Dear Islanders,
The Government of India in a bold and historic decision, has introduced the Goods and Service Tax (GST) on 01st July 2017. The aim of introducing the GST is to replace all the indirect taxes and improve the economy of the nation. It is one of the biggest fiscal reforms in the country since Independence.

GST is a single taxation system which subsumes a number of indirect taxes such as central excise, VAT, service tax, octroi etc. The implementation of GST will help in reducing prices of products and services, which will be beneficial for the people. GST would not be charged at every point of sale like other indirect taxes, but will be consumption based tax and not on production. It would also result in setting up corruption free taxation system, improve exports, generate more employment opportunities and enhance growth of the economy.

In order to ensure smooth implementation of GST in the A & N Islands, a GST Department was created with a GST Commissioner and many other related officers. Training programmes are being organized by the GST Department for the trading community and other stakeholders in all the 3 districts of the Islands.

In order to ensure smooth implementation of GST in the Islands, facilitation centres with trained staff have been setup at the DC & AC offices to assist and guide the traders/dealers in migration/registration. Also, all the 35 Common Service Centres have been notified as facilitation centres and their operators have been trained in registration and migration.

I appeal to the traders, dealers and other business community of Andaman & Nicobar Islands having an income of above Rs. 20 Lakhs per annum to get registered in the facilitation centres or at the GST offices set-up in every district of the Islands.

People urged to refrain from employing children as domestic help Convergent efforts of A & N UTCPCR & DCPU (SA) saves 15 year old girl

Port Blair, July 26
A 15 year old girl, working as a domestic help at the residence of Shri Rajesh Williams and Smti. Hema Rajesh at Prem Nagar, Port Blair ran away due to the inhuman treatment and physical torture which was meted out to her during her stay with her employers. She was found in a very frightened state with signs of physical and mental abuse. On receipt of information, the staff at DCPU (SA) rushed to the spot and got the formalities

completed by the Police Department. The DCPU (SA) was assisted by A & N UTCPCR member Smti Rubina Siddiqui who provided guidance and directions for proceeding with the case. The girl was brutally beaten by the accused with sticks while her hands remained tied with a rope. She even confessed that she was stuffed in her mouth with red chili powder and salt while she was beaten with blows of hands and feet. The girl was taken

to GB Pant Hospital for treatment and later kept at a shelter home for children as she was a child in need of care and protection. Subsequently, 2 arrests have been made under the supervision of SHO, PS Aberdeen, Shri. A.K Singh under section 75 of the JJ Act, 2015 which provides for protection of children against mental and physical suffering caused to the children by persons having actual charge or control over such children

Any frame /structure in a

precarious state, the licensee of the concerned board shall immediately restore it. Non Compliance of this will be treated as breach of terms & conditions of licence and action as deemed fit including penalty, cancellation of the Licence shall be initiated against the defaulter, a communication from Secretary, Municipal Council said.

India 399/3 at Day 1 of 1st cricket Test against Sri Lanka

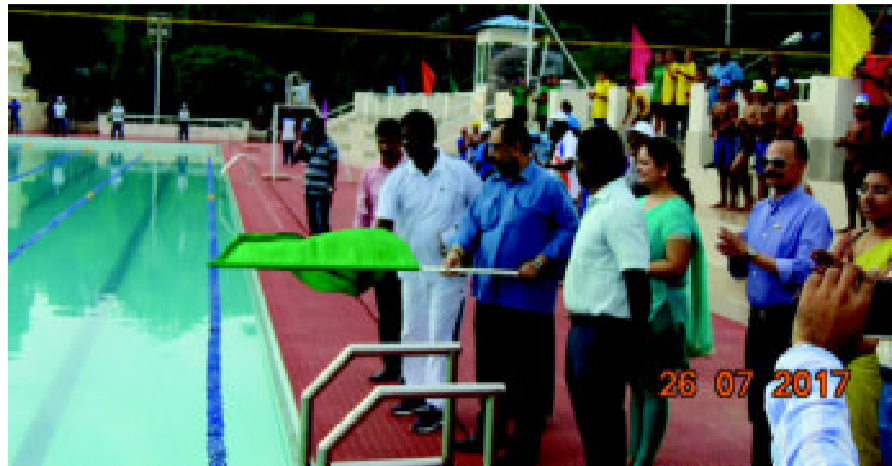
Gale, Jul 26
Riding on opener Shikhar Dhawan's quickfire highest Test score of 190 runs and an unbeaten 144 by Cheteshwar Pujara, helped India amass their highest score on a single day of any away test. India were 399 for 3 at stumps on the opening day of the first cricket Test against Sri Lanka at Galle today. Ajinkya Rahane with 39 not out was at the crease. Dhawan played a whirlwind knock as his runs came off just 168 balls with the help of 31 boundaries. Together with Pujara, Dhawan tormented the Lankan bowling



