## NGT directs all states, UTs to submit Coastal Zone Management Plan before April 30

New Delhi, Nov 28  
The National Green Tribunal has directed all States and Union Territories to submit a Coastal Zone Management Plan (CZMP) to the Ministry of Environment and Forests before April 30 next year.

A bench headed by NGT Chairperson Justice Swatanter Kumar yesterday warned the States and UT governments that if they failed to submit a plan, they would be liable for an exemplary cost of five lakh rupees which should be recovered from the salary of the concerned defaulting officers concerned. The bench said the Environment Ministry by July 31, 2018, shall issue approval in regard to the fixation of hazard line and CZMP for the respective state covering the entire coastal area. The green panel also granted liberty

to the Environment Ministry to approach the tribunal if any of the states defaulted. The direction came on a plea seeking an expeditious framing of CZMP for different states and UTs such as Puducherry, Lakshadweep, Daman and Diu. The Coastal zone management involves managing coastal areas to balance environmental, economic, human health and related activities.

## MP expresses gratitude to FM for extending benefits of risk & hardship allowances to fire fitting staff

The Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray has been consistently pursuing the matter with the Home Ministry and also the Ministry of Finance for extending the benefit of additional 13th month's pay and for the Risk & Hardship allowances to fire fitting staff of this UT Islands. ## Civil aircraft simulated accident contingency & mass casualty evacuation exercise on Nov. 30

In order to check the preparedness of safety services to deal with an accident/incident at Veer Savarkar International Airport, Port Blair, a simulated exercise is scheduled to be conducted from 3 pm to 5.50 pm on Nov. 30, 2017. During the exercise, a mass casualty situation will be simulated. Dummy casualties will be evacuated to GB Pant Hospital and Naval Hospital INHS Dhanvantari. The exercise will involve heavy movement of Ambulances and associated vehicles to and from the Airport to the hospitals. People have been requested to avoid using the stretch of road from GB Pant Hospital to INS Utkrosh (Lamba Line) via VIP Road and from Lamba Line to INHS Dhanvantari via Minnie Bay circle from 2:45 pm to 6 pm. Various stakeholders that will be participating in the exercise are the Andaman and Nicobar Command, Airport Authority of India, Directorate of Health Services, Disaster Management Cell (Andaman & Nicobar Administration) and District Police, a communication said.

## Regional level marine oil pollution exercise by Coast Guard today

A Regional Level Marine Oil Pollution Response Exercise by the Indian Coast Guard will be carried off Port Blair tomorrow (Nov.29). Four thousand ton, specialized pollution control vessel, Indian Coast Guard Ship (ICGS) Samudra Paheredar has already arrived at Port Blair from mainland to carry out the exercise. The exercise is aimed at analysing the preparation and coordination between various agencies in response to a marine oil spill in the Andaman sea, informed the Captain of the Vessel, DIG Praveen Kumar Mishra while briefing the media persons



on board the Vessel today.

DIG Mishra further informed that the vessel is capable of carrying out Oil Pollution Response operation at sea. The capabilities include Containment, Recovery and Disposal of the spilled oil owing to accidents or incidents at sea. The Officer-In-Charge, Pollution Response Team Port Blair, Commandant Virk informed that the ship is fitted with state of the art equipments capable of containing, recovering and stowage of recovered oil at sea even in rough weather. The media visit on board the vessel was coordinated by the PRO Coast Guard, Commandant Dalip Singh.

