India says sea lanes of communications should be devoid of tension & rivalry

Papua New Guinea, Apr 28
India today called for freedom of navigation, saying sea lanes of communications should be devoid of tension and rivalry. In an interview to the 'Post Courier' newspaper of Papua New Guinea, President Shri Pranab Mukherjee said, India does not see itself as in competition with any country in this regard. He was replying to a question about the future of security cooperation between Papua New Guinea, PNG and India against the backdrop of strong Chinese military presence in the region. Shri Mukherjee is on a maiden two-day state visit to PNG, the

largest island in the Pacific region. The President said, the waters and Exclusive Economic Zones (EEZs) of Pacific Island countries have seen a surge of illegal activities such as smuggling, illegal fishing, human and drug trafficking which impact on the economy and political security of the Island Countries. The President said, India is ready to cooperate with Papua New Guinea and the Pacific Island Countries in helping them secure their EEZs and also extend help in disaster warning and disaster mitigation. He said, India is also ready to share satellite images developed by Indian satellites for



early warning system and help map the natural resources of each country using Indian satellite system.

New Delhi, Apr 28
Urban Development Minister Shri M Venkaiah Naidu has said that Government will notify the Real Estate Development and Regulation Bill on 1st of May. Speaking to media on the sidelines of a function in New Delhi today, Shri Naidu said, after the notification stakeholders including

New Delhi, Apr 28
Road Transport and Highways Minister Shri Nitin Gadkari has said government plans to make it mandatory to set aside one per cent of total cost of any highway project for road safety. Speaking in New Delhi yesterday, Shri Gadkari said this money will be used for road safety issues that include fixing

accidental spots, installing cameras, lights and on other such issues. Shri Gadkari said the government is committed to reducing the number of road accidents and fatalities by 50 per cent in next two to three years. He said road accidents cause an annual loss equivalent to three per cent of the GDP.

India successfully launches 7th navigation satellite; President, PM greet scientists

New Delhi, Apr 28
India has successfully put into orbit its seventh and final navigation satellite called IRNSS-1G with its own rocket. On the historic occasion at the Indian space centre, PSLV C33 rocket carried the seventh satellite of the IRNSS series precisely at 12:50 this afternoon. The 1425 kilogram satellite was ejected by the launch vehicle around 20 minutes after take off. President Shri Pranab Mukherjee has congratulated the Indian Space Research Organization, ISRO on the successful launch of PSLV-C33 carrying IRNSS-1G. In his message to Chairman of ISRO Dr A.S. Kiran Kumar, Shri Mukherjee



said, the launch of PSLV-C33 is an important landmark in the country's space programme with India now joining the small group of nations having their own regional satellite navigation system. He said, it demonstrates, yet again, India's growing capabilities in space launch technology. He said, the nation is proud of this achievement. Prime Minister Shri

Narendra Modi congratulated the entire team of ISRO scientists and the nation for the successful launch. Speaking to the scientists from New Delhi, Shri Modi said, with the launch, India will determine its own paths powered by its technology. He said, in space science, Indian scientists have achieved many accomplishments. He said, lives of people can be

transformed through space science. The Prime Minister said, till now India was dependent on other countries for GPS but now due to the satellite it has become self dependent. Shri Modi said, it will also help in disaster management. He said, the new technology will benefit the nation's people especially the fishermen. Shri Modi announced that the world will know it as NAVIC. The Prime Minister said, fellow SAARC nations can also benefit from it. 27th India - Indonesia Coordinated Patrol gets underway

Port Blair, Apr 28
The Indonesian Navy and the Indian Navy have been participating in coordinated patrol (CORPAT) twice a year since 2002 to keep this vital part of the Indian Ocean Region safe and secure for commercial shipping and international trade.

The 27th series of India - Indonesia Coordinated Patrol (CORPAT) is being conducted from Apr 28 to May 19. Opening ceremony of the CORPAT is being held at Port Blair from Apr 28 - 30. Closing ceremony will be held at Belawan, Indonesia from



May 16 - 19. The Indonesian Navy is being represented by the ship KRI Imam Bonjol and Maritime Patrol Aircraft CN 235 whilst INS Karmuk and one naval Dornier aircraft are representing the Indian

Navy. A high level Indonesian delegation for the 27th CORPAT arrived at Port Blair today. Later in the day, senior officers of the delegation led by First Admiral Muhammad Ali,

called on Vice Admiral Bimal Verma AVSM at his office, wherein the two discussed issues of mutual interest and cooperation. Apart from securing the trade sea route, the coordinated patrol also serves to enhance mutual understanding and inter-operability between the two navies. The CORPAT thus reflects the shared concern between the two countries for a peaceful Indian ocean for the benefit of international community, a communication said.

