## Bali orders evacuations amid Mount Agung eruption fears

Bali, Nov 27

About 100,000 people near Bali's Mount Agung have been ordered to evacuate as officials fear a major eruption. Indonesian authorities have raised the state of alert to its highest level and expanded the exclusion zone around the rumbling volcano. The Island's airport has now closed, leaving thousands stranded in the tourist hotspot. Authorities say dark smoke and ash have been billowing up to 11,150 ft above the mountain's summit. Officials have warned residents to stay away from rock and debris flows known as lahars, which have been spotted flowing down from the mountain. Mount Agung's volcanic tremors first began in September.

## Regional Level Marine Oil Pollution Exercise by Coast Guard on Nov 29

Port Blair, Nov.27

The sea off Andaman will witness a Regional Level Marine Oil Pollution Response Exercise by the Indian Coast Guard on Nov. 29, 2017. The exercise is aimed at analyzing the preparation and coordination between various agencies in response to a marine oil spill in the Andaman sea. The Director General Indian Coast Guard is the Chairman of the NOSDCP (National Oil Spill Disaster Contingency Plan) and ICG is also the Central Coordinating Agency for oil spill response in the country. More than 64% of world's oil passes through the Ocean Channels crisis crossing the A&N Islands.

Four thousand ton, specialised pollution control vessel, Indian Coast Guard Ship (ICGS) Samudra Praharedar from mainland entered Port Blair today and will be participating in Regional Level Pollution Exercise along with A&N based Coast Guard ships and aircraft, a communication from the PRO Coast Guard said.

## Rotational load shedding by Electrify Department

Port Blair, Nov. 27

Due to the defect in Alternator of two DG sets (5 MW each) of M/s. Suryachakra Power Plant, Bambooflat, both the units have gone out of operation, resulting in shortfall of power. In order to repair these alternators, experts are required from mainland along with special spares and tools. Hence the repair work will take considerable time. To manage the shortfall of power generation through available power, the Electricity Department will exercise one-hour rotational load shedding as per schedule during evening peak hours i.e. 5 PM to 11 PM, in Port Blair and South Andaman, till both the DG sets are put in operation. The given schedule will be enforced for next one week. The load shedding schedule is tentative and the duration & timing may vary in view of emergency and technical reasons. **India maul Lanka by an innings and 239 runs to win 2nd Test**



Nagpur, Nov 27  
India trounced Sri Lanka by an innings and 239 runs to win the second cricket Test, here today. India dismissed Sri Lanka for 166 runs in 49.3 overs in their second innings just after lunch to wrap up the match well inside four days. Ravichandran Ashwin (4/63)

picked up four wickets for India, while Ravindra Jadeja (2/28), Umesh Yadav (2/30) and Ishant Sharma (2/43) shared six wickets between them. India, thus, took a 1-0 lead in the three-match series. Brief scores: Sri Lanka 1st innings: 205 & 166 all out in 49.3 overs

**India thump Pakistan, South Korea to win Asian Kabaddi Championship 2017 titles**



Gorgan, Nov 27  
For the second time in a week, Ajay Thakur proved to be the decisive man for India over Pakistan as the world champions edged the neighbours 36-22 to win the Asian Kabaddi Championship gold medal in Gorgan, Iran on Sunday. Thakur produced a match-winning showing as India dominated the final completely and Pakistan never came close to bothering Rambir Singh Khokkar-coached side. Sandeep Narwal returned to India's line-up ahead of Mohit Chhillar who had played in the semifinal against South Korea

the same day. Narwal repaid his coach's faith with a solid performance on the right corner position and cancelled out any plans Pakistan made of attacking from that side. However, it was Thakur's raiding skills that got India over the winning line and kept Pakistan team at arm's length. His attacking spree gave India a strong start and ruined any plans the men in green may have had of exacting revenge of their 18-44 defeat in the group stages. At half time, India led 25-10 and showed no signs of letting go of their lead. With the game more-or-less

the bag, India had to ensure they remain steady in the second half and keep Pakistan away from scoring big raids – and that is exactly what they did. India brought in all their experience into the second half as Pardeep Narwal and Maninder Singh chipped in with useful raid points to help Thakur's cause as well. In the end, India had ensured a comfortable 14 point margin to be crowned champions of Asia. Earlier in the group stages, Thakur had scored 12 raid points and Maninder Singh chipped in with 11 points to give India a resounding 44-18 victory over Pakistan.

