Miami Open: Ailing Rafael Nadal retires as Stan Wawrinka, Petra Kvitova fall

Florida, Mar 27
Ailing Rafael Nadal, struggling to cope with heat and humidity, retired from his second-round match on Saturday at the ATP and WTA Miami Open, handing 94th-ranked Bosnian Damir Dzumhur a 2-6, 6-4, 3-0 triumph.
Two-time Grand Slam champions Stan Wawrinka and Petra Kvitova also crashed out of the hardcourt event, but it was 14-time Grand Slam champion Nadal's exit that proved most stunning of all. The Spanish fifth seed, a four-time Miami finalist but never a champion, was also a first-match loser at the Australian Open, only the second Grand Slam opener defeat of his



career.
Dzumhur, 23, won 22 of the last 29 points as Nadal, 29, repeatedly spoke with a trainer and searched for solutions, asking for his blood pressure to be taken after two games of the third set.
Nadal battled through three more points and finally said he could not go on.

"Definitely I want Rafa to recover," said Dzumhur. "He's one of the best players in tennis and I wish all the best for him." Nadal squandered nine break-point chances before Dzumhur held in his first service game of the match. But the Bosnian double faulted away the last three points in the fourth game 6-4, 6-4.

to surrender a break and Nadal broke him again to finish off the set. Dzumhur broke Nadal in the third game of the second set but netted a forehand in the eighth game to pull the Spaniard level at 4-4. But the Bosnian responded by breaking back for a 5-4 lead, fist pumping after a backhand winner to claim the game, and held at love to force a third set. Swiss fourth seed Wawrinka, who has won titles this year at Chennai and Dubai, was ousted by Russia's Andrey Kuznetsov 6-4, 6-3 while Czech eighth seed Kvitova, the 2011 and 2014 Wimbledon winner, fell to Russian 30th seed Ekaterina Makarova 6-4, 6-4.

Indian boxers make disappointing start at Asian Olympic Qualifiers

Qian'an, China, Mar 27
The Indian boxers' campaign in the Asian Olympic Qualifiers was off to a disappointing start with all three in action on Saturday, including former Commonwealth Games champion Manoj Kumar (64kg), bowing out with opening round losses here. Manoj, a former Asian bronze-medallist, went down to Kazakhstan's Zhussupov Ablaihan. Among other Indians, Sumit Sangwan (81kg), who was coming back after a lengthy injury layoff, lost to Korea's Heeguan Yang. In the women's qualifiers being held simultaneously, Asian Games bronze-medallist Pooja Rani (75kg) was beaten by Tajikistan's Shaira Zulkaynarova to round off a poor opening day for the country's pugilists. Five Indians will be in action tomorrow, including the celebrated M C Mary Kom, who has got top seeding in the 51kg category. The five-time world champion and London Olympics bronze-medallist will be up against Kazakhstan's Nazym Kyzaybay in the first round. Also, former Asian champion Laishram Sarita (60kg) will open her campaign against Japan's Tomoko Kugimiya. Among the men, Asian Championships silver-medallist Vikas Krishan (75kg), seeded fourth, will fight it out with local favourite Zhao Minggang. Satish Kumar (+91kg) also finds himself faced with the challenge of outstaging a local boy as he takes on Haipeng Mu. In the 60kg category, Dheeraj will square off against Thailand's Pachanya Longchin.

NZ in semifinals, SA crashes out

Bangaluru, Mar 27
New Zealand underlined its status as title-favourite with a facile seven-wicket victory over South Africa in the ICC Women's World T20 here on Saturday.
New Zealand — the side has now won all four of its group-stage matches — has sealed a semifinal berth.
South Africa, on the other hand, exited the tournament after a second loss in three outings.
Opting to field first, medium-pacer Sophie Devine (three for 16) and offie Leigh Kasperek (three for 19) helped the White Ferns bowl South Africa out for a meagre 99. The catching was outstanding — wicket-keeper Rachel Priest took

the best of the lot with a low, diving one-handed effort to dismiss Sune Luus.
The chase was smooth, guided by a 57-run opening stand between Suzie Bates (29, 25b) and Rachel (28, 28b).
After Suzie and Rachel departed, the hard-hitting Sophie (27 n.o., 17b) arrived to carry her team through.
The scores: South Africa 99 in 19.3 overs (Marizanne Kapp 22, Sophie Devine three for 16, Leigh Kasperek three for 19, Erin Bermingham two for 14) lost to New Zealand 100 for three in 14.3 overs (Suzie Bates 29, Rachel Priest 28, Sophie Devine 27 n.o.).

