

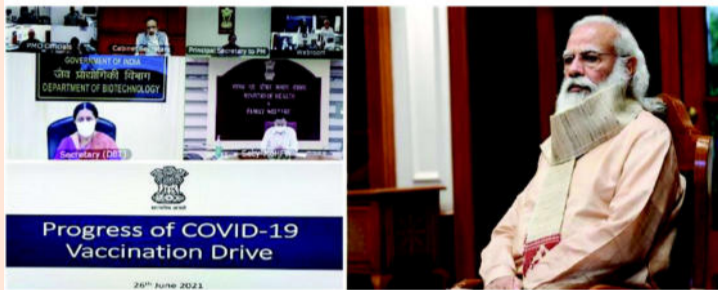


PM holds high level meeting to review progress of vaccination

Ensure that the pace of testing does not go down as testing remains a very important weapon to track & contain rising infections in any region: PM

New Delhi, June 26 (PIB)

Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi held a meeting with top officials to review the progress of vaccination & Covid situation in the country. Officials gave a detailed presentation to the PM on progress of vaccination in the country. PM was briefed about the age wise vaccination coverage. Prime Minister was also briefed about the vaccine coverage among healthcare workers, frontline workers and general population in various States.



Officials apprised the PM about the vaccine supply in the upcoming months and efforts being made to increase production. PM was informed that 3.77 crore doses have been administered in the last 6 days which is more than the entire population of countries like Malaysia, Saudi Arabia and Canada. It was also discussed that 128 districts in the country have vaccinated more than 50% of the 45+ population and 16 districts have vaccinated more than 90% of the 45+ population. PM expressed satisfaction at the rising speed of vaccinations in this week and stressed that it is important to carry this momentum forward.

Officers briefed the PM that they are in touch with State Governments to explore and implement innovative methods to

Ensuring regular supply of food grains to AAY & PHH beneficiaries under NFSA

Special dispensation to beneficiaries above 65 years or differently abled

Port Blair, June 26

All the AAY & PHH beneficiaries have been informed that GoI is taking several reform measures to bring about greater efficiency and transparency in the functioning of the TPDS since inception of NFSA, 2013 to ensure regular supply of food grains to the beneficiaries in a smooth and hassle free manner.

In this regard, Govt. of India has decided that the NFSA beneficiaries who are above 65 years of age or who are differently abled, and have no other adult member between 16 to 65 years of age listed in

the ration card and are not in a position to visit the Fair Price Shops themselves would be eligible to be covered under special dispensation. This facility has already been extended to the NFSA

beneficiaries of this UT. Such NFSA beneficiaries should apply for special dispensation to the Director of Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs, A & N Administration at Port Blair and to the Circle

Officer (CS&CA)/ Assistant Director (CS&CA) of the respective areas along with details and Aadhar number of their nominee for receiving the entitlement of food

Beneficiaries advised to furnish Life Certificate for availing financial assistance

financial assistance to be credited in their Aadhaar based bank account.

Therefore, all the above beneficiaries have been advised to furnish their Life Certificate alongwith the additional information and

documents to nearby Anganwadi workers or CDPO office on or before 30.06.2021. Thereafter, the pension benefit will be stopped if Life Certificate is not received, a press release from Directorate of Social Welfare said.

The safety of the citizens is the foremost priority of the Administration, especially during this pandemic time. To shield its citizens from the corona virus, the vaccination of eligible beneficiaries is being initiated by the Administration in different parts of the Islands. Accordingly, the vaccination began with administering of COVISHIELD vaccine for Health Care Workers followed by frontline workers and vulnerable population with comorbidities.



Subsequently, the vaccination for 45 and above was initiated followed by 18 to 44

years which is currently underway.

Meanwhile, the vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 1,60,610 beneficiaries

persons bound for Middle & North Andaman at Ferrargunj. He said today, 4 flights with 605 passengers arrived and their RTPCR reports are awaited.

