Prime Minister exhorts people to move towards cashless society

New Delhi, Nov 27

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today gave a clarion call to the youth of the nation to take the initiative to usher in a cashless society. Sharing his thoughts in the 26th edition of Mann Ki Baat programme on All India Radio, Shri Modi said, young people are the agents of change. He said, the youth should take to online transactions which are safe and secure and help instructing the elderly on online purchasing.

Shri Modi asked young men and women to teach at least 10 families everyday how to go cashless and make electronic payments. The Prime Minister said, common man will be trouble free if they are made aware of the digital financial transaction options and youths can do this quickly. Shri Modi also urged small traders to enter the digital world to increase their business.



He sought everyone's cooperation to make the campaign against black money a success. The Prime Minister said, the dream is a cashless society, but why can't India move towards a less-cash society. Shri Modi said, the decision was taken for the poor, farmers and labourers who are deprived and who are suffering. He said, transfer of wages of labourers and farm workers in their banks accounts will stop the problem of non-payment of minimum wages. He said, labourers must open bank accounts which can enable them to use e-wallet facility using any mobile phone. Saying farmers are backbone of Indian economy, Shri Modi said they are standing tall in tough times. He said, despite problems the sowing of crops has increased manifold.

He said, those who are trying hard to bring back black money into the system by putting it into poor people's accounts, will be severely punished if found guilty of 'benami' transactions. Shri Modi said, it will take 50 days for situation to normalise the effect of demonetization. He said, it is not easy to get rid of 70 year old problem. Complementing the citizens, the Prime Minister said, people are giving their unstinted support even though they are facing hardships. Patting the back of employees of banks and post offices, Shri Modi said, they are working day and night with dedication. He said, they are working with a mission to transform India. Prime Minister said, the spirit of people makes him confident that India will succeed.

Saying this year's Diwali was unique, Shri Modi said 1.25 billion Indians dedicated this Diwali to soldiers. (Contd. on last page)

MoUD asks all statutory Urban Local Bodies to shift to e-payments

New Delhi, Nov 27

Urban Development Ministry has asked all the statutory 4,041 Urban Local Bodies to shift to e-payments at the earliest. These cities and towns account for about 75 per cent of the total 40 crore urban population in the country. Interacting through video-conferencing with senior officials of concerned States, Urban Development Secretary Shri Rajiv Gauba emphasized that all transactions relating to both income and expenditure of urban local

bodies needs to be shifted to e-payment mode. These include payment of property tax, professional tax, water and power bills, license charges, online booking of community halls and registration of shops. An official release said, states have been asked to promote online banking using credit and debit cards for cashless transactions besides using Public Finance Management Systems developed by the Ministry of Financing for fund transfer, accounting and reconciliation up to the level of cities and towns.

New Delhi, Nov 27

Health Minister, Shri J P Nadda has said his Ministry is presently framing rules, regulations and protocols for facilitating organ donation, at India Gate today. He said there are about 1.5 lakh brain deaths happening in the country every year, and organs from them can be used for saving lives of several lakhs of patients. Shri Nadda added it is a

matter of concern that the current organ donation and transplantation rate is not close to the requirement within the country. He said government has started taking decisive steps for harvesting cadaver organs and tissues and saving many lives as a result of this. Shri Nadda said the Health Ministry is implementing the National Organ Transplant Programme

with a view to promoting organ donation from deceased persons and thereby increasing the availability of organs for transplantation. The Minister also took a pledge to donate his organs amidst thousands of enthusiasts comprising officers, staffers, doctors, nurses and other paramedical staff members of all Central Government Hospitals of New Delhi.

However, Facebook did not indicate if the Wi-Fi will provide limited access of a few websites, like its Free Basics, or provide full access.

Express Wifi empowers local entrepreneurs to help provide quality internet access to their neighbours and make a steady income, it further said.

