Acid attack victims to get quota in central govt jobs

New Delhi, Jan 28
People with autism, mental illnesses, intellectual disability and victims of acid attacks will now get quota in central government jobs. The Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT) recently wrote to all central government departments to ensure that one percent of each post be reserved for people with blindness and low vision; deaf and hard of hearing;

locomotor disability including cerebral palsy, leprosy cured, dwarfism, acid attack victims and muscular dystrophy. It said in case of direct recruitment, four percent of the total number of vacancies, up from the existing three percent, in groups A, B and C shall be reserved for people with benchmark disabilities. Benchmark disability means a person with not less than forty percent of a

specified disability. The move to enhance reservation quota for those with learning disability and acid attack victims comes after passage of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, and the notification of relevant rules in this regard. As per an earlier order of the DoPT, issued in 2005, three percent of the total posts were to be reserved for people with disabilities.

Federer beats Cilic to win record-extending 20th Grand Slam title

Melbourne, Jan 28
Roger Federer powered home to beat Marin Cilic in five sets to win his sixth Australian Open and 20th Grand Slam title in a riveting final on Sunday. The Swiss defending champion dropped his only sets of the tournament before completing a 6-2, 6-7 (5/7), 6-3, 3-6, 6-1 win over the sixth seeded Croatian in 3hr 3min. ALSO READ: Roger Federer's Grand Slam records - in numbers
Federer, playing in his 30th Grand Slam final, joined Novak Djokovic and Australian great Roy Emerson as joint top for the most Australian Open men's titles.
He added to his already imposing win-loss record in Melbourne and is now 94-13. His overall his Grand Slam mark stands at 332-52. The roof was closed over Rod

Cilic's serve came under immediate pressure with a whipping backhand return winner for break point which the Croatian followed with a smash into the net for a break in the opening game. The Croat was finding it difficult to settle and changed racquets in his second service game, but it had no obvious benefit as he dropped serve again after

He finally held serve to get on to the board and trail 4-1 with Federer hitting the ball cleanly. The Swiss star served out the first set in just 24 minutes after a double break and a shaky Cilic opening. Federer fought off two break points in his opening service in the second set with pinpoint serves, while Cilic had a tussle before holding in the third game. Cilic worked his way back into the match as both players traded furious forehands to stay on serve.

Suresh Raina returns to India's T20 squad against South Africa

New Delhi, Jan 28
Suresh Raina returned to the Indian team setup for the first time after February, 2017 when he played in a T20 against England. And that is the format he has made a return to by being included in the squad for South Africa T20s. India will play three T20s against South Africa with the series starting on February 18. Virat Kohli will lead the side with Rohit Sharma returning to his duties as vice captain after sporting the leadership duties against Sri Lanka in December. Also named in the squad is uncapped T20 player Shardul Thakur. Meanwhile, Shreyas Iyer has been left out of the team.

Raina had been out of the squad ever since failing to clear the Yo-Yo test, now mandatory for inclusion in the national side. The Uttar Pradesh star cleared the test prior to the announcement of the ODI series against South Africa - which will be played before the T20s kick in. Since clearing the test, Raina has returned to form and been pivotal for the side in the Syed Mushtaq Ali T20 trophy. He was UP's highest run scorer and the sixth highest overall in the recently concluded T20 tournament which Delhi won. He scored 314 runs in the tournament with two fifties and an unbeaten 126 against Bengal the highlight inning.

Among the players missing out besides Iyer are Washington Sundar, Deepak Hooda, Basil Thampi and Mohammad Siraj who were named in the limited over squad to face Sri Lanka. For India, Ramandeep Singh (29, 53), Nilakanta Sharma (42) and Mandeep Singh (49) were the goal scorers before the shootout. Earlier in the day, Japan beat hosts New Zealand 4-1 in the shootout for bronze after holding the Black Sticks to 1-1 in regulation time. The final between India and Belgium was yet another goal-fest with both teams testing each other hooper-to-hooper.



It was a steady start for India as they were made to work hard to keep the ball. The Belgian attack meanwhile kept Indian goalkeeper PR Sreejesh busy through the first quarter with as many as three PCs including a penalty stroke. Their first PC coming in the 8th minute but Sreejesh was up to the task, lunging to his right to save. With 52 seconds for the first hooter, Belgium won two more PCs which were brilliantly saved by the Indian

goalkeeper but it was the penalty stroke taken by the ever-dangerous Loick Luypaert that Sreejesh saved which enthralled the evening audience in Hamilton. India won two back-to-back PCs at the start of the second quarter but couldn't make much of it before finally taking the lead, thanks to clever some work by Mandeep Singh in finding Ramandeep Singh at the top of the circle. Saina Nehwal's splendid run at the Indonesia Masters was halted in the final by World No 1 Tai Tzu Ying as the Chinese Taipei player became the first to win the tournament in the history of the event. Tzu Ying won 21-9, 21-13 and forced Nehwal to settle for a silver medal in the match that lasted 27 minutes. Nehwal was making her first appearance in the final of a tournament in over



a year. Her last foray in the final of a tournament came back in January, 2017, when she won the Malaysian Masters Grand Prix Gold. With the

defeat, Nehwal now trails Tzu Ying 5-9 in the head-to-head record with the Chinese Taipei girl edging the current World No 12 in recent matchups.

Rs 20 lakh reward for champion lifter Mirabai Chanu

Aizwal, Jan 28
The Manipur government on Saturday awarded Rs 20 lakh to Saikhom Mirabai Chanu, world champion weightlifter from the state.

Mirabai won gold medal at the 2017 World Weightlifting Championships held in the USA. She is only second Indian to have achieved the feat after Karnam Malleswari who clinched back-to-back titles in 1994 and 1995. Presenting the reward of Rs 20 lakh to Mirabai, Chief Minister Shri N Biren Singh said, "Efforts will be made so that sportspersons based outside the state return, and bring laurels both for the country as well as for the state." Chanu, who is employed with the Indian Railways, had lifted 85kg in snatch and 109kg in clean and jerk to total an impressive 194kg in the women's 48kg category to become world champion. Sandeep Lamichhane becomes first Nepal player to get IPL contract

New Delhi, Jan 28
Sandeep Lamichhane became the first cricketer from Nepal to land an IPL contract on Sunday when he was picked by Delhi Daredevils in the ongoing players auction in Bengaluru. The 17-year-old, the only Nepal player in the IPL auction, was sold at his base price of Rs 20 lakh.

The leg-spinner rose to prominence with a successful outing at the 2016 U-19 World Cup where he guided Nepal to a creditable eighth place. He hogged the limelight by

becoming the second-highest wicket-taker in the tournament with 14 scalps in six innings at an average of 17 and an economy of 4.67. Sandeep had scalped five wickets in two warm-up games and was also part of Nepal's first match against New Zealand, which they won by 32 runs.

However, his moment of glory awaited him in the next match against Ireland when Sandeep took a hat-trick, becoming only the fifth bowler in history to achieve the feat in the under-19 World Cup.
