New Delhi, July 22

The Vice President of India, Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu has asked the young officers to take the benefits of government schemes to the poorest of the poor in the society. He was addressing the gathering at Guru Puja, Samkalp, a Project by Jan Kalyan Shiksha Samiti, here today. The Vice President said that the importance of Guru in our system cannot be over-emphasized. He further said that we all know Lord Krishna himself is the Guru of all living entities. Yet, in order to teach us the importance of Guru and how to serve the Guru, Lord Krishna accepted Sandipani Muni as his spiritual master. Such is the exalted position of Guru in our tradition, he added.

The Vice President said that the Teachers at Samkalp precisely helped aspirants of Civil Service Examination, especially those, who come from a poor background and guided them to pursue their

goals with grit and determination and they deserve our admiration. The Vice President said that the challenge is to touch every section of the society and make them part of developmental process. He

GST Council reduces tax rates on over 80 items: return form simplified

New Delhi, Jul 22

The GST Council has reduced tax rates on over 80 items and exempted sanitary napkins, rakhis, stone, marble, wooden deities and Saal leaves from GST. Briefing media after chairing the 28th GST Council meeting in New Delhi yesterday, Finance Minister Shri Piyush Goyal said, GST on footwear priced below one thousand rupees will attract 5 percent rate. He said, the decisions will benefit 125 crore citizens, particularly low and middle-income families, traders and artisans. The Minister said, there will be minimal impact of these decisions on revenue collections. Shri Goyal also said that the premium to be charged under Ayushman Bharat - National Health



Protection Mission will be exempted from the GST. The Minister said, besides revenue collection, the GST council will now focus on job creation as well. He said, GST council has cleared amendments which will be passed in Parliament. Shri Goyal said, exemption limit for traders in Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh and Sikkim has been increased from 10 lakh to 20 lakh rupees. He said, simplification in tax is the

government priority. He said, soon the government will link RFID tags with Goods and Services Tax Network (GSTN) for transporters and this will reduce harassment of transporters at toll plazas. The GST Council also approved the new return formats and associated changes in the law. All taxpayers excluding small taxpayers and few exceptions will file one monthly return. The return

Govt to increase scholarship of minority communities schoolgirls

New Delhi, July 22

The Ministry of Minority Affairs has decided to increase the scholarship of schoolgirls belonging to minority communities by up to 15 per cent. The Maulana Azad Education Foundation (MAEF), a subordinate organisation of the Ministry, has decided to increase the total budget for its 'Begum Hazrat Mahal National Scholarship Scheme' for schoolgirls. MAEF Secretary Shri Rizwanur Rahman said, around Rs.

78 crore was allotted during 2017-18 under the scheme and about 1,15,000 girls were given scholarship. He said, this year, the budget will be increased to Rs. 90 crore. Shri Rahman said, around 300 'Garib Nawaz Skill Development Centres' are being run by the MAEF across the country. Under the scheme, the girl students of Class 9 and 10 are given Rs.5,000 each per year and the students of Class 11 and 12 are given Rs.6,000 each per year.

New Fire Station building being developed in Diglipur A fleet of 45 fire vehicles maintained in Isles

As part of its infrastructure development initiatives, the Fire Service Headquarters functioning under A&N Police Department is constructing new fire stations in all parts of the Islands. Accordingly, one such new Fire Station is coming up adjacent to Diglipur Police Station. The new building being constructed by the Andaman Public Works Department is nearing completion and will be inaugurated soon, Fire Service Headquarter Sources informed 'The Daily Telegrams' here recently.



The sources further informed that the new double storied building is having provision to accommodate a water tender and a water bouzer besides barrack for 20 fire personnel, a mess, room for Station Officer and watch room. Apart from this, two new fire station buildings were constructed and inaugurated at Mayabunder and Kalighat respectively, equipping the station with water tender and adequate manpower, in the month of May this year, sources added.

