## Towards 'Zero Waste Andamans'

### RD Deptt. adopts Smart Waste Segregation using Colour Coded Dustbins

Port Blair, July 27

Swachh Bharat Mission (Grameen) Phase-II has been uniquely designed to leverage the capacity of individuals and communities in rural India to create a people's movement to ensure that the ODF status of rural areas is sustained, people continue to practice safe, hygienic behaviour and that all villages have solid and liquid waste management arrangements.



Door-to-door waste collection methods have been incorporated mainly in several rural areas across Andaman & Nicobar Islands by the Gram Panchayats, with the primary purpose of achieving higher sorting rates of waste. The Directorate of RD,



PRI and ULBs, with the aim of 'Zero Waste Andamans', is working on a model where the waste does not find a fixed point. Being an Island territory, there is no escape route for us as far as waste is concerned. Surrounded by sea, whatever is thrown in and

around, ultimately is discharged to open sea, which then is disposed off along shores with the tide of waves. Potentially having limited geographical area, the idea of heaps of dump yard is also obsolete.

Therefore, the only potential solution is to make the SWM Cluster-a centre for the processing of waste and to ensure that things received are processed, managed, and supplied outward for further

## NFSA beneficiaries provided free foodgrains under Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana

### Left out AAY & PHH beneficiaries urged to collect foodgrains

Port Blair, July 27

With the intention to provide food security to 80 crore poor Indians covered under the National Food Security Act, 2013, the Govt. of India has launched the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana, wherein, all the NFSA beneficiaries (AAY & PHH) are being provided free foodgrains @ 5 kg per person per month w.e.f May, 2021 till November 2021. The foodgrains issued under PMGKAY is in addition to the regular entitlement under the Act.

In pursuant to this

direction from the GoI, the Department of Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs of the UT Administration is also issuing foodgrains under PMGKAY @ 5 kg per person per month to around 59500 NFSA beneficiaries of this UT shall continue till November, 2021. Accordingly, rice under PMGKAY is being issued in July, 2021 to all the AAY & PHH beneficiaries.

Further, in addition to foodgrains, the Department of CS & CA has issued sugar to the

NFSA households @ 1 kg per household per month for 12 month at one go during May & June, 2021. However, it was observed that due to COVID-19 movement restrictions in the UT, considerable number of AAY & PHH households were unable to procure their quota of sugar during May & June, 2021. Taking into consideration of this fact, the UT Administration decided to extend the period for lifting of sugar till July, 2021 as a one time incentive for left out

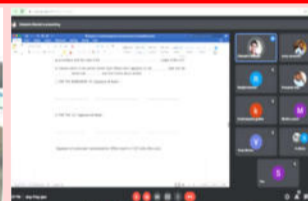
## Providing social, financial & technical assistance for better livelihood Virtual training on financial management of Cluster Level Federation and Village Organization formed under DAY-NRLM held

Port Blair, July 27

Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana -National Rural Livelihood Mission (DAY-NRLM) is being implemented in this UT since 2016-17 with the formation of the Self Help Groups and its Federations, namely Village Organization and Cluster / Block



Level Federation. Implementation of this scheme aims to organize the rural poor women in SHGs, and its Federations to provide them social, financial and technical assistance for better livelihood. The SHGs are federated into Village Organization (Primary Level Federation) at the village level, Cluster Level Federation



at sub-block and Block/District Level Federations at higher levels and are supported to become self-sufficient and community-managed institutions over time.

Since its inception, 997 SHGs and 72 Village Organizations have been formed under DAY-NRLM. In the last Financial Year -2020-21, the

Andaman and Nicobar Islands Rural Livelihood Mission (ANIRLM), with the support and guidance of the National Institute of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj (NIRDPR), Hyderabad has formed 5 Cluster/Block Level Federations in

### Landless beneficiary's dream of possessing own house fulfilled

Port Blair, July 27

The Pradhan Mantri Awaas Yojana (PMAY-G) initiative of the Government of India aims to provide affordable housing to the urban poor by the year 2022. This scheme aims to simplify the process of constructing a home for the poor and weaker sections of society. Shri P. Yeranna, a private labourer residing with his wife and two sons at Mayabunder village narrated his story of becoming a proud owner of a house constructed under PMAY-G scheme.



