Lt. Governor visits Katchal & Car Nicobar Islands

Holds meetings with tribal leaders & Heads of Offices; inspects ongoing projects



Car Nicobar, Oct 27
The Lt. Governor, A&N Islands, Admiral D. K. Joshi, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NM, VSM (Retd.) visited Katchal and Car Nicobar Islands today. He was accompanied by the Secretary to Lt. Governor, Dr. Ajay Kumar Singla and Superintending Engineer (APWD), Shri Tej Bahadur. At Katchal, the Lt. Governor visited PHC Katchal and interacted with

the patients and the medical staff. He then proceeded to Community Hall, Japan Tikrey and met the Tribal Leaders, and local Heads of Offices. The Katchal Settlers Association met the Lt. Governor and put forth their long pending demand of issuance of Islander Identity Cards. On reaching Car Nicobar, the Lt. Governor visited Tsunami Memorial and paid homage to the

departed souls. Thereafter, the Lt. Governor visited Mus Church and laid wreath on the grave of Late Bishop John Richardson. He then visited Mus Jetty and inspected the site of sea wall construction and dredging area. The Lt. Governor also held meeting with the Tribal Council Leaders and local Heads of Offices in the Conference Hall of EOC. The Deputy Commissioner,

Nicobar District, Shri Awanish Kumar welcomed the Lt. Governor and requested the Tribal Council leaders to present their demands. The Secretary Tribal Council, Shri Martin Luther highlighted issues like construction of Sea Wall at Mus, poor BSNL connectivity, posting of

Gynecologist, posting of CDPO, installation of incinerator at BJR Hospital, Car Nicobar etc. The issue of poor shipping service and reinstatement of chartered flight service was also highlighted. The Lt. Governor assured to look into the issues and resolve them as soon as possible.

Complete identification of properties owned by de-registered companies at earliest: Centre

New Delhi, Oct 27
Government has asked States to complete the identification of properties owned by de-registered companies at the earliest and ensure that district administrations prevent transactions in those assets. Amid intensifying efforts to fight black money, the Corporate Affairs Ministry has also urged the States to initiate disciplinary action against the officials concerned in case such transactions go

through. The names of over 2 lakh companies, which were not carrying out business activities for long, had been struck off the official records and a number of directors associated with such firms disqualified. Against this backdrop, the Minister of State for Corporate Affairs Shri PP Chaudhary held a review meeting with representatives from various States in New Delhi yesterday on the action

taken with respect to properties belonging to de-registered companies. The States have been requested to share information with the Ministry in a time-bound manner. Last month, the Ministry had sent a letter to States for identification and tracking of properties belonging to around 2.09 lakh companies that were deregistered. Now, the number of such firms is about 2.25 lakh.

Regularization of past services of 495 Mazdoors of Electricity Department

MP expresses gratitude to Minister of Power

Port Blair, Oct 27
The Minister, Ministry of Power, Govt. of India has conveyed the decision for implementing the order of the Hon'ble High Court for regularisation of past service with all consequential benefits to the 495 Mazdoors in the Electricity Department. It may be recalled that during UPA-I Govt, the Ministry of Power, in compliance to the order of the Labour Court, regularized the services of Daily Rated Mazdoors of Electricity Department from 1st October 2009 without the benefit of past services and other consequential benefits since 1993-94. This was aggrieved and the

mazdoors appealed to the Hon'ble CAT & High Court, the judgment of which was upheld by the Supreme Court of India. Despite of that, the matter was delayed in the Ministry citing one and other reason. In the meantime, the Mazdoors of Electricity Department interacted with the Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray for proper redressal of their grievances. In response, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray made enormous efforts with the then Minister of Power during UPA -II govt., but all went in vain. However, after formation of BJP led Government of 16th Lok Sabha, Shri

Bishnu Pada Ray once again took up the issue with the Ministry of Power for considering the cases of Mazdoors of Electricity Department. In response, the Minister, Ministry of Power, on oct 13, 2017, has intimated the decision to implement the High Court order dated 09.04.2013. This is an exceptional & outstanding effort of the BJP led Govt. and Shri Bishnu Pada Ray has expressed his gratitude to Minister of Power, Govt. of India, Shri Raj Kumar Singh, for considering the demands of the 495 Mazdoors of Electricity Department, a communication from MP Bhawan said.