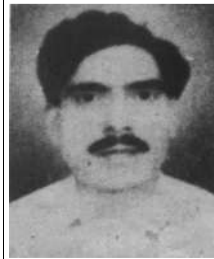

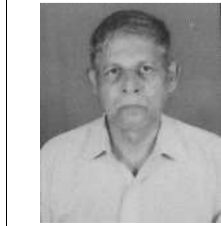

Vikas Krishan to get 'Best Boxer' award at AIBA 70th anniversary gala

New Delhi, Nov 27

In a historic first for Indian boxing, former Asian Games gold-medallist Vikas Krishan will be presented the 'Best Boxer' award by the International Boxing Association for his performance this year, during the world body's 70th anniversary celebrations on December 20.

"In recognition of your achievements throughout the year, AIBA would like to use the occasion to present you with the 2016 AIBA Pro Boxing (APB) Best Boxer award," AIBA President wrote in a letter sent to the two-time Olympian. The 24-year-old Vikas is currently in New Jersey, USA. He has been training there for more than a fortnight to



prepare for the season ahead. The two-time Asian Games medallist, a gold in 2010 and a bronze in 2014, Vikas competed in two APB bouts this year. He lost the first but went on to beat Kenya's Nickson Abaka in the second bout that was held in Delhi which was conducted by the Professional Boxing Organisation of India (PBOI). Abaka is currently

placed 8th in the AIBA APB rankings. "It is a huge honour but I am not particularly happy because I have already missed what I really wanted this year and that is an Olympic medal," Vikas told PTI over phone from New Jersey. The Haryana-lad, who is also a former World Championships bronze medallist, had gone down in the quarterfinals of the Rio Olympics.

PV Sindhu, Sameer verma lose in final of Hong Kong Open Super Series

Hong Kong, Nov 27

In Badminton, Rio Olympics silver medallist PV Sindhu and Sameer Verma today lost their respective Singles Final matches of the Hong Kong Open Super Series tournament. While Sindhu lost to fourth seed Tai Tzu Ying of Chinese Taipei, 15-21, 17-21, Sameer went down fighting local favourite Ng

Ka Long Angus, 14-21, 21-10, 11-21. It was Ying's fifth victory over Sindhu. The ace Indian has defeated the Taiwanese thrice in the past. Ying had stunned world number one Carolina Marin of Spain in the semi-finals. Sindhu had won the China Open last week following which she broke into the top-10 of the Badminton World Rankings. In the Men's Singles, Sameer Verma came into the tournament as a qualifier and had defeated third seed Jan Jorgensen of Denmark in the semi-finals.

Four Nations Hockey: India thrash Malaysia 4-1 to bag bronze



Melbourne, Nov 27

India put up a dominating performance to beat Malaysia 4-1 in the bronze medal play off match on Sunday and finish at third position in the Four Nations Invitational Tournament here. The Indians managed to control the proceedings from start to finish, scoring twice in the final quarter to post a much deserved victory.

Shrugging off yesterday's disappointment, India were looking to strike and consolidate early to avoid any pressure from the Malaysians. They started off with several quick turnovers and passes, before scoring as early as in the second minute of play. Birendra Lakra picked up the ball near centre field and drove his shot diagonally into the circle. The cross evaded everyone, before falling to Akashdeep Singh lurking at the far post. Akashdeep showed great awareness and superb skill to deflect the ball in and give India the lead.

India kept control throughout the quarter and had several more chances, most notably with a flurry of four consecutive Penalty Corners right at the death, but the Malaysians defended stoutly to go into the first break down by one goal.

