PM Modi holds review meeting on key Cabinet decisions

New Delhi, Jan 28
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi held a meeting with the entire Council of Ministers in New Delhi yesterday. At the meeting, Shri Modi reviewed the status of implementation of the several key Cabinet and Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) decisions taken in the last 18 months by NDA



Government related to the sectors of food, fertiliser and agriculture. The Prime Minister also took stock of

the progress made on revival of three fertiliser plants, setting up of an agriculture university in Bihar and soft loans to cash-starved sugar mills as he reviewed progress made on the decisions by the Cabinet. He also addressed the Secretaries and Ministers on maintaining timeline for implementation of the Cabinet decisions.

Beating Retreat at Netaji Stadium today

Port Blair, Jan 28
The 'Beating Retreat' ceremony will be held at the historic Netaji Stadium at 5 pm tomorrow (Jan 29). The Chief Secretary, Shri Anand Prakash will be the chief guest on the occasion. IRCTC restricts online ticket booking to six/month to prevent misuse

New Delhi, Jan 28
Any individual will not be able to book more than six tickets online in a month from IRCTC website from his/her user ID. The restriction will come into force from 15th of next month. It is aimed at

preventing possible misuse of online booking of tickets. Under the existing system a maximum of ten tickets can be booked online through IRCTC website. Railway Ministry in a release said, this has been done keeping in view the analysis of usage of quota of 10 tickets which indicated that 90 per cent of users are booking upto 6 tickets in a given month and only 10 per cent are making more than 6 tickets.

MP meets HRD Secretary; discusses setting up of Polytechnic in Nicobar & N&MA District

Port Blair, Jan 28
The Govt. of India sometime in the year of 2008-2009 has sanctioned 300 polytechnics for un-served and underserved districts of the country. Out of which, two Polytechnics, one each in Nicobar district and North & Middle Andaman District, being un-served and underserved district of Andaman & Nicobar Islands have been

sanctioned. In attempt of that, Ministry of HRD vide letter dated 07.05.2015 informed the Administration to furnish the consent to provide free of cost land and the commitment to meet the recurring expenditure in regard to opening of polytechnics. Due to undue delay in establishment of polytechnic, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray, MP met with Home Secretary, MHA today and presented a brief note on the issue and requested to expedite the matter for establishment of polytechnic. After having discussion, the Home Secretary has assured the MP Shri BP Ray to take-up the matter with the Administration for establishment of the polytechnic at the earliest.

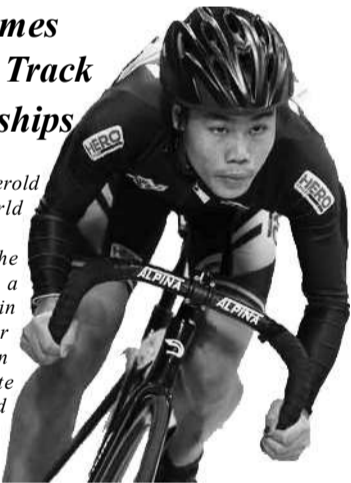
Deborah Herold becomes first Indian to qualify for Track Cycling World Championships

New Delhi, Jan 28
India's young cycling sensation Deborah Herold has continued her remarkable rise in world cycling.

The 20-year-old, who brought laurels to the country's cycling community by achieving a historic fourth spot in the world rankings in December last year, on Tuesday added another feather to her cap by becoming the first Indian to qualify for the 2016 Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI) Track Cycling World Championships.

The criteria for qualifying for the World Championships is based on the points acquired at the UCI organised events.

Hailing from Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Deborah, who survived the catastrophic Tsunami in 2004, has a feat of exceptional performances over the last one year. She bagged five medals at the Taiwan Cup Track International Classic, including a gold in the women's elite sprint category, three silver and a bronze. She then clinched three medals at the 2015 Track Asia Cup, ensuring India's third-place finish with 11 medals in the competition held in New Delhi in December. The Track Cycling World Championships will be held in London from March 2-6.

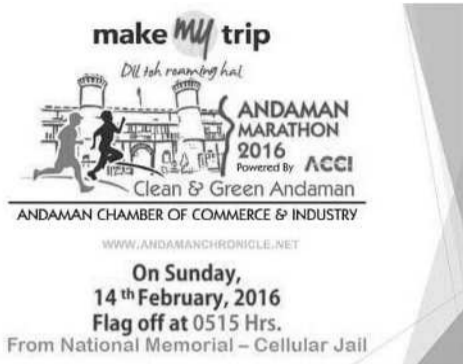

Kingpin in ganja case of PS Hutbay arrested from West Bengal

On receipt of credible information about illicit Ganja on Oct. 31, 2015, a police team of PS Hut Bay had conducted a raid at R.B. Nagar, Little Andaman and arrested one person namely Makhhan Sarkar with 1.1477 kg illicit Ganja. On interrogation, the accused had revealed that the said consignment of Ganja was received at Little Andaman through courier from West Bengal sent by Provakar Mallick in the form of postal parcel. The said Provakar Mallick was the resident of Gopi Nagar village, Gangnapur, Nadia District, West Bengal. He was

also involved in few other NDPS & cheating cases of these Islands which are pending trial.

Upon this, a police team headed by Insp. Vishal Ram, I.O of the case was deputed to West Bengal and arrested Provakar Mallick on 13.01.2016 from Nadia District, West Bengal. He was brought to Port Blair and produced before the Hon'ble Special Judge, District and Session Court on 18.01.2016 from where he was remanded to Judicial Custody.

This arrest underlines the commitment of Andaman Police to go to any extent to apprehend the anti-social

elements involved in drug trafficking in the Islands and to prevent entry of such contraband in these Islands.
