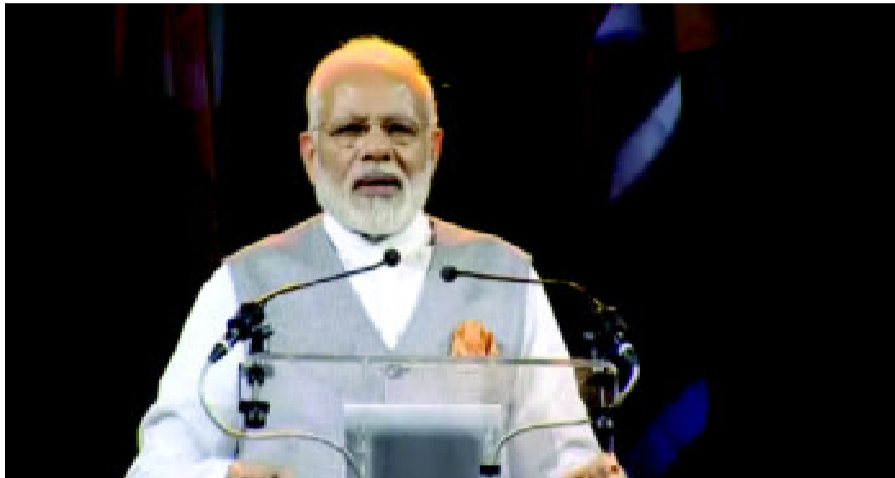

India of 21st century cannot be left behind; everything we have must be world class: PM

Hague, Jun 28

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has said that everything the country have must be world class as the India of the 21st century cannot stay behind when it comes to technology and infrastructure. Addressing Indian diaspora at a stadium in South Holland's capital the Hague, Prime Minister stressed on larger community participation in development. Shri Modi said, India will have to be modernised at a greater speed. Addressing the diaspora, the Prime Minister announced that five years business visa will soon be granted to the



Dutch nationals.

Shri Modi appealed all Indian origin people in Netherlands to apply for their Overseas Citizens of India, OCI, cards at earliest. Shri Modi praised the Sarnami Indians for maintaining Indianness

despite being outside India for around 150 years. He said, despite migrating as labourers to American country of Surinam & then to Netherlands, the Sarnami community has maintained Indian language, culture and

traditions. Emphasizing that relations of blood do not change with change in colour of passport, he said, Indian diaspora across world has feeling of an obligation towards India.

The Prime Minister, citing the contribution of India's women across all fields, said his government aims at the women-led development. He said, his government's thrust has been on 'jan bhagidari' (people's involvement) in governance as he believed that the country's progress cannot be ensured only through the government's work.

He mentioned about various initiatives taken by his government in the sectors like banking, energy and digitalisation and talked about progress being made in areas like space, healthcare and sanitation.

Govt aims to promote transport & tourism through rivers: Minister

Shipping Minister Shri Nitin Gadkari has said government aims to promote transport and tourism through rivers. He was speaking on the occasion of preparation of an action plan for development of Cruise Tourism in the country yesterday. said the Brahmaputra River will be dredged to boost trade and tourism with South East Asian nations. He also said government is trying to bring alternative fuel like ethanol in Shipping, which is cost effective, pollution free and indigenous. Shri Gadkari said government is keen on pushing development of cruise tourism on fast track mode.

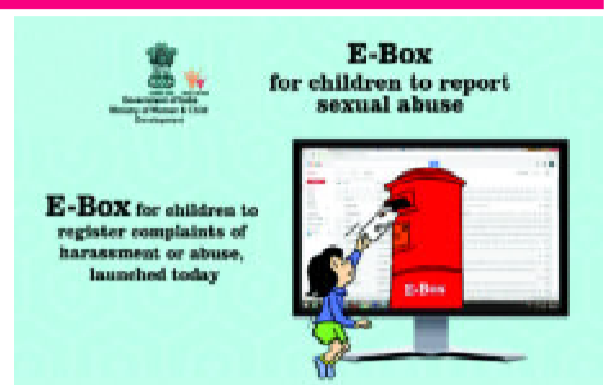

Considering the growing menace of cyber crimes targeting children, NCPCR has now enhanced the scope of POC SO e-box to handle cyber bullying, cyber stalking, morphing of images and child pornography. Child victims themselves or their friends, parents, relatives or guardians can report cyber crimes by pressing the e-box button available at the Commission's website, www.ncpcr.gov.in. They can also register their complaints on email id, pocsoebox-ncpcr@gov.in



or mobile no 9868235077. POC SO e-box is an easy and direct medium for reporting of child sexual abuse under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, 2012. Developed by NCPCR, POC SO e-box was launched by Women and Child Development Minister Smti Maneka Sanjay Gandhi. Child abuse is finding new forms and channels

through mobile and digital technologies. In India about 134 million children have access to mobile phones and the number is growing very fast with even faster access to internet. While this provides opportunities for accessing useful material for learning purposes, lack of digital literacy and online safety measures expose children to hazards of cyber crime.

