Indian women hockey team
leave for New Zealand

Bangaluru, Mar 28
An positive start to their Rio Olympics preparation would be key on their agenda when the Indian women's hockey team launches its campaign in the Hawke's Bay Cup in Hastings, New Zealand on April 2. Going into the tournament, there will be two things paramount on the minds of the team's think-tank — fitness and converting short corners into goal. These are the two key areas that chief coach Neil Hawgood, his coaching staff and senior members of the squad, have singled out for special attention during the recent training and preparatory camp. If India, placed 13th in the world rankings, is to outplay Black Sticks, ranked fourth, and China a place behind, the Indian eyes would need to sustain their intensity for the entire duration of the match. Even Ireland, which is ranked below India, is capable of springing a surprise. "In the past we have lost some crucial matches due to fitness and not being able to convert penalty corners. In this camp we have been paying extra attention to these two critical aspects. In fact, you can say that our chief coach Neil Hawgood is obsessive about improving the fitness levels of those in the camp," said Deepika, who will lead the Indian team in the Hawke's Bay Cup in the



absence of Ritu Rani. "In modern hockey, converting penalty corners makes a huge difference between winning and losing. We have to learn from the mistakes of the past and ensure they are not repeated." Deepika received the Hockey India Player of the Year Award for women in the second Hockey India Annual Awards in Bengaluru on Mar 26. "To get this recognition by Hockey India right before the Hawke's Bay Cup is undoubtedly a big boost. I am overjoyed to be selected for the most coveted Hockey India awards in recognition of my efforts," said Deepika. The New Zealand outfit will also give the chief coach and selectors a chance to see how some of the junior players who have been drafted in the camp fare at the senior level ahead of the 2016 Rio Games. CIARI to celebrate 'International Year of Pulses' today

Port Blair, Mar 28
The United Nation Organization has declared 2016 as International Year of Pulses during its 68th General Assembly. The FAO is the nodal coordinating agency which aims to increase public awareness regarding the nutritional benefits of pulses for ensuring overall nutritional security of the people across the world. This is even more relevant to India as well as A&N Islands, where a large majority of people are dependent on pulses for their nutrition. Keeping the above factors in view, ICAR-

CIARI, Port Blair has decided to make all possible efforts to enhance the pulse production in these islands in coordination with the Development Department and other stakeholders. In this connection, a daylong awareness workshop and scientist-farmer's interface meeting will be conducted at CIARI's Garachama Complex from 10 am onwards tomorrow (Mar 29) to mark International Year of Pulses -2016 with special reference to "Sustainable Islands Agriculture Production" under the leadership of Dr.

S. Dam Roy, Director, ICAR-CIARI. Dr. G.S. Pandey, Director, Department of Agriculture, A & N Administration will be the guest of honour. A field day on Mungbean crops and new varieties will also be held to create awareness about the production technology of pulse crops in the islands. During the programme the stakeholders particularly farmers will participate.

Firing practice

Port Blair, Mar 28
The CISF will carrying out small arms firing practice, at Bird Line, Prothrapur on Mar 29 & 30 from 6 am to 4 pm. Meanwhile, 108 Mtn Bde unit will utilize the firing range at Chinthe 200m long range Brichgunj on Mar 31, 2016 for firing practice from 9.30 am to 2 pm. All concerned have been warned to keep themselves and their vehicle or livestock away from the firing range during the mentioned date and time.

Calls upon IOC

Government is working towards making these Islands green, and accordingly, a 100 MW Solar Plant will be installed through the public sector. NTPC and Lignite Corporation have been entrusted with the responsibility to carry out the project by the Minister of State with Independent Charge for Power, Coal, New and Renewable Energy, Shri Piyush Goel. Land for the said project has been identified and will be allotted soon.

The Lt. Governor also informed that the Administration is working on replacing diesel in a significant manner with LNG in the Islands. LNG can be easily stored, is slightly cheaper, and has better environmental norms than diesel. A floating storage tank has been identified for storage of LNG here, the Lt. Governor informed.

The Lt. Governor, Member of Parliament and the General Manager, WB, State Office, IOC, Shri Ranjan Kumar Mahapatra flagged off two oil tanker trucks on the occasion, marking the launch of BSIV in the Islands.

In his address on the occasion as the guest of honour, the Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray said, Indian Oil is doing yeoman services to the people of A&N Islands. He requested the Indian Oil to contribute 2% of the turnover profit towards CSR activities in the Islands. With the launch of BSIV, the sulphur emission will be lowered and by 2020, it will reach zero, he said and expressed gratitude to the Petroleum Minister, Shri Dharmendra Pradhan, the Govt. of India and Indian Oil for the launch of BSIV here in the Islands. Highlighting the problems faced by the consumers pertaining to supply of LPG, the Member of Parliament requested that a time schedule for the supply of LPG be chalked out. He also urged that new distributorship may be allotted for remote Islands such as Diglipur, Mayabunder, Rangat, Little Andaman, Havelock, Kamorta and Campbell Bay, to facilitate customers in those areas.

In his key note address, the General Manager, West Bengal State Office, Kolkata, Shri Ranjan Kumar Mahapatra said the Govt. of India has decided to reduce fuel emission, with the initial launch of BSI & BSII and now BSIV has been launched across the country. Apart from A&N Islands, BSIV has also been launched in 62 cities; he said, adding that by 2020 the entire country will be called BSIV. He also highlighted the various CSR activities taken up by IOC in various parts of the country including A&N Islands and assured to work together with the support of the stakeholders in taking the Islands forward. The GM also presented mementoes to the dignitaries on the occasion.

Earlier, the Terminal Manager, Indian Oil, Shri Sudipto Roy welcomed the gathering and the programme concluded with the vote of thanks proposed by Plant Manager, LPG Port Blair, Shri Ajay Vinod Khalku.

which a person posing as agents of Banks seeks ATM Pin, account details of the customers, at times announcing winning of lottery etc by the customer. Such incident should be reported to the Police immediately, he said adding that it is the duty of every individual to help create awareness about cyber crime among the mass, including the grass root population and sensitize them about the various cyber crimes and its preventive measures. In his welcome address, the SP CID, Shri Atmaram Deshpande said we are living in the era of Information Technology and cyber crime is a global phenomenon. The evolution of IT in cities, towns and rural areas has lead to an increasing number of cyber crimes. He said and called upon one and all to be aware of such crimes. He said that awareness programmes will be carried out in schools, colleges and Gram Sabhas in all the three districts of A&N Islands involving the PRI for effective reach of cyber crime awareness.

A power point presentation was also made by the SP CID highlighting about cyber crime, its characteristics, types of cyber crimes viz. Internet crimes, email scams in the form of bogus business opportunities, work at home schemes, chain mails, advance fee fraud, goods at discount, winner of lottery, investment opportunities, phishing email, Trojan horse emails, eavesdropping, email bombing and defamatory emails. He also highlighted about cyber crimes committed through financial scams, credit/ATM Card scams, intellectual property scams, cyber crimes targeting women, social media and instant message, phone calls & SMS frauds etc.

The A&N Police has also advised the general public and students to be cautious about cyber crimes by adhering to the 5 SMART rules when using Internet and mobile. S- Safe: keep safe by being careful and not to give out personal information such as name, email address, phone number, home address, photos or school names, M- Meet: meeting someone through on line contact can be dangerous, A-Accept: accepting email, IM messages or opening files pictures or texts from people you don't know can lead to problems, R-Reliable: information you find on internet may not be true, hence make sure to check information before believing and lastly T- Tell you parents, trusted adult about someone or something that makes you feel uncomfortable or worried or someone being bullied online.