This landless family was deprived of having their own house as they were economically weaker. Due to some health issues, the head of the family, Shri P. Yeranna is presently incapable of working in a bakery, and that is the sole income for the family. They were managed to live in a dwelling house (Katchha House) for many years.

Through the Department of Rural Development initiative, this family was selected under PMAY-G's flagship scheme. Shri P. Yeranna was allotted 50

sq. mt land at Mayabunder Village, block no 1 and he also received one lakh twenty thousand rupees in three installments for construction of his house. He has completed his home recently and happily staying in his own house with his family.

Shri P. Yeranna shared the dream of his own home coming true and conveyed his deep gratitude to the Department of RD, PRI, ULBs for taking the initiative for marginalized persons like him who cannot construct their own house due to financial crisis.

Due to the active and prompt action by the Andaman & Nicobar Administration, many homeless like P. Yeranna

## Lockdown/restricted movement shall continue to be in force in South Andaman District till August 3

Port Blair, July 27

In order to ensure measures of isolation and social distancing in South Andaman District with continuous focus on the fivefold strategy for effective management of COVID-19 i.e., Test-Track-Treat-Vaccination and adherence to COVID appropriate behavior to control any surge of the cases of COVID-19 again

and also to prevent any disturbance to the peace and tranquility and taking into consideration the request of the public representatives and general public, Shri Suneel Anchipaka, District Magistrate, South Andaman District, in exercise of the powers vested U/s 144 of Cr.P.C has ordered that lockdown/restricted movement shall

continue to be in force in the entire District of South Andaman with effect from July 28 to August 3, 2021.

The order issued by DM (SA) further states that shops selling essential and non-essential items shall be allowed to open between 6 am to 8 pm by observing COVID appropriate behavior. It shall be the sole responsibility of the

owner/In-Charge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance and shall be held responsible for any violation and he/she shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.50,000/- in addition to sealing of the shop/establishment for a period of 14 days by the Executive Magistrate and shall be liable for action under DM Act.

## Media briefed on COVID-19 COVID Appropriate Behaviour should be strictly followed to protect oneself from corona virus: Secretary (IP&T)

Port Blair, July 27

The Secretary (IP&T), Shri Sunil Kumar Singh briefing the media persons on COVID-19 status in the Islands held in the conference hall of IP&T here this evening stated that during the RT-PCR test conducted on 323 passengers, who arrived here yesterday, no positive case has been detected. He informed that 251 persons bound for Middle & North



Andaman were tested at Ferrargunj and all were found negative.

Today, 2 flights with 349 passengers arrived here and the results of RT-PCR reports are awaited. The District Administration

conducted mobile RAT screening at Manna Church, Chunabhata, Hope Town today. Random tests were conducted on 98 persons and all were found negative. The Secretary once again reiterated to adhere to COVID Appropriate Behaviour to protect oneself from corona virus.

C.D.Block Prothrapur, Ferrargunj, Rangat, Mayabunder and Diglipur under DAY-NRLM.

The State Rural Livelihood Mission (SRLM) releases the Mission funds to strengthen SHGs and their Federations. After completing the gestation period of three months, SHGs are eligible for Revolving Fund @ Rs. 15,000/- per SHG and after completion of six months are eligible for Community Investment Fund (CIF) up to Rs.1,10,000/- per SHG on Loan Basis through their concerned Federation. The Federations acts as a Financing Institution for the SHGs which provide loan to the SHGs on submission of Micro Credit Plan (MCP) wherein the credit needs of SHG members is prioritized. The Federations received various funds such as Start-up fund, Community Investment Fund (CIF), Vulnerability Reduction Fund (VRF), Livelihood Fund (LF) from SRLM and Savings, Membership Fee, Interest from Loan given to SHG, etc. from the member SHGs. There is always a need for proper management and accounting of fund flow and utilization in the federations of SHGs.