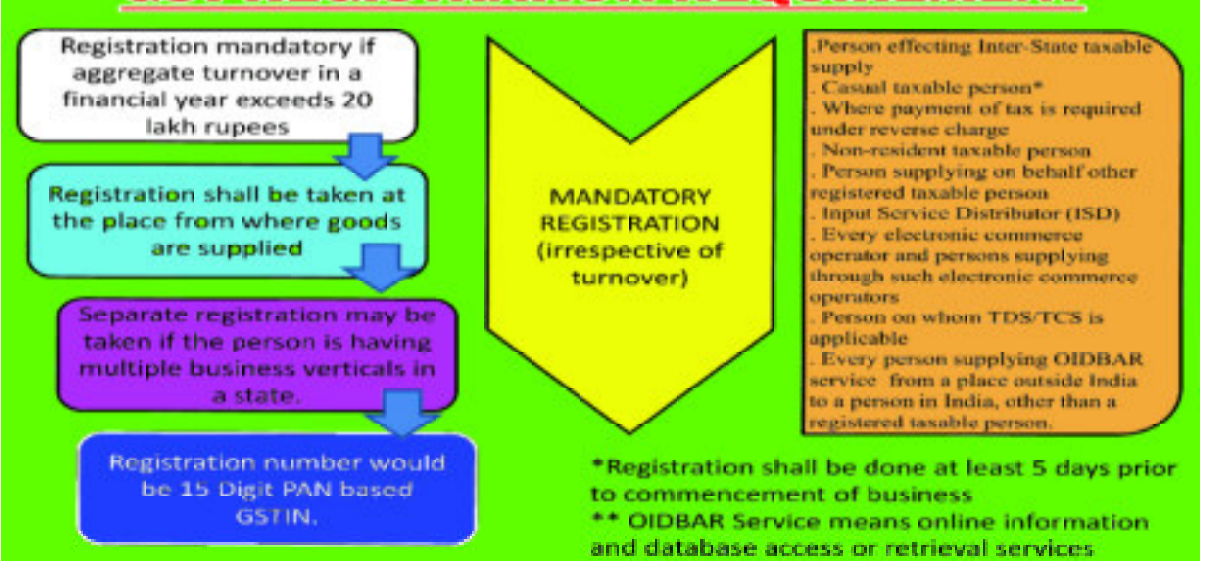

Swachh Bharat Abhiyan is a campaign by the Government of India to clean the streets, roads and infrastructure of the country's 4,041 statutory cities and towns. It includes ambassadors and activities such as run, national real-time monitoring or spread of updated NGOs practices.

The campaign was officially launched on 2 October 2014 at Rajghat, New Delhi, by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi. Overall progress of monsoon is fairly satisfactory: IMD

New Delhi, Jun 28

India Meteorological Department - IMD said overall progress of monsoon is fairly satisfactory. DG I MD K J Ramesh said so far, all India rainfall has been 100 percent. He said monsoon has covered most parts of country, except Uttar Pradesh, Delhi, Haryana, Rajasthan, Uttarakhand, Punjab and Jammu Kashmir. He said monsoon will advance in these areas between 30th June and 4th July. Meanwhile, pre-monsoon showers lashed various parts of the national capital on Wednesday afternoon, bringing relief to Delhiites from scorching heat. The city has so far received 15.6 millimetre rainfall. Wednesday's maximum temperature was recorded 35 degree Celsius, two degree below normal while the minimum settled at 28 degree Celsius. The weatherman has predicted generally cloudy sky with spell of rains during next 24 hours. Thursday's maximum and minimum temperature will be hovering around 32 and 26 degree Celsius.