More than 31 crore 50 lakh COVID vaccine doses administered to eligible adults across the country so far

New Delhi, June 26 India has achieved a significant landmark by administering over 31 crore COVID vaccine doses as the nationwide vaccination drive has picked up pace. With the availability of more vaccines and improvement in the vaccine supply chain and with the active support of States and Union Territories, the Union Government is continuously engaged in expanding the scope of Covid vaccination drive.

Over 31 crore 50 lakh Covid vaccine doses have been administered to the beneficiaries so far across the country. The Health and Family Welfare Ministry has said, over 60 lakh 19 thousand vaccine doses were administered to the beneficiaries in the last 24 hours alone. Covid Vaccine is a powerful shield in the fight against the Covid-19 pandemic. Vaccine provides vital immunity from the infection. The Health Ministry has said that more than 31 crore 17 lakh vaccine doses have been provided free of cost by the Centre to States and Union Territories so far. The ministry further added that more than 19 lakh 10 thousand 650 vaccine doses are in the pipeline and will be received by the States and Union Territories within the next 3 days. Government launches e-filing portal of Income Tax Appellate Tribunal, 'itat e-dwar'

New Delhi, June 26 Law Minister, Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad formally launched the e-filing portal of Income Tax Appellate Tribunal (ITAT), 'itat e-dwar' yesterday. The portal will enable online filing of appeals, applications and documents by various parties. Speaking on occasion, he explained the power of Digital India saying it means empowering an ordinary Indian with the power of technology and a framework for transforming India with the power of technology. Shri Prasad highlighted that nearly 129 crore of the Indian population are enrolled for Aadhar which is the digital identity to supplement one's physical identity. Nearly 40 crore bank accounts have been opened for the poor and linked to Aadhar. Shri Prasad said, Digital India has positioned India as a world leader in digital payments. He said another achievement of Digital India is the establishment of Common Service Centres (CSCs), which now stand at four lakh. The CSCs provide several services that are citizen centric and the Minister suggested that the lawyers must associate themselves in tendering legal advice to the needy through Tele Law programme, through them. The Minister added that during the pandemic and the lockdown that ensued the Judiciary functioned through digital means and he heard more than one crore cases. He stated that data about more than 18 crore cases are available in the National Judicial Data Grid (NJDG) and he suggested that cases of ITAT should also be integrated in it. (Source: india.gov.in)

grains on their behalf. Such nominee must fulfill the conditions viz. the nominee must be NFSA beneficiary tagged to the same FPS, food grains shall be issued to the nominee only after proper authentication/identification as in the case of any other NFSA beneficiary and the FPS dealer or his/her family member cannot be allotted as nominee. Further, after approval, such nominee's biometric mapping shall be made in the beneficiaries ration card to draw PDS items on his/her behalf. The Vigilance Committee(s) have also been advised to identify and recommend such beneficiary to be covered under special dispensation to the Directorate of CS&CA and to the respective Supply Units. have been vaccinated so far in A&N Islands, out of the target beneficiaries of 2, 81, 603 (approx.). A total of 39,235 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years have been vaccinated till date. A total of 5542 people were vaccinated today in A&N Islands. 3567 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which, 3150 were in the age group of 18-44 years. In North & Middle Andaman District, 1375 beneficiaries were vaccinated, out of which, 1230 were in the age group of 18-44 years. In Nicobar District, 600 beneficiaries were vaccinated, out of which, 553 were in the age group of 18-44 years.

OXYGEN SATURATION IN COVID-19

Introduction:

The percentage of Hemoglobin that is bound with Oxygen out of the total Hemoglobin is called Oxygen saturation in the blood. Oxygen saturation is commonly measured at peripheral parts of the body like finger tips, ear lobes or toes. Normal Oxygen saturation level in a human being is 94 - 100%. It is denoted by the symbol sPo2. If sPo2 is less than 94%, it is called Hypoxia and it indicates inadequate oxygenation to the tissues. Oxygen therapy may be used to assist in raising the blood oxygen levels and consequently possible increase in the oxygen supply to the tissues. We measure SPo2 by using an instrument called Pulse Oximeter.

