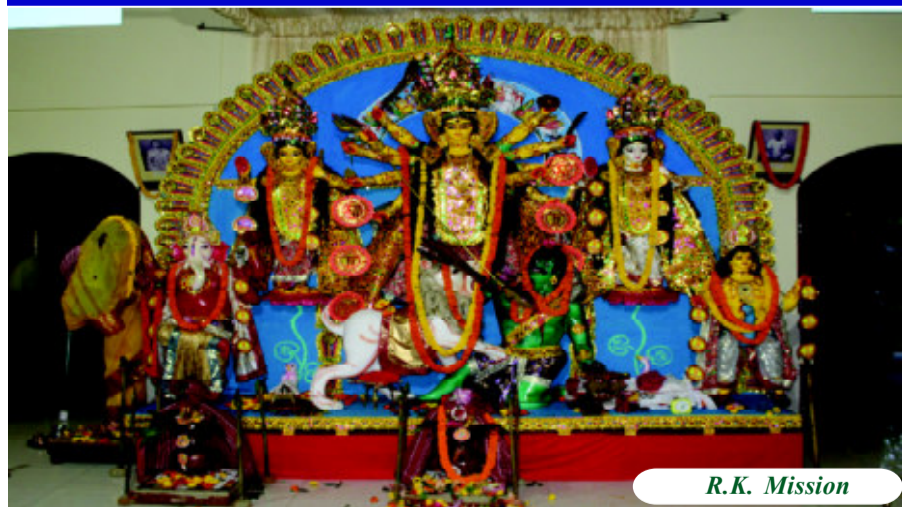
MP requests for construction of bridges between creek of Rangat & Long Island

India look to continue domination as they take on Australia in Bengaluru

Anand wins, Harika draws in third round of IOM International Chess



New Delhi, Sep 27
Five-time world champion Viswanathan Anand notched up a win over German International Master Lubbe Nikolas but Harika Dronavalli played out a draw against Swedish Grand Master Nils Grandelius in the third round of the Isle of Man International Tournament. Playing with white pieces, Anand was more active and showed better precision to outwit his opponent, who is rated 279 points below the Indian, in 42 moves. World No. 10 Harika, also playing from the white side

Bengaluru, Sept 27
There will be no let-up in intensity as a ruthless India look to inch closer to yet another series whitewash when they take on a beleaguered Australia in the fourth One-day International here tomorrow. Virat Kohli's team is going through a dream phase and if yesterday's training session at the M Chinnaswamy Stadium was any indication, the winning streak is most likely to continue. The fate of the five-match series was decided after India swept aside Australia in the first three matches, leaving the possibility of an embarrassing whitewash hanging over the tourists' heads. While the likes of Kohli and former captain Mahendra Singh Dhoni have been consistently doing what they do best, Hardik Pandya's growth as an all-rounder has added a new dimension to the team. He slammed a fluent 78, a few days after an attacking 66 -ball



83, as India comfortably chased down 294 in the last game at Indore to take an unassailable 3-0 lead. Rohit Sharma and Ajikya The visitors could not cross even 300 after centurion Aaron Finch placed them at a commanding 232 for two in 40 overs in Indore. From there, all they could muster was another 59 runs while losing four wickets. Australia will hope that skipper Stephen Smith and opener David Warner fire in the remaining games. Leg-spinner Adam Zampa, who was taken to the cleaners by Pandya in Chennai before being dropped, is likely to replace Ashton Agar with the left-amer in Australia having his broken finger assessed by a specialist. While part-time wicketkeeper Peter Handscomb failed in Indore, he should get another chance to prove he can replace Matthew Wade who was axed after a lean trot with the bat. Australian pacers, especially Nathan Coulter-Nile, have been consistent with his nagging line and length. Pat Cummins

has been a good foil for him. Asian Indoor & Martial Arts Games: Sumit Nagal bags men's singles gold medal

Ashgabat, Sep 27
Sumit Nagal bagged the men's singles gold medal in the tennis event of Asian Indoor and Martial Arts Games with a dominating win over compatriot Vijay Sundar Prashanth in Ashgabat, Turkmenistan today. Nagal outplayed Prashanth 6-1, 6-1 in the all-Indian final as he broke him five times in the match. It was the second medal for Prashanth in the tournament, having won a gold in the men's doubles with reigning singles national champion Vishnu Vardhan. Vradhan also won two medals in the tournament as he won a silver in the mixed doubles with Prarthana Thombare, who is now focussed on doubles.



Thombare also won a silver in the women's doubles with Ankita Raina, who is country's top woman singles player. The women's singles was the only event where India returned empty-handed. Overall, India won five medals - two gold and three silver medals - from tennis.

Player send-offs, DRS change in place from September 28: ICC

Dubai, Sept 27
Following the recommendations made at ICC's annual meeting in May earlier this year, the world governing body on Tuesday (September 26) introduced a host of changes to the Laws of Cricket, to be effective in all series starting on September 28 or later. The significant changes include restrictions on batsizes, changes to the existing run-out rule, player send-offs in case of serious incidents of misconduct and modification of the Decision Review System. In what has rapidly become a batsman-dominated game, the global cricket body, in its bid to strike a balance between the bat and ball, has limited the bat dimensions. With the new recommendations in place, the edge limit of a bat can be of maximum 40mm and bat depth 67mm (60mm for the depth plus an allowance of 7mm for a possible curve on the face of the bat). A new first, as per the new playing conditions, is the introduction of the player send-off law. Applicable to the Level 4

offences, a player can be sent off the field for any serious misconduct. In cases of physical violence, that include threatening an umpire, physical assault of umpire, player or spectator or any other case of physical violence - all of which constitute the Level 4 offences - a player can be disallowed from taking part in the remainder of the match. One understands that this has been done to tighten the disciplinary standards in the lower-grades of cricket, and the members of the committee had insisted that while it happens regularly in the lower levels, such incidents are rarely occur at the international level.

India to host South Asian boxing Ch'ship in Guwahati

New Delhi, Sep 27
India will be hosting the South Asian boxing Championship for the first time in Guwahati from December 6 to 10. Boxing Federation of India, BFI, after its executive committee meeting yesterday said, the country will also host the 'India International Open tournament' in New Delhi in the third week of January. In a release BFI said, Pakistan, Afghanistan, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh will participate in the Championship with other SARCC countries. The India international tournament will also see countries like Uzbekistan,