**India win five golds at World Women's Youth Boxing C'ships**



Guwahati, Nov 26  
At the AIBA World Women's Youth Boxing Championships in Guwahati, it was gold rush for India on Sunday. The country's pugilists grabbed five top positions to finish overall champions for the first time. The girls who won the coveted yellow metals are: Nitu in the 48kg category, Jyoti Gulia in 51kg, Sakshi Choudhury in 54kg, Shashi Chopra in the 57kg and Ankushita Boro in 64kg division. Adding to the tally were two bronze medals secured by

Neha Yadav in the Plus 81kg and Anupama in 81kg, making it India's best ever performance at the marquee age group event. The country had won just one bronze medal at the previous edition of the event and had not won a gold since 2011 when Sarjubala Devi secured the yellow metal. The championship has been hosted by India for the first time.

**Ravichandran Ashwin breaks Lilee's record of fastest 300 Test wickets**

Nagpur, Nov 27  
India off-spinner Ravichandran Ashwin became the fastest bowler to reach the milestone of 300 Test wickets today in his 54th match, breaking Dennis Lillee's record during India's win over Sri Lanka in the second Test. Australian fast bowling legend Lillee had reached the milestone in 56 Test matches way back in 1981 and it took 36 years for another bowler to eclipse the record. Ashwin is only the fifth Indian bowler to complete a career 300 wickets



in Test cricket behind Anil Kumble (619), Kapil Dev (434), Harbhajan Singh (417) and Zaheer Khan (311).

**Sathyan wins gold in Spanish Open TT**

New Delhi, Nov 27  
Indian paddler G Sathyan defeated Japan's Kazuhiro Yoshimura 4-2 to clinch the men's singles gold medal at the 2017 ITTF Challenge Spanish Open in Almeria, Spain. Sathyan beat Yoshimura 11-7 3-11 11-6 6-11 13-11 11-7 in the men singles final last night. The ninth seeded Indian's calculated game enabled the 24-year-old to prevail over the 11th seed. Incidentally, this was Sathyan's second major title after the singles gold he had won two years ago in the ITTF World



Tour Belgium Open. Incidentally, this was the second ITTF Challenge Series title won by an Indian this year after Soumyajit Ghosh beat compatriot Anthony Amalraj in Chile Open final a few months ago. Earlier, Indian pair of Manika Batra and Mouma Das, seeded second, went down to the top-seed Korean duo of Jihe Jeon and Haeun Yang 11-9 6-11 11-9 9-11 9-11 in a thrilling women doubles final. The Indian combination had to satisfied with the silver despite putting up a good fight.

for the first time ever an initiative of this scale has been taken up to train EWRs who will go out and administer the villages professionally. It is regrettable that not many women sarpanches and EWRs come forward to take up their responsibilities and mostly allow their husbands to take the lead. So, they remain 'sarpanchanis' in name only, the Minister added. She said that training two lakh women sarpanches across the country will help bring important changes. It will help to create model villages. It will help prepare women as political leaders of the future. The training program which will include simple engineering skills will give them an insight into women's issues as well as focus on education and financial matters, Smt Maneka Gandhi explained. The Minister disclosed that awards will be given to the Master Trainers to those who have succeeded in empowering EWRs of their areas. The Minister also appreciated the initiatives taken by some states to specify certain minimum education level for sarpanches and panchayat members. The Capacity building of Elected Women Representatives (EWRs) is critical to empower women to participate effectively in the governance processes. This will help them assume the leadership roles expected of them and guide their villages towards a more prosperous future. About 150 master trainers and 450 EWRs attended today's program.