Pulse oximeter:

It is a non - invasive method of monitoring a person's Oxygen saturation. It is a safe, convenient, non - invasive, inexpensive method to measure oxygen levels. The Pulse - Oximeter may be incorporated into the Multi - Parameter patient monitor. Most monitors also display the pulse rate. Portable Battery operated Pulse oximeters are also available for the transport of patients and for home monitoring of the patient's oxygen saturation.

It is particularly convenient for non - invasive and continuous measurement of blood oxygen saturation. It avoids blood being drawn from the patient. Pulse oximeter is useful in any setting where a patient's oxygenation including in Intensive care, Operating room, Emergency and Hospital ward settings for the assessment of any patient's oxygenation and determining the effectiveness of or the need for supplemental oxygen.

It is a medical device that indirectly monitors the Oxygen saturation of a Patient's blood (as opposed to measuring Oxygen saturation directly from a blood sample which involves pricking of the patient) and change in the blood volume in the skin, producing a photoplethysmogram that may be further processed into other measurements.

Erroneously low reading may be caused by decreased flow blood to the place being used for monitoring (often due to Limb being cold), incorrect sensor application, movement of the body part (Severing) and especially during conditions with low blood flow to be measured. To ensure the accuracy, sensor should return a steady pulse wave form.

Pulse oximeter is also not a complete measure of circulatory oxygen adequacy. If there is insufficient blood flow or inadequate Hemoglobin in the blood (anaemia), tissues can suffer hypoxia despite high arterial oxygen saturation.

The 6 minute walk test:

In COVID - 19 patients, Pulse Oximeter with early detection of SILENT HYPOXIA, in which the patients still look and feel comfortable, but their SPo2 is precariously low. This happens to the patients either in the Hospital or at home. Low sPo2 (less than 94%) may indicate moderate or severe COVID - 19 pneumonia requiring Oxygen therapy including the possible need for Mechanical Ventilation. It also shows the Pulse rate of the patient. The normal pulse rate of an adult is 60-100 beats per minute.

Continuous monitoring of saturation is essential to detect worsening of the disease early. There is a test called "6 minute walk test". If patient has normal saturation (sPO2 of >93%), he / she walks for 6 minute at normal pace and then checks the saturation at the end of 6 minutes. If there is a decrease in saturation of more than 5% it indicates patient likely having significant lung involvement and consequently, a severe form of the disease.

All COVID - 19 patients who are in home isolation should keep a Pulse Oximeter with them and keep monitoring their Oxygen saturation every 6 hours. If it goes to less than 94%, if saturation decreased by more than 5% with 6 minute walk test, they develop breathing difficulty or if their fever or cough persist for more than 5 days, they should immediately report to a Doctor. Thus, knowledge about Oxygen saturation and Pulse Oximeter may be of great help to all of us in this Pandemic situation.

Treatment of Covid 19:

1. Self - Prone is one of the most effective method to increase saturation in CoVID-19 patients. The earlier it is started, the better.
2. Drugs as decided by the Medical facility.
3. Oxygen therapy if needed, by suitable mode as decided by the Medical facility.

The target saturation for patients who need oxygen is 92 - 96%. More required Oxygen may be harmful to the patient. So, attempt is made whenever possible to reduce the amount of oxygen administered to wean the patients from Oxygen. This is to prevent Oxygen dependence / adverse effects of Oxygen in lungs. In patients with some pre-existing lung diseases, saturation of 88 - 92 % is acceptable.