Spain to meet England in title clash of U-17 FIFA World Cup today

Kolkata, Oct 27
In Football, Spain will meet England in Kolkata tomorrow in the title clash of the Under-17 FIFA World Cup being held in India.
In the semi-finals on Wednesday, Spain defeated Mali, 3-1 at Navi Mumbai to book a Final berth for the fourth time. England stunned three-time champions Brazil by the same margin at Kolkata to enter their maiden Final.
The two losing semi-finalists - Brazil and Mali - will also play for the third place tomorrow.



All India Radio will broadcast on the match between Spain and England from 1945 hours to 2200 hours on Rainbow network and Rajdhani Channel.

India vs New Zealand, 3rd ODI: Teams arrive in Kanpur for series decider

New Delhi, Oct 27
The Indian and New Zealand cricket teams arrived in Kanpur for the third and final ODI match of the series. The iconic Green Park stadium in the city will host the series decider on Sunday (October 29).
India leveled the series 1-1 on Wednesday with a six-wicket win in Pune. The Kiwis have won the first match by an identical margin in Mumbai last

week.
In 2016, India had famously played New Zealand in their 500th Test match. Then, a special cake was cut commemorating the landmark match. The Green Park will host its first ever ODI under lights on Sunday. Lesson learnt after the Pune pitch fiasco, the Uttar Pradesh Cricket Association (UPCA) has beefed up security around the 22-yard strip for the

match. UPCA acting secretary Yudhvir Singh said the security officials at the Green Park Stadium have been clearly instructed to not allow anyone into the venue without a valid pass. The groundsman too have been strictly instructed not to discuss the nature of the pitch with anyone. BCCI curator Taposh Chatterjee is overseeing pitch preparations for the crucial game.

India ready to host any big event: FIFA president

Kolkata, Oct 27
Hours after FIFA president Gianni Infantino's arrival in the city on Thursday, the game's global governing body announced that India are now ready to host any big tournament. As the under-17 World Cup enters its final phase, FIFA has set the ball rolling for India's next target - hosting the Under-20 World Cup. Soon after landing here in the morning, Infantino had said that India "is now a football country." A few hours later, FIFA head of tournaments Jaime Yarza went a step further. "What India has now in terms of infrastructure and passion for the game, they have the ability to host any major tournament. They can do it for sure. India's infrastructure is almost at senior World Cup level," Yarza told a news conference.

Sitting beside him, All India Football Federation chief Praful Patel said that he would present the country's case as future hosts of another tournament in front of the game's powers-that-be.
Patel will attend the FIFA Council meeting, which will be held at a city hotel on Friday. "India has bid for the under-20 World Cup to be staged in 2019. I have been invited to FIFA Council meeting as (representative of) the host nation. I will use all the goodwill in my command to good use and present the case for future of Indian football," Patel maintained.
The attendance for matches of India's maiden tryst with a FIFA tournament breached the one-million mark in the final match of the round of 16. With the Salt Lake Stadium expected to see another full house during the third-place playoff and final on

Saturday, the tournament is on track to becoming the most attended World Cup at the junior level.
"This tournament is going to be the most-watched tournament in under-17 and under-20 categories ever. We are proud of this," Patel said.
FIFA boosts World Cup prize money to \$400m
Kolkata, Oct 27
The 32 national teams competing at the 2018 World Cup will share \$400 million (344 million euros) in prize money, a 12 percent increase from the 2014 tournament, FIFA said Friday.
The purse at the previous edition in Brazil was \$358 million - \$35 million of which was awarded to champions Germany, with runners-up Argentina pocketing \$25 million.

