## Laying of submarine pipeline by Horizontal Directional Drilling method to connect HDPF pipeline laid at Rutland and Pumping Line laid from Pongibalu to Dhanikhari Dam under progress

### HDD rig transported to Phongibalu; drilling to commence from August 1

Port Blair, July 28  
The laying of submarine pipeline by Horizontal Directional Drilling (HDD) method to connect Phase-I-HDPF pipeline laid at Rutland and Phase-III-Pumping Line laid from Pongibalu to Dhanikhari Dam is presently under progress. Welding of 900 mtrs of pipeline out of approximately 1.70 Km length has been



completed. Various tools and plants for Horizontal Directional Drilling (HDD) across the sea channel

between Pongibalu and Rutland have already reached at Port Blair and has been shifted to the site.

Due to non availability of suitable capacity of crane at Port Blair HDD Rig has to be dismantled in two pieces for



transportation from Vishakhapatnam. Now, HDD rig has reached Port Blair and transported to Phongibalu Forest Check Post. It shall be re-assembled and then shifted to site at Pongibalu. It is expected that by 1<sup>st</sup> August actual drilling may commence and within a period of one and half months i.e mid September, 2021.

Fresh encroachments committed on Govt. land bearing 5000 sqmtr at Rangachang village cleared out of Sy. No. 17 in the shape of 3 nos. of temporary structures along with fence. Similarly, around 3000 sq. mtrs. cleared at Beodnabad village (one structure along with fencing). An area of 500 sq. mtrs. was cleared out of Sy.No. 418/P at Wimberlygunj. The above Govt. land has now been restored to its original status.

With a view to provide the required platform for promoting industrial activities and also to encourage entrepreneurship among the people of the Islands, the Industries Department of A&N Administration had allotted plots/sheds on lease basis in the

Industrial Estates to entrepreneurs. However, it has been observed by the Department that the entrepreneurs who have been allotted such plots/sheds on lease basis in the Industrial Estates are either keeping the plots/sheds idle for long period or not utilizing it for the purpose for which the space was allotted. It has

also been noticed that the entrepreneurs are misusing the space, subletting or entering into sales of assets created in the allotted space illegally.

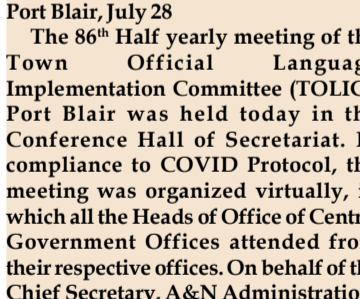

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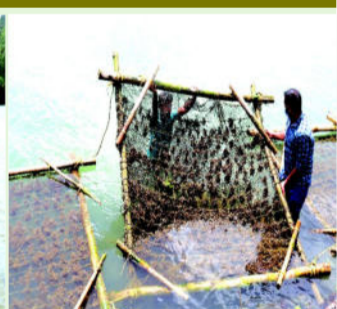

(CSMCRI), Gujarat. During her interaction with the officials of Department of Fisheries and CSMCRI, she exhorted the need for



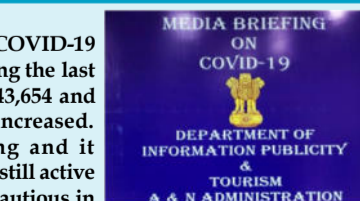

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## Media briefed on COVID-19 "We need to be very cautious as the virus is still active", says Secretary (IP&T)

Port Blair, July 28  
The number of new COVID-19 cases in the country during the last 24 hours has gone upto 43,654 and the death rate too has increased. "This trend is alarming and it indicates that the virus is still active and we need to be very cautious in our approach", said the Secretary (IP&T), Shri Sunil Kumar Singh briefing the media persons on COVID-19 status in the Islands held in the conference hall of IP&T here this evening. He reiterated the need to strictly adhere to COVID



Appropriate Behaviour to protect oneself from the virus. Failure to adhere to these safety measures will increase the number of cases thereby leading to more lockdown

restrictions, the Secretary said appealing to people to be ever vigilant during this pandemic. The Secretary stated that during the RT-PCR test conducted on 349 passengers, who arrived here yesterday, no positive case has been detected. He informed that 272 persons bound for Middle & North Andaman were tested at Ferrargunj and all were found negative. Today, 2 flights with 330 passengers arrived here and the results of RT-PCR reports are awaited. The District Administration conducted mobile

## Vaccination drive in A&N Islands 2, 88,807 doses of vaccine administered to beneficiaries in Isles so far

Port Blair, July 28

The safety of the citizens is the foremost priority of the Administration, especially during this pandemic time. To shield its citizens from the corona virus, the vaccination of eligible beneficiaries is being initiated by the Administration in different parts of the Islands. Accordingly, the vaccination began with administering of COVISHIELD vaccine for Health Care Workers followed by frontline workers and vulnerable population with comorbidities. Subsequently, the vaccination for 45 and above was initiated followed by 18 to 44 years which is currently underway.