We should remember that Oxygen is also a drug which is used at appropriate times, in appropriate quantity by appropriate mode. **(The contributor of this article is a Doctor of ANIIMS)**

Tap water supply increases four-fold from 7% to 31% in 117 Aspirational districts with 84 lakh households getting tap connections in just 22 months

UNDP lauds India's Aspirational Districts programme 'as a very successful model of local area development that should serve as a best practice for several countries'

New Delhi, June 26 (PIB)

An independent appraisal report released by United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) has lauded the Aspirational Districts programme (ADP) 'as a very successful model of local area

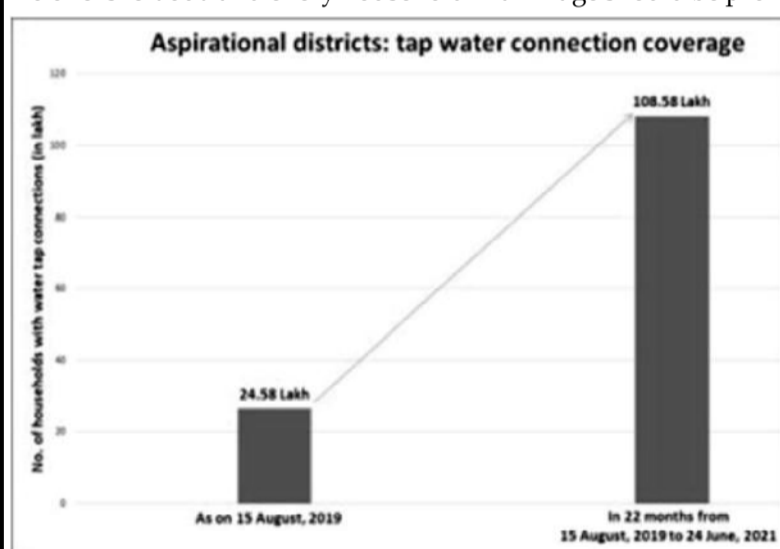
development that should serve as a best practice for several countries where regional disparities in development status persist for many reasons.'

With concerted efforts made under ADP, these 117 districts in remote locations with low human development indicators and basic facilities, have experienced faster development. Jal Jeevan Mission has played a key role to make it possible. On 15th August, 2019, when Jal Jeevan Mission was announced, only 24.58 lakh (7%) households in Aspirational Districts had tap



water supply. In a short span of 22 months, tap water connections have been provided to additional 84 lakh households in these districts and thus now 31.37% household have assured tap water supply. This 24% increase in coverage in aspirational districts is more than 22.72% increase in tap water supply across the country during these 22 months.

The Aspirational Districts Programme was launched by the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi in January, 2018 as a part of government's effort to raise the living standards of citizens living in 117 districts which were lagging behind in various human development index parameters. Jal Jeevan Mission is a key programme reducing deep inequalities in these districts. Following the principle of Prime Minister's vision of 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas', the motto of the Mission is that 'no one is left out' and every household in a village should be provided with tap water connection.



At the start of Jal Jeevan Mission in 2019, out of a total of 19.20 Crore rural households in the country, only 3.23 Crore (17%) had tap water supply. During the last 22 months, despite Covid-19 pandemic and lockdown disruptions, Jal Jeevan Mission, has been implemented with speed and 4.36 Crore households have been provided with piped connections. With the increase in coverage by about 23%, presently 7.59 Crore (39.58%) rural households across the country have tap water supply.

Goa, Telangana, Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Puducherry have achieved 100% household connection in rural areas and has become 'Har Ghar Jal'. Translating the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi's vision of providing clean tap water to every household, at present, every household in 63 districts and about 94 thousand villages has tap water supply.

Union Minister, Jal Shakti, Shri Gajendra Singh Shekhawat in his letters to the Chief Ministers of States have been constantly reiterating the emphasis given by the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi to provide tap water on priority in next few months to all households in Aspirational Districts, SC/ST majority villages and quality-affected areas.

All 3 Aspirational Districts of Telangana have become 'Har Ghar Jal'. It is expected that all households in villages of Aspirational Districts in Bihar in 2021, Gujarat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Manipur, Meghalaya, Punjab and Sikkim in 2022 will get tap water connections.

