PM Modi inaugurates Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam's memorial at Rameswaram

Rameswaram, Jul 27
 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today inaugurated the memorial of former President Dr APJ Abdul Kalam at Rameswaram in Tamil Nadu. The event coincides with the second death anniversary of Dr Kalam. The memorial has been designed and established by the Defence Research and Development Organization (DRDO) in an area of over 2 acres at Pei Karumbu near the pilgrimage centre where Dr Kalam was laid to rest two years ago. The memorial has been built at a cost of about 20 crore rupees. It contains the models of Agni-II missile, SLV rocket and other products in which the former President



played a significant role. His personal belongings, the veena he used to play and several portraits are also displayed there. The Prime Minister also unveiled a life-size bronze statue of Dr Kalam in the premises of the memorial. Shri Modi also interacted with the family members of (Contd. on last page)

New continent discovered under New Zealand, called Zealandia

Washington, July 27
 New continent discovered under New Zealand, mostly submerged unknown continent beneath the South Pacific has been named as Zealandia. Researchers said Zealandia is a distinct geological entity and meets all the criteria applied to Earth's seven other continents - elevation above the surrounding area, distinctive geology, a well-defined area and a crust much thicker than that found on the ocean floor. In a paper published in the Geological Society of America's Journal, GSA Today, Zealandia measured 1.9 million square miles and is 94% underwater. The paper's authors said it had only three major landmasses, New Zealand's North and South Islands to the south, and New Caledonia to the north Zealandia.

Sri Lanka vs India, 1st Test

Hardik Pandya, Mohammed Shami put visitors on top at end of Day 2 in Galle

Galle, July 27
Hardik Pandya powered India to 600 in their first innings with fifty on debut on day two of the first Test at Galle, Sri Lanka, today. In reply, the hosts were struggling with 154 for 5 at stumps. India began the day at a solid 399 for three and added 201 runs to their overnight total. Pandya with 50 off 49 balls and Mohammad Shami 30 off 30 balls added 62 runs for the ninth wicket to help India reach the 600-run mark. For Sri Lanka, Nuwan Pradeep claimed 6 wickets,



giving away 132 runs and three wickets were taken by Lahiru Kumara for 131 runs. Pacer Umesh Yadav provided India the early breakthrough.

Mohammed Shami claimed two wickets. Upul Tharanga with 64 and Angelo Mathews with 54 were at the crease at the close of the second day.

Indian Railways rewards women cricketers with Rs 13 lakh each

New Delhi, Jul 27
Railway Minister, Shri Suresh Prabhu today announced a cash award of 13 lakh rupees for each of the 10 women cricketers employed with his department for their inspiring show at the recently concluded World Cup. 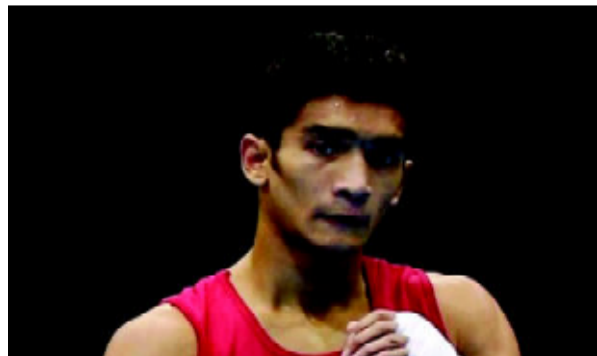
Selection of candidates for Yoga Championship

Seven of the nine Indian pugilists competing in this tournament have qualified for next month's World Championships in Hamburg, Germany.

The bus, housing science exhibits, will travel the whole nation and reach Rashtrapathi Bhavan in New Delhi on October 15th, marking the birth anniversary of Dr Kalam. The Prime Minister hoisted the National Flag and inaugurated the memorial in the presence of Tamil Nadu Governor Shri Vidyasagar Rao, Chief Minister Shri EK Palaniswamy, Central and State Ministers and other dignitaries. Later addressing a public rally at Mandapam near Ramanathapuram, Shri Modi said, Rameswaram is a sacred land that also gave Dr Kalam to the nation. He said the Central Government gives emphasis on completing mega works in record time, and the construction of Dr Kalam Memorial is an example. The Prime Minister also flagged off a weekly express train connecting the two pilgrimage towns of Rameswaram and Ayodhya. He distributed sanction letters to fishermen for long liner trawlers and released the synopsis for the Green Rameswaram Project being initiated by many agencies with public and private funding. For the fisheries project, the Centre has granted 200 crore rupees to the state. Shri Modi also dedicated to the nation a 9.5 km long stretch of National Highway linking the famous tourism spot Dhanushkodi by road that remained cut off from the mainland since the devastating cyclone 53 years ago.