attack to stitch 253 runs for the second wicket. Earlier, Dhawan opened the innings with Abhinav Mukund after Indian skipper Virat Kohli won the toss and decided to bat first. Mukund made 12 and

Kohli was out for 3. India have handed Test debut to all-rounder Hardik Pandya. The hosts are being led by Rangana Herath. Their regular skipper Dinesh Chandimal was unwell.

XXIII Vice President Cup Soccer Championship at Car Nicobar

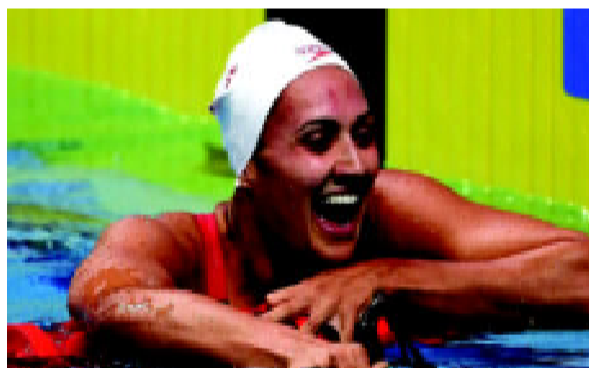
Port Blair, July 26

India through to quarters in world junior squash

Tauranga, Jul 27
India finished runners-up in pool C to qualify for the girls' team event quarterfinal in the WSF-World junior squash championship here today. India will play the Pool D winner Hong Kong in the quarterfinal tomorrow. In its last pool league match, India defeated lower ranked France 2-1 to get the second place behind England. The margin could have been

3-0 but Akanksha Salunkhe, playing the French girl Fanny Segers in the inconsequential third match of the tie, had to retire midway with muscular pain in her legs. As Coach Surbi Misra said Akanksha had begun confidently and went two games up when suddenly she developed pain.

"In great pain, she went down in the third game and at that point we decided she will not

be able to continue," Misra said. Earlier, Misra said Sunayna Kuruvilla had given a good start with a fluent win over Maelle Fuhrer in 17 minutes. Somdev Dewarman all set to head Centre of Excellence at DLTA

New Delhi, July 26
A Centre of Excellence, under the guidance of Somdev Devvarman, will soon be established at the DLTA to provide coaching to budding players but the development has cast a doubt over the future of the grassroots level program, which has been running there for four decades.

Scouting has begun for coaches, sports psychologist and physios, who will work in tandem at the upcoming National Academy, which will have involvement of the Sports Ministry. Under the supervision of India's former number one singles player Somdev, who is



also a government observer for the sport, a comprehensive plan has been submitted by the All India Tennis Association (AITA) to the Sports Ministry for approval. It has been learnt that coaching in various age groups has been planned and

and makes it a cognizable offence with punishment for a term which may extend to imprisonment for three years or with a fine of Rs. one lakh rupees or both. Also, Shri Manoharan (a private worker), F/o Smti Hema Rajesh) has been arrested under POC SO (Protection of Children from Sexual Offences) Act, 2012. One more accused, Smt. Celina D'souza (M/o Hema Rajesh) is absconding. It is pertinent to mention that three out of the four accused are government employees under A&N Administration. The A&N UTCPDR not only has proposed to the respective Departments to initiate disciplinary action against the accused but also will be pursuing the matter to avail financial compensation to the victim through concerned Departments.

The victim child was saved and the arrests of the accused have been possible due to the convergent efforts of the DCPU (SA) and the A&N UTCPDR, who proactively pursued the case with all line Departments. Meanwhile, the general public have been appealed to refrain from employing children as domestic help, as it is against the basic rights of the children and is a punishable offence. In case they notice any such cases in their neighborhood, they can bring the matter to the notice of the District Child Protection Units (Control Room Ph. No.03192-238881) Child Line 1098 /A&N UT Commission for Protection of Child Rights, Police or the Labor Department, a communication received here said.
