Lt Governor inducts newly chartered Inter Island vessel 'Coral Queen' into service



Port Blair, June 27

The Lt Governor, A&N Islands, Prof. Jagdish Mukhi, formally inducted the newly chartered Inter Island vessel 'Coral Queen' into service on June 26, 2017 by cutting the ribbon and participating in puja rituals. The Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray, the Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Anindo Majumdar, the Chairperson PBMC, Shri Eswar Rao, the Adhyaksh ZPSA, Shri Jaydeep Kumar Dey, the Principal Secretary/Commissioner cum Secretary Shipping, Shri S.C.L Das and other senior officers of the Administration were present on the occasion.

The Lt. Governor along with the officials went round the ship and was briefed about the facilities available for the passengers on board. The total passenger capacity of the ship is 451, consisting of Deluxe (12 pax), Cabin (64 pax), Bunk (281) and Seats (94) besides facilities like cafeteria, recreational room, dining room and

medical bay etc. for the passengers. The vessel is fully air conditioned with better passenger amenities and has a cargo capacity of 100 Ton.

The Lt Governor also interacted with the passengers who were ready to take up their journey on the ship's maiden voyage to Hut Bay. The Lt Governor assured that the newly inducted ship will make regular trips to southern group of Islands including Hut Bay. He informed that the Islanders will witness more

improvement in shipping sector in the coming days. He said that four vessels of 150-200 passenger capacity built in Goa are ready to sail for Port Blair, once the weather is fair. Once inducted, they will further augment the Inter-Island shipping services.

'Coral Queen', carrying logo of 'Beti Bachao- Beti Padhao' on the ship's side, will also be the harbinger of gender justice and equality on high seas.

The passengers whole heartedly thanked the Lt Governor and the

Administration for chartering the vessel to ease the difficulties being faced by the people in the Southern Group of Islands.

'Coral Queen', a 1996 built vessel with a passenger capacity of 451 and with cruising speed of 12 knots, is especially chartered for providing services to the Southern Group of Islands. The induction of the vessel 'Coral Queen' has fulfilled the long felt demands of the residents of Southern Group of Islands including Hut Bay.

LG visits Chatham Saw Mill Issues directions for computerization of Timber Depots



Port Blair, June 27

The Lt. Governor, A&N Islands, Prof. Jagdish Mukhi today visited the Chatham Saw Mill to take stock of the working system of the Saw Mill. He was accompanied by the Secretary to LG, Dr. A K Singla and the OSD to LG, Shri P K Singh. On arrival at Chatham, the Lt. Governor was received by Principal Secretary E&F & PCCF, Dr. Alok Saxena and other senior officers of the Department of Environment & Forests.

During the visit, the Lt. Governor inspected the Chatham Saw Mill, and was apprised of its functioning. He issued direction to the officials of the Forest Department to computerize the Timber Depots spread over seven places in the South Andaman. This will enable the applicants, the wood based industry owners and general public to know the position of their applications. It will also check the possibility of any manipulation in issuance of timber.

The Lt. Governor was also apprised of the man power in the Saw Mill, where

about 500 workers, including regular mazdoors and industrial staff are engaged in shift system. While inquiring about the welfare measures in place for the employees, the Lt. Governor was informed that a Dispensary is being run by the DHS to cater to the health care needs of the employees at Chatham. Besides, a canteen is also being run by the Forest Department, providing refreshments and lunch facilities to as many as 70 employees daily.

Two representatives of the employees put forth before the Lt. Governor some of the genuine demands of the employees. This included non issuance of uniform, footwears etc. The Lt. Governor issued directions to the concerned officers to look into the matter and make necessary arrangements to issue the same within three months. He also directed that such facilities should be extended to the employees in a calendar year without fail. Thereafter, the Lt.

Governor inspected the canteen and issued directions for maintaining hygienic conditions in the canteen, so as to provide a healthy environment for all the employees utilizing the canteen services. Later, the Lt. Governor visited the Forest Museum and evinced keen interest in the exhibits of flora and fauna, including wooden handicrafts on display. A memento was presented to the Lt. Governor by the PCCF on the occasion.

New DGP assumes office

year 1991 and was allotted AGMUT Cadre. Prior to her posting to these Islands, she was holding the Charge of Inspector General of Police in Arunachal Pradesh. She has held various important assignments in Delhi and other areas.

Pradhan Mantri Surakshit Matritva Abhiyan

The Union Government launched Pradhan Mantri Surakshit Matritva Abhiyan (PMSMA) to provide free health check-ups to pregnant women at government health centres and hospitals. The Scheme was launched by Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare Shri J P Nadda in New Delhi. It was announced by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi during his monthly radio address Mann Ki Baat in June 2016.

