Parliament passes Mental Healthcare Bill; attempt to suicide to be no more punishable

New Delhi, Mar 28
Parliament on Monday passed a bill that seeks to decriminalise suicide attempt by mentally ill people and provides for the right to better healthcare for people suffering from mental illness. 'The Mental Healthcare Bill' also has a provision to protect and restore the property right of the mentally ill people, Health Minister Shri J P Nadda said in the Lok Sabha, just before it was passed by the House by a voice vote. The Rajya Sabha had passed it in August last year with 134 official amendments. The bill provides for

decriminalising suicide attempt by mentally ill persons by making it non-punishable under the Indian Penal Code. It also focusses on

INLCU L51 commissioned into Indian Navy

Port Blair, Mar 28
INLCU L51 was commissioned into the Indian Navy today by Vice Admiral Bimal Verma, AVSM, Commander-in-Chief, Andaman and Nicobar Command at Port Blair. The commissioning ceremony was attended by Vice Admiral Dilip Deshpande, Controller of Warship Production and Acquisition, Rear Admiral VK Saxena (Retd), CMD, Garden Research Ship Builders and Engineers (GRSE) and other senior officers from Indian Navy. LCU L51 is the first of the eight ships of the Landing Craft Utility (LCU) MK IV Class. It has been built by M/s Garden Reach Ship



Builders & Engineers Ltd, Kolkata. Conceived and designed indigenously, the commissioning of the ship adds a feather to the nation's 'Make in India' initiatives & indigenisation efforts in the field of warship design and construction. With a displacement of 900 tons the ship spans 62.8 m in length and 11 m in breadth.

The ship is propelled by two MTU diesel engines to do sustained speeds within AOR. The ship has been built to assist in amphibious operations by carrying out beaching operations and a reach throughout the Area of Responsibility. The ship will also play a key role in carrying out maritime surveillance of Andaman & Nicobar Islands for



preventing poaching, illegal fishing, drug trafficking, human trafficking and other illegal activities. It will also enhance the capabilities of the Andaman and Nicobar Command in Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR) operations. The armament onboard the ship includes two 30 mm CRN -91 guns manufactured

indigenously by Ordnance Factory, Medak. The gun is controlled by an electrical day-night fire control system namely Stabilised Optronic Pedestal (SOP) manufactured by Bharat Electronic Limited (BEL). The ship is also equipped with 12.7 mm Heavy Machine Guns and 7.62 mm Medium Machine Guns. In addition, the ship is fitted

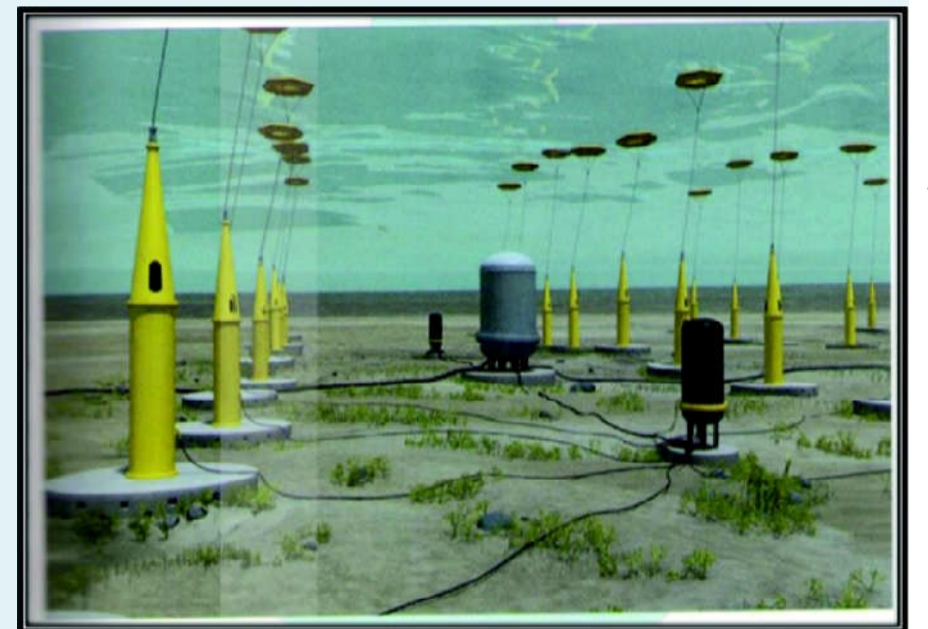
Converting Isles into total green power zone India's First Tidal Wave Energy Park of 1.125 MW to come up at Hut Bay in A&N Islands

Port Blair, Mar 28

The A&N Administration has initiated action to convert these Islands into total green power zone by December 2018 through alternative energy sources such as solar, hydro, wind, waves and LNG. As part of this initiative, the Administration will be setting up the first Tidal Wave Energy Park of 1.125 MW at Hut Bay. The project has been approved and cleared by the Project Appraisal Committee (PAC) of Ministry of Non-Renewable Energy (MNRE), supporting Green Energy Initiative to harness offshore Renewable Energy in A&N Islands. This will be executed on a pilot project basis under the Research Design Develop & Demonstration (RDD&D) scheme of GOI, MNRE, Electricity Department sources informed 'The Daily Telegrams' here.