The Fire Service Headquarter, a crucial unit of A&N Police which plays a vital role in disaster management and firefighting, is having a total strength of 638 personnel in 24 Fire Stations spread all over the Islands while it has been maintaining a fleet of 39 Fire Vehicles which include 29 Water Tenders, 5 water Bowzers, one each of Rescue Tender, Foam tender, and Dry Chemical Powder (DCP) Tender besides two Ambulances for immediate evacuation of the persons in emergent situations. Recently, 6 new Water Tenders were inducted in the A&N Fire Service, taking the total strength of Fire Tenders to 45.

SAI selects 734 athletes for Khelo India scholarship

New Delhi, July 22
The Sports Authority of India (SAI) on Sunday cleared 734 athletes for a scholarship programme under Khelo India Talent Identification Development scheme, through which they will get training at government-accredited residential academies. An annual stipend of Rs 1.2 lakh will be given to each player on a quarterly basis to meet their out of pocket expenses, treatment of injuries and other expenses. The athletes will be put up at various Khelo India accredited academies which will take care of the training, boarding and tournament expenses of the athletes. A release from the Sports Ministry said, "For the first time ever, in order to create a strong ecosystem for nurturing talent, various private, state and SAI academies have been accredited. A High Powered Committee accredited 21 non-SAI academies as well. The plan is to develop more such academies so that young



athletes can get access to the best training without having to travel long distances." A Talent Identification Committee (TIC) was formed comprising Arjuna awardees and Dronacharya awardees to short list and propose the names of the beneficiaries to the High Powered Committee, which cleared the athletes after due diligence. It said that the talent spotting and age verification of the selected players has been done using scientific and trusted method through TW3. "The High Powered Committee also decided that a strong performance management

system would be in place and performance be rewarded. If athletes are not fulfilling this criterion and coming up to the requisite standards, they may be weeded out from the academies. "It was also decided that the academies will be divided into three categories. To encourage excellence, there will be gap analysis which will offer these academies opportunities for upgradation. At the same time there will be a strong review mechanism for academies on a periodical basis. Academies that do not maintain desired standards and fulfill the performance criteria, may be

delisted," the release said. It was also decided that athletes must report injury immediately so that timely rehabilitation can be offered. The High Powered Committee also decided to put into place a robust performance monitoring system to get the best out of everyone involved in the system. Sports Minister Col Rajyavardhan Rathore said that "transformational changes have been introduced into Indian sports". "Catch them young is no longer a slogan but is visible in our action. We are developing a sports system that connects local potential to global podiums, that encourages every Indian to have sports as a part of their lives for entertainment, education or excellence," he said.

Lakshya Sen stuns World No 1 to bag badminton gold in Asian Junior Championships

Jakarta, July 22
India's rising badminton talent Lakshya Sen on Sunday created history as he went on to bag the gold medal in men's singles competition at the Badminton Asia Junior Championships 2018 in Jakarta. The 16-year old defeated the top seed and the World No. 1 Kuntlavut Vitidsarn in straight games 21-19, 21-18 to bag the top honour at the event. The gold medal win is Sen's biggest win in his career as the world number nine became the first Indian to win the medal at the competition in six years. He also became the first individual in 53 years to win the medal in men's singles event. Sen, who was seeded sixth in the event,



joins Gautam Thakkar and PV Sindhu to become the third shuttler to win the junior Asian championship. While Sindhu had won the title in 2012, Thakkar had won the gold medal all the way back in 1965. Sen had to go past some of the strong competitors on his way to title triumph. The young shuttler defeated 2nd seed

China's Li Shifeng 21-14, 21-12 in the quarterfinal, and then had to beat 4th seed Ikhshan Leonardo Imanuel Rumbay 21-7, 21-14 to reach the final. Sen, who is a former world No. 1, had won a bronze at the same event. He had lost to China's Sun Feixiang 21-12, 21-16 in Bangkok in the semifinals.