Mohali Test, Day 2: Resilient Ravichandran Ashwin spurs India revival

New Delhi, Nov 27

England would be mightily pleased by the effort from their bowlers as compared to that of their batsmen the preceding day. For the second time this series, they had the Indian batsmen on the mat on Day 2 after being bowled out for 283. Had it not been for a couple of useful knocks from Virat Kohli and Cheteshwar Pujara, and a late lift from R Ashwin, the tide of the match could have very well turned towards England than where it is now. At the moment, the Test is nicely poised. India endured a slide in the final session, which saw them lose three wickets for 8 runs, before a somewhat promising stand between Kohli and Ashwin led a mini revival. At the moment, they are 271/6,

trailing England by 12 runs. They're not exactly in danger, nor far from it. They'd need to get as many as possible to get close to England's first-innings score since they are the side batting last and the surface is beginning to crack. India seemed to be on course with Pujara and Kohli shepherding their response by putting up an unbeaten 75-run stand, after the home team had lost both its openers with not much on the board. Kohli and Pujara had already bailed India out of a sticky situation when they put on 226 runs in the last Test at Vizag. The signs were ominous for England here again. Ever since he sent the second ball of his innings towards the mid-on boundary, Pujara looked freakishly

determined. He was gifted a couple of full tosses and a few dibby-dobbles for the batsman to make the merry. He drove with precision and angled his bat to guide the ball in the gaps. And while Pujara was at it, Kohli possessed a watchful eye. As the innings progressed towards the break, he opened up. Stokes was hit for consecutive boundaries and he punished Adil Rashid for bowling half-trackers. England introduced Gareth Batty in the dying stages of the second session and he bowled a few rubbish ones. Kohli didn't spare him either. It capped a second straight session that belonged to India.

Brief scores: India 271/6 (Virat Kohli 62, R Ashwin 57; Adil Rashid 3/81) trail England 283 all out by 12 runs.

Australia vs S/Africa: Rejuvenated hosts won Adelaide Test by 7 wickets, but lose series

Adelaide, Nov 27

Australia rebounded to a seven-wicket victory over South Africa to end a run of five Test defeats in the day-night third Test in Adelaide on Sunday. The Australians, rejuvenated by five team changes in response to two humiliating defeats to the Proteas to lose the series, chased down 127 runs for victory after dismissing the tourists for 250 on the fourth day of the pink-ball Test. Debutant Peter Handscomb hit the winning run to finish one not out with fellow newcomer Matthew Renshaw on 34 in Australia's 127 for three. Handscomb came to the wicket after skipper Steve Smith was caught behind for 40 off Kyle



Abbott with two runs to win. The home side also lost the wickets of David Warner and epic first-innings centurion Usman Khawaja along the way. Warner blazed 47 off 51 balls before he was run out in a mix-up and Khawaja, who batted for almost eight hours in the first innings, lasted just two balls before he was leg before wicket to a Tabraiz Shamsi wrong'un.

Australia's victory saw off the threat of South Africa taking an unprecedented series clean sweep Down Under and was just the tonic after recrimination over the team's abject form. But after seizing a 124-run innings lead, Steve Smith's team broke down the Proteas resistance for their first Test victory since beating New Zealand by seven wickets in Christchurch in February.

RBI introduces incremental CRR to manage excess liquidity in banking system

Mumbai, Nov 27

In order to absorb the surge in liquidity in banking system following demonetisation of high value notes, the Reserve Bank introduced an incremental Cash Reserve Ratio of 100 per cent for the fortnight which began yesterday. CRR is the portion of the deposits which banks are required to park to the RBI. Currently it is at 4 per cent. As per the RBI guidelines, on the increase in NDTL, Net Demand and Time Liabilities between September 16 and November 11, scheduled banks shall maintain an incremental CRR of 100 per cent, effective the fortnight beginning November 26, 2016. As per the estimates, this could be 3.5 lakh crore rupees.

RBI said, it will review the decision on December 9 or earlier as the incremental CRR is intended to be a temporary measure within RBI's liquidity management framework to drain excess liquidity in the system. The regular CRR would however continue to be at 4 per cent. RBI observed that the magnitude of surplus liquidity available with the banking system is expected to increase further in the fortnights ahead. In view of this, it has been

decided to absorb a part of this surplus liquidity by applying an incremental CRR as a purely temporary measure. RBI stated that this move is intended to absorb a part of the surplus liquidity arising from the return of now defunct 500/1000 rupees notes to the banking system, while leaving adequate liquidity with banks to meet the credit needs of the productive sectors of the economy.
