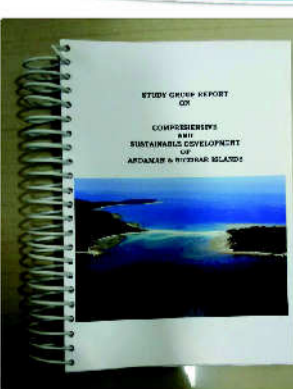

IPL 2016, Qualifier 2: Warner's unbeaten 93 helps Hyderabad beat Gujarat by 4 wickets; set-up final date with Bangalore

New Delhi, May 27 Sunrisers Hyderabad skipper David Warner was not a happy man during his team's second strategic time-out. SRH needed 46 off 25 balls with four wickets in hand after Naman Ojha was caught in the deep for 10. Warner, batting on 74 off 48 at that point, had all the reason to be annoyed as in chase of 163 his batsmen had let him down - not for the first time in the tournament. In SRH's nine victories before this game, Warner had been the only batsman to make a telling impact with five fifties and a score of 48.



On Friday against Gujarat Lions in Qualifier two, the Australian was SRH's 'Man Friday' waging a lone battle against an inspired Gujarat bowling attack. Much similar to the Royal Challengers Bangalore's predicament against Gujarat in Qualifier 1, Warner needed an Iqbal Abdulla at the other end to see his team home, and Bipul Sharma proved to be SRH's Abdulla scoring a crucial cameo off 27 off 11 balls and Warner, most fittingly, hit the winning runs to remain unbeaten on 93 off 58 balls and take his team to their maiden final. Bipul joined Warner in the middle after Ojha's dismissal and eased the pressure off his captain with a six of Praveen Kumar in the 17th over. A flick off Dhawal Kulkarni in the 18th over earned Bipul his second six towards backward of

square. Equation became 24 off two overs, and the all-important 19th over bowled by Dwayne Bravo was taken for 19 runs. Warner took two fours off it, before Bipul connected the full delivery well for the third time. The final over was just a mere formality. With this superb knock, Warner became only the fourth batsman to aggregate 700 plus runs in a single IPL season. There has been many memorable knocks in this IPL and some audacious ones too, but, Warner's innings today was one of the finest captain's knock one could ever witness. Warner lost his opening partner Shikhar Dhawan for a duck in the second over courtesy Brendon McCullum's direct hit. None of the recognised batsmen were able to hang in there with the skipper for a long period.

Apart from Moises Henriques (11), none of the top-order and the middle-order batsman reached the double-figure mark. Left-arm spinner Shivil Kausik, drafted in place of Shahdab Jakati, did well to contain Warner and Co. in the middle overs with a spell of 4-0-22-2 and managed to take the big wicket of Yuvraj Singh (8). Deepak Hooda was undone by a slower yorker from Bravo, while Ojha perished playing to the galleries. All this while, Warner soaked in the pressure and on a tricky Delhi track, rotated the strike well and did not miss out on punishing the loose deliveries to reach his eighth fifty this season. He only wanted support from the other end, which he only got from Bipul late in the day.

Sports Ministry asks states to promote football

New Delhi, May 27 To make the 2017 FIFA Under-17 World Cup a huge success, the Sports Ministry has urged all the states and Union Territories to take necessary steps to popularise and promote football in their region. The Ministry has asked them to include the game in various programmes. FIFA Under-17 World Cup is going to be held in India in October 2017 for the first time. A 'Mission 11 Million' programme has been formulated and will be launched in coordination with FIFA in about 30 cities across the country. According to a sports ministry communication the primary objective of the programme is to engage more than 11 million children in activities relating to football.

French Open: Paes, Bopanna in men's doubles third round

France, May 27 India's Leander Paes and Rohan Bopanna have sailed into the men's doubles third round with their respective partners at the French Open Tennis. In the tournament being held at Roland Garros in Paris, sixth seeded Indo-Romanian combination of Bopanna and Florian Mergea defeated the French pair of Gregoire Barrere and Quentin Halys 6-3 6-4 in the second round.

BrahMos supersonic missile's land version successfully test-fired by Indian Air Force

New Delhi, May 27 The Indian Airforce successfully test-fired an advanced version of BrahMos land-attack supersonic cruise missile on Friday. As per reports, the supersonic cruise missile was test-fired at 1200 hrs at the Pokhran field firing range in Rajasthan's Jaisalmer district. The flight conducted today met its mission parameters in a copybook manner and the designated target, the missile was hit and annihilated. The missile has a range of 290 km, has a maximum velocity of 2.8 Mach and cruises at altitudes varying from 10 metres to 15 km, claims BrahMos. The land-attack version of BrahMos is fitted on a mobile autonomous ramjet supersonic cruise missile that can be launched from submarines, ships, aircraft or land. The name BrahMos is a portmanteau



formed from the names of two rivers, the Brahmaputra of India and the Moskva of Russia. It is also capable of being launched from submarine from a depth of 40-50 metres. In 2013, it was successfully launched from a submerged platform. Meanwhile, BrahMos air-launched version is getting ready to be soon test-flown from the Su-30MKI fighter of the IAF.