Meanwhile, the vaccination drive is



continuing smoothly in A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 2, 88,807 beneficiaries have been vaccinated so far in A&N Islands, out of the target beneficiaries of 2, 81, 603 (approx.). A total of 4036 people were vaccinated today in A&N Islands.

Today, 1913 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which 1345 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years. Similarly, 1658 beneficiaries were vaccinated in North & Middle Andaman District out of which, 1517 were in the age group of 18-44 years. In Nicobar District, 465 beneficiaries were vaccinated out of which, 253 were in the age group of 18-44 years. A total of 87,916 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years have been vaccinated till date, a press release from DHS said.

## Digital transformation in the logistics sector to achieve the target of improved India's ranking in Logistics Performance Index

New Delhi, July 28 (PIB)

With an aim to further improve ease of doing business, Centre today launched the "Secured Logistics Document Exchange" along with a Calculator for Green House Gas Emissions. The Digital initiative is now set to improve logistics efficiency, reduce logistics cost, and promote multi-modality and sustainability in a big way.

These digital initiatives have been launched to fill the gap areas where no action has yet been taken either by private players or any of the line ministries. The Launch Event was attended by more than 75 participants from the Central Ministries, Banks, IT companies, international organizations, logistics sector stakeholders and industry bodies. The Event emphasized on the importance of digital transformation in the logistics sector to achieve the targets of improved India's ranking in Logistics Performance Index; reduction in logistics cost and establishment of indigenous India-specific metrics for continual improvement in logistics.

The Logistics Division with the mandate of "Integrated Development of the Logistics Sector" has planned specific digital initiatives with a focus on integrating the various digital systems across ministries/ departments and filling gaps so identified. In

this context, key digital initiatives including SLDE platform for digital exchange of logistics-related documents and a Calculator for GHG emissions for choosing sustainable and right mode of transport for freight movement, have been developed.

The SLDE platform is a solution to replace the present manual process of generation, exchange and compliance of logistics documents with a digitized, secure and seamless document exchange system.

This will enable generation, storage and interchange of logistics-related documents digitally using Aadhaar and blockchain-based security protocols for data security and authentication; it will also provide a complete audit trail of document transfer, faster execution of transaction, lower cost of shipping and overall carbon footprint, easy verification of authenticity of documents, lowered risk of fraud, etc. The proof of concept of the platform has been developed and executed with banks (ICICI, Axis Bank, State Bank of India and HDFC Bank) and stakeholders including freight forwarders, exporters, importers and vessel operators.

Along with the SLDE, Centre also launched a Green House Gas Emission calculator as well. The GHG Calculator is an efficient, user-friendly tool and provides for

calculating and comparing GHG emissions across different modes. It allows for commodity-wise comparison of GHG emissions and total cost of transportation, including their environmental cost, between movement by road and rail. The tool is intended to facilitate appropriate modal choice for all concerned.

In his opening remarks Special Secretary (Logistics), Shri Pawan Kumar Agarwal remarked on the importance of Digital Transformation in the Logistics space and highlighted the role of Logistics Division in facilitating digital integration across the sector through such critical initiatives that have interface with more than one Ministry / Department. He further added that the initiatives launched at the event have the potential of creating a lasting and significant impact on the sector. Emphasising on the benefit of sectors u doing

business in the logistics sector that the SLDE platform would facilitate, the banking sector endorsed the robustness of the SLDE platform and lauded the efforts of the Logistics Division, MOCI, in this direction. Emphasizing on the need for a fast, secure and efficient way of exchanging logistics-related documents including digitization of the e-bill of lading, all industry stakeholders expressed their support and adoption of this initiative.

Speaking on the occasion representatives from user industry associations like Federation of Indian Export Organisations (FIEO), Container Freight Station Association of India (CFSAI), etc., stressed on the importance and utility of a tool for calculating GHG emissions and basing modal choice on availability of environmental cost estimates would go a long way in promoting green and sustainable logistics.

### Chandrayan-3 likely to be launched during the third quarter of next year

New Delhi, July 28

Chandrayan-3 is likely to be launched during the third quarter of next year assuming normal work flow henceforth. This information was given in a written reply in the Lok Sabha today by the Minister of State for Space, Dr. Jitendra Singh. He said

the realization of Chandrayaan-3 involves various processes including finalization of configuration, subsystems realization, integration, spacecraft level detailed testing and a number special tests to evaluate the system performance on Earth. (Source:india.gov.in)

## Nano-structured self-cleaning aluminium surface that reduces bacterial growth can be useful for biomedical & aerospace applications



