## Lt. Governor visits Campbell Bay Directs officers for mitigating outstanding issues regarding shipping, port & jetty

Campbell Bay, Oct 28  
The Lt. Governor, A&N Islands, Prof. Jagdish Mukhi accompanied by the Chief Secretary, A&N Administration Shri Anindo Mazumdar visited Campbell Bay today. On his arrival, the Lt. Governor was accorded warm welcome by the Deputy Commissioner Nicobar, Smti. Neha Bansal, SP Nicobar District, Shri Deepak Yadav, Smti Manjula Lakra, Pramukh, Campbell Bay and other Senior Officers of local Administration.

Soon after his arrival, the Lt. Governor proceeded to APWD Guest House at Campbell Bay where he was accorded an impressive guard of honour. The Lt. Governor held interactions with the public at the guest house, during which various issues such as availability of shipping service, BSNL connectivity, availability of doctors at PHC, up-gradation of PHC to CHC, issue of sea sand, supply of timber, allotment of permanent shelters were extensively discussed.

Regarding shipping services, the Director of Shipping Services explained the present status of ships for Campbell Bay. He assured that the ship M.V. Campbell Bay will re-start the services by the middle of November 2016. Further, he assured that one new ship namely "Coral Queen" will arrive at Port Blair in the month of January 2017 and will provide service to the southern group of Islands. He further assured that one



cargo-cum-passenger boat will be stationed soon in Campbell Bay which will help transport surplus vegetables and fish to other sub-divisions of the district. Regarding the issue of poor BSNL Services at Campbell Bay, the Lt. Governor directed the Deputy Commissioner to make a detailed note on the availability of the services rendered currently by the BSNL in the district so that the matter can be taken up at the highest level. Regarding the availability of sea sand, DFO, Nicobar

Division explained that the sea sand will be available soon after getting the permission from the MoEF. Sawn timber is available at the depot of Campbell Bay and he suggested that the Pradhan may place the requirement of sawn timbers required for each Panchayat to the DFO. The Lt. Governor also directed the Chief Secretary, A & N Administration to ensure the visit of Secretary (Shipping) along with the Chief Port Administrator to solve all outstanding issues regarding shipping, port and jetty.

He also desired that the Director Sport should visit the sub division and submit a report on sports potential and infrastructure required for the same. The Lt. Governor and Chief Secretary interacted with the officers regarding the progress of development works and directed them to expedite the work in time bound manner. People of Campbell Bay expressed their gratitude to the Lt Governor for visiting the island and according a high priority to the issues of Campbell Bay.

Visakhapatnam, Oct 28  
The series-deciding fifth and final cricket ODI between India and New Zealand will be held in Visakhapatnam tomorrow.  
With the series locked at 2-2, Dhoni and his men will be eager to clinch the issue while history beckons Kane Williamson's men as they have a glorious opportunity to taste their maiden success in a bilateral ODI rubber.  
The only thing that can play spoilsport is the cyclone threat which can lead to complete washout.  
While Dhoni's captaincy may not be under immediate threat but a series loss against New



Zealand will certainly raise questions about 'Captain Cool's' ability to marshal his resources after his much publicised admission of being unable to rotate strike lower down the order.  
Under Dhoni, India lost three ODI series -- 1-2 against Bangladesh in Bangladesh, 1-4 against Australia Down Under and 2-3 at home against South Africa. The only ODI series victory in the last 18 months has been against a lowly Zimbabwe.

Accept 500/1,000 notes only after careful scrutiny: RBI

New Delhi, Oct 28  
Reserve Bank of India has urged public to examine 500 rupees and 1000 rupees currency notes before accepting them in the usual course of transactions to avoid circulation of fake currency notes. RBI said, unscrupulous elements are putting into circulation Fake Indian Currency Notes of higher denominations. The

central bank has cautioned the public to subject notes that are accepted to "careful scrutiny".  
RBI has asked public to make it a habit of looking at the notes before accepting them and help arrest the counterfeiting of Indian banknotes. Counterfeiting of notes, or possession, exchange, acceptance or in any way abetting such actions are offences under the Indian Penal Code and are liable to be punished stringently. Reserve Bank has appealed to the public for cooperation and also authorities in containing the menace of circulation of counterfeit notes. Detailed information on the security features on the banknotes are available on RBI website.

Clinical Establishments directed to renew provisional registration

Port Blair, Oct. 28  
The District Registering Authority, South Andaman has directed the Clinical Establishments which are already registered, to apply for renewal of provisional registration within 30 days before the expiry of the validity of the certificate of provisional registration. In case the application for renewal is not submitted within the stipulated period, the authority shall allow for renewal of registration on payment of the renewal amount and penalty of Rs. 100 per day till the date of the application for renewal under Section 22 of the Act. The details of the clinical establishment will be uploaded in the official website of A & N Administration i.e. www.andamangov.in.

Whosoever carries on clinical establishments without registration shall on first contravention, be liable to monetary penalty upto fifty thousand rupees; for second contravention to a monetary penalty which may extend to two lakh rupees and for any subsequent contravention to a monetary penalty which may extend to five lakh rupees.

Those who have any objection, may give it in writing with evidences for their objection to the District Registering Authority, South Andaman, Room No. 40, Deputy Commissioner Office South Andaman, Port Blair, a communication from the Chairman/ADM (SA), Enforcement Committee, District Registering Authority, South Andaman said.

Depression over westcentral Bay of Bengal

Port Blair, Oct. 28  
The depression over westcentral Bay of Bengal moved further west-south westwards with speed 10 kmph, and lay centred over westcentral Bay of Bengal last night, near Latitude 15.3° N and Longitude 83.0° E, about 260 km south-southwest of Vishakhapatnam and 220 km east-southeast of Machilipatnam and 330 km east-northeast of Nellore. It is most likely to move west-southwestwards and weaken further into a well marked low pressure area during next 24 hours. Do's & Don'ts for burns & scalbs

The Directorate of Health Services has issued do's & don'ts for burns & scalbs in view of the ensuing Diwali festival. It advised to apply cool, wet clothes or immerse in water at least for 15 minutes and do not use ice. Blot gently and apply a dry, sterile pad if necessary. If arms and legs are affected, elevate above heart level. If deep tissue destruction with a white or charred appearance is noticed; without pain, call for medical help immediately. Be alert for signs of shock such as cold clammy skin and low pulse rate.  
Do not clean burns or break blisters. Do not remove any clothing that sticks to burn. Do not apply grease, ointment or medication to a severe burn. Do not use cotton or material with loose fibers to cover burns. Call 03192-232102 /102 for any emergency, a communication from the DD (Health) said.
