Dream project of Oil Exploration in Islands likely to become a reality soon

Administration's prolonged persuasion with GoI yields result; "No Go" Zone area in Andaman Basin reduced to 2.19 Lakh Sq.Km

GoI constitutes Apex Steering Committee under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary to fast-track activities pertaining to the project

Applications invited from Superannuated Officers for engagement as Advisor/Officer (Coordination)

Port Blair, Aug 27

The Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) of Andaman & Nicobar Islands is about 6 lakhs sq.km forming around 30% of EEZ of the country. EEZ in the Islands has both potential for fishing and also has a potential prolific basin with sedimentary basin estimated to be 2.26 lakh sq.km. Andaman basin has 2 million metric tonnes of oil equivalent discovered and 369 million metric tonnes of oil equivalent undiscovered potential. The EEZ of the Islands was under "No Go" zone till 2018, thus restricting exploitation of oil reserve in the Islands, having huge potential for economic growth as well as socio-economic development of the Islanders. Administration's prolonged persuasion with Government of India and with the intervention of the Islands Development Agency, the Government of India has reduced "No Go" Zone area in Andaman Basin from 6 Lakh sq.km in 2018 to 3.74 Lakh sq. km. in 2019 and subsequently in March, 2020 the "No Go" Zone has been further reduced to 2.19 Lakh Sq.Km, opening up avenues for oil exploration.

The Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas, Government of India in 2018 has entrusted the responsibility of acquisition, processing and interpretation of 42,211 Line Kilometer (LKM) of 2D Seismic Data in on land unappraised areas of Indian Sediment Basins covering about 20 States and Andaman & Nicobar Islands to the Oil and Natural Gas Corporation Limited (ONGC). ONGC has engaged M/s TNG LLC a Russian company for 2D Seismic Data acquisition in Andaman on land area. The Administration during May, 2019 has granted NOC to ONGC to undertake seismic survey. The field survey in North & Middle Andaman has been

completed.

Now the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas has awarded two more blocks to M/s Oil India Ltd.(OIL) for undertaking 2D Seismic survey for appraisal of unappraised areas in Andaman deep waters. A stakeholder's meeting under the Chairmanship of the Chief Secretary

was held on 17.03.2020. M/s OIL has invited International Competitive Bids (ICB) from competent and experienced contractors through M/s OIL's e-procurement site for hiring of services for 2D Seismic Data Acquisition, Processing and Interpretation of 15,000 LKM in Andaman Basin. Opening of ICBs is scheduled on 1st September, 2020. Seismic survey is expected to be completed by twelve months from the date of award of work.

The Government of India has also constituted an Apex Steering Committee under the Chairmanship of the Chief Secretary to streamline and fast-track the activities pertaining to the project and effective coordination amongst various organisations and departments. The Apex Steering Committee is scheduled to meet after bid opening to finalize the schedule of activities and standard operating procedures.

Now for facilitating Exploration & Production operations in the Andaman & Nicobar Basin area, the Director General of Hydrocarbon under Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas is engaging Advisor/Officer (Coordination) on contract/deputation basis. Applications have been invited from superannuated officers retired from Senior Level positions/serving officers under All India Services, Central Government Services, Andaman & Nicobar Administration, CPSEs and Defence Services having minimum 03 years experience of working in the Andaman & Nicobar Islands for engagement as Advisor/Officer (Coordination) on contract/deputation basis. Last date of submission of application is 25.09.2020. The details and updates may be seen on the website www.dghindia.gov.in under job opportunities section, a press release from A&N Administration said.

A&N Administration fully geared up to ensure safety of tribes

Adequate steps taken to prevent spread of virus among Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups

Port Blair, Aug 27

The Andaman & Nicobar Administration is alert to the safety of its tribes, especially Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs). A number of proactive steps have been taken for the safety and protection of the tribes from mid-March, 2020 even before any case of COVID-19 was reported in the Islands.

