Two years of NDA Govt: I will continue to be your 'pradhan sevak', says PM Modi in mega rally in UP's Saharanpur

Saharanpur, May 26 On the day BJP-led NDA government completed two years in office, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi said on Thursday that he would continue to serve 125 crore people of India. Addressing a mega rally in Uttar Pradesh's Saharanpur to mark two years of his government, Shri Modi said, "I have come to give an account of my work in the past work years. I am coming to you at a time when, exactly at this time two years ago we were taking the oath of office. As I had said earlier - as a 'pradhan sevak' I have tried my best to serve my countrymen."



"Governments come and go. Elections happen. But a government is formed to serve the masses. In the two years, people have seen our work. I had said earlier that my government is dedicated to the poor of this country," the PM added. "Our endeavour has been to strengthen state governments so that they too work for the welfare of the people. I have been a CM of a state and so I decided that Centre will have 35 percent in their treasury and the rest will be part of state coffers. We have brought many schemes for the poor," he said. "We have given importance to building schools, hospitals, roads and transforming lives of the poor. We want to ensure that our sugarcane farmers do not face any problems. Government's policy is that if sugar mills run honestly, no farmer would remain unpaid. I am warning the sugar mills, you won't be allowed to do injustice to the farmers," Shri Modi said. "Merely throwing crumbs at farmers was not our way of working. We are trying to solve the problems the farmers face," he asserted.

On tackling corruption, Shri Modi said, "Two years back, you would remember that corruption was at its peak. It has been two years since we came to power, and there has been no charge of corruption against my government. The previous government had robbed the country of all its wealth." "Have you heard in the two years that Shri Modi government indulged in corruption? Siphoned off money. Have you heard," the PM asked the crowd. Talking about initiatives taken by his government, he said, "We have given soil health card to farmers to improve fertility of land of the nation. Give our farmers the right opportunity and see the wonders they can do. We have started work to double the income of farmers by 2022. We brought 'Fasal Bima Yojana' for farmers." Government doctors retirement age to be raised to 65: PM

Saharanpur, May 26 Citing shortage of doctors, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi on Thursday announced raising the age of retirement of government doctors to 65 years and said the Union Cabinet will give its nod to the decision this week. In a rally to observe the second anniversary of his government, Shri Modi said there is a need for more doctors across the country but it was not possible to fill the gap in two years of his government. The decision will cover all government doctors whether serving under states or the central dispensation, he said. "There is a shortage of doctors. In government hospitals, their retirement is 60 years in some states, 62 in some others. If adequate number of medical institutes were there, then we would have more doctors and would not feel the shortage. It is difficult to make doctors in two years but poor families cannot be forced to live without doctors. "Therefore from Uttar Pradesh, I want to announce this to my countrymen that this week our government's Cabinet will take a decision and the retirement age of our doctors, whether in states or government of India, would be made 65 years instead of 60 or 62," he said.

NDA Govt establishes new benchmarks for development: Amit Shah

New Delhi, May 26 BJP President Shri Amit Shah today said that NDA government has established new benchmarks for development and progress and redefined the idea of governance and delivery. On the second anniversary of the Shri Narendra Modi government, Shri Shah tweeted that the Ministers have left no stone unturned in providing people friendly and corruption free government. He said, the government has established new benchmarks for development and progress and executed its ideology of sabka saath sabka vikas.



Govt has set path for accelerated growth, made changes to curb corruption: PM

New Delhi, May 26 Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi has said changes have been made to curb corruption and gaps in rural infrastructure filled in last two years of his government. In an exclusive interview to Wall Street Journal on the eve of the NDA government's second anniversary at the Centre, Shri Modi said his government has made it easier to do business and opened up more of economy for foreign investment. Prime Minister said maximum reform measures have been undertaken but added that he



has enormous tasks ahead in this regard. He said labour law should not just mean in the interest of industry but they should be in the interest of the labourer. The Prime Minister also asserted that he expects Goods and Services Tax Bill,

a major reform measure aimed at replacing a web of varying state taxes will be passed this year. The bill has been stuck in the Rajya Sabha in Parliament, where the government is in a minority. He also commented that today, unlike before, India is not standing in a corner. The interview comes ahead of Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi visit to Washington early next month, where he is to meet President Mr. Barack Obama and address a joint session of the US Congress.

Lt. Governor to lay foundation for 20 MW Solar Power Project

Port Blair, May 26 In view of the rising demand of electric power generation and concern towards environmental conservation, the Electricity Department is on the march to start/promote generation of electric power through renewable sources of energy and reduce dependency on diesel generated electric power supply. In this regard, solar and hydro electric power projects had already been implemented by the Department. In line with the objective, the Ministry of New & Renewable Energy has sanctioned 100 MW Solar Power Project for A&N Islands. The Ministry has also notified M/s. National Thermal Power Corporation of India (NTPC), M/s. Rajasthan Electronics Instruments Ltd. (REIL) & M/s. Neyveli Lignite Corporation (NLC) all the three Central PSU's to develop Solar Power Park in different Islands. Accordingly, M/s. NLC has been entrusted with 20 MW Solar Power Project in Port Blair with allotment of 42 hect. land at Attam Pahad by A&N Administration. The foundation laying ceremony of the project will be held at 11 am on May 29, 2016. The Lt. Governor, A&N Islands, Lt. Gen AK Singh (Retd.) will lay the foundation of the 20 MW Solar Power Project at the said venue in the presence of Secretary (MNRE) & Advisor (MNRE), Director (NLC) and higher officials of the Administration and Electricity Department.