Therefore, the Andaman and Nicobar Islands Rural Livelihood Mission (ANIRLM) attached to Directorate of RD, PRIs and ULBs, Andaman and Nicobar Administration, Port Blair in collaboration with National Mission Management Unit, New Delhi and National Institute of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj, Hyderabad has organized 'Three days virtual training on Financial Management of Cluster Level Federation and Village Organization under DAY-NRLM' from July 23 to 25. The training was imparted by Shri Debashis Mandal, National Resource Person, attached to NIRDPR, Hyderabad and was attended by the dedicated staff attached with State Mission Management Unit (SMMU) and Block Mission Management Units (BMMU) of C.D Block Prothrapur, Ferrargunj, Little Andaman, Rangat, Mayabunder, Diglipur and Campbell Bay under ANIRLM.

During the training, detailed discussion was done and information was given about basic accounting principles and practices of Federations; institutional structure and functions, to frame financial policies in CLFs; credit management; fund management; financial control; financial management functions in CLF and financial management roles of different players in SHG networks and methods to train the CLF leaders and staff.

The ANIRLM is planning to organize training for Book keepers of the Village Organizations and Accountants of CLFs in the coming month to have a strong and transparent Financial Management System of Federations of SHGs, leading to effective implementation of DAY-NRLM in this UT, a press release from Secretary (RD) said.

**Parliament passes landmark 'Marine Aids to Navigation Bill 2021' to repeal and replace the Lighthouse Act 1927**

New Delhi, July 27 (PIB) Parliament today passed the Marine Aids to Navigation Bill 2021, which aims to replace over 90-year-old Lighthouse Act 1927, to incorporate the global best practices, technological developments and India's International obligations in the field of Marine Aids to Navigation, to fulfill the vision of the Prime Minister to make the legislative framework user-friendly and to promote ease of doing business. Union Minister for Ports, Shipping and Waterways Shri Sarbananda Sonowal moved the bill in Rajya Sabha on 19.07.2021 and it was passed today. Now the bill will go to the President for his assent.

Union Minister of Ports, Shipping and Waterways, Shri Sarbananda Sonowal said that this initiative is part of the proactive approach adopted by the Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways by repealing colonial laws and replacing them with legislations catering to

modern and contemporary needs of the maritime industry. Shri Sarbananda Sonowal also added that the bill aims to adopt state-of-the-art technologies of marine navigation which were not covered under the statutory provisions of the old Lighthouse Act 1927. The administration and management of Lighthouse and Lightships in India is governed by Lighthouse Act 1927 for safe navigation. At the time of enactment of Lighthouse Act 1927, there were only 32 Lighthouses in the then British India spread across six regions viz. Aden, Karachi, Bombay, Madras, Calcutta and Rangoon. Post-Independence, 17 Lighthouses came under the administrative control of India, which have now increased manifold to meet the growing needs of the shipping industry. Presently, there are 195 Lighthouses and number of advanced radio and digital aids to navigation administered under the said Act.

recycling. To achieve this, segregation of waste, therefore, becomes very significant.

To improve the segregation in rural areas and teach the habit amongst the households, the Directorate of RD, PRIs and ULBs under Swachh Bharat Mission (Grameen) provides two colour-coded Dustbins (Green & Blue) to all Gram Panchayats in a phased manner.

In one such case, colour coded dustbin has been distributed for effective door-to-door collection at Gram Panchayat Madhupur under Diglipur block in the North & Middle Andaman district. The GP received sets of dustbins for 1134 households from the Directorate of RD. Around 850 households have received the dustbins so far. The collection of wastes is carried daily, and user fees are collected from households & commercial establishments in the village under the SWM Bye-Laws.

These two separate dustbins have been given for the disposal of different types of wastes. Wastes are now segregated and dumped in separate dustbins. The 'Green' coloured dustbins are meant for wet and bio-degradable waste (Eg. kitchen wastes, including vegetables and fruit skins). 'Blue' dustbins are meant for the disposal of plastic wrappers and non-biodegradable waste. The Swachhagrahis and Sanitary workers and supervisors are trained for the proper collection of segregated waste.

Sorting waste fractions at home for a door-to-door collection system proves to positively affect the environmental impacts of waste management strategies by reducing waste landfills, a press release from Secretary (RD) said.

All POL outlets shall be opened from 6 am to 8 pm. Port services will continue to operate as usual and both essential and non-essential cargo can be moved in and out of port, as per requirement for loading/unloading/clearing of cargo and the same shall be permitted till 8 pm only. For any relaxation in case of exigency, prior permission of Assistant Commissioner concerned may be obtained.

