Violence in the name of faith will not be tolerated: PM Modi on 'Mann Ki Baat'

New Delhi, Aug 27

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today said that violence in the name of faith will not be tolerated. Shri Modi said no one has the right to take the law into one's own hands in the name of one's beliefs. In his 'Mann Ki Baat' programme of All India Radio, the Prime Minister said that each and every person will have to abide by the law and the law will fix accountability and the guilty will unquestionably be punished.

Saying India is the land of Buddha and Gandhi, and also it is the land of Sardar Patel who gave up his all for the unity of the nation, Shri Modi said, for centuries, our forefathers have imbibed community values, nonviolence, mutual respect and these are inherent to people. The Prime Minister appealed to the countrymen to begin a campaign, 'Swachhata hi Sewa', Cleanliness is Service, at least fifteen days prior to Gandhi

Jayanti. Shri Modi said the campaign for cleanliness which was initiated three years ago will be marking its third anniversary on 2nd October. He said the positive results are now being seen as toilets have increased from 39 per cent to 67 per cent for the population and over two lakh thirty thousand villages have declared themselves 'Open Defecation Free'. The Prime Minister called for celebrating Gandhi Jayanti this year as



'Swachh Do Aktoobar', Clean 2nd October. Lauding the efforts of volunteers of Jamiat Ulema e Hind for cleaning temples and mosques during floods in Gujarat, Shri Modi said this set an inspiring example of unity for cleanliness. Saying festivals are symbols of faith and belief, Shri Modi said individual households, festivals and cleanliness are linked together. He said

preparations for festivals always begin with cleaning. The Prime Minister also said festivals provide an opportunity to attract foreign visitors and said all should think what more can be done in this direction. Appealing to countrymen, the Prime Minister said people should not bargain with small shopkeepers, vegetable sellers and auto rickshaw drivers as they earn through sheer hard

work. Remembering hockey wizard Major Dhyana Chand, the Prime Minister said, the young generation of the country should come forward in the world of sports. VP to launch National Sports Talent Search Portal today

New Delhi, Aug 27

Vice President Shri Venkaiah Naidu will launch the Sports Ministry's much-awaited National Sports Talent Search Portal at a function in the Indira Gandhi Indoor Stadium at New Delhi tomorrow (Aug 28). The portal will enable any person from across country to upload his information and as per that the Ministry will tap their talent and train them further in their respective disciplines.

The portal will provide a three step simple process for registration, profile

creation and upload of achievements. Around 1000 kids will be selected and they will receive scholarships of 5 lakh rupees per year for eight years. The portal will be available in English and other regional languages so that any boy or girl can upload his or her achievements from any part of the country. The portal will also be available as App which can be downloaded on smart phones. Sports Minister Shri Vijay Goel said there have always been issues regarding fair selection of

talented sports persons in the state, national and international level teams in various sporting disciplines in the country. He said any child or his teacher or parent can upload the sporting achievements of the child who is eight years of age. Shri Goel said the achievements will be considered by the Sports Ministry and Sports Authority of India- SAI while short listing the talented kids, who will then be called for trials at the nearest SAI Centre for final selection.

Jan Dhan, Aadhaar and Mobile trinity has ushered in a social revolution: FM

New Delhi, Aug 27

Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley today said JAM (Jan Dhan, Aadhaar and Mobile) trinity has ushered in a social revolution which will eventually bring all Indians into a common financial, economic and digital space, similar to how GST has created a unified market. He said, within reach of the country is what might be called the 1 billion-1 billion-1 billion vision. Shri Jaitley said that is 1 billion unique Aadhaar numbers linked to 1 billion bank accounts and 1 billion mobile phones.

Large quantities of contraband tobacco products seized from two at airport; travelers, FBOs cautioned

As part of stringent action against those involved in selling, storage and distribution of contraband tobacco products, 1500 pouches and 504 pouches of Bhagban 69 brand tobacco (40 gms each) have been seized by the Food Safety Officer from the possession of Shri. M. Durga Kumar, S/o M. Nagesh Rao, R/o Jirkatang and Shri. V.K. Abdul Aziz, S/o Late V.M. Koonni, R/o Brindaban, Ferrargunj

respectively, at the arrival point of Veer Savarkar International Airport, Port Blair this afternoon with the help of SB CID, Port Blair and P.S., CCS, Port Blair. The accused have been booked under relevant section of Food Safety and Standards Act'2006. Tiny diamonds may prevent fires in smartphone batteries: Study

Washington, Aug 27

A study by scientists in the United States reveals that nanodiamonds can prevent lithium batteries from bursting into flames, making smartphones, laptops and other mobile devices safer to use. The study was published in the journal Nature Communications.