England books a spot in the semifinal

New Delhi, Mar 27
Going to the semifinal of the World T20, England has surely ticked most of the boxes. Most importantly, the side proved it had the bowlers to deal with pressure at the 'death'.
When a gallant Angelo Mathews was threatening to take away the match that looked like going England's way for the better part of the contest, the bowling of Chris Jordan and Ben Stokes should give skipper Eoin Morgan an added reason to be pleased — to go with the relief of coming through a tough test.
If Jordan struck four times,

Stokes gave away just 19 runs, including just four in the final over when Mathews was looking for 15. As a result, England's fast bowlers complemented the batsmen in scripting a crucial victory.
But spare a thought for Mathews, who did his bit to help Lanka make a match of it but could not take the side past the finish-line. What looked like a walk in the park for England after it reduced Sri Lanka to 15 for four in its chase of 172, ended with just a 10-run victory.
The margin did not matter as the win gave England a ticket to the semifinal. The result also rendered Monday's Sri Lanka-South Africa match meaningless.

World T20 championships: Afghanistan stuns West Indies

Nagpur, Mar 27
Spirited Afghanistan upset former champions West Indies at the World Twenty20 with a thrilling six-run victory in their last Group 1 match on Sunday.
Afghanistan's four-pronged spin attack led by 17-year-old Rashid Khan and Mohammad Nabi, who returned identical figures of 2-26, restricted the West Indies to 117 for 8 on a turning wicket after Najibullah Zadran's 48 off 40 balls earlier anchored them to 123 for 7.
Despite the defeat, West Indies topped Group 1 on a superior net run-rate than England as both teams finished on six points with one defeat and three victories. West Indies will take

LG launches 'Pradhan Mantri (Contd. from page 1)

Governor informed that last year, Medical College was opened while the Administration will also open Advanced Cancer Treatment Center, Trauma Centre and Heart Treatment Centre this year.

On education, the Lt. Governor informed about starting of a Law College this year, besides a Professional College in Management. "By another two to three years, we will have our own Central University", he said. The matter of opening of a 'Sainik School' in the Islands, has also been taken up with the concerned authority for consideration, he said.

Turning to tourism sector, the Lt. Governor informed that apart from Port Blair, Havelock and Neil Islands, other small Islands will also be opened for eco-tourism.

On Corruption, the Lt. Governor said the Administration follows 'zero tolerance towards corruption' policy of the GoI and there is no scope for corruption in the 21st Century. He appealed to one and all to initiate action to inform if they come across any corrupt activities. He also lauded the ZPSA Adhyaksha for her call towards corruption free work. The Lt. Governor also stressed for strict compliance of Citizen Charter by the officers of the Administration.

The Lt. Governor thanked the Member of Parliament for the beautifully built Manglutan Community Hall under MPLAD and desired that such halls be constructed at every village under MPLAD or any other fund of the Administration, where villagers can come together and interact with one another. He also requested the CIARI and Agriculture Departments to extend the benefit of their research works to the Islands' farmers. "Their target should be to continue their research works for the benefit of the farmers", he said.

Addressing the gathering on this occasion, the Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray congratulated the A&N Administration for implementing the vision of the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, in these Islands. He requested the Administration to implement all the schemes launched by GoI, in these Islands.

Laying emphasis on 'Organic Farming' in the Isles, the MP urged the CIARI to explain the soil health card reports to the Isles farmers. Expressing the concern on the deteriorating soil health in these Isles, which is the result of the rampant use of chemical fertilizers, the MP urged the farmers to understand the alarming situation and turn towards 'organic farming'. He also requested the Administration to compensate farmers suitably as they take up organic farming. He also opined that PRI Members should be made aware of all the schemes so that they can enlighten the targeted people about the same. He also urged senior officials of the Administration to hear the grievances of the public on a regular basis.