Fig: Diagrammatic representation of the mechanism of the developed surface

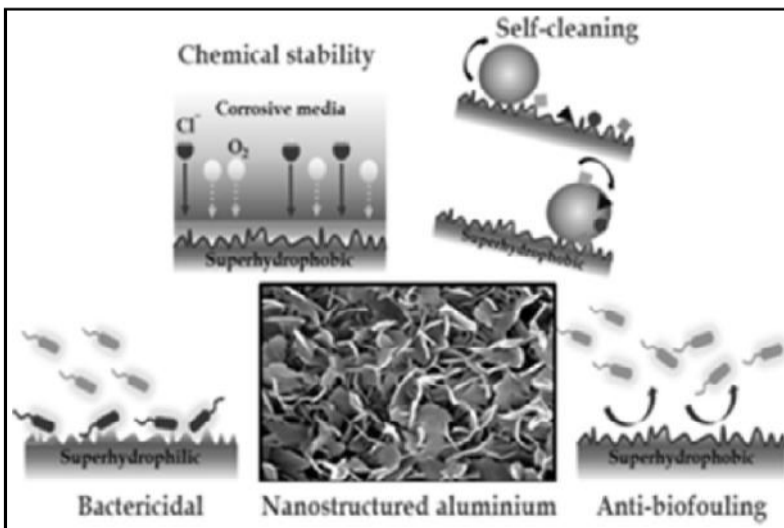


Fig: Raman spectrometer obtained through (FIST) project

New Delhi, July 28 (PIB)

A group of researchers have recently developed a nano-structured self-cleaning sustainable aluminium surface by utilizing a simple and environment-friendly fabrication route. It could have multiple applications ranging from biomedical to aerospace and automobiles to household appliances, and the process is easily scalable to industrial-level production. Aluminium is a light metal, which has many industrial applications as it can be easily cast, machined and shaped. However, atmospheric degradation due to the accumulation of contaminants and humidity significantly limits its performance and sustainability. Besides, the leaching of aluminium also

causes environmental and health-related issues.

To overcome these problems, Dr Harpreet Singh Grewal, Dr Harpreet Singh Arora and Mr Gopinath Perumal, researchers from the Department of Mechanical Engineering and Dr Sajal Kumar Ghosh and Ms Priya Mandal from Department of Physics of Shiv Nadar University, Delhi-NCR have jointly developed the nano-structured aluminium surfaces that show immense mechanical, chemical, and thermal durability restricting the corrosion and leaching effects. A Raman spectrometer obtained through the 'Fund for Improvement of Science & Technology infrastructure' (FIST) project of the

Department of Science & Technology, Government of India, has been used to carry out this work. This result is reported in the Journal of Cleaner Production.

The researchers have developed a flake-like nano-structure on aluminium surface. This is achieved by heating the aluminium sample in water with a temperature maintained at 80° C for an hour, without using any chemical reagents and toxic solvents. The surface obtained by this facile and environment-friendly approach showed a complete wetting nature (ability of a liquid to spread over a solid surface). A coating of low surface energy hydrocarbon material on it converts it into a surface where a water droplet

immediately rolls off the surface. This makes it useful for self-cleaning applications.

"This self-cleaning surface is stable over a wide range of temperature, from -80 to 350oC, improving its corrosion resistance property. In fact, it shows 40 times reduction in the corrosion rate when compared to the existing surfaces developed by other processing routes," said Dr Grewal.

Dr Ghosh explains that because of their nanostructured morphology coated with hydrocarbons, these surfaces are capable of reducing bacterial adhesion and growth to a great extent and hence can be used in healthcare and medical devices, including dental implants and heart assistive devices.

## Cabinet clears Deposit Insurance & Credit Guarantee Corporation Bill 2021

New Delhi, July 28

Union Cabinet today cleared the Deposit Insurance and Credit Guarantee Corporation Bill 2021. Briefing reporters in New Delhi after the cabinet meeting, Finance Minister, Smti. Nirmala Sitharaman said, it insures all bank deposits such as savings, fixed deposits,

current or recurring deposits.

She said, it also covers all commercial, public, private sector banks and branches of foreign bank in India. The Minister said, each depositor's deposits in the banks are insured upto maximum of five lakh rupees in each bank. (Source:india.gov.in)

## NIA registers 22 cases related to fake currency in last two years: MoS Home

New Delhi, July 28

Home ministry today said that the National Investigation Agency (NIA) has registered 22 cases related to fake currency during the last two years. In a written reply to a question Minister of State for Home Affairs, Shri Nitya Nand Rai informed the Lok Sabha, 48 special courts have been established across the country for speedy trial of the cases investigated by the NIA, including the fake



currency cases. He said maximum punishment for offences related to fake currency is up to life imprisonment. (Source:india.gov.in)

## Around 1.13 cr houses sanctioned under PMAY-Urban till date: Govt.

New Delhi, July 28

Government has said that around one crore 13 lakh houses have been sanctioned under Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana - Urban till date. Out of them more than 84 lakh houses are grounded and more than 50 lakh have been completed and delivered to the beneficiaries.

More than 41 thousand patients recovered during last 24 hours. Till now, more than three crore six lakh 63 thousand people have recovered from COVID-19. India reported more than 43 thousand new cases in last 24 hours. Country's Active Caseload is currently over three lakh ninety nine

thousand. Active cases constitute 1.27 per cent of total cases. Weekly Positivity Rate remains below five per cent and it is currently at 2.36 per cent. Daily positivity rate is at 2.51 per cent and it remains below five per cent. Six hundred forty deaths were reported in the last 24 hours. Till now, more than four lakh 22 thousand people have lost their lives due to the pandemic.