American researchers developed a recipe that can turn electrolyte solution into a safeguard against the chemical process that leads to battery-related disasters. Electrolyte solution is a key component of most batteries. Nano diamonds are tiny particles, ten thousand times smaller than the width of a hair.

Indian Coast Guard evacuates critically ill mariner from Greek Merchant Ship

Port Blair, Aug 27

Indian Coast Guard Ship Rajkamal evacuated a 19 year old Greek national deck cadet from merchant vessel Hamburg on passage to Singapore early today. The crew namely Mr. Galanisathanasios was reported suffering with severe pain in the lower right abdomen and suspected to be an appendicitis case with life threatening symptoms.

Maritime Rescue Coordinating Centre, Port Blair on receipt of request from Greek MV Hamburg for urgent medical evacuation, swung into action. Tele-



medical advice was provided by the Coast Guard Medical Officer to the crew. Although, the vessel was in Sri Lankan SRR, vessel desired to arrive off Port Blair, enroute for medical evacuation. The vessel was directed to alter course and proceed towards

Port Blair with maximum available speed to carry out early evacuation. Simultaneously, Coast Guard Ship Rajkamal was sailed with a medical team for providing assistance. The CG ship rendezvoused

Govt notifies Banking Regulation (Amendment) Act

New Delhi, Aug 27

The Government has notified the Banking Regulation (Amendment) Act. The Act authorises the Reserve Bank of India, RBI to issue directions to banks to initiate insolvency resolution process to recover bad loans. The banking sector is saddled with non-performing assets, NPAs of over 8 lakh crore rupees, of which, 6 lakh

crore rupees are with public sector banks. Earlier this month, Parliament had approved the Bill, which replaced an ordinance in this regard. The Government in May had promulgated an ordinance authorising the RBI to issue directions to banks to initiate insolvency resolution process under the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016.

Manoj, Bisht continue India's good run at World Boxing Championship

New Delhi, Aug 27
Manoj Kumar drew from his huge reservoir of experience, while Kavinder Bisht relied on sheer tenacity for hard-fought opening victories on another good day for India at the 19th World Boxing Championship. Manoj defeated Moldovan Vasili Belous 3-2 in an exhausting welterweight (69kg) contest. Kavinder, on the other hand, edged past Japan's Ryusei Baba in a similarly draining flyweight (52kg) bout, which ended 3-2 in his favour.

However, there was slight disappointment too as Asian Games bronze-medallist Satish Kumar (+91kg) bowed out of the competition after losing his opening contest to Azerbaijan's two-time world champion Mahammadrasul



Majidov 5-0. The Indian was slightly under the weather going into the contest, having suffered a bout of viral fever before coming. Kavinder was the first to take the ring for the country, which had all its bouts in the evening session for the second day in a row. The Asian Championships quarter-finalist started rather cautiously and spent the opening three minutes getting a measure of his opponent. However,

Kavinder's approach allowed Baba to land some clear blows, giving him the early advantage. Kavinder, however, made a quick recovery and became the aggressor in the second round. His right hooks connected quite well and disturbed Baba's rhythm. Kavinder upped the ante further in the final three minutes to get the decisive nod from the judges in his favour.

Daria Gavrilova stuns Dominika Cibulkova to win first career title

New York, Aug 27
Unseeded Australian Daria Gavrilova upset Slovakian second seed Dominika Cibulkova 4-6 6-3 6-4 at the Connecticut Open on Saturday for her first career WTA Tour title and a timely confidence boost ahead of the U.S. Open. Gavrilova, riding high after stunning top-seeded defending champion Agnieszka Radwanska in the semis, sealed the nearly three-hour match on her third championship point with a stinging forehand from well behind the baseline that was just out of reach of her world number 11 opponent. After dropping the first set, the 23-year-old Australian



roared back and ultimately levelled the match on her third set point when she broke Cibulkova with a forehand winner. The victory capped a remarkable week for Gavrilova, who ground out tough wins over Czech Kristyna Pliskova and Hungary's Tímea Babos

before raising her game in straight-sets dismissals of Belgian Kirsten Flipkens and Radwanska. Gavrilova will face American qualifier Allie Kiick in the U.S. Open first round on Monday.