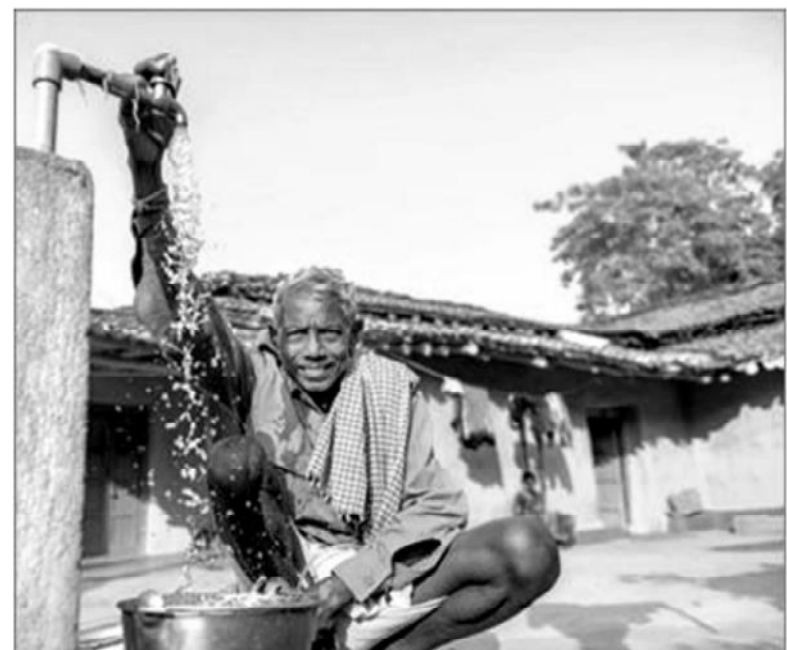
Among the States, Bihar has done a lot of good work in Aspirational Districts. Now, 72% households in 13 Aspirational Districts in State have tap water supply. In Kadapa, Andhra Pradesh, which is an Aspirational District, 82% rural households have been provided with tap water connection under Jal Jeevan Mission. Similarly, 77% households in Narmada, an Aspirational District in Gujarat, has tap water supply. Villages in this hilly region with rocky aquifer and low ground water level, had no reliable source of drinking water. A multi-village scheme of two water treatment plants was planned on Ukai reservoir. The scheme is now providing potable water in 221 villages covering 2.75 lakh people.

To ensure safe tap water to children in schools, ashramshalas and anganwadi centres in the country, Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi announced 100-days campaign, which was launched by the Union Minister Shri Gajendra Singh Shekhawat on 2nd October 2020. As a result, States/ UTs like Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Gujarat, Andhra Pradesh, Goa, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Andaman

& Nicobar Islands have made provision of tap water in schools, ashramshalas and anganwadi centres.

For other States, Union Minister, Jal Shakti, Shri Gajendra Singh Shekhawat in his letters to the Chief Ministers has urged them to ensure that in few months provision of safe tap water is made in all remaining schools, ashramshalas and anganwadi centres of their States for better health, improved sanitation and hygiene for children.

Jal Jeevan Mission announced by the Prime Minister on 15th August 2019 from Red Fort is under implementation in



partnership with States/ UTs to provide tap water connection to every rural household of the country by 2024. Total budget for Jal Jeevan Mission in 2021-22 is Rs 50,011 Crore. With State's own resources and Rs 26,940 Crore as 15th Finance Commission tied grant for water and sanitation to RLBs/ PRIs, this year, more than Rs. 1 lakh Crore are being invested in rural drinking water supply sector. This is creating new employment opportunities in villages and boosting the rural economy.

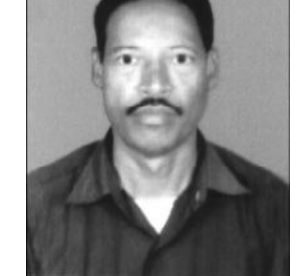
