Development of Tourism in A&N Islands Niti Aayog takes up initiative for holistic development of 5 Islands

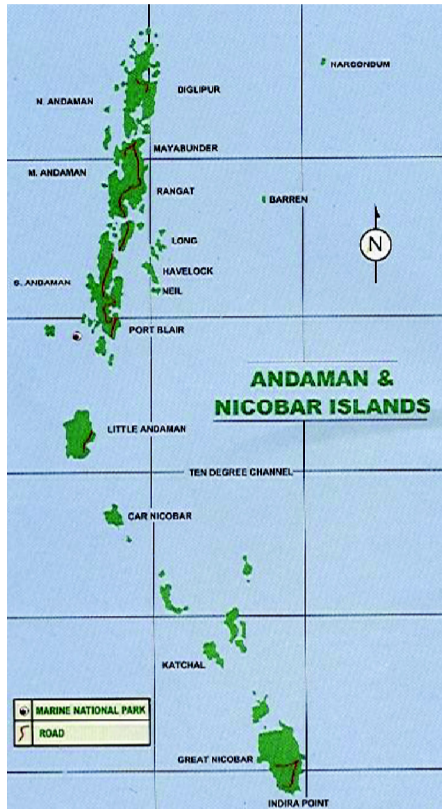
New Delhi, Nov 28

Niti Aayog has informed that they have taken up an initiative for preparation of a Concept Development Plan and detailed Master Plans for Holistic development of 10 Islands in Andaman & Nicobar as well as Lakshadweep Islands. Andaman & Nicobar Administration has formulated a "Tourism Policy" in the year 2010 for development of tourism. Similarly, Lakshadweep Administration has notified Lakshadweep Tourism Policy-2016, which envisages for holistic development of tourism in the entire UT of Lakshadweep Islands. Lakshadweep Administration has informed that they are in the advance stage of finalizing the Guidelines for establishment of Eco-friendly Resort, Scuba diving Centres etc. These guidelines will enable establishment of tourism

infrastructure in all the tourist focal islands of Lakshadweep through Public as well as Private Investment and Public Private Partnership (PPP) mode. A Request for Qualification (RFQ)-cum-Request for Proposal (RFP) document has been prepared and uploaded on the website of NITI Aayog for engagement of a suitable consultant to facilitate preparation of Concept Development Plan and Detailed Master Plans for five Andaman & Nicobar Islands as well as five Lakshadweep Islands.

The Administration of Andaman & Nicobar Islands has established separate Department "Directorate of Disaster Management" for managing disasters. A State Control Room has also been established and functioning 24/7 x 365 days. The Emergency

CS chairs meeting on implementation of cashless transactions in Islands

Instructs banks, Govt. Departments and other stakeholders to promote cashless transactions

Port Blair, Nov. 28

A meeting regarding implementation of cashless transaction in A&N Islands was held under the Chairmanship of the Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Anindo Majumdar in the conference hall of Secretariat today. During the meeting, the Chief Secretary instructed all banks to promote use of internet banking, mobile banking, RuPay etc. They have also been asked to promote use of POS machines. At present, 249 out of 350 POS machines are active and the SBI will install more POS machines in the Islands, within a week.

Apart from this, the Government Departments viz. APWD, Electricity, Forest, Shipping, Civil Aviation, Transport, Tourism, DC (SA), DC (N&MA), DC (N), Information & Publicity have been instructed to open current account. In this regard, the Director (Accounts & Budget) will submit a proposal to CGA, Delhi immediately. The Govt. Departments have been asked to use of SBI Buddy App and Pay TM and other mobile e-Wallets to deposit payments by public upto Rs.5000/- in Govt. Treasury. POS machines will be used in all Govt. Guest Houses, Transport Department, PBMC and ANIIDCO and its outlets.

The IT Department has

been instructed to promote use of Citizen Service Centres (CSC). The Deputy Commissioner (SA), Deputy Commissioner (N&MA) and Deputy Commissioner (N) have been asked to promote cashless transaction in their respective areas by creating public awareness. They have also been asked to coordinate with bankers, traders, public representatives and public at large. Bankers have also been directed to create awareness and launch publicity to encourage

cashless economy in the Islands.

Flight, shipping, bus transport, Police Department will switch over to cashless mode and use of RuPay card will be promoted in the Islands.

The Andaman Chamber of Commerce has been requested to promote use of POS machines and e-Wallets and RuPay Card. The Chamber of Commerce urged for waiver of bank fees and the banks will take a decision in this regard accordingly.

The CGM, BSNL has

been asked to take steps to provide improved connectivity and approach the Ministry of Telecom/IT to enhance the same.

The Principal Secretary (Finance), Shri Raajiv Yaduvanshi, the Lead Bank SBI and all banks, Presidents of ACCI & Grain Dealers and Grocers Association, CGM, BSNL, Secretary, Civil Supplies, Labour Commissioner, DC (SA), Director (Tourism) attended the meeting, an official release said here today.