Andy Murray pulls out of US Open 2017 with hip injury

Washington, Aug 27
Andy Murray has withdrawn from the US Open two days before the start of the tournament due to a hip injury on Saturday. The 2012 US Open champion has been out of action since Wimbledon. Murray was hampered by the injury since his loss to United States' Sam Querrey in the quarter-finals. Murray is the latest in a list on four top-10 players to pull out of the final Grand Slam of the year as he joins Novak Djokovic, Stan Wawrinka, Kei Nishikori and Milos Raonic on the sidelines.

Aussie spinners strike after Shakib, Tamim fifties

Dhaka, Aug 27
Shakib Al Hasan and Tamim Iqbal hit half-centuries for Bangladesh in their landmark 50th Test before Australian spinners struck back on the first day of the opening Test in Dhaka today. Nathan Lyon dismissed Shakib for 84 runs at the stroke of tea as the hosts reached 190-5 after electing to bat first at the rain-soaked Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium. Shakib added 155 runs with Tamim Iqbal (71) for the fourth

wicket to steady the innings after Pat Cummins rocked the side with a three-wicket burst in the morning. Occasional spinner Glenn Maxwell broke their resilience when he forced Tamim to cut one loose at backward point where David Warner took the catch. Australia were soon back on top as Lyon bowled one that took a sharp turn, forcing Shakib to hand a catch to Steve Smith at first slip. Shakib struck 11 fours in his 113-ball innings.

Saurav Ghosal, Joshna Chinappa reign supreme in national squash meet

Chennai, Aug 27
It all went according to script as top seeds Saurav Ghosal and Joshna Chinappa were crowned champions at the 74th National Squash Championship at Greater Noida on Saturday. Both Saurav and Joshna did not have it easy in the title round but they eventually managed to pull it off. Joshna was tipped to win the title after Dipika Pallikal, who beat her in the final last year, pulled out with an injury. The 30-year-old didn't put a foot wrong to notch up her 15th national title defeating Lakshya Ravendran 11-6, 8-11, 11-2, 11-4 in the final. She is now just one shy of equalling Bhuvneshwari Kumar's record of 16 titles. Saurav had a hard time fending off Maharashtra's Mahesh Mangaonkar winning



the first set but going down in the second. But he pulled back and pocketed two back-to-back sets to win 11-8, 11-13, 11-9, 11-6 and complete a dozen national titles. "Winning 12 national titles is definitely a big achievement and since it has not been done

by anyone else, it makes it all the more special. Reflecting on his match, Saurav said that the scoreline does not reflect the true story. "Mahesh is a brilliant player and it wasn't at all easy for me. It was good practice for me ahead of the upcoming China Open."

Mayweather stops fading McGregor with 10th round TKO

Las Vegas, Aug 27
A ruthless Floyd Mayweather scored a 10th round technical knockout over mixed martial arts champion Conor McGregor on Saturday, cementing his legacy as one of boxing's all-time greats. McGregor, making his professional boxing debut, had boasted he would knock out the 40-year-old American early but his lack of ring savvy betrayed him as Mayweather improved to 50-0 to surpass heavyweight

great Rocky Marciano's 49-0 record for most wins without a loss or draw. Whether the megafight will be the richest of all-time, as promoters predicted, is still to be determined but Mayweather left no doubt of his place in the pantheon of boxing greats in what he said was his last fight. As promised, McGregor came out full of fury and menace but Mayweather, long regarded as the finest defensive fighter to step into the ring, left few

openings and used the first three rounds to feel out his opponent. By the fourth round Mayweather went on the attack and started landing blow after blow against a suddenly desperate McGregor who was bravely hanging on while clutching and grabbing the American. In the 10th, Mayweather moved in for kill pinning a visibly fatigued McGregor against the ropes and landing a flurry of punches when the referee stepped in to stop the fight.
