District Administration (SA) conducts Camp Court at Swaraj Dweep for disposal of long-pending Land Diversion Cases

Swaraj Dweep, Apr. 27
 The District Administration, South Andaman has undertaken a focused initiative to expedite the disposal of long-pending land diversion cases pertaining to Swaraj Dweep under Sri Vijaya Puram Tehsil, with an emphasis on improving service delivery and reducing pendency.

A Camp Court was convened on 25th and 26th April, 2026 at Gram Panchayat Community Hall, Shyam Nagar, Swaraj Dweep, under the chairmanship of Shri Kamalleshwar Rao S, IAS, Assistant Commissioner, South Andaman. The primary objective of the Camp



Court was to address and resolve pending land diversion cases at the field level, thereby ensuring timely and accessible redressal for applicants.

Strengthening Public Healthcare: A&N Administration inducts Specialists to bolster Medical Services across A&N Islands

District Hospitals being strengthened to improve access to care; IPHL set up at Garacharma to enhance diagnostic services

Sri Vijaya Puram, Apr. 27
 The Directorate of Health Services, A&N Administration, has taken major steps to strengthen specialist healthcare services across the Islands. In this regard, applications were invited for filling up 32 Specialist posts in various disciplines on contractual basis for a period of one year. The vacancy notice was published in print media and uploaded in the official websites of the Administration and the Directorate of Health Services.

A total of 120 eligible applications were received, out of which, 85 candidates appeared for online interviews. Based on the recommendations of the Screening



IPHL established at District Hospital, Garacharma to strengthen diagnostic and laboratory services.

Committee, offers of appointment were issued to 32 candidates. So far, 23 candidates have accepted the offers, and 06 Specialists have already joined duty, while some candidates have sought extension of joining time. To further improve

healthcare delivery, the Directorate has also initiated strengthening of services at District Hospital, Garacharma, Dr. R.P. Hospital, Mayabunder, and BJR Hospital, Car Nicobar. This step will help reduce patient congestion at G.B. Pant Hospital, Sri Vijaya

Puram, the main referral hospital of the Islands, and bring specialist treatment closer to the people. An Integrated Public Health Laboratory (IPHL) has also been set up at District Hospital, Garacharma to strengthen diagnostic and

laboratory services. Specialists in the fields of Surgery, Medicine, Anaesthesia, Dermatology, Orthopaedics, Microbiology, Pathology, Gynaecology, and Paediatrics are being positioned at District Hospital, Garacharma to enhance healthcare facilities and ensure better access to specialist treatment for the public.

The Directorate of Health Services remains committed to providing better healthcare infrastructure and quality medical services to all residents of the Andaman & Nicobar Islands, a press release from DHS said.

Insurance, Cattle Breeding Policy and the new Community Fodder Bank scheme. Certificates were distributed to ten Veterinary Compounders who had completed Artificial Insemination training in Kerala. Sorghum seed mini kits along with leaflets on package of practices and silage making were distributed to around thirty farmers.

On 24th April, 2026, an exposure visit was organised for 30 students of Government Middle School, Dollygunj to the Livestock Farm Complex where they visited goatery, piggery, cattle and hatchery units. Director, AH&VS and Joint Director, Dr. Ajay Verma and other officers motivated the students to develop compassion towards animals. Table eggs were distributed to the students. Director, AH&VS also met poultry farmers at the Government Poultry Farm, Dollygunj. A chicks distribution programme was also organised on the occasion.

Animal Health Camps and ABC programmes were organised at various centres. At Hut Bay, Little Andaman, 14 sterilizations were performed on pet dogs and cats. A farmer meet was conducted and hatching eggs of different breeds were distributed. Animal Health Camps were also held at all Veterinary Hospitals, Dispensaries and Sub-Dispensaries where chicks, fodder seeds, medicines and dewormers were distributed and procedures like castration, spaying and anti-rabies vaccination were carried out. At Wimberlygunj, six dogs and one tom cat were castrated. At Garacharma and New Bimblitan, four dogs and one female cat were sterilized. A major Animal Health and Awareness Camp was organised at Rangachang No.5 where a large number of animals were treated. An anti-rabies vaccination camp was conducted at Shaheed Dweep while health and ABC camps were held at Port Mout and Elephant Point.

In Campbell Bay, the programme was organised at Veterinary Hospital with the presence of Shri Barnabus Manju, Shri Sanjay Ekka and Smti. Shakila Nawaz as invited guests. At Kamorta, two-day celebrations included a drawing competition for school children on 24th April and a Veterinary Health and Deworming Camp on 25th April along with fun games for CLF staff and villagers. AC Shri Kshitij Gyanraj and Captain Shri Moses Stanley graced the occasion.

Building on this expanding ecosystem, UPI is now embedded in the everyday economic fabric of the country. What began as a tool for convenience has evolved into a dependable system that supports individuals, businesses, and financial institutions alike.

For users, the experience is defined by ease and trust. Transactions can be completed anytime, from anywhere, through a single application connected to multiple bank accounts. There is no need to share sensitive banking details, and built-in safeguards ensure that payments remain secure. Support features within apps further simplify grievance redressal, making the system accessible even for first-time users.

Further strengthening this trust, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has introduced enhanced authentication mechanisms for digital payment transactions, effective from April 1, 2026. The mandate of two-factor authentication ensures that every transaction is verified through multiple layers, such as PINs, biometrics, or secure tokens alongside OTPs. This significantly reducing fraud risks while reinforcing confidence in digital platforms.

For merchants, it offers a fast and efficient way to receive funds without handling cash. They enable businesses to serve a wider customer base, including those who prefer mobile-based payments over cards or cash. Whether in small shops, street markets, or online

Not long ago, a simple financial transaction demanded time, effort, and patience. Paying bills meant standing in long queues. Sending money required a visit to the bank, filling out forms, and waiting days for confirmation. For millions in India without access to banking, it meant exclusion from the financial system itself. That India, however, is now the past.

For much of its modern history, cash remained the dominant mode of transaction. While cheques and demand drafts formalised payments, they were slow and accessible only to a limited segment. Users only need a mobile number, a UPI ID, and secure authentication to initiate instant transfers. Transactions are processed in real time, available round



the clock, and seamlessly interoperable across banks and applications.

This interoperability has been central to UPI's rapid expansion. From 216 banks in 2021 to 691 by January 2026, the network has grown into a unified payments infrastructure, enabling users to transact effortlessly regardless of their bank or platform. In parallel, its low-cost architecture has reduced barriers for individuals and merchants alike, while encouraging innovation among banks and fintech players.

At the same time, UPI is evolving into a broader financial platform. UPI Lite supports quick, small-value payments, while UPI AutoPay streamlines recurring expenses such as utility bills and subscriptions. Credit on UPI extends its reach further by enabling access to pre-approved credit lines. Building on this infrastructure, NBFCs and fintech firms are delivering loans, enabling repayments, and offering tailored financial products — expanding the reach of formal finance across the country.

This growing international footprint is facilitating cross-border transactions, supporting remittance flows, and contributing to financial inclusion, while strengthening India's role in the global fintech landscape.