Godowns and allied establishments which are permitted as per said Order can operate till 8 pm for non-business purposes and should not cater to any customers. Only internal operations, receiving/dispatching of stocks etc. shall be permitted. For any relaxation in case of exigency, prior permission of Assistant Commissioner concerned may be obtained. Establishments violating this provision shall be liable for fine of Rs.25,000/-. For any relaxation in case of exigency, prior permission of Assistant Commissioner concerned may be obtained.

Construction activities shall be permitted from 6 am to 8 pm. Construction activities of national importance and strategic projects beyond 8 pm shall be permitted with prior permission of respective Assistant Commissioners. Public Transport/Buses shall be allowed to ply with maximum 90% seating capacity including Autos, Taxis and Jeeps. Transportation of cargo shall also be permitted. SOPs in this regard issued by the Transport Department should be strictly adhered to.

Sale and service of liquor at licensed premises shall be permitted. SOPs and orders regarding the timings for sale and service of liquor at all licensed establishments (under relevant category) shall be issued by the Deputy Commissioner (Excise), Nicobars, separately.

Gyms and yoga institutes shall be permitted to open from 6 am to 8 pm subject to strict adherence of COVID appropriate behaviours. Any person/organisation violating the above directions shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.25,000/-.

All Religious places/places of worship are allowed to open between 6 am to 8 pm with only priest and two management staff to perform day to day rituals. Wearing of face masks, maintaining social distancing, provision of thermal scanning and use of hand wash or sanitizers will be mandatory. No devotees shall be allowed to enter the religious place. The Management Committee of the religious places shall be responsible to ensure strict compliance and any violations of the directions shall be liable for fine to the tune of Rs.10,000/- payable by the Committee.

In view of the emergent circumstances, this order is being issued ex-parte and is addressed to the public in general. Further, the Superintendent of Police/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Executive Magistrates and all authorities concerned shall ensure strict compliance of this order and shall adequately inform and sensitize the field functionaries to note that these restrictions fundamentally relate to movement of people, but not to that of essential services.

Any disobedience of the above orders shall invite penal action u/s 188 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and the relevant provisions of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 against the violator(s) and also fines shall also be imposed as per Order No.27 dt. 23rd April 2021.

This order shall come into force in the Nicobars District from 28th July 2021 and shall be effective till further orders, the Order issued by DM (Nicobars) added.

Non-compliance of the SOPs/National Directives for COVID-19 Management and violations of the conditions of the above order will be viewed seriously and appropriate action under relevant provisions of the Excise Regulations-2013 and Disaster Management Act, 2005 shall be taken against the defaulters in addition to sealing of the premises for a month and he/she shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.50,000/- (Rupees Fifty Thousand Only).

All licensed establishments shall display boards and banners in prominent places, showing the right way of wearing mask, social distancing, washing hands and cough etiquettes and strictly follow all government directives.

No movement of men and material without valid movement pass/e-pass shall be allowed other than the time fixed for opening of shops between 6 am to 8 pm. Movement shall be allowed for emergency cases, medical emergencies, pregnant women and patients availing medical services. Persons engaged for essential activities for movement of goods on Andaman Trunk road, loading and unloading of essential cargo after 8 pm shall be allowed on production of valid movement permit issued by the Office of District Magistrate.

Travel of persons who intend to proceed to their destinations at mainland after 8 pm shall be allowed on production of valid travel documents. However, the person (one person) who intend to pick/drop after 8 pm, should apply for e-pass well in advance with supporting documents and the same shall be issued by the Office of District Magistrate on case to case basis.

Movement of officers/officials involved in providing essential services such as District Administration, Police, CISF, Health Services, ICMR, PBMC, Electricity, Home Guards, Civil Defence, Fire and emergency services, Defence personnel on duty after 8 pm shall be permitted on production of valid Identity Cards issued by their concerned Departments.

Movement of Officers/Officials, involved in providing services such as Pay & Accounts, Shipping Services, Forest, Banking, Water Supply & Sanitation in Rural Areas, Disaster Management, Port services and related services, Telecommunication shall be allowed after 8 pm on production of movement passes already issued by the Office of District Magistrate.

Movement of personnel involved in providing Broadcasting, all print and electronic media persons after 8 pm shall be allowed on production of valid movement passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate.