**India to kick-start hockey event vs Pakistan at 2018 Commonwealth Games**

New Delhi, Nov 28  
India will begin their campaign in the hockey event of the 2018 Commonwealth Games by facing arch-rivals Pakistan in what is slated to be an exciting start to the competition. The Commonwealth Games next year will be hosted by Gold Coast in Pakistan. Both teams have been placed in Pool B with the contest scheduled for April 7.  
As per the schedule released by International Hockey Federation (FIH) on Tuesday, also placed in Pool B are England, Malaysia and Wales. It poses an easy challenge and yet a tricky one for the sixth-ranked Indian team. Last edition's bronze medallists and EuroHockey Championships' bronze medallists England could pose a real threat. Pool A comprises of five-time champions and hosts Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Canada and Scotland. Indian mens team fixture list sees them take on Pakistan first



(April 7) followed by Wales (April 8), Malaysia (April 10) and England (April 11). By the time India face Pakistan, they would have already hit the ground running with the game against Wales.  
The women's team are placed in Pool A which consists of reigning silver medallists England, South Africa, Malaysia and Wales. The other group includes the defending champions Australia, New Zealand, Scotland, Canada and Ghana.  
Indian women's team begin their campaign on the start of the tournament where they take on Wales on April 5. It will be followed by games against

**Italy legend Buffon wins best player award**

Milan, Nov 28  
Italy legend Gianluigi Buffon eased some of his World Cup heartache by winning the Serie A Best Player of the Year award at the Gran Gala del Calcio Awards in Milan.  
"The failure to participate in the World is the biggest disappointment in my career together with some (lost) Champions league finals," said the 39-year-old Juventus goalkeeper at Monday night's ceremony. "I'm happy and proud. I never thought I'd get this kind of trophy, and I'll hold on tight to it because I've never won best youngster!"  
Napoli's Maurizio Sarri was named the best coach in the



Italian football awards.  
Buffon quit international football last month as four-time champions Italy sensationally missed out on their first World Cup finals in 60 years after a playoff defeat to Sweden on Monday.  
"Italy-Sweden was the biggest disappointment of my life," he told Sky Sports Italia.  
"But we need to move on, the season must end in the best way and with Juventus there are so many goals to be achieved."  
Buffon won a tenth Serie A title with Juventus, as well as a third Italian Cup title as well as helping the Turin side reach the Champions League final for the second time in three years.

**Pujara rises to 2nd, Kohli stays 5th in latest ICC rankings**

Dubai, Nov 28  
Indian batsman Cheteshwar Pujara jumped a couple of rungs to second, while skipper Virat Kohli held on to the fifth spot in the latest ICC rankings for Test batsmen, issued here today. Pujara trails Australian captain Steve Smith, who has extended his lead at the top but the next four batsmen are separated by just 11 points in the latest rankings, the ICC said in a statement.  
Pujara has returned to number-two ranking after scoring 143 in his side's huge victory by an innings and 239 runs against Sri Lanka in Nagpur. He had first peaked to second



following the Ranchi Test against Australia in March, while the last time he was second was following his 133 against Sri Lanka in Colombo in August.  
Pujara has been rewarded with 22 points, lifting him from fourth to second on a career-high 888 points.  
The 29-year-old now leads his fifth-ranked captain Kohli by 11 points. Kohli has vaulted from 817 points to 877 points after scoring his fifth career double-century in 62 Tests.

**Pankaj Advani secures IBSF World Snooker Championship title**

Doha, Nov 28  
Ace Indian cueist Pankaj Advani dished out another superb performance to outclass Iran's Amir Sarkhosh in the finals and claim yet another title at the IBSF World Snooker Championship on Monday.  
His deadly attacking game coupled with phenomenally tight safety play helped Advani to secure his 18th World Championship title with an 8-2 win over Amir at the Al-Arabi Sports Club. The best-of-15 frame final witnessed Amir pocketing the first frame rather comfortably. The Iranian looked strong and focused in



the second frame too, progressing well and nearing a 2-0 scoreline, but a missed green pot gave a lifeline to Pankaj as he seized the opportunity with both hands and drew parity. Pankaj never looked back from there as he

The facility of submission of Jeevan Pramaan digitally is available in all offices of the EPFO, pension disbursing banks and common service centres. Further, digital Jeevan Pramaan has been made available in the UMANG App of EPFO. Life Certificate in physical form may be accepted from such pensioners who have genuine reason for non submission of digital Jeevan Pramaan and such reason should be recorded by pensioner while submitting the life certificate, a communication said.
