India's efforts for NSG membership will make headway in future: PM Modi

New Delhi, Jun 27

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has expressed confidence that India's membership efforts for Nuclear Suppliers Group (NSG) will make headway in the future. He said the government has started making sincere efforts in this direction. In an interview to a private TV channel, Shri Modi said all previous governments have contributed from time to time towards country's membership bid for UNSC, SCO, NSG, MTCR. However, the Prime Minister said, it was during his tenure that India succeeded in securing membership of SCO and MTCR.

On willful defaulters and economic offenders, Prime Minister warned them saying his government will set them right with the help of law. Shri Modi said people of the country have full confidence that only he can bring such cases to a logical conclusion.

The Prime Minister was asked about the cases against the willful defaulters and economic offenders who are evading the law in the country, in an obvious reference to liquor baron Vijay Mallya. Replying to a question on AgustaWestland VVIP

chopper scam, Shri Modi said there is no doubt that there are experienced and knowledgeable powers behind it. He said it is clear that such a thing could not have been done without political patronage. He said agencies are probing the matter and the outcome



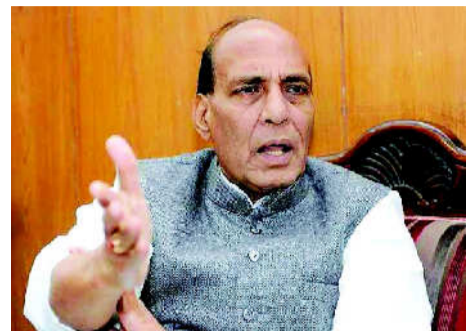
of the probe should be awaited.

Lionel Messi retires from international football

East Rutherford (United States), June 27
Ace footballer Lionel Messi on Monday announced retirement from International Football after Argentina's loss in Copa America final. Chile stunned Argentina to win the Copa America Centenario in a penalty shootout as Messi's title curse struck again.

Messi, a five-time FIFA player of the year, winner of four Champions League titles and eight Spanish La Liga crowns with Barcelona, was crushed. Much of his nation had counted on him to bring home its first major title since 1993. Playing two days after his 29th birthday, Messi lost a final for the third year in a row and the fourth time overall with Argentina.

A crowd of 82,076 filled MetLife Stadium the largest to see a soccer game in New Jersey and many wore his No. 10 jersey in Argentina's blue and white and Barcelona's navy and red. "For me the national team is over. I've done all I can, it hurts not to be a champion," the 29-year-old Barcelona superstar told reporters after his fourth defeat in a major final with Argentina.



Chile beat Argentina to retain Copa America



New Jersey, Jun 27

Defending champions Chile defeated Argentina to win the Copa America Centenario in a penalty shootout in East Rutherford, New Jersey, on Sunday as Lionel Messi's Argentina title curse continued. Messi blazed a penalty over the bar in the shootout before Lucas Biglia missed to leave Chile's Francisco Silva with the task of stroking home the winning spot-kick at the MetLife Stadium.

It was a carbon copy of last year's Copa America final, also won by Chile on penalties after a goalless draw. Argentina's players meanwhile were left disconsolate as they digested a third defeat in major final following losses to Germany in the 2014 World Cup and Chile in last year's Copa.

Heber Lopes struggled to get a grip on an ill-tempered contest played in front of a crowd of 82,026. The first yellow card of the match came in the 16th minute when Marcelo Diaz brought down Messi with a cynical hack across the thighs as the Barcelona star advanced on the Chilean goal. Argentina should have taken the lead on 21 minutes when a defensive blunder from Gary Medel, miscontrolling a back pass, allowed Gonzalo Higuain to go clean through on goal.

Team India to attend preparatory camp under new coach Anil Kumble!

New Delhi, June 27

The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) on Sunday officially announced that ahead of forthcoming tour of West Indies, Team India will undergo a preparatory camp from June 29-July 4 at NCA, Bangalore.

It means, Team India will attend the preparatory camp under newly announced chief coach Anil Kumble. On Thursday, BCCI had picked

the legendary leg-spinner to coach Team India for a year. For the upcoming tour of West Indies, Sanjay Bangar, Abhay Sharma will be assisting Kumble. India are scheduled to play four Tests in the tour. The seven-week long sojourn will have two practice matches as well. The first Test will begin from July 21 at the Vivian Richards Stadium in Antigua and Barbuda.

Sachin Tendulkar lone Indian in Brendon McCullum's all-time XI

London, June 27

Batting icon Sachin Tendulkar is the lone Indian to find a place in former New Zealand skipper Brendon McCullum's list of all-time cricketing XI with West Indian legend Vivian Richards as the captain.

McCullum's team comprises four Australians in Ricky Ponting, Adam Gilchrist, Shane Warne and Mitchell Johnson, three West Indians in Vivian Richards, Brian Lara and Chris Gayle, two Kiwis in Tim Southee and Trent Boult, Tendulkar and South Africa's Jacques Kallis.

The Kiwi great, who broke the record for fastest Test ton in his final match, opted for Gayle and Tendulkar to open the batting with former Australia skipper Ponting at first drop.

"I wanted someone destructive at the top of the order. Chris Gayle -- there ain't much better than that," McCullum was quoted as saying by lords.org. "Obviously Sachin can bat for days. Ponting is another man with phenomenal statistics, he takes the game on and even if you lose two early wickets, he's still going to come on and play

his shots and be aggressive." In the middle order, McCullum went for Lara at No.4 followed by the legendary Richards. "(Lara) can hopefully take the game away in a session. Sir Viv Richards comes in next and captains the side as well, with his charm, his swagger and his ability to hit the ball out of the park."

"Gilchrist as wicketkeeper at seven, on the back of that top six I think he can come in and

ice it off pretty quickly," he said. The bowling department is led by Aussie duo of leg-spin legend Warne and pacer Johnson along with Kiwi pace combo of Boult and Southee.

Mitchell Marsh emerged as the unlikely bowling hero for Australia as the World Cup-holders defeated the West Indies by 58 runs in the final of the Tri-Nation One-Day International Series.

Set a challenging target of 271 after wicketkeeper Matthew Wade's unbeaten 57 led an Australian lower-order revival from 173 to six to a final total of 270 for nine off 50 overs, Marsh claimed the prized wickets of Darren Bravo and Marlon Samuels, adding the scalp of opening batsman

Johnson Charles for good measure to effectively short-circuit the home side's pursuit. His disciplined medium-pacers realised miserly figures of three for 32 with the West Indies unable to recapture the impressive batting form of earlier matches in being dismissed for 212 off 45.4 overs at Kensington Oval in Barbados on Sunday. Josh Hazlewood polished off the tail to finish with the best figures of five for 50, but it was Marsh's spell that made the difference when it mattered most.