There are six notified scheduled tribes in A&N Islands. Except Nicobarese, rest of the 5 tribes viz. Great Andamanese, Jarawa, Onge, Shompen and Sentinelese are recognized as PVTGs. The

Andaman Adim Janjati Vikas Samiti (AAJVS), a registered society of Govt. is monitoring and overseeing the welfare and protection of PVTGs, whereas, the Deputy Commissioner, Nicobars District through Integrated Tribal Development Agency (ITDA) is taking care of the welfare and wellbeing of the Nicobarese tribe.

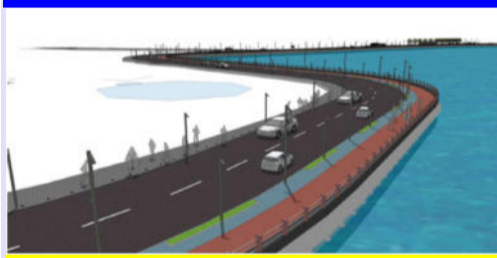
As proactive measures, the Administration had earlier shifted the Great Andamanese and Jarawa to the Strait Island and West Coast of Jarawa reserve respectively, to avoid any contact with the outsiders. The number of convoys has

been restricted for the safety of Jarawa tribe. Field functionaries have been regularly advised to interact with tribal with face mask, gloves and keeping distance. The tribal have been sensitized by field staff about COVID-19 and its precautions with pictures/videos in their own language. The movement of field functionaries of AAJVS and other line departments to the tribal settlements is being allowed only after COVID testing and they have been advised not to move outside the tribal settlement and interact

The Port Blair Smart Projects Limited is on the task to undertake various developmental projects in Port Blair City under Smart City Mission. The projects which have been approved for execution include construction of Marine Esplanade at Marina Road with restructuring of dedicated walkway having 10 M wide two-lane road, landscaping, street furniture and illumination from Marina Park entrance to Flag Point.

A Faecal Sludge Treatment Plant will come up at Brookshabad in which the

faecal sludge of households of entire municipal area will be transported on call cum roster basis through cess pool emptier and shall be processed. Apart from this, Neighborhood Parks at 6 locations in the city along with development of three sea side sites. These parks/sites shall be aesthetically provided with proper benches, illumination and parking facilities.

To facilitate working women, a Working Women's Hostel will be constructed opposite to ANHDCO Office. It will have the capacity to accommodate

upto 90 working women.

The biggest project envisaged under the Smart City Mission is the establishment of the Integrated Command and Control Centre. This facility shall collect data from various sources and turn data into information and information into insight for evidence based policy making and to make informed decision. The key objective of this project is to establish a collaborative framework where inputs from different smart city solutions and other stakeholders shall be assimilated.

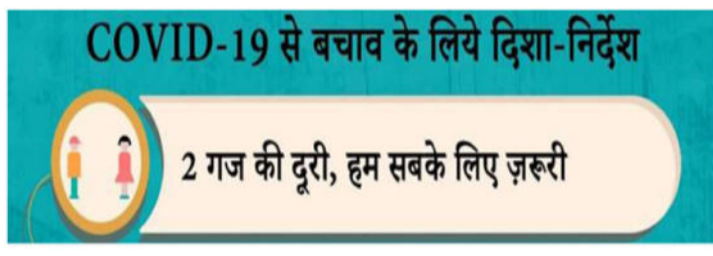

staff with protective gears from Quarantine Homes, Horn Bill Nest, Haddo Circuit House, South Point Circuit House, Pillar Hospital and Zilla Niwas and are transported to the incinerator of G.B. Pant Hospital for final disposal. PBMC provided a number of dustbins (660 liters and of 60 liters capacity) to G.B.Pant Hospital to augment the capacity of the hospital to collect its waste securely for safe disposal at the incinerator.

PBMC has been entrusted with the responsibility to sanitize the entire Municipal jurisdictions regularly by adhering to the specified norms/guidelines. Ensuring availability of fish & other sea food at reasonable price
Deptt.of Fisheries conducts raid at Mohanpura & Junglighat Modern Fish Markets
Price of different varieties of fishes notified for strict adherence

Port Blair, Aug 27
Fish is a staple for many living in A&N Islands. To ensure, fish and other seafood products are available at affordable price fixed by the Fisheries Department, a meeting was held in the chamber of the Director (CS&CA) in the presence of Director of Fisheries yesterday, to workout modalities for restraining the price hike in the open market.