Huge theft of IMFL from ANIIDCO Wine Shop cracked by South Andaman Police

Port Blair, June 28
The South Andaman Police has cracked the sensational burglary case at ANIIDCO, Wine Shop Mohanpura. On the complaint of Shri K. Srinivas Rao, In-Charge ANIIDCO, Wine Shop, Mohanpura, a case vide Crime No. 172/2017 dtd.17-04-2017 U/s 457/380 IPC was registered at PS Aberdeen against unknown person on Apr 17, 2017. The complainant stated that he closed the wine shop properly at 8 pm on Apr 16, and went to home. When he came and opened the shop on Apr 17, he noticed that a portion of wall was broken and some of the IMFL cartoons were stolen. On this he informed the matter to ANIIDCO and police, and immediately rushed to spot and enquired thoroughly and checked the stock and found around 950 IMFL bottles were stolen by some unknown person in the intervening night by breaking the wall of the wine shop.

technical surveillance to unearth the theft and ensured checking at JPP Jirkatang on in North & Middle Andaman. The special team of PS Aberdeen was closely monitoring the movements of one suspect namely Maisaiah, 36, R/o Sisty Nagar from many days and intercepted him who during interrogation accepted his guilt and revealed that on the intervening night of Apr 16 & 17, 2017, he broke the side wall of ANIIDCO wine Shop, Mohanpura and got away with the huge catch of IMFL. He also accepted that on Jun 24, he again went to the same shop with the intention of burglary but had to run away due to sighting by the neighbour. The Excise team of PS Aberdeen has recovered 50

bottles of IMFL from his possession, along with the instruments used for the burglary. This burglary was unsolved for last 2 months and was being monitored by Shri. Atul Kumar Thakur, SP (D) South Andaman. The South Andaman Police has worked extremely hard in cracking this case by deploying tremendous efforts. ISSF Junior World Championship: India finish second with 8 medals

Berlin, Jun 28

India's shooting squad finished second at the ISSF Junior World Championship taking place in Suhl, Germany with eight medals – three gold, two silver and three bronze. With 19 medals in their kitty, China topped the medal tally to finish first in the tournament. They claimed eight gold medals in the tournament that finished on Tuesday. The 25m pistol junior men's event gave India three medals – a gold and a silver – in the individual sections. The team got a bronze from the 25m junior women's event. The fourth and final day of the tournament saw Anish Bhanwala winning all the three colours in medals for



India. His wins included both individual events and team, in which he teamed up with Anhad Jawanda and Shivam Shukla to total 1733 in the 25m pistol to win gold. India's Muskan finished in the sixth position after a 578 shot to qualify for the eight-woman final. She missed out on a medal with a score of 24 out of 40 shots and a finish in

fourth place. Korea ended at the third position in the tournament. They were a point behind India in winning silver. However, China were a point behind the Koreans in bronze. The Test events will take place on Wednesday in the mixed format in 10m air rifle and air pistol categories.

ICC Women's World Cup: India to take on West Indies today

London, Jun 28

After upstaging England, India would take on the West Indies in their second match of the ICC Women's World Cup on Thursday, in Taunton which is the county town of Somerset, England. The match will begin at 3 p.m. Indian Standard Time. The Indian eves could not have asked for a better start to the tournament as they stunned hosts England by 35 runs in their tournament-opener.



It was an all-round performance by Mithali Raj led India against England as they excelled in all three departments of the game. First the batters piled up a

competitive 281 for three after being sent in and then the Indian bowlers bundled out the hosts for 246 in 47.3 overs. The West Indies, on the other hand, lost by eight wickets to

fancied Australia in their opening match.

Malinga suspended for one year, fined for media remarks

Colombo, Jun 28
Lasith Malinga was suspended for one year after the fast bowler pleaded guilty to a breach of contract by speaking to the media without permission. Sri Lankan Cricket, SLC, board in Colombo yesterday said that Malinga will also be fined 50 percent of the match fee of his next one-day international. Malinga appeared before SLC's special inquiry panel, where he accepted the charges against him and tendered a formal apology.

Kumar Sangakkara becomes first batsman to reach 1000 runs in County Championship 2017

London, June 28
Former Sri Lankan batsman Kumar Sangakkara has added one more feather to his cap as he became the first batsman to reach 1,000 runs in the Specsavers County Championship this season. Sangakkara's latest century, his sixth this season, propelled Surrey to 516 for seven declared during a heavily rain affected Day Two at Headingley against

Yorkshire. The left-hander operated at a brisk pace and was happy to score most of his runs in boundaries. The left hander was unbeaten at 180 from 183 balls when Surrey declared their innings. Sangakkara hit 21 fours and four sixes in his knock. The Sri Lanka legend reached his sixth century in only his eleventh innings off 136 balls with 12 fours and a six and his 150 off another 28.
