,016) from the German Football Association (DFB) if they claim the Olympic champions title. Michael Ilgner, head of the DSA foundation, said on Monday the bonus is not to "reward Olympic success", but to "promote the development of talent" in preparing for the future. The DSA paid out a total of 1,336,875 euros (\$15,07,727) to Germany's medallists for the 2012 London Olympic Games.

Govt to provide Rs 1 lakh per month to Rio-bound athletes
New Delhi, Apr 26
Union Sports Ministry has decided to provide one lakh rupees per month as out of pocket allowance to the sports persons under the Target Olympic Podium (TOP) scheme in their preparation for the Olympics and Paralympic Games at Rio de Janeiro. 77 Indian athletes in eight disciplines have qualified for the Olympics till date and many more are likely to qualify in the next two months. Target Olympic Podium scheme is a sports ministry initiative under which Olympic



medal prospects are funded by the government for top class training as part of their preparations for the Games.

New Zealand Cricket Willing to Play Pink Ball Test on India Tour

Dubai, Apr 26
New Zealand Cricket (NZC) has opened up to the possibility of playing a Day-Night Test match with the pink ball during the tour of India later this year. In order to raise the dwindling number of spectators in the stadium, the Board of Control for Cricket in India last week said it is all set to host its first-ever Day-Night Test in India with the pink ball against New Zealand in October. NZC chief executive David White had talks with the Indian officials during the International Cricket Council meeting in Dubai late last week. "We've said we are receptive to the idea," New Zealand Herald quoted White as saying. He added, "We will work closely with the players, but in saying that, if the trials look good and they (India) are comfortable with (the trials) it's very positive from our point of view. We believe day-night Test cricket has a big future in the game."

Mumbai could emerge as the most likely venue to host the game should the two boards go ahead with the plan. India will try out playing with pink balls in domestic matches before New Zealand's arrival. BCCI secretary Anurag Thakur had said, "We have decided that we will play one day/night Test match with pink ball against New Zealand later this year. Before that Duleep Trophy will act as a dress rehearsal for the day/night Test match." Thakur said that the main objective of the Duleep Trophy will be to check how the pink kookaburra behaves under lights in sub-continental conditions. White said there was a solid consensus around the ICC table in Dubai about the importance of day-night cricket in the future Test landscape. "The sentiment was very positive. Everyone realises it's going to be important for the future of the Test format to make it accessible to the fans."

Indo-Swiss pair of Sania Mirza, Martina Hingis lose summit clash in Stuttgart



New Delhi
The Indo-Swiss pair of Sania Mirza and Martina Hingis lost the finals of Stuttgart Open on Monday to second seeds Caroline Garcia and Kristina Mladenovic. Even after winning the first set 6-2, the top-ranked pair lost the next two 1-6, 6-10, and with that failed to win their 14th title. Mirza and Hingis haven't

won a title since February and this time too they lost in the final to French pair in a dramatic match. Referring to Hingis and Mirza, Mladenovic said after the match: "It's very exciting and challenging to get to play you guys. I hope we get to play many more finals together." San Tina will now look to put up a good show on red dirt as they aim to win their first French Open together, which is scheduled to take place in June.

Countdown for launch of navigation satellite IRNSS-1G begins

Sriharikota, Apr 26
Countdown for the launch of India's seventh navigation satellite IRNSS 1G on board the launch vehicle PSLV C33 has begun this morning at 9.20 hrs at the Satish Dhawan Space Centre, Sriharikota. The satellite is the final in the series of space fleet to

establish India's own space technology-based navigation system to aid the air, maritime and surface transport. Indian Regional Navigation Satellites System is aimed at self-reliance in space based navigation. The satellite IRNSS 1G is similar in

configuration to its six other peer satellites which are now in space. The rocket PSLV C33 with the passenger on board will undertake the journey in its extended version with strap on boosters, given the passenger satellite's weight and the orbital destination.

SC directs Mallya to furnish details of assets in India, abroad

New Delhi, Apr 26
The Supreme Court today asked the Debt Recovery Tribunal in Bengaluru, to expedite the hearing on loan recovery suit against fugitive businessman Vijay Mallya within next two months. Hearing on a petition filed by the consortium of banks led by SBI, the apex court directed Mallya to furnish the details of his and his family's assets in India and abroad to the banks in a sealed cover. The court found untenable the objections raised by the liquor baron, that the assets of his NRI wife and kids cannot be disclosed to the banks.

Centre notifies rules to control stray dog population

New Delhi, Apr 26
The Centre has notified the Animal Birth Control Dogs Rules, to control the population of stray dogs. In a written reply in the Rajya Sabha today, Health Minister Shri J P Nadda said the government is implementing National Rabies Control Programme with an objective to prevent human deaths due to rabies. Shri Nadda said 100 deaths were reported last year due to rabies. As per data one

hundred four in 2014 and 132 deaths reported in 2013 due to rabies. He also said, health is a state subject and it is primarily the responsibility of state governments to ensure the availability of anti-rabies vaccine. The Minister said, under the National Health Mission, funds are provided to states and UTs to strengthen their healthcare system including support for anti-rabies vaccines.