Accordingly, a surprise check was conducted followed by meeting in Mohanpura and Junglighat Modern Fish Markets to assess the prevailing rate and it was found that the selling rate of fish was reasonable and as per the rate fixed earlier by the Department of Fisheries in consultation with Fishers, traders and the Department of Civil Supplies.

Similar surprise checking will also be conducted in different areas of South Andaman in the coming days for strict compliance of the rate fixed by the Department. The fish vendors have been asked to strictly follow the rate fixed by the Department.

To enable consumers have access to fishes with fixed price, the Department of Fisheries has chalked out the rates for different varieties of fishes to be sold in the retail markets of South Andaman District.

Transport restrictions to combat spread of COVID-19
Service of stage carriage buses, autorickshaws, taxis & jeeps suspended upto midnight of Aug. 31

Port Blair, Aug 27
To contain the spread of COVID-19 in the South Andaman District, the Directorate of Transport, A&N Administration in an order issued has decided to suspend public transport service like stage carriage buses, autorickshaws and taxis till the midnight of August 31, 2020. The decision has been taken following increased movement of general public in the public transport service operated in South Andaman District which might be one of the medium for transfer of virus between the infected and non infected persons resulting in faster spread of the virus.

August 25 till the midnight of August 31, 2020 in Port Blair and Ferrargunj Tehsils under South Andaman District. Accordingly, the services of all Stage carriage buses (STS and Private) shall remain suspended during this period. Similarly, services of passenger autorickshaws, Taxis and Jeeps shall also remain suspended during this period.

The Order further stated that the following transport restrictions will come into effect from the midnight of

However, for the movement of employees working in the Departments involved in essential services for performing their duties, bus service would be provided on the request of concerned department, the order to this effect issued by the Director of Transport said.

analyzed and managed on a single platform; subsequently resulting in aggregated city level information and management center. Further, it is proposed to procure 5 MTPD Bio Methanation Plant to manage the wet/organic waste, generated at various markets, which would process the wet/biodegradable wastes. Construction of Solid Liquid Resource Management (SLRM) Centre at 18 wards have also been planned to segregate, process & transport Municipal solid waste produced at various wards of Port Blair Municipal Area, as per Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016 & Hon'ble NGT's direction.

Other major infrastructure projects like Sewerage System, Storm Water Drainage, Augmenting Water Supply System and Power Quality Improvement are also proposed under Area Based Development of Smart City covering Ward Number 2,3,4 & 5.

Under Project Green Connect, Heritage Walks have also been planned. These entails to create a one-day destination through seamless integration of Gandhi Park, City Forest and Joggers park for tourists and also it will act as green lung space within the city under 'Green Connect'. Heritage Walk shall incorporate 4 locations viz. Aberdeen Memorial, Andaman Club, Clock Tower and Cellular Jail, with a vision to highlight the historical significance of each site by creating an organized trail a press release from Secretary, PBMC said.

with the outsiders. Further, all the field functionaries are being periodically tested for COVID-19. Jarawa have been provided with tools and steel rods etc. for making arrows to keep them engaged. Patrolling on the West Coast has been intensified by AAJVS, Police and Forest Departments. Fisheries Department has also sensitized fishermen not to interact with Jarawa. Jarawa have been advised to stay in smaller groups to avoid any possible spread in an event of COVID-19 outbreak. Intensive monitoring of Jarawa movement in Yeaterji, Bamboof Tikrey, Phooltala, Santipur and Katai Dera is being carried out by AAJVS staff.