Movement of personnel involved in Private Security Services, Cable Services, Internet Service Providers, POL Outlets, LPG Stores/Godown, ATMs, e-Commerce activities, Cold Storages, Godowns and Warehouses shall be allowed after 8 pm on production of e-passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/In-Charge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance and also if any person attached with such organisation is found misusing the e-passes or using the same for purposes other than it is meant for, the owner/in-charge shall be held responsible and he/she shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.25,000/- and shall also be liable for action under DM Act.

All POL outlets shall be opened from 6 am to 8 pm. Movement of private medical personnel such as Doctors, nursing staff, paramedics etc. attached with diagnostic centres and clinics, veterinary clinics shall be allowed after 8 pm on production of e-passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate.

Movement of persons from containment zones shall be strictly restricted and shall only be permitted on case to case basis upon approval from the Office of District Magistrate.

Port services will continue to operate as usual and both essential and non-essential cargo can be moved in and out of port, as per requirement for loading/unloading/clearing of cargo and the same shall be permitted till 8 pm only. e-Passes for operation of cargo movement after 8 pm needs to be obtained, which shall be strictly permitted on case to case basis by the Office of the District Magistrate.

Construction activities shall be permitted from 6 am to 8 pm. Construction activities of national importance and strategic projects beyond 8 pm shall be permitted with prior permission of District Magistrate and e-Passes needs to be obtained, which shall be strictly permitted on case to case basis by the Office of the District Magistrate.

Movement of persons involved with Hotels/Restaurants and Mess to be certified by the firm/organisation for home delivery of food shall be allowed till 9 pm on production of e-passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate. Dine-in shall be permitted between 6 am to 8 pm only, subject to 50% of the seating capacity and strict adherence of COVID appropriate behaviours. However, take away/parcel service and home delivery should be encouraged. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/In-Charge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance and also if any person attached with such organisation found misusing the e-passes or using the same for purposes other than it is meant for, the owner/in-charge shall be held responsible and he/she shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.50,000/- in addition to sealing of the shop/establishment for a period of 14 days by the Executive Magistrate and shall also be liable for action under DM Act.

Public Transport/Buses shall be allowed to ply with maximum 90% seating capacity including Autos, Taxis and Jeeps in partial modification to this Office Order No.566 dt.23rd April 2021. Transportation of cargo shall also be permitted. SOPs in this regard issued by the Transport department should be strictly adhered to.

The e-passes issued by the Office of the District Magistrate to individuals for movement after 8 pm involved in various activities/services shall be revalidated on case to case basis.

Sale and service of liquor at licensed premises shall be permitted till 8 pm. SOPs and orders regarding the timings for sale and service of liquor at all licensed establishments (C, C1, B1, B2, B3 and B4 category) issued by the Deputy Commissioner (Excise), South Andaman should be strictly adhered to.

Gyms and yoga institutes shall be permitted to open from 6 am to 8 pm subject to strict adherence of COVID appropriate behaviours. Any person/organisation violating the above directions shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.25,000/-.

Last rites/funerals shall be permitted with a maximum of 20 persons with strict adherence to COVID appropriate behaviours.

No tribal passes will be issued for southern group of islands till further orders except for official purposes. All Religious places/places of worship are allowed to open between 6 am to 8 pm with only priest and two management staff to perform day to day rituals. drainage systems as well architecturally and technologically developed features are reflected in the design, execution, and effective harnessing of local materials. Unlike other Harappan antecedent towns normally located near to rivers and perennial sources of water, the location of Dholavira in the island of Khadir was strategic to harness different mineral and raw material sources (copper, shell, agate-carnelian, steatite, lead, banded limestone, among others) and to facilitate internal as well as external trade to the Magan (modern Oman peninsula) and Mesopotamian regions.

Dholavira is an exceptional example of a proto-historic Bronze Age urban settlement pertaining to the Harappan Civilization (early, mature and late Harappan phases) and bears evidence of a multi-cultural and stratified society during the 3rd and 2nd millennia BCE. The earliest evidence can be traced back to 3000 BCE during the early Harappan phase of the Harappan Civilization. This city flourished for nearly 1,500 years, representing a long continuous habitation. The excavated remains clearly indicate the origin of the settlement, its growth, zenith and the subsequent decline in the form of continuous changes in the configuration of the city, architectural elements and various other attributes.

