clubs and establishments selling/serving liquor shall be permitted to sell/serve liquor to anyone whatsoever on the aforesaid days.

This order is applicable to IMFL vending licencees i.e ANIIDCO, CSD Canteen, all Defence Canteens, Police Mess and all private bar licencees, a communication said.

LG to launch khadi prog. in Isles through New Model Charkhas & Semi Automatic Looms

Port Blair, Sept 28

On the auspicious occasion of Gandhi Jayanti, the Lt. Governor, A&N Islands, Prof. Jagdish Mukhi will inaugurate the launching of khadi programme in the territory through modernization / upgradation of the existing looms and charkhas at the District Jail, Prothrapur on 2nd October at 7 pm in a brief function being organized by the Directorate of Industries at the ITF ground as a part of Andaman Bazaar. During the programme, the Lt. Governor will handover the looms and charkhas to the Superintendent, District Jail, Prothrapur.



The A&N Islands Khadi and Village Industries Board is striving hard since last 20 odd years to implement Khadi programme in A&N Islands but absence of traditional spinners, weavers, high wages, scarcity of raw materials has been the prohibitive factors for non-implementation of khadi programme in the territory so far.

However, this is for the first

time in the history of A&N Islands, the Khadi and Village Industries Board has decided to implement Khadi programme in these islands through replacement of the existing looms and charkhas with New Model Charkhas and Semi Automatic Looms at the District Jail, Prothrapur. The programme is expected to be successful due to the possibility of less overhead expenses including labour charges

involved in mass production of khadi fabrics at jail. Once the programme is implemented successfully and production starts, the ultimate produce of the District Jail could be extended marketing support through the departmental sales outlet of KG Bhavan, being the indigenous khadi products of A&N Islands, produced by the inmates. Dipika Pallikal storms into semis of San Francisco Open

San Francisco, Sept 28
India's world No.21 Dipika Pallikal made short work of USA's Olivia Blatchford 13-11, 11-6, 11-9 to enter the women's semifinals of the San Francisco Open squash tournament, a PSA World Tour event. She made it two wins over seeded players in as many days after having beaten fourth-seed Emily Whitlock in round one. It would be her biggest PSA World Tour semifinal since 2014. Pallikal was in fine form in her match against sixth seeded Whitlock and continued in the same vein against her American rival on Wednesday. She had in fact lost to Blatchford in the first round of the same event in 2015. The first game saw the Indian



come up with some composed rallies to go four game balls up before the sixth-seed fought back. Blatchford came into her own as she fought for every point and she managed to level the scores. However, after she had overturned another game ball in the tie-break, the US No.2 tinned an attempted volley drop under pressure from Pallikal to go a game down. It was one-way traffic in the second as Pallikal dominated and quickly doubled her advantage, while a tightly-contested third game saw the Indian go match ball up when a contentious no-let decision was given against Blatchford to bring an end to the 35-minute match. She said after some unimpressive results in the summer, things were falling in place, for which she credited national coach Ashraf el Karagui.

Lakshmanan completes double at National Open Athletics C'ship

Chennai, Sep 28
G Lakshmanan of Services completed a double by cruising to victory in the men's 10,000 metres on the final day of the 57th National Open Athletics Championship at the Nehru Stadium in Chennai today. Lakshmanan had won the 5,000 metres gold on Monday. Railways with 296 points won the overall team championship with Services a distant second with 182 points in their kitty. Also, Railways topped the women's team standings while Services reigned supreme in the men's section. As far as the medals tally, Railways finished with 16 gold medals followed by the Services with 12. Tamil Nadu athlete Santhosh Kumar, who set a new meet record in the 400 metres hurdles and Chintha Yadav of Railways, the steeplechase winner, were named the 'best



male and female athlete' respectively. L Surya, too achieved a double, by coasting to victory in the 10,000 metres. She had won the 5,000 metres event on the opening day of the championship. In the triple jump, national record holder Ranjith Maheshwari of Railways was relegated to fourth with a leap of 15.94 metres. Kerala's K Sreejithmon jumped a distance of 16.15m to capture the gold medal. The Services team won the 4 X 100 metres gold while Haryana men secured the 4 X 400 metres title. In the women's 800 metres event, Olympian M R Poovamma of ONGC finished a poor fifth in a time of 2:09.24. Lili Das of Railways secured the gold in 2:04.51 followed by Sipra Sarkar of West Bengal.