Govt to substitute physical currency with digital money

New Delhi, Nov 28

The government has said it wants to substitute physical currency with digital money. In reply to supplementaries in the Lok Sabha, Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley said, the government's effort is to see that the quantum of physical currency comes down, but trade and economy must expand.

Shri Jaitley said there are 80 crore debit cards of various kinds in circulation and 40 crore of them are being used at the ATMs actively. He said electronic wallets and digital transfer of funds are the future technology and government is encouraging it. He also sought cooperation of state governments in this regard.

Importance of Official Language, policy, Hindi Grammar and all other aspects related to Official Language will be covered during the seminar, a communication said.

UTLBC meeting to review performance of banks today

Port Blair, Nov. 28

The Union Territory Level Bankers' Committee (UTLBC) meeting for A&N Islands for September 2016 quarter will be held tomorrow (Nov. 29) at 11.30 am at Megapode Nest. The Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Anindo Majumdar will be the guest of honour of the meeting while the General Manager, State Bank of India will chair it. The meeting is being held to

review the performance of banks upto September 2016 quarter under Annual Credit Plan 2016-17 and various govt. sponsored schemes.

It will also be attended by higher authorities from Reserve Bank of India, FIDD, Kolkata, NABARD and banking sector. Senior Officers of the Govt. Departments and developmental agencies will also attend the meeting, a communication said.

Prohibited tobacco products seized in N&M Andaman

Mayabunder, Nov. 28

A team of Food Safety Department conducted raids against contraband tobacco at Kalighat area recently. During their raid 18.6 kg of dried tobacco leaf (sukha patti) kept in three bags were found stored in one room of M/s Ratan Store, Kalighat owned by Shri Ashok Kumar Das. An adjudication case is already registered against the offender for indulging in storage and sale of banned tobacco products (zarda).

Earlier, similar raids were also carried out at Mayabunder and Rangat by the Food Safety Officers along with Police Personnel. Seven adjudication cases have already been registered in the Court of Adjudicating Officer (Deputy Commissioner), N&M Andaman, Mayabunder so far, and thirty six petty food business operators have

been compounded by the Designated Officer for storing and selling prohibited tobacco products and a sum of Rs.40,000/- has been seized as fine.

The FSO team was headed by Shri Nagoor Meeran, Food Safety Officer, Diglipur along with Police

RBI allows banks to deposit old Rs 500, 1000 notes at district chests

New Delhi, Nov 28

To decongest storage facility of banks of old 500 and 1,000 rupee notes, the Reserve Bank of India, RBI has allowed lenders to park such currencies at currency chests at the district level in view of mounting deposits due to the demonetisation drive. The central bank said a currency chest operating at the point to be called Designated Chest-DC will be required to operate a

separate vault -- to be named Chest Guarantee Vault CGV as an extended arm of it. RBI said in a notification, preferably Banks not having any currency chest, will deposit such notes in sealed boxes and will get the value of the notes to the credit of their current account with the chest branch. The facility will also be available at post offices if they are maintaining current

account with the chest branch managing CGV. RBI also said expenses relating to round the clock guarding will be borne by the central bank, if necessary. Besides, expenses relating to remittance of old currency notes to RBI will also be borne by the apex bank. The notification further said the regional office of RBI will arrange evacuation of notes from the district chest on priority basis.

N&M Andaman ZP Adhyaksh visits Karmatang Village; inspects developmental works

Mayabunder, Nov. 28

The Adhyaksh, Zilla Parishad, North & Middle Andaman, Shri Saw Tathu along with Engineering staff of Zilla Parishad, North & Middle Andaman visited Karmatang village and inspected the Community Hall at Ward No.4 which needs immediate maintenance for the use of the public.

The Adhyaksh assured the public to take up the maintenance work on priority basis. The youths of Karmatang also requested for the establishment of gym and the Adhyaksh assured them for opening of gym in the said Community hall by utilising some space -by partitioning. Accordingly, he directed the Engineering

Wing to prepare the estimate for maintenance as well as establishment of gym. Mohali Test: England 78/4 at stumps on day 3

Mohali, Nov 28
India are on course for yet another comprehensive victory, outclassing England on all counts in the third Cricket Test at Mohali. The visitors were reeling at 78 for four, at stumps on Day 3, still trailing by 56 runs with 6 wickets remaining in their second innings. Joe Root survived the day with 36 not out amidst Ravichandran Ashwin's onslaught who has captured 3 wickets so far. Earlier the Indian team post a commendable 417 to give India a healthy 134 run first innings lead. Ravindra Jadeja smashed his way to a career-best 90 as the lower middle-order came good



again in the third Test today. The highlight of the first two sessions on day three was Jadeja's 90 off 170 balls comprising 10 fours and a six. His partnership of 97 with Ravichandran Ashwin (72) is likely to have a telling impact in the final context of the match. Not to forget the 80-run stand he shared with debutant

Jayant Yadav who made 55, his maiden half-century in Test cricket. For the record, no visiting team has won against India after having conceded 65 run plus lead in the first innings. The last time it happened was 52 years ago, back in 1964 when Bob Simpson Australia won after conceding a 65-run firstinnings lead.