Though all Great Andamanese were shifted to Strait Island in April, 2020 after conducting COVID-19 test, but many of the Great Andamanese are in Govt. jobs and have Govt. accommodation in Port Blair. So many families have returned to Port Blair in the month of June, 2020, after declaration of unlock. In view of surge in COVID-19 cases in August, 2020, the Andamanese tribal were again advised to shift to their settlement at Strait Island. While conducting the COVID-19 tests, some Great Andamanese tribal have been tested positive with mild symptoms or asymptomatic, out of which, 3 tribal have been recovered and remaining are in GB Pant Hospital as an abundant precaution or in home isolation. Most of the tribal except family members of tribal tested positive have been shifted back to Strait Island. All the active cases are in good health and under close observation.

Further, with the emergence of COVID-19 positive cases amongst the Great Andamanese, the Administration has taken some samples of Onga tribal from Dugong Creek and all have been tested negative. Further, the Administration has decided to conduct random testing of Jarawa tribal shortly. The A&N Administration reiterates its commitment to protect its Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) and their safety is of paramount importance. It will leave no stone unturned to protect our human heritage, a press release from Tribal Welfare said.



Simple Ayurvedic Procedures

1. Nasal application - Apply sesame oil / coconut oil or Ghee in both the nostrils (Pratimarsh Nasya) in morning and evening.
2. Oil pulling therapy - Take 1 table spoon sesame or coconut oil in mouth. Do not drink, Swish in the mouth for 2 to 3 minutes and spit it off followed by warm water rinse. This can be done once or twice a day.

During dry cough / sore throat




1. Steam inhalation with fresh Pudina (Mint) leaves or Ajwain (Caraway seeds) can be practiced once in a day.
2. Lavang (Clove) powder mixed with natural sugar / honey can be taken 2-3 times a day in case of cough or throat irritation.
3. These measures generally treat normal dry cough and sore throat. However, it is best to consult doctors if these symptoms persist.

Ayurvedic Immunity Promoting Measures

1.  Take Chyavanprash 10gm (1tsf) in the morning. Diabetics should take sugar free Chyavanprash.
2.  Drink herbal tea / decoction (Kadha) made from Tulsi (Basil), Dalchini (Cinnamon), Kalimirch (Black pepper), Shunthi (Dry Ginger) and Munakka (Raisin) - once or twice a day. Add jaggery (natural sugar) and / or fresh lemon juice to your taste, if needed.
3.  Golden Milk- Half tea spoon Haldi (turmeric) powder in 150 ml hot milk - once or twice a day.

Recommendations of AYUSH for positive cases of COVID-19:

- Food should be freshly cooked, warm, easily digestible, and in suitable quantity as per individual needs. Spices like Haldi (Turmeric), Jeera (Cumin), Dhaniya (coriander), Lahsun (Garlic), Adrak (Ginger), Pippali (Pepper) are recommended in cooking. Warm soups of lentils /pulses / meat can be taken as per preference. Avoid overeating.
- Use warm water for drinking (in optimal quantity at suitable intervals).
- Avoid foods/drinks like curd, banana, cold drinks, ice-cream, refrigerated items; and cold air which may trigger respiratory symptoms.
- AYUSH Kaadha: Drink 150 ml of Herbal Tea /decoction [made by boiling Tulsi (basil), Dalchini (Cinnamon), Kalimirch, Shunthi (Ginger), Munakka (Raisin) in water] once or twice a day. Jaggery and fresh lemon juice may be added for taste.
- PratimaarshyaNasya: Apply sesame oil /Coconut oil in both nostrils (Twice a day).
- Oil pooling (Gandusha): Gargle with warm water twice a day (a tea-spoon full of Sesame oil, half tea spoon Haldi and pinch of common salt may be added to water).
- Steam Inhalation: Thrice a day (Mint leaves or pinch of Ajwain (Carum seeds) may be added to the water in case of congestion)
- Half tea spoon of Clove powder or Licorice powder may be used once or twice a day along with honey for dry cough /sore throat.
- Have adequate sleep, preferably during night hours; avoid day sleep to the extent possible.
- Use warm water for bathing; and dry your hair thoroughly after head-bath.
- Stay calm and stress-free with daily practice of Yogasana, Pranayama, Meditation.
- Most important, think positive. You will overcome this problem.
