He said that at G-20 forum also this issue was raised for the first time & consensus formed on it.

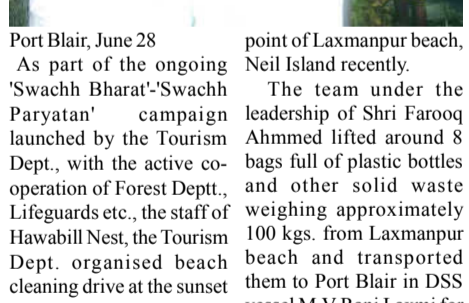
'Safety of Fishermen at Sea'

Public advised to take precautionary measures & prevent electric fire mishaps

Port Blair, June 28 The Chief Fire Officer, A&N Islands has asked the general public to take appropriate precautionary measures and avoid fire incidence that occur due to electric short circuit. The advisory has been issued in view of the steep rise in the number of business establishments like hotels, shops etc. and set-up of Govt. Residential and Non-Residential buildings in the territory over the past

decade due to which their needs have also increased. The CFO, in a press release received here recently mentioned that a data analysis of fire calls occurred in A&N Islands from the year 2015 to till date shows that as many as 727 fire calls have been attended by A&N Police Fire Service. Out of these, 162 number of fire calls were received merely for the reason of 'Electric Short Circuit' due to overheating,

overloading, use of substandard appliances, illegal tapping of electrical wires, improper electrical wiring, carelessness and ignorance etc. and such incidents could lead to serious fire and fatal accidents, if proper instructions are not followed. Such incidents can be minimized to a great extent if adequate fire precautions are observed.

France, June 28
Lowly ranked Iceland becomes the last team to book the last-8 berth as they stunned a mighty England side, 2-1, in the Euro Football Championships 2016 last night.
In the round of 16 match, England attained an early lead in the 4th minute with Wayne Rooney's penalty kick. However, it was shortlived as Iceland's Aron Gunnarsson equalised from a half volley that went past England's Goal Keeper Joe Hart, in the 8th minute.
Then 133rd ranked Iceland took lead with Kolbeinn Sigthorsson strike from edge of penalty area. This is one of the biggest upset in EURO Football cup



history.
While in another round of 16 match last night, two time defending champions Spain were ousted by Italy 2-0. Italy out classed former champions as they rode on goals by Giorgio Chiellini and Graziano

Hyderabad, June 28
Dutee Chand's brilliant performance in Almaty (Kazakhstan) to qualify for the Rio Olympics in the 100m event may well provide a perfect backdrop for the 56th National inter-state senior athletics meet to be held at GMC Balayogi Stadium (Gachibowli) here from July 28 to August 2.
However, according to Prof K. Ranga Rao, secretary of Telangana Athletics Association, which is hosting the event, Dutee, who has been training at this venue for the last one year after coming back from the IAAF suspension, will not be taking part in the meet as she is not in the country. This meet also happens to be the one final chance for Indian athletes — desperately seeking to meet the qualifying marks in their respective events — to make it to the Rio Games this August.
One of the major attractions here will be Tintu Luka, who has already booked a ticket to Rio in 800m.
It was from here in the 2012 Nationals that high jumper Sahana Kumari qualified for the London Olympics. It is a venue which fortunately is still well-

maintained despite the track (laid before the 2002 National Games) showing some signs of wear and tear.

New Delhi, June 28
Indore is set to host its first-ever Test during the three-match series against New Zealand in September-October as India's top cricketers on Tuesday announced the full schedule of the tour that will kick start the team's home season.
Skipper Virat Kohli announced on twitter that the first Test will be played at the Green Park stadium in Kanpur between September 22 and 26.
Batsman Ajinkya Rahane revealed that the second Test will be held at the Holkar Stadium in Indore between September 30 and October 4, while the iconic Eden Gardens has been given the third and final Test from October 8 to 12, according to seamer Mohammad Shami.

"The land of great Syed Mushtaq Ali will host its 1st ever Test Match. Indore is waiting 4 the moment. #IndvNZ 2nd Test Match starts Sept 30," Rahane wrote on his twitter handle. Kohli said, "TeamIndia will begin the home season at one of the oldest venues in the country — KANPUR vs. @BLACKCAPS #IndvNZ 1st Test starts Sept 22."
Dharamsala will host the first of the five ODIs on October 16, while Delhi (October 19), Mohali (October 23), Ranchi (October 26) and Visakhapatnam (October 29) will organise the other matches. Through his twitter account, newly appointed head coach Anil Kumble urged fans to turn up for the final One-day International in the port city of Visakhapatnam. "Vizag is all set to host the final ODI of the series against Kiwis #IndvNZ on Oct 29. Turn up at the stadium and support #TeamIndia @BCCI," Kumble said.

India as a member of MTCR will strengthen international non-proliferation: US

Washington, Jun 28
The United States has said that India becoming a member of the Missile Technology Control Regime (MTCR) will strengthen international non-proliferation. State Department spokesperson Elizabeth Trudeau said in Washington that New Delhi has demonstrated to all MTCR partners a sustained commitment to non-proliferation. She said India has a legally based, effective export control system that puts into effect the MTCR

guidelines and procedures, and administers and enforces such controls effectively. Ms Trudeau told reporters at her daily news conference that all 34 current members, including the United States, agreed India met the standard required to become an MTCR member. In a separate statement issued by the State Department, the US welcomed India's accession as the newest member of MTCR.

- * Undertake wiring work through qualified/certified/registered firm or technical hands.
- * Use ISI certified appliance
- * Use good quality fuses of correct rating, Miniature Circuit Breakers (MCB) and Earth Leakage Circuit Breakers (ELCB).
- * Use one socket for one appliance.
- * Switch off the electrical supply of the fire affected areas.
- * Fuses and switches should be mounted on metallic cubicles for greater fire safety.
- * Replace broken plugs and switches.
- * Keep the electrical wiring away from hot and wet surfaces.
- * Switch off appliance after use and remove the plug from the socket.
- * Switch off the main switch when leaving home for a long duration.
- Don'ts**
- * Don't use sub standard fixtures, appliance
- * Never have temporary or naked joint or wiring
- * Don't lay wires under carpets, mats or doorways. They get crushed, resulting in short circuiting.
- * Do not allow appliance's cords to dangle.
- * Don't place bare wire ends in a socket.
- * Don't keep appliance running when going out of home/office etc.