Rohan Barooah bags three gold, one silver medal in Jorhat Open Swimming Championship

New Delhi, Oct 27
Veteran swimmer Rohan Barooah won three gold and a silver medal, emerging as the best swimmer in his age group in the recently-concluded Jorhat Open State Masters Swimming Championship. Representing Kamrup district in the championship, organised

by the Jorhat Swimming Society, Rohan won gold medals in 100 Metre Freestyle, 50M Butterfly and 50M Breast Stroke events and a silver in the 50M Freestyle in his age group of 35-39 years, a press release said.
There were around 8 to 10 participants in his age group in

the Masters Swimming Championship held on October 22 at Jorhat, the release said. The fifth edition of the annual championship was held under the aegis of the Assam Swimming Association with participants from all over the state in different age groups ranging from 20 to 60 years.

Hockey India name 33 players for junior women's national camp

New Delhi, Oct 27
Hockey India on Friday named 33 players for the junior women's national camp to commence at the Sports Authority of India (Centre) in Bengaluru on Sunday.
The players will report to junior women's coach Baljeet Singh and will train together till December 16. Among the national campers Bichu Devi Kharibam, Salima Tete, Asmita Barla, Gagandeep Kaur, Ishika Choudhary, Mahima Choudhary, Suman Devi Thoudam, Sangita Kumari, Mumtaz Khan were part of the India 'A' team that participated in the recently-held Australian Hockey League (AHL) in Perth. The list also includes forward Lalremsiami who is presently with the senior women's team representing India at the women's Asia Cup in Kakamigahara, Japan. "We have quite a few girls who played at the AHL while Lalremsiami will join the camp after the women's Asia Cup.
Though we don't play an immediate tournament, the focus is on the qualifying tournaments in 2019 for the next Junior World Cup and the national camps hence forth will be focused on this target and we want to ensure we achieve the qualification," said coach Baljeet.



French Open Super-Series: Sindhu, Srikanth, Prannoy and 3 others advance to quarterfinals

Paris, Oct 27
In Badminton, Indian shuttlers, PV Sindhu, Kidambi Srikanth, H S Prannoy and 3 others advanced to the quarterfinals of the French Open Super-series tournament in Paris.
H.S. Prannoy progressed to the men's singles quarterfinals defeating Denmark's Hans-Kristian Vittinghus in straight games 21-11 21-12 today. He will next clash with 2016 Australian Open finalist Jeon Hyeok-jin of Korea. Newly-crowned Denmark Open champion Kidambi Srikanth will face fourth seeded Chinese Shi Yuqi, who had reached the finals at All England Championship in March this year.
Olympic silver medalist P V Sindhu will meet World No. 10 Chinese Chen Yufei, who had beaten the Indian in the opening round at Odense last week.
Young Indian doubles pair of

Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty, meanwhile, notched up a stunning win over World No 6 Danish combo of Mads Conrad-Petersen and Mads Pieler Kolding to reach their second quarterfinal of the season.
The World No 32 Indian pair, shocked the 2016 European champions Conrad-Petersen and Kolding 22-20 12- 21 21-19 in a match that lasted an hour.
The Indian pair will square off against another Danish pair of Mathias Boe and Carsten Mogensen, who are the 2012 London Games silver medalists.
In another men's singles pre quarterfinal match, B Sai Praneeth bowed out after losing 13-21 17-21 to Japan's Kenta Nishimoto late yesterday.
Amanpreet wins bronze at ISSF World Cup Final
New Delhi, Oct 27
India's Amanpreet Singh clinched a bronze medal in his maiden appearance in an International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) World Cup Final.
But Jitu Rai fizzled out to finish a poor seventh on the fourth day of competition in New Delhi today.
World Cup silver medalist

Amanpreet shot 202.2 to win the bronze in the final of men's 50m pistol at the Dr Kamal Singh Shooting Ranges. Rai could manage only 123.2 to finish last in the seven-man final.
Serbia's Damir Mikec won the gold medal with 229.3, while Ukrainian Oleh Omelchuk finished with silver after scoring 228.0 in a low-scoring but thrilling final.