Explaining the 'Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana' to the farmers present on the occasion, the MP said while the Govt. has allocated a sum of Rs.8800 crore for implementation of this scheme in the country, the farmers will have to pay a very nominal premium under this scheme. This new crop insurance scheme aims at providing a more efficient insurance support to the farmers of the country and become a financial support to the farmers. Govt. has decided to provide low premium insurance cover to the farmers so that they can sustain even if the yield is damaged, the MP said.

Speaking about the State Level Sanctioning Committee constituted by the Administration for implementation of the scheme in A&N Islands, the MP urged that all crops, vegetables, horticultural produces may be included under the scheme here, as declared by the Govt. of India. He also requested that farmers and people's representatives may be included in the committee for its effective implementation. The MP also suggested growing of 'sea grass' in these islands.

The MP also praised the ZPSA Adhyaksha, Smt. Minati Biswas for all her efforts in serving the people of the Islands.

Speaking on the occasion, the Adhyaksha, Zilla Parishad, South Andaman, Smt. Minati Biswas expressed happiness that the scheme was launched from Manglutan Village. She also highlighted the various problems of the farmers of the District like soil erosion and requested the Administration that APWD may be asked to work on the projects. She also urged for providing 50% subsidy to farmers for buying fertilizers, providing transportation to farmers of far flung Islands like Campbell Bay so that they can bring their produce to Port Blair easily. She also called for formation of farmers SHGs for taking up activities like poultry, piggery, fisheries etc.

The ZPSA Adhyaksha also called upon the farmers to educate their girl children and motivate them to excel in life thereby contributing towards 'women's empowerment' in the country. She also praised the cleanliness of the Port Blair city & elsewhere, under the 'Swachh Bharat Abhiyan' of the GoI.

In his brief address, the Chief Secretary (I/c), Shri Raajiv Yaduvanshi, hailed the launch of this scheme in the Islands. Similar 'Kisan Sammelans' will be organized in other Isles too, he said, urging one and all to follow the slogan 'Jai Jawan - Jai Kisan'. While underlying the need for judicious use of water by farmers, he also suggested for formation of cooperatives by farmers to take up other allied activities for better economic prosperity.

Earlier, welcoming the gathering, the Secretary, Agriculture, Smt. R. Menaka informed about the various schemes being implemented by A&N Administration for the welfare of farmers in the Islands. She also underscored the need for adopting organic farming in the Islands, for which the A&N Administration in making all efforts.

The programme concluded with the vote of thanks proposed by the Agriculture Director, Dr. G.S. Pandey.

Willey, Roy fined for breaching ICC Code of Conduct

Dubai, Mar 27
England opener Jason Roy and fast bowler David Willey have been fined for breaching the ICC Code of Conduct during their side's ICC World Twenty20 match against Sri Lanka in New Delhi on Saturday. Roy, who scored a 39-ball 42, was found to have breached Article 2.1.5 of the ICC Code of Conduct for Players and Player Support Personnel, which relates to "showing dissent at an umpire's decision during an international match". Roy displayed dissent on two accounts after he was given out leg before in the 13th over (obscene language on being given out and then throwing his bat and helmet as he left the field) for which he has been fined 30 per cent of his match fee.

Load shedding at Havelock; consumers advised

Port Blair, Mar 27
Due to break down of 400 KW hired DG set and one 320 KVA DG set at Havelock, round the clock load shedding will be exercised. The load shedding will be to the tune of 200 KW during day time, 600 KW during the evening peak & 400 KW in the night and also on as when required basis till the break down DG sets are repaired. Due to ongoing school and board examination, load shedding for general public will be exempted as far as possible. This load shedding can be avoided (minimized) if the restaurant, lodges and hotel owners cooperate and operate their own DG set as per above schedule due to severe deficit of power generation during day, evening & night. All the restaurant, hotel and lodge owners have

been requested to operate their own DG set and co-operate with the Electricity Department.

All consumers have also been requested to use barest minimum electrical equipments especially during evening peak hours i.e. from 5 pm to 10 pm. It is also suggested that during the peak hours the general public shall cooperate by judicious use of power by avoiding use of air conditioners, geysers, microwave ovens, washing machines, electrical iron, water pump etc. The work of repair of both the DG sets is in progress which may take some time. Once the DG sets are repaired, power supply will be resumed back, a c o m m u n i c a t i o n from the Executive Engineer (SA), Electricity Department said.