The project will be accomplished by Seafaradays Energy Private Ltd., New Delhi which is the authorised technology partner of Sea based AB, a Swedish OEM, and Patent Technology Holder of the Wave Energy Converter. A detailed feasibility study and resource assessment was carried out by Seafaradays Energy Private Ltd., New Delhi (SEPL) in two locations in Isles and after gathering the satellite data of Wave Climate Sourced from an International Reputed Survey Agency (Fugro GEOS), Hut Bay was finalized for setting-up of 1.125 MW Tidal Wave Energy Park. The project, to come up near Harminder Bay, Hut Bay will be established on built, own and operate basis. The Joint Electricity Regulatory Commission (JERC) has fixed indicative tariff of Rs. 15.69 per unit for this proposed project. The Power Purchase Agreement will be signed soon after the approval of Administration and JERC.



Cashless Ticketing Services introduced at Chennai Ticketing Counter

The commuter approaching these counters may purchase the tickets/ monthly boat passes through Cashless mode of payment from Phoenix Bay

Counter. Moreover, the Directorate of Shipping Services is making all efforts to introduce such facilities in all other STARS ticketing counter all over the Islands keeping with the national policy on the subject of less cash India, a communication said.

IND vs AUS: KL Rahul, Ajinkya Rahane orchestrate Dharamsala run-chase; India claim Border-Gavaskar series 2-1

Dharamsala, Mar 28
Opener Lokesh Rahul and skipper Ajinkya Rahane steered India to an eight-wicket win in the fourth and final test against Australia to secure a 2-1 series victory for the hosts at the Himachal Pradesh Cricket Association Stadium on Tuesday.
Rahul made 51 not out and Rahane added a quickfire unbeaten 38 to help the hosts chase down the 106-run victory target with more than five sessions to spare.
Rahul scored the winning run, completing his sixth fifty of the series in the process.
Wrapping up the win appeared just a formality for India when their openers walked out to bat needing 87 runs to win the series with all 10 second innings wickets intact.
Josh Hazlewood was determined to make sure it was not a walk in the park, however, and struck Murali Vijay's pad back-to-back in the very first over. Both the leg-before



appeals were turned down. Rahul was fluent against spin, driving and sweeping Steve O'Keefe for a couple of boundaries in the left-arm spinner's second over of the day. Pat Cummins injected brief excitement in his second over of the day when two Indian wickets fell.
The paceman dismissed Vijay caught behind for eight with his first delivery, and five balls later, a scoreless Cheteshwar Pujara, normally a good judge of singles, was run out chasing a risky run. Glenn Maxwell did an excellent job at point, where he collected Pujara's push and threw down the middle stump at the non-striker's end with the batsman well short of crease after a mix-up with Rahul.
Leading the side in the absence of injured regular skipper Virat Kohli, Rahane played with uncharacteristic aggression, hitting Cummins for back-to-back sixes at the HPCA Stadium which debuted as a test venue with this match.
The victory was India's seventh test series win in a row, dating back to their triumph in Sri Lanka in August 2015. It also marked the end of India's 13-test home season, in which they won 10, drew two and had the lone loss to Australia in the series opener in Pune.

Cristiano Ronaldo tops Lionel Messi in list of best paid footballer for 2016-17 season



Paris, Mar 28
Real Madrid's Portuguese striker Cristiano Ronaldo was the best paid footballer in 2016-17, with 87.5 million euros (\$95.3m) in earnings, ahead of his Argentinian rival at Barcelona, Lionel Messi (76.5m), according to figures to appear in Tuesday's edition of France Football.
Messi's Brazilian teammate Neymar is third with 55.5 million euros ahead of Real Madrid's Welsh forward Gareth Bale (41m) and Argentina's Ezequiel Lavezzi (28.5m), who plays for Hebei Fortune in the Chinese Super League.
Manchester United's Jose Mourinho is the best paid coach, with income of 28 million euros, the magazine said.
France Football said it based its figures on salary, bonuses and advertising income for the 2016-2017 season.

ICC Test Rankings: India hold on to No. 1 spot, retain Test mace at Apil cut-off

New Delhi, Mar 28
The Indian cricket team on Tuesday continued leading the ICC Test rankings to retain the Test Championship mace after clinching a four-match series against Australia 2-1 in Dharamsala. The achievement also helped them earn cash award of one million dollars for ensuring top position in the ICC Test Team rankings on the annual April 1 cut-off date.
Skipper Virat Kohli received the mace and cheque from ICC Cricket Hall of Famer Sunil Gavaskar at a ceremony after the fourth and final Test against Australia in Dharamsala. Going into the series the hosts needed just one win to ensure possession of the prestigious mace, which it had reclaimed following the Indore Test against New Zealand in October 2016.
The second and third places in the rankings will be decided after the ongoing Hamilton Test between South Africa and New Zealand. If South Africa wins or draws the Test, it will be assured of second place but a loss will see Australia finish ahead of it in second place.

Messi faces suspension

Chile, Mar 28
The Argentina captain is expected to miss his team's World Cup qualifier against Bolivia on Tuesday after being reported for his outburst. The incident was not in the officials' original match report, but was added on Monday and sent to Conmebol for review.

health-care, treatment and rehabilitation of persons with mental illness "in a manner that does not intrude on their rights and dignity." While replying to a debate on the bill, Shri Nadda described it as a "patient-centric" measure and said there was a need to empower the patients so that they could secure proper treatment.
The legislation has been brought after wider consultations with the stakeholders, he said. Stating that the 1987 Mental Act was institutionalised, the Minister said that in the present bill, instead of the institution, the focus was on the community.
The bill is a "progressive legislation" and intends to take care of everyone in case of any exigency, he said. Describing the bill as "historic", the Health Minister said with the support of all, "we can develop the mental health services."
