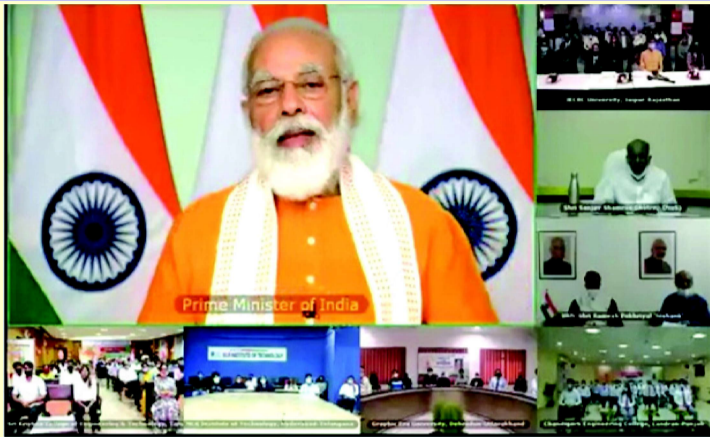

Port Blair, Aug 1
 In pursuance of powers vested u/s 51(b) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 and in order to enforce strict compliance of the National Directives on COVID-19 and contain the spread of COVID-19 in South Andaman district, the District Magistrate, South Andaman District, has directed that all shops/establishments shall remain closed from the midnight of 4th August, 2020 till the midnight of 11th August, 2020, except the following: -

On Weekends, i.e Saturday and Sunday, the orders No. CS/Sr.PS/05/2020 dated 28th July, 2020 shall be strictly complied with. The above Shops & Establishments shall however ensure that the shopkeepers/customers strictly maintain social distancing (2 Gaz ki Doori) and respiratory etiquettes. The directions on the operation of shops and establishments vide order No. 868 dated 29th July, 2020, shall be strictly complied with by all. Any establishment/persons violating the above directives shall be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, besides legal action under section 188 of the IPC, and other legal provisions as applicable. They will also attract fines as prescribed under order No.876 dated 31.07.2020, an order to this effect issued by District Magistrate, South Andaman District said.

The National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) are the standards for ambient air quality with reference to various identified pollutant notified by the CPCB under the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, with the objective to make uniform yardstick for the assessment of air quality at National level, to indicate air quality levels and appropriate margins required to ensure the protection of vegetation, health and

Govt. working with RBI to restructure loans due to impact of Corona virus: FM

New Delhi, Aug 1 MSMEs covered under the emergency credit facility and any aberration in such cases must be brought to notice. She was responding to the concerns raised by the FICCI members on the difficulties faced by the MSMEs in taking loans under the Emergency Credit Guarantee Scheme. On the suggestion for creating an institution to handle the emerging credit requirements of the industry, the Finance Minister informed that the Government is working on the plan to create a Development Finance Institution in the country. She said, the details will be shared after formalization of the plans. Ms. Sitharaman informed that the decision on reducing GST rates on the healthcare and other products will be taken by the GST Council. She also affirmed that the Finance Ministry is working with RBI on the demand of the hospitality sector for extension of moratorium or restructuring of the loans. (Source: india.gov.in)

Govt. extends ban on international flights till August 31

New Delhi, Aug 1 The Government has extended the ban on international flights till 31st of August amid the coronavirus pandemic. However, this restriction will not be applicable for international all-cargo operations and flights specifically approved by the DGCA. India had first suspended international flights on March 22, just before the national lockdown was announced. As part of allowing gradual movement of passenger traffic amid the pandemic situation, 'Transport Bubble' agreements have been signed with the US, France, and Germany. Such bilateral agreements allow operation of flights between the two countries subject to a set of regulations. International flight services to and from India remain suspended since March 23 due to the pandemic. (Source: india.gov.in)
