## Kargil Vijay Diwas observed; PM says, country will never forget its martyred fearless soldiers

New Delhi, Jul 26  
Kargil Vijay Diwas was observed across the country today. The day is observed on 26 July every year in honour of the Kargil War Heroes. Defence Minister Shri Manohar Parikar and three Service Chiefs paid homage to Kargil martyrs at Amar Jawan Jyoti, India Gate in New Delhi this morning. Shri Parikar paid rich tribute to the heroes of Kargil War and said the nation salutes them for their bravery and sacrifice. In a tweet, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has said the country will never forget the fearlessness of its courageous soldiers who gave a befitting and unforgettable reply to the intruders during Kargil war. Shri Modi bowed to



every valiant soldier who fought for India till the very last breath. He said the heroic sacrifices of every soldier will inspire the country. The Prime Minister recalled with pride, the firmness demonstrated by India's

political leadership in 1999, which ensured a decisive victory in Kargil. It was on this day in 1999 that the Indian Armed Forces, as part of Operation Vijay, recaptured Indian posts in Kargil which had been occupied by Pakistan's

army. Union Home Minister Shri Rajnath Singh paid rich tribute to the war heroes of Kargil. In a tweet, Shri Singh said he salutes the supreme sacrifice and exemplary courage of soldiers who laid down their lives in Kargil war.

### Centre issues notification for implementation of 7th Pay Commission

New Delhi, Jul 26

The Centre has issued notification for the implementation of 7th Pay Commission. With the issuance of notification, 4.8 million central government employees and 5.2 million pensioners will get the increased payout from their August salaries. The Cabinet had approved the recommendations made by the 7th Pay Commission in June. The 7th Pay Commission hike will result in increase in salaries in the range of 7 thousand rupees to 18 thousand rupees per month. A fitment factor of 2.57 would apply for pay revision of all employees and the rate of annual increment has been retained at three per cent. The government has announced that CBSE chief Shri Rajesh Kumar Chaturvedi will be given additional charge of chief of the implementation cell of the Seventh Central Pay Commission. The pay panel had in November last year recommended 14.27 per cent hike in basic pay at junior levels. The Commission recommended changes in the pay of around 1 crore individuals which includes 33 lakh central government employees, 14 lakh armed forces personnel, and 52 lakh pensioners.

It is estimated that the total burden on the exchequer on account of the 7th Pay Commission recommendation will be 1.02 lakh crore rupees in 2016-17. There will be an additional impact of 12,133 crore rupees on arrears and of salary and pension for two months.

**Ashwin regains top spot in ICC bowler rankings**

Dubai, July 26  
India off-spinner Ravichandran Ashwin has surged to the top of the ICC player rankings for Test bowlers after a superb outing in the first Test against the West Indies in Antigua. Ashwin, who was top-ranked in the 2015 year-ending rankings, regained the top spot with his second-innings haul of seven for 83. He also gained in the batsmen's rankings with a knock of 113 and resultantly strengthened his grip on the top spot among all-rounders. Ashwin has replaced Pakistan leg-spinner Yasir Shah, who had grabbed the number-one ranking for bowlers only last week with a 10-wicket haul in the opening Test against

England at Lord's. India pace bowler Umesh Yadav has gained six places to reach 24th rank with five wickets in Antigua while his new-ball partner Mohammad Shami has returned to the rankings at 28th place. In the ICC Player Rankings for Test Batsmen, England's Joe Root and Alastair Cook have reaped the benefits of solid knocks to gain two and four places, respectively. Captain Virat Kohli's 200 at Antigua has helped him move up two places to 12th place while opener Shikhar Dhawan has gained four places after a knock of 84. Ashwin is only the third Indian to be top-ranked among all-rounders after Vinoo Mankad and Kapil Dev.
