Any historical event, post Independence, which still lingers in the minds of every Islander is the Tsunami triggered by earthquake which struck the archipelago way back in the year 2004. Twelve years has rolled by since then and today it was yet another occasion to pay obeisance to the dear Islanders who lost their precious life in this unpredictable natural calamity.



The 12th anniversary of Tsunami was observed today. The Hon'ble Lt. Governor, A&N Islands, Prof. Jagdish Mukhi paid glowing tributes at the Tsunami Memorial erected in the vicinity of Andaman Water Sport Complex here this morning. He placed a wreath at the memorial. Soon after the Lt. Governor's tribute, the Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray, Chief Secretary, Shri Anindo Majumdar, Principal Secretary, Shri Raajiv Yaduvanshi, Adhyaksh ZPSA, Shri Jaydeep Kumar Dey, Chairperson PBMC, Shri B Eswar Rao, Councillors of PBMC, DGP, Shri Rajesh Malik, Dy. Commissioner SA, Shri Udit Prakash Rai, senior Officers of A&N Administration, leaders from Political Parties, near & dear of the affected families, prominent citizens and

India's spin trio, R Ashwin, Ravindra Jadeja, Jayant Yadav likely to be rested for England ODIs

New Delhi, Dec 26
India's successful spin combination of Ravichandran Ashwin, Ravindra Jadeja and Jayant Yadav are rest to be rested for upcoming ODI series against England. After securing a comprehensive 4-0 triumph in the 5-match Test series, the Indian side will be back in action on January 15, as the limited overs' series begins. As per the latest reports, MS Dhoni is likely to rest India's successful spin trio including Ashwin, Jadeja and Jayant for the entire series, just like he did in the New Zealand ODIs. The decision is taken citing the

upcoming Test matches against Bangladesh and Australia, hence selectors don't want their ever-present spinner to encounter injuries. India are schedule to play a single Test match against Bangladesh and then welcome Australia in the month of February for a four-Test rubber. While Ashwin and Jadeja's absence looks certain, Jayant might manage to grab a place in the squad alongside Amit Mishra, who bagged man of the series award in the ODI series against the Kiwis. Delhi seamer Ishant Sharma, meanwhile, looks set to spearhead India's pace attack yet again while Bhuvneshwar

Kumar, Umesh Yadav and veteran seamer Ashish Nehra are also in contention. When it comes to the batting unit, Rohit Sharma is certain to miss out after undergoing a successful thigh surgery while opener Shikhar Dhawan would be hoping to be given another chance despite failure in Tests and Ranji Trophy matches. Karun Nair and KL Rahul look set to be handed opportunities in the limited overs' team too after producing scintillating knocks in the Chennai Test.

Tom Latham's century guides New Zealand to a crushing 77-run victory over Bangladesh

Christchurch, Dec 26
Opener Tom Latham's career best 137 set New Zealand up for a crushing 77-run victory over Bangladesh in their opening one-day international at Hagley Oval today. With Latham in commanding form and Colin Munro chiming in with a rollicking 87, New Zealand posted 341-7 and the Bangladesh innings closed at 264-9 with Mushfiqur Rahim retired hurt. It was New Zealand's highest score in 26 matches against Bangladesh and Latham's

158-run stand with Munro was a New Zealand record for the fifth wicket against the tourists. For New Zealand, it was the commanding performance they were looking for after their recent 3-0 hiding by Australia. But for Bangladesh there were few highlights to launch their New Zealand tour. Their talisman Shakib Al Hasan topped their bowling (3-69) and batting (59) performances, and Mosaddek Hossain was not out 50 at the end, his maiden ODI half century.

Tamil Nadu becomes 1st team to enter semi-finals of Ranji Trophy

Chennai, Dec 26
In Cricket, Tamil Nadu has become the first team to enter the semi-finals of the ongoing Ranji Trophy. In the quarter-final played in Visakhapatnam, they defeated a star-studded Karnataka by 7 wickets, within two days of the game. Karnataka had made only 88 in their first innings on the opening day, replying to which Tamil Nadu were bowled out for 152. Karnataka were no better in the second innings as they were again all out for 150 setting a target of just 87 runs. Tamil Nadu achieved the target in 19.3 overs, with 7 wickets in hand. Dinesh Karthik, playing his 100th Ranji game, made a 30-ball 41. Indian team's in-form players - Lokesh Rahul and Karun Nair - were part of the Karnataka

round of the tournament. B Neeliah beat Srinivas Rao of RSB Hyderabad while P Satish beat GV Raman of RSB Hyderabad. It's the first time that the Island team is participating in a major tournament in chess, a communication said.

officials also attended the function. The Veterinary Health Cards were released to the beneficiaries by the chief guest. Speaking on the occasion, she expressed hope that all livestock farmers will come forward to enroll themselves for issuance of the Health Card.

Welcoming the gathering, Dr. Shivkumar spoke about the importance of issuing Veterinary Health Cards. He explained that it will help keep a record of each animal owned by the farmer and this information will be used to provide health care and extension facilities as suited. The card will have entries of vaccination, deworming and medication while keeping information on AI, calf born and inputs provided. These records will also be used to focus on individual-based needs while providing training and inputs.

On the occasion, a total of 20 cards were distributed. The department will issue similar Veterinary Health Cards to all the livestock owners of Andaman and Nicobar U.T. in the coming months.

significant steps to encourage use of plastic waste in road construction. He wished that his presence will also encourage use of plastic waste in A&N Islands as well. Large scale use of plastic waste in road construction shall open the door for better and cleaner environment of A&N Islands.

Based on field observation from different States, he informed that use of plastic waste results in higher durability less wear and tear and provide production against damages during rains by reducing porosity of flexible pavements. It also results in economical construction of roads. A&N Islands being heavy rainfall area, use of plastic waste may reduce maintenance considerably. He also suggested to adopt policy of incentives to agencies for encouraging use of plastic wastes in road construction. He hoped that Administration will allow use of plastic waste as a policy matter and implement solid waste management in Municipal area to provide sufficient amount of plastic waste to APWD for use in work, a communication said.
