## PM's bilateral meetings with African leaders on the sidelines of India Africa Forum Summit

New Delhi, Oct 28  
The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, today held bilateral meetings with African leaders on the sidelines of the India Africa Forum Summit in New Delhi.

The Prime Minister met Mr. Robert Mugabe, President of Zimbabwe, and Chairman of African Union. They discussed issues of common interest, including UN Reform and the threat of terrorism.

The Prime Minister spoke of the close bilateral ties between India and Zimbabwe. President Mugabe is the co-chair for the India Africa Forum Summit, and the two leaders reviewed the preparations

for the Summit. The Prime Minister met President John Dramani Mahama of Ghana. Warm ties between the two countries and growing bilateral trade came up for discussion. Areas of cooperation including agriculture, IT, skill development, cyber security and maritime security figured in the talks.

The Prime Minister met the King of Swaziland H.E. Mswati III. The Prime Minister complimented the Swaziland King on his leadership and vision, and offered assistance in its development.

The Prime Minister met Dr. Boni Yayi, President of Benin. The growing

economic relationship between the two countries, and areas of cooperation such as agricultural mechanization, power generation, water supply and transportation came up for discussion.

The Prime Minister met Mr. Muhammadu Buhari, President of Nigeria. Oil exploration, defence cooperation, and UN reform were among the areas were discussed at the meeting.

During the meeting between Mr. Uhuru Kenyatta, President of Kenya, and the Prime Minister, areas of cooperation including healthcare, infrastructure and mutual trade and economic relations came up for discussion. The

historical ties between the two countries and the large Indian diaspora in Kenya were mentioned. Terrorism and UN reform also came up for discussion.

The Prime Minister met President Jacob Zuma of South Africa. Both leaders recalled the historical ties between the two countries. Issues of terrorism, reform of the United Nations Security Council, and reform of institutions of global governance, came up for discussion.

The Prime Minister met the President of Uganda, Mr. Yoheri Museveni. The two leaders discussed ways to enhance prosperity and mutual understanding between the two countries.

## Finance Minister launches two tax-payer friendly initiatives

New Delhi, Oct. 28  
Finance Minister, Shri Arun Jaitley launched an e-Sahyog pilot project of Income-Tax Department at a function in New Delhi yesterday. The project is aimed at reducing compliance cost, especially for small taxpayers and provide an online mechanism to resolve mismatches in Income-tax returns of the assesses whose returns have been selected for scrutiny. Under the initiative, the Department will provide an end to end e-service using SMS, e-mails to inform the tax assesses of the mismatch. The taxpayers will simply need to visit the e-filing portal and log in with their user-ID and password to view mismatch related information and submit online response on the issue.

The Finance Minister also

launched a drive to provide public service at peoples' door step by holding special PAN camps in remote areas. Under the campaign, special camps are being held over two days at forty- three remote, semi urban and rural locations across the country. This is the first instance to facilitate obtaining of PAN card by persons residing in such areas.

On the occasion, Shri Jaitley interacted with applicants and officials at seven of these camps through a video conference.

**Sports Ministry to give more incentives to athletes, coaches ahead of Rio Olympics**

New Delhi, Oct 28  
With the Rio Olympics to be held in Brazil next year, India's sports ministry has decided to come up with a variety of incentives for athletes, coaches and National Sports Federations (NSFs).

According to a report, these incentives have been kept in view to boost the nation's build-up for next year's Rio Olympics and beyond. Some of the perks that the sports persons will get are allocations for national championships, improved salaries of chief coaches and the facility of air travel, which has been extended.

A revision had been announced by Sports Minister Shri Sarbananda Sonowal in Guwahati on Tuesday. Part of that revision includes the amount for senior, junior and sub-junior competitions has been increased to Rs 5 lakh, Rs 7 lakh and Rs 10 lakh respectively.

Further reports claim that the government has also decided to sanction air travel for senior players and coaches for a distance beyond 500 km. Meanwhile, the junior players have been allowed to travel by air for a distance beyond 1, 200 km in economy class.

Earlier, air travel wasn't a part of any plan. Trains were the main source, as senior players would travel by AC II tier and junior and sub-junior players would travel by sleeper class for domestic



competitions. Sub-junior players will now have the opportunity to travel in AC III tiers. Sports Minister, Shri Sarbananda Sonowal stated that air travel has been allowed for coaching camps and competitions held in north-east region of the nation. "Air travel has been allowed for coaching camps and competitions held in the North-East Region. Similarly, the

athletes from the North-East region will be allowed air travel from their residence-coaching camps to and from Kolkata," Shri Sonowal stated. Meanwhile, salaries of chief coaches has been increased drastically. This is a big bonanza for athletes and its implementation now will be key as the growth of sports in every corner and welfare of sportspersons seems to be a key factor for the government.

**Sania-Hingis off to a winning start**

Singapore, Oct 28  
Top seeds Sania Mirza and Martina Hingis got off to a winning start at the year-ending \$7 million WTA Finals, being played on the hard courts of the Singapore Indoor Stadium, here on Monday. The Indo-Swiss pair took just an hour and 15 minutes to defeat American sixth seeds Raquel Kops-Jones and Abigail Spears 6-4, 6-2 in the Red Group of the round-robin league format. Sania, who won the prestigious tournament last year with Zimbabwean Cara Black,

and Martina broke the American combination once in the first set, which was enough for them to take the lead in the match. The top seeds, who are also individually the two highest ranked players in the world, not only saved six breakpoint opportunities the Americans earned but also broke Raquel and Abigail twice to seal the second set and the tie. The Indo-Swiss pair will next take on Czech seventh seeds Andrea Hlavackova and Lucie Hradecka in the second match of the round robin.

Nov. 5th to 11th from 9 am to 9.30 pm on all days except Nov. 10 & 11 during which the closing time shall be 10 pm instead of 9.30pm. Shri Dinakaran and Shri P.J. Shekar, both Members of the Andaman Chamber of Commerce & Industry shall be the coordinators on behalf of the ACCI.

The Fire Service Department shall make necessary inspection and expedite clearance on Nov 4. The Fire tenders shall be placed on duty inside the ITF ground on all days and random inspection is to be carried out to check the fire equipments throughout the festival time. Proper parking of vehicles and overall security arrangements shall be ensured by the Police Department.

Lighting and partitions required during the period shall be arranged, but its expenditure will be borne by the dealers. The GI sheets shall be provided by the APWD and if damaged the payment shall be made by ACCI. While toilet blocks, water arrangements and sanitation will be taken care of by the PBMC. Chowkidars /guards shall be arranged by the dealers at their own expenditure.

The Dy.