Dholavira is an outstanding example of Harappan urban planning, with its preconceived city planning, multi-layered fortifications, sophisticated water reservoirs and drainage system, and the extensive use of stone as a building material. These characteristics reflect the unique position Dholavira held in the entire gamut of Harappan Civilization.

The expansive water management system designed to store every drop of water available shows the ingenuity of the people to survive against the rapid geo-climatic transformations. Water diverted from seasonal streams, scanty precipitation and available ground was sourced, stored, in large stone-cut reservoirs which are extant along the eastern and southern fortification. To further access water, few rock-cut wells, which date as one of the oldest examples, are evident in different parts of the city, the most impressive one being located in the citadel. Such elaborate water conservation methods of Dholavira is unique and measures as one of the most efficient systems of the ancient world.

## India gets its 40<sup>th</sup> World Heritage Site Dholavira, the Harappan City in the Rann of Kutch, Gujarat inscribed on UNESCO's World Heritage List

New Delhi, July 27 (PIB)

India's nomination of Dholavira, the Harappan City in the Rann of Kutch, Gujarat has been inscribed on UNESCO's World Heritage list. India submitted the nomination dossier for Dholavira: A Harappan City to the World Heritage Centre in January, 2020. The site was on the UNESCO's tentative list since 2014. Dholavira: a Harappan city, is one of the very few well preserved urban settlements in South Asia dating from the 3rd to mid-2nd millennium BCE.

Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi tweeted, "Absolutely delighted by this news. Dholavira was an important urban centre and is one of our most important linkages with our past. It is a must visit, especially for those interested in history, culture and archaeology."

The Union Minister of Culture, Tourism and Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER) Sri G Kishan Reddy shared this news on Twitter shortly after the announcement. This follows a few days after the Rudreswara Temple, (also known as the Ramappa Temple) at Palampet, Mulugu district, Telangana State becoming the 39th World Heritage Centre in India.

With this successful nomination, India has 40 world



heritage properties overall, which includes 32 cultural, 7 natural and one mixed property. The Union Minister for Culture was referring to the countries that have 40 or more World Heritage sites and apart from India, this now contains Italy, Spain, Germany, China and France. The Minister also observed in his tweet how India has added 10 new world Heritage sites since 2014, and this is testimony to the Prime Minister's steadfast commitment in promoting Indian culture, heritage and the Indian way of life.

About the Harappan city of Dholavira

Dholavira: a Harappan city, is one of the very few well preserved urban settlements in South Asia dating from the 3rd to mid-2nd millennium BCE. Being the 6th largest of more than 1,000 Harappan sites discovered so far, and occupied for over 1,500 years, Dholavira not only witnesses the entire trajectory of the rise and fall of this early civilization of humankind, but also demonstrates its multifaceted achievements in terms of urban planning, construction techniques, water

management, social governance and development, art, manufacturing, trading, and belief system. With extremely rich artefacts, the well preserved urban settlement of Dholavira depicts a vivid picture of a regional centre with its distinct characteristics that also contributes significantly to the existing knowledge of Harappan Civilization as a whole.

The property comprises two parts: a walled city and a cemetery to the west of the city. The walled city consists of a fortified Castle with attached fortified Bailey and Ceremonial Ground, and a fortified Middle Town and a Lower Town. A series of reservoirs are found to the east and south of the Citadel. The great majority of the burials in the Cemetery are memorial in nature.

The configuration of the city of Dholavira, during its heyday, is an outstanding example of planned city with planned and segregated urban residential areas based on possibly differential occupational activities, and a stratified society. 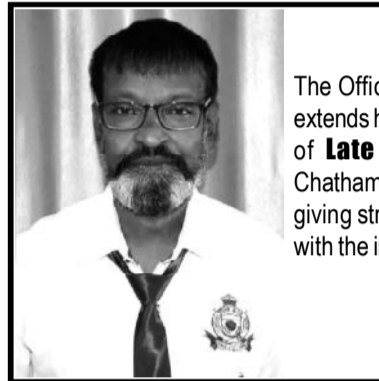