Sensational Sindhu sets sight on fourth Macau Open title

Macau, Nov 28
Three-time champion and Olympic silver medalist P V Sindhu will look to continue her rampaging run when she starts her title defence at the USD 120,000 Macau Open Grand Prix Gold badminton tournament which begins here tomorrow. Second seed Sindhu, who clinched her maiden Super Series Premier title at China Open and then reached the finals at the Hong Kong Super series in the last two weeks, will be the hot favourite when she starts her campaign against China's Yue Han on Wednesday. Interestingly, Sindhu's march towards her fourth title might be halted by compatriot and top seed Saina Nehwal, who is slowly and steadily getting back

her bearing after recovering from a serious knee injury which affected her Olympic campaign three months back. After undergoing a knee surgery in August, followed by a rigorous rehabilitation and training under the watchful eyes of her coach Vimal Kumar, Saina made a comeback at China Open but lost in the opening round. She competed at the Hong Kong Open before losing closely in the quarterfinals. The former World No. 1 Indian, who will take on Indonesia's Hanna Ramadini in the opening round, will be eager to add this title to her name to boost her confidence ahead of the new season. Both the Indians are clubbed in the two halves and it would be interesting to see if they can

set up a mouth-watering final clash on Sunday. In the men's singles, national Champion Sameer Verma, who hogged the limelight after reaching the finals at Hong Kong last Sunday, will also hope for another stellar performance when he opens his campaign against Czech Milan Ludik. It would be a sort of comeback for Commonwealth Games P Kashyap, who had taken a break after the Denmark Open. "After Dutch Open I was not feeling that fit and though I played Denmark, I decided to take a break to get back my full fitness and make some changes to my game. So I got around 4-5 weeks and I worked hard with Gopi, so looking forward for a good week ahead," Kashyap told.

Abu Dhabi Grand Prix: Nico Rosberg foils Lewis Hamilton to claim maiden title

Abu Dhabi, Nov 28
Nico Rosberg clinched his maiden world title on Sunday when he finished second in the Abu Dhabi Grand Prix despite Lewis Hamilton ignoring team orders in his quest to foil the German. The 31-year-old Rosberg concluded the longest season in the sport's history with a nail-biting second place under intense pressure after leader and ultimate race winner Hamilton had slowed the field to create a difficult finish. Hamilton reeled off his 10th win of the season - the most by any driver not to win the title - and the 53rd of his career, but his gamesmanship upset his team and his team-mate in the closing laps. His final lap was nine seconds slower than the lap that carried him to pole and was clearly designed to push Rosberg into a vulnerable position as Sebastian Vettel closed in his Ferrari.



Hamilton ignored two instructions from the team to increase his speed at the front, but was unable to create a situation in which Rosberg could be attacked and passed. It was Rosberg's triumph, in the end, as his wife Vivian made clear when she screamed her congratulations on the team radio. "We did it, we did it!" "Yipppee!" Rosberg replied. Rosberg joined an exclusive club by becoming only the second son of a former champion to take the title, his father Keke having won the championship 34 years ago with the Williams team. Briton

Damon Hill did the same when he won the title with Williams, following his father Graham's achievements, in 1996. He also became Germany's third champion. The tension was palpable as they climbed from their cars to go to the podium after the race in which Vettel finished third for Ferrari ahead of Dutchman Max Verstappen and his Red Bull team-mate Daniel Ricciardo. Rosberg celebrated by giving F1 supremo Bernie Ecclestone a massive bear hug, lifting the diminutive octogenarian high into the air, as Hamilton stared glumly at the floor.

Demonetisation among 3 most important economic reforms: Ratan Tata

New Delhi, Nov 28
Industrialist Ratan Tata said that demonetisation will help fight black money. He said it is amongst the three most important economic reforms in India's history, along with delicensing and GST. In a tweet, he said the government's bold implementation of the

programme needs the nation's support. Ratan Tata said the Prime Minister's recent focus on mobile and digital payments will also greatly facilitate the transition from a cash-driven economy to a cashless economy, which in the long term will enormously benefit the poor and underprivileged. He added that the parallel black money economy in India has fueled tax evasion, money laundering and corruption.

Operation Centres are functioning in coordination with all line departments/stakeholder under the supervision and control of State Emergency Operation Centre with fine state of art communication linkage with support of Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services, Hyderabad, Indian Meteorological Department, New Delhi, Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO), Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), National Disaster Response Force (NDRF). In Lakshadweep, the Integrated Island Management Plan (IIMP) has taken care of the protection in the event of natural calamities. At present, SPORTS (Society for Promotion of Nature Tourism & Sports), the Government agency of Union Territory of Lakshadweep, employs tribals for running tourism and the UT Department of Tourism is imparting training to them in tourism related field. The Andaman & Nicobar Administration have informed that tribal areas are not open for tourism in Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