Key Features

1. The national programme aims to provide pregnant ladies free ante-natal services (ANC) and required treatment for free on 9th of every month.
2. Objectives of the scheme are (i) Provide healthy life to the pregnant women. (ii) Lowering the maternity mortality rate. (iii) Making pregnant women aware of their health issues and diseases. (iv) Making sure safe delivery and healthy life of the baby.
3. The scheme is applicable only for the pregnant women in their pregnancy period of 3 to 6 months. It will provide all kinds of medical checkups completely free to pregnant



women.
4. These checkups will take place at the medical centres, government and private hospitals and private clinics across the country.
5. These free of cost tests will include blood pressure, sugar level, weight, haemoglobin test, blood test and screening.
6. Women will be marked differently using different colour stickers based on their health problems so that doctors can easily detect the problem.
Different colour stickers will be Red Sticker for Serious patients, Blue Sticker for High blood pressure and Yellow Sticker for Other diseases.

Mithali Raj & Co script history, become first team to successfully use Decision Review System

New Delhi, June 27
Indian team that headed to England for their 2017 Women's World Cup campaign, not only kick-started their journey with a comfortable 35-run victory over the host nation, but also scripted history when they became the first team to successfully use the Decision Review System (DRS) in women's cricket. It was days prior to the World Cup that

International Cricket Council (ICC) CEO Dave Richardson announced through a social media release that DRS would be used for the first time in women's cricket. And it was only in the second match of the opening day that witnessed the first use of it. It was the 18th over of England's innings where Deepti Sharma was introduced into the attack. English batswoman Natalie

Scrifer tried to play a sweep shot off the first ball, but the ball got a knick of her gloves as wicketkeeper Sushma Verma hurtled to take the catch. The umpire wasn't convinced despite the huge appeal by Indian eves, which forced Mithali to go for the review. Umpires upstairs checked and rechecked as eventually, the decision went in favour of the Women in Blue.

ISSF Junior World Championship: India win team bronze in 25m rapid fire pistol

Suhl, Germany, Jun 27
India won Team Bronze in 25 meter Rapid Fire Pistol Men Junior Shooting World Championship. India added a Bronze medal on day three of the International Shooting Sport Federation Junior World Championship Rifle/Pistol, currently underway in Suhl, Germany yesterday. The trio of Anish, Anhad Jawanda and Shivam Shukla notched up a combined score of 1711 to claim third place and



take India's overall tally from the competition to two Golds, one Silver and one Bronze medal. This is Anish's second medal of the competition.

ICC T20I Rankings: Virat Kohli retains top spot; Jasprit Bumrah rises to second position

New Delhi, June 27
Indian skipper Virat Kohli has retained his top spot amongst batsmen, while bowler Jasprit Bumrah jumped to second position in the latest ICC T20 International Rankings released on Sunday.

Virat Kohli has continued with his World No. 1 spot, sitting comfortably atop with 799 points. The 28-year-old is followed by Australia's Aaron Finch (787) and New Zealand captain Kane Williamson (745). The Delhi-based batsman also retained his top position in the recently released ICC ODI Rankings. Next Indian on the list in T20I rankings is Lokesh Rahul, at 13th position. Proteas batsman AB de Villiers, who enjoyed a rather pleasant England series post the team's forgettable Champions Trophy campaign, marked a return to the top 20 position.



In the bowling department, Pakistan's left-arm spinning all-rounder Imad Wasim edged past South African leggie Imran Tahir to climb atop in the latest ICC T20I rankings. Tahir's disappointing performance in the team's defeat to England, saw him slip down to number three. India's death-over specialist pacer Jasprit Bumrah has climbed up to the second position, standing just 16 points behind Wasim.

In all-rounders' category,

Bangladesh's superstar Shakib Al Hasan leads the chart, followed by Glenn Maxwell and Mohammad Nabi. Following England's 2-1 victory in their recently concluded T20 series against South Africa, Eoin Morgan's men clinched two points to crawl up to the second spot, pushing down Pakistan to number three. New Zealand, with 125 points, lead the chart, while India sit at position four.

Federer to start 2018 at Hopman Cup in Perth

Sydney, June 27
Swiss great Roger Federer will use the Hopman Cup in Perth as preparation for the defence of his Australian Open title in 2018, mirroring his successful early season build-up this year. The 18-time Grand Slam champion made his long-awaited comeback after six months out with a knee injury at the mixed teams tournament in January, and it served him well. Against the odds, he went on to defeat old rival Rafael Nadal in a thrilling five-set final at the Australian Open, and followed it up with titles at Miami, Indian Wells and on grass at Halle two days ago.

Rate of kerosene oil re-fixed