Women's hockey World Cup: India hold England 1-1 draw

London, July 22
India held World Number Two England 1-1 in their opening match of the women's hockey World Cup in London yesterday. In the Pool B encounter, Neha Goyal gave India the lead in the 25th minute before Lily Owsley equalised from a penalty corner in the 54th minute for the hosts. India will play Ireland in their next Pool B match on Thursday. It will be followed by the pool fixture against the United States on July 29. A total of 16 teams, divided into four groups, are taking part in the tournament. The Netherlands who are the defending champions, are in Group-A with South Korea, Italy and China. Group-C comprises Argentina, Germany, Spain and South Africa, while Pool-D features Australia, New Zealand, Japan and Belgium.

Tokyo introduces futuristic mascots for 2020 Olympics

Tokyo, July 22
Japanese organisers formally introduced their doe-eyed 2020 Olympic mascots to the world on Sunday, christening them with superhero names that could provide a tongue-twisting challenge to some. The blue-checked Olympic mascot was dubbed "Miraitowa" -- combining the Japanese words for future and eternity, organisers said at an event in Tokyo. It expresses the hope for a bright future stretching off forever, according to officials. Its Paralympic partner which sports pink checks is called "Someity" -- borrowing from the year for a variety of Japan's iconic cherry trees and the



English expression "so mighty". The characters are said to combine tradition and innovation, organisers said. The pointy-eared mascots bestowed with "special powers" were unveiled in February this year after being chosen by schoolchildren from a shortlist of three across mascot-mad Japan.

Miraitowa has a "strong sense of justice and is very athletic," according to Olympic officials, adding that it also possesses magical powers that enable it "to move anywhere instantaneously". Someity is said to be "usually calm" but "gets very powerful when needed," organisers noted cryptically.

Record-breaker Muhammed Anas improves his national mark again

New Delhi, July 22
In the last two years, Muhammed Anas has rewritten the 400m national record on four occasions. The latest, at a meet in the Czech Republic where he clocked 45.24s to improve on his previous national mark of 45.31 seconds which he set at the 2018 Commonwealth Games. The record-shattering effort also bagged him the gold ahead of compatriot Muhammed Kunhu (46.68s) and Suresh Jeevan (46.98).. Anas, who had narrowly missed out on a bronze in Gold Coast, is training under coach Galina Bukharina along with other one-lap national campers near Prague. Anas's record-breaking streak began in Poland in 2016 where he rewrote Arokiya Rajiv's 45.47s



with a 45.40s run. The effort also bagged him a historic Olympic berth. He improved the mark again at the Grand Prix in Delhi clocking 45.32. He shaved a minuscule .01s in Gold Coast before making a significant cut on Saturday. The gifted quartermiler was in class 10th when his father, a failed athlete-turned-salesman, passed away after suffering a heart attack. The untimely death

left the family distraught. But Sheena, his mother, did not let the setback affect their son's upbringing. Anas, who started off as a jumper back then, had just taken his baby steps in athletics under local coach Ansar. Ansar, Anas's first coach, felt youngster would fare better on the track and convinced him to give up jump. The move proved to be the game-change.

is simple with two main tables of which one will be for reporting outward supplies and one for availing input tax credit. The Council approved the quarterly filing of return for the small taxpayers having turnover below 5 crore rupees as an optional facility. The quarterly return will be similar to main return with monthly payment facility but for two kinds of registered persons which are small traders making only B2C supply or making B2B B2C supply. For such taxpayers, simplified returns have been designed called Sahaj and Sugam. In these returns details of information required to be filled is lesser than that in the regular return. The Finance Minister informed that the Special meeting of GST council will be held on 4th of next month in Delhi and it will be focussed on Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) Sector.

Human Resource Development Minister Shri Prakash Javadekar said, it is a very good initiative which will be launched initially in Government schools and later expanded to cover all schools. The programme focuses on students of Classes 8 and 9 and special care has been taken to ensure that it does not lead to increase in the workload of the students. 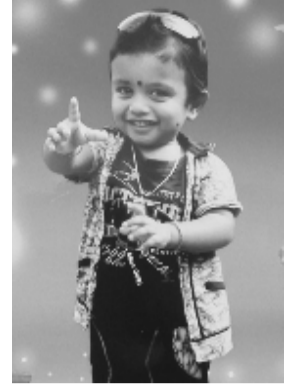