Various amendments introduced in process for diversion of land Number of documents required reduced; specific time period set

Port Blair, May 26 Regarding diversion of land, with a view to increase public convenience, reduce pendency and curtail the involvements of outs, various amendments have been introduced by the SDO/SDM (SA). Accordingly, process flow has been streamlined and the number of steps taken have been reduced. Once the case is decided, challan will now be issued within two hours of the hearing conducted/same day itself, orders will now be issued within 3 working days from payment of challan, earlier there was no specific time period as such, which lead to multiple visits by the applicant. Similarly, the number of documents which were required have also been reduced. Earlier for diversion into Commercial/Industrial purpose, 11 documents were called for, now only 6 documents are needed. 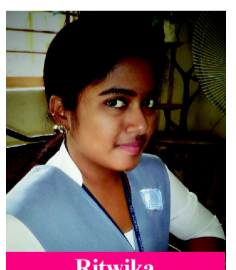

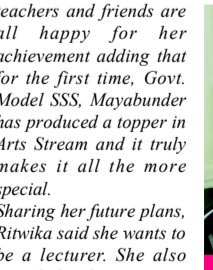

ICC hopeful of World T20 return in 2018

Dubai, May 26 The ICC will take a further step towards ensuring the World Twenty20 returns in 2018 when senior figures meet with Star Sports later today. South Africa is believed to be the preferred option to host the 2018 WT20, which could place pressure on the South African government to review its recent decision to ban CSA from bidding to host world events for a year because of failing to meet transformation guidelines. ICC members are overwhelmingly

behind the idea to restore the WT20 to every two years, leaving the main question whether Star Sports agree to buy two extra WT20 tournaments - in 2018 and 2022 - in addition to the 2020 tournament already agreed during the current rights cycle. The ICC is also considering expanding the Super 10s to include two teams, which would go some way towards assuaging Associates who complained of being excluded during this year's WT20.

18 months with Team India most memorable of my life: Shastri

New Delhi, May 26 Ravi Shastri considers his 18-month stint as the Indian cricket team's Director the "most cherished and memorable phase" of his life but does not want to comment on whether he would seek a contract renewal. "I have no doubt in my mind that these are the best 18 months that I have spent during my association with Indian cricket as a player and then as a Team Director. It has been the most memorable phase of my life if I just look back at what we achieved as a team during this phase. Credit to the boys for making it special," Shastri told PTI when asked about his stint with the Indian team. Asked if he would apply for the Chief coach's post for which BCCI will be advertising, Shastri gave a typical tongue-in-cheek reply. "I will only apply for accreditation of the IPL final," Shastri quipped. Shastri took over as the Team

Director after India's 1-3 Test series defeat against England in August 2014 and was there till the end of ICC World T20, earlier this year. "Yes, I have had success as a player. I fondly remember 1985 World Championship of Cricket, 1983 World Cup and proud of those but this phase as the Team Director was special. Look at some of the performances during this phase. "We beat England in England in ODIs. (For the) first time a team whitewashed Australia in any format (3-0 in T20s) Down Under, winning a Test series in Sri Lanka after 22 years, beating South Africa in a Test series at home after a decade. When you take over, you set the bar high but you do not know as to what all you can achieve," Shastri said. So what has been the most special out of these bilateral series wins? Is it the Sri Lanka Test series or the 3-0 T20

series win in Australia, Shastri said: "That's for you people to decide as I would not like to get into comparisons." Asked if he spoke to the BCCI officials and gave the roadmap ahead for this young Indian team, Shastri gave a very open-ended reply: "I have spoken to them long back. I have given them my feedback. Beyond that, I won't say anything." He has seen Virat Kohli evolve as India's premier batsman during this phase and for Shastri, the four centuries in Australia will remain a pinnacle of glory for the immensely talented Indian Test captain. "Four centuries in four Tests in Australia. You can't beat that. He has been brilliant in IPL. Four centuries and nearly 1000 runs in IPL is fantastic but nothing can beat four Test hundreds Down Under," Shastri said. Shastri then said that Kohli is yet to hit the peak.

New Zealand coach Mike Hesson extends contract until 2019

Wellington, May 26 Mike Hesson has been rewarded for his successful reign as New Zealand coach with a contract extension that takes him through until after the 2019 World Cup in England. Since taking over as coach in 2012, Hesson has overseen a marked improvement in New Zealand's standing in international cricket and they are now ranked number one

in Twenty20, second in one-day internationals and fifth in tests. "Mike's the most successful coach in New Zealand cricket history and, in my opinion, the best selector we've ever had," New Zealand Cricket chief executive David White said in a statement. "To have him committed to the (team) until after the next World Cup is great news for all concerned."

TGCE to conduct B.Ed. exams from June 2

When I talk of 'Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao' I do that for daughters of every caste, class and religion. If India's girl child is not empowered how can the nation be" Shri Modi said, pointing out, "Swachh Bharat' is not for rich, it's for poor. It will stop them from falling ill." "In the present government road construction is double than that of the previous government. I have decided to link villages with roads. Its shameful - there were 18,000 villages where was not even an electricity pole," he said. Further enumerating the good work done by his government, Shri Modi said, "Over one crore people have given up their LPG subsidy." "The youth of this country must get jobs. The entire world says if there is a bright spot in the global economy, it is India," he went on to say. Meanwhile, Shri Modi said with tongue in cheek, "Whatever I do is always under scrutiny and I welcome that. The government should be accountable to the public every second, for every rupee."