Seven-year-old Tajamul Islam to represent India at World Kickboxing Championships

Bandipora (J&K), Apr 28
Looks can be deceptive and that holds true for Tajamul Islam, a seven-year-old soft-spoken girl from a remote north Kashmir village, who is the national kickboxing champion and is all set to represent India at an international event in Italy.

Tajamul won national recognition when she bagged the gold medal in sub-junior category at 2015 National Kickboxing Championship, held at Talkatora Stadium in New Delhi.

Her achievement at the national level got her an entry to the World Championships, to be held in Andria, Italy in November. She would be the first ever Kashmiri girl to do so.

"I felt so happy that I won and would be going to Italy. My mother, who was with me in Delhi, told me that is how you play and knock down your opponent. My father, whom I spoke to on phone, told me that I will get a treat once I reach home and I was treated with my favourite Biryani," Tajamul said.

Tajamul, hailing from Tarkpora village of Bandipora, 65kms from Srinagar, is now a hero in her village and school -- Army Goodwill School, Bandipora. In fact, kickboxing is not even her forte. She excels in wushu and is also doing well in taekwondo. Her journey started in 2014 when she joined a local academy, which trains young boys and girls in

marital arts. She was declared the best fighter of Jammu and Kashmir after she won the state level championship, held last year in Jammu, and took home a gold medal. The chief coach at the championship, Kuldeep Handu, impressed with her skills, pitted her against a competitor weighing eight kgs more than her. The lean but agile Tajamul, weighing just 25kgs at that time, got the better of her opponent. The win at the state-level championship earned her a place at the 2015 National Kickboxing Championship in New Delhi. Despite kickboxing not being her forte, Tajamul, a student of second standard, participated in the championship.

Her opponent was 13-year-old but that did not deter Tajamul, as she knocked her down in just 15 minutes and became the youngest girl to win a national medal.

On Thursday, in the realm of Australian domestic cricket, a 16-year-old batsman of Indian origin, Jason Sangha, became the youngest player to ever be contracted by the country's most decorated team, New South Wales. The teenager has come up the ranks of NSW cricket rapidly, having scored heavily in the Under-19 National Championships and then scoring a hundred on debut for the Australian U-19 team against Pakistan in January this year.

Kane Williamson named New Zealand skipper in all three formats

Wellington, Apr 28
Star batsman Kane Williamson got the nod as New Zealand's captain in all three forms of the game, replacing the retired Brendon McCullum. Williamson has long been seen as McCullum's heir apparent and has already skipped the Black Caps in several one-day and Twenty20 matches. "Kane has been a leader within the team for a long time now and already shown himself to be an extremely capable captain," NZ Cricket chief executive David White said. "He's respected by his peers and the wider cricket community for his professional approach both on and off the field, and has a superb cricket brain." Williamson, who is currently in India playing in the IPL, said he wanted to build on the

achievements of McCullum, who retired in February.

Williamson led New Zealand on a giant-killing charge to the semi-finals at the recent World Twenty20 tournament in India, winning praise for his bold use of spin. Known for his calm demeanour under pressure, he made his international debut in 2010 against India. He was named Wisden Almanack's Leading Cricketer in the World this month after amassing 2,692 international runs across all formats last year - the third-highest annual aggregate ever.

Eight new rail corridors to have 160-200 km per hour speed: Minister

New Delhi, apr 28
Indian Railways has identified eight new corridors for increasing the speed of passenger trains to 160 and 200 kilometers per hour. Replying to supplementaries in the Lok Sabha, Railway Minister Shri Suresh Prabhu said the corridors includes Delhi-Chandigarh, Delhi-Kanpur, Mumbai-Goa, Mumbai-Ahmedabad and Chennai-Hyderabad. He said the feasibility and implementation study for

Delhi-Chandigarh corridor to raise the speed of passenger train to 200 kilometers per hour is being carried out. The Minister said, for other corridors, the technical inputs required for upgradation of speed of trains to 160 kilometers per hour have also been identified. The constellation of the Regional Navigation Satellite System (IRNSS) is similar to GPS (global positioning system) of the US, Glonass of Russia, and Galileo of Europe as well as China's Beidou. India can take pride in formally joining the select group of nations once IRNSS is declared operational after checking the systems-space (satellites), ground (ground stations) and the user end signal receivers.

Only on declaration of the system as operational, user end signal receiver makers will seriously get into manufacture of the equipment for use at the retail end. The system will provide accurate position information service to users across the country and the region, extending up to an area of 1,500 km. The full system comprises of nine satellites seven in orbit and two on the ground as stand-by.

The applications of IRNSS are: terrestrial, aerial and marine navigation, vehicle tracking and fleet management, terrestrial navigation for hikers and travellers, disaster management, integration with mobile phones, mapping and geodetic data capture and visual and voice navigation for drivers.