India Football team undergoes training session ahead of FIFA U-17 World Cup

The Indian football team had its first training session after arriving here for the upcoming FIFA U-17 World Cup, under the watchful eyes of head coach Luis Norton de Matos. The boys, who arrived on Tuesday from Goa, went through the paces at the Conscient Football grounds at neighbouring Gurgaon, as they started their preparations for the opening match against United States of America on October 6. De Matos emphasized on tactical training along with focus on set pieces among other technical matters. The players looked to be high on confidence as they followed the drills on the guidance of the head coach and other technical staff. "The level of enthusiasm in the

Viswanathan Anand draws at Isle of Man International tournament

Douglas, Sept 28
Young prodigy R Praggnanandhaa stunned British Grandmaster David Howell while S P Sethuraman defeated Israel grandmaster Gelfand Boris in the fifth round of the Isle of Man International tournament here. However, five-time world champion Viswanathan Anand and 22-year-old Indian Grandmasters Vidit Gujrathi played out draws against Swedish grandmaster Nils Grandelius and American Grandmaster Aleksandr Lenderman respectively last

night. International Master Praggnanandhaa, who is just 12 years old, took 64 moves to force 26-year-old Howell to surrender, taking take his overall points to 3.5. Grandmaster and former Asian champion, Sethuraman, completed the victory in 52 moves against Boris, a six-time World Championship Candidate, who had won the 2009 World Cup and was the challenger for the 2012 World Championship, which Anand had defended successfully.

Five Indian shuttlers in top-20 of BWF men's rankings

New Delhi, Sep 28
Five Indians find themselves in the top-20 of the BWF men's singles rankings with H S Prannoy being the biggest gainer after his quarterfinal showing at the Japan Open last week. Prannoy has jumped four places to be world no. 15 while Kidambi Srikanth, who too lost in the quarterfinals in Japan, remains the highest-ranked Indian male player at eighth. Ajay Jayaram remains 20th while B Sai Praneeth too has not moved from his position last



week when he was 17th. Sameer Verma has gained a couple of places to enter the top-20 at the 19th spot. India's leading ladies, PV Sindhu and Saina Nehwal, remain at the second and 12th spot respectively. They both had lost in the second round in Japan. The mixed doubles pairing of Sikki Reddy and Pranaav Jerry Chopra have gained two places to be 17th. They had reached the semifinals of the Japan Open.

Kakinada. Coal carrying merchant vessel had long passage time to next port of call Kakinada, therefore it was decided to evacuate crew amid sea during dark hours in rough sea conditions, having high waves with squally rains and gusting winds. Braving all odds, Indian Coast Guard Ship Rajveer successfully evacuated the crew and headed towards Port Blair with maximum speed. The medical team onboard administered the patient with basic first aid and stabilized the crew enroute prior entering Port Blair in early morning hours.

On arrival at Port Blair, the patient in stable condition was immediately admitted at GB Pant Hospital, Port Blair for further medical treatment. On an average, 220 ships transit daily through Ten Degree Channel and south of Campbell Bay. Prompt medical evacuation and assistance will go long way projecting the savior image of Indian Coast Guard and A&N Administration amongst the mariners fraternity. The improved medical facilities in GB Pant Hospital will certainly gain confidence and instill sense of safety among the mariners transiting across Andaman Seas, a communiqué from Coast Guard said here.

Contraband tobacco products seized

Acting on a specific information received from reliable source that an unclaimed parcel containing contraband tobacco dispatched from mainland by Jet Airways is kept at Cargo Terminal, VSI Airport, a team of CCS rushed to VS International Airport on Sept 26 and examined the suspected parcel.
