Rameswaram, July 27 The Nation observes the first death anniversary of former President Dr A P J Abdul Kalam today. Union Ministers Shri Venkaiah Naidu, Shri Manohar Parikkar unveiled bronze statue of former President Dr A P J Abdul Kalam in Rameswaram today. The foundation stone of

Dr Kalam National Memorial was also laid at Rameswaram today. Union Minister Shri Venkaiah Naidu recalled the teachings and achievements of Dr Kalam. Union Minister Shri Venkaiah Naidu showered accolades on the former President recalling Dr. Kalam's Vision of making

developed India in 2020. He said that central government has selected Rameswaram under Amrut scheme as a special case. 48 crore rupees scheme has been announced for Rameswaram with 45 crore rupees for sanitation and 3 crore rupees for planting trees and garden.

Port Blair, July 27 The Lt Governor, Lt Gen A K Singh (Retd), met Hon'ble Union Minister of Civil Aviation, Shri Ashok Gajapathi Raju Pusapati today and thanked him for the outstanding support the Islands have received from the Ministry to improve the connectivity to the Islands and between the Islands.

The Lt Governor made a request to the Hon'ble Minister to include Shibpur and Campbell Bay (being unserved airports) in the Regional Connectivity Scheme. He also requested that the centre should provide VGF support to the tune of 90 % as is being done for Northeastern States instead of the proposed 80 %. He emphasized the geographical remoteness and the concomitant security imperative attached to these islands for enhanced support. The Minister was informed of the development works



being carried out at Shibpur, Car Nicobar and Campbell Bay airports.

During the meeting the held up work at the Port Blair terminal was brought up and Chairman, Airport Authority of India informed that they are seized of the matter and fresh work order could be issued shortly. The Lt Governor brought out that in the meantime the present

terminal building should be given a facelift before the oncoming tourist season.

The Lt Governor brought out the need to continue the CRJ flight via Bhubaneswar as the same flight goes to Car Nicobar. He was assured that Air India would be starting flight from 1st October as the present lease with CRJ is running out. The unstinted effort of the

Administration to get these flights was acknowledged by the Ministry.

The issue of a larger sized helicopter with 26 passenger capacity was brought out in the meeting. The Lt Governor emphasized that these helicopters are a lifeline of the Islands and requested that Pawan Hans should induct a larger helicopter at the earliest for which the

UT Administration was willing to sign an agreement. He also requested that Pawan Hans should replace their existing fleet with newer helicopters so that the capacity could be utilized optionally. He brought out that due to the ageing fleet of Pawan Hans helicopters, they are operating below their designated capacity.

## People pray for safe return of the passengers & crews

Port Blair, Jul 27 Amidst massive search operation launched by Indian Air Force, Navy and Coast Guard for the IAF aircraft AN 32, with 29 personnel on board, which went missing on Jul 22, a special prayer meet for the crew/passengers of the aircraft was organized by an NGO of the Isles, Living On The Edge (LOTE) Wimberlygunj and 'Digital Andaman', at Marina Park here this evening. The prayer meet brought together Islanders from all walks of life, who gathered at Marina Park to show solidarity with the family members of 22 year Airman Raghuvir Verma, a resident of Bahadur Line, Port Blair who was on board the missing aircraft, and all other crew members/ personnel. The OSD to the Lt. Governor, Maj. Pankaj Thakur who was also

present on the occasion and interacted with the family members of Raghuvir Verma and assured of all support. President of Andaman Tour Operators, Shri Vinod, citizens from Port Blair, Little Andaman, Shoalbay showed their solidarity and prayed for the missing AN 32. People from all walks of life joined in and offered prayers for a fruitful search operation and safe return of the crews. Shri Ranvir Verma, brother of Raghuvir varma, Mother Smt. Sunita Verma, relatives, friends and neighbours were present at the prayer meet.

Interacting with the DT Reporter, an emotional Shri Lakhi Chand Verma, working in Police Department, F/o Raghuvir Verma said, his son was posted in Barmer, Rajasthan and was coming back to meet family when this incident occurred. He said senior officials from the



Administration and the Commander in Chief ANC, Vice Admiral Bimal Verma and his wife visited his residence. Anxious family members and

well wishers expressed hope that the massive search operation carried out by the IAF, Navy and Coast Guard would yield positive outcome.

**Odisha announces Rs 60 lakh special incentive for Rio Olympic qualifiers**

Odisha, Jul 27  
Odisha government has announced 60 lakh rupees cash special incentive for six sportswomen of the state who have qualified for the Rio Olympics. The six sportspersons, sprinters Dutee Chand and Srabani Nanda and four hockey players would receive 10 lakh rupees each. Chief Minister Shri Naveen Patnaik while directing the Odisha Mining Corporation to pay the special incentive amount to the six sportswomen said the incentive would be of immense help for them to prepare for the mega event.



While Dutee has qualified to participate in the 100-metre run, Srabani has qualified for 200-metre run event. Both have also qualified for the 4X100-metre relay race. Besides, the four hockey players of the state have found places in the Indian team.

**Roger Federer to miss Rio 2016 Olympics**

Wimbledon, Jul 27  
Start tennis player, Switzerland's Roger Federer has announced that he will not compete at the Rio Olympics and miss the rest of 2016 in order to treat an injury. 34-year-old Federer reached the semi-finals of Wimbledon, where he lost to Milos Raonic, but the 17-time Slam winner underwent surgery on a knee injury in February, which forced him to miss the French Open. It was the first Grand Slam that the Swiss great had not competed in since 1998, but his

announcement to pull out of the Olympics means Federer will not take part in the US Open too and, surely ending his hopes of ever winning a singles gold - although he did win doubles gold in Beijing in 2008. Federer said that he took the decision on the advice of doctors as he aims to prolong his career for as long as possible. On Facebook, he said that after consulting with several doctors, he felt it best to end his season in order to prepare for next year. The 34-year-old has no intention of calling it quits just yet, though.

**Rio2016: Praveen Rana to replace Narsingh Yadav**

New Delhi, Jul 27  
Wrestler Praveen Rana will represent India at the Rio Olympics in 74 kilogram category, replacing Narsingh Yadav, who failed a dope test. Freestyle wrestler, Rana had earlier won a gold medal in the 74 kilogram category at the Dave Schultz Memorial wrestling tournament in USA in 2014. With the Wrestling Federation of India's decision to send Praveen to Rio, Narsingh Yadav's chances of making it to Rio, are all, but over.
