## PM addresses nation through 'Mann Ki Baat' prog.

### People and all institutions engaged in making India 'Drugs Free' should make use of MANAS Helpline: PM

Port Blair, July 28 Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi today expressed pride that Charaideo Maidam of Assam is being included in the UNESCO World Heritage Sites. Addressing the nation in his Mann Ki Baat programme on Akashvani this morning, the Prime Minister highlighted that it will be the 43<sup>rd</sup> site of India in the list, and the first Cultural World Heritage site from the Northeast. Elaborating on why it is such an important place, Shri Modi said Charaideo was the first capital of the Ahom dynasty. The people of the Ahom dynasty traditionally kept the mortal remains of their ancestors and their valuables in the Maidam.

Prime Minister added that the Maidam is a symbol of reverence for the departed kings and dignitaries of the Ahom Empire. Prime Minister termed it as a great feat for the Ahom Empire to sustain from the 13<sup>th</sup> century till the beginning of the 19<sup>th</sup> century. He stated that the principles and beliefs of the Ahom Empire were so strong that they kept this dynasty alive for a long time. Shri Modi also recalled unveiling the tallest statue of the great Ahom warrior Lachit Borpuhan on 9<sup>th</sup> March this year. Prime Minister said, he feels privileged to have paid respects to the ancestors of the Ahom community at Lachit Maidam. He urged people to include Charaideo

Madamin in their future travel plans. Shri Modi noted that a country can progress only by taking pride in her culture. Highlighting efforts being made in India in this regard, he mentioned Project PARI, which stands for Public Art of India. Prime Minister observed that Project PARI is becoming a great medium to bring emerging artists on one platform to popularise public art. He said that the paintings made on roadsides, walls, and underpasses are made by the same artists who are associated with PARI. Shri Modi said this not only enhances the beauty of public places but also helps in making Indian culture more popular. He gave the

example of Delhi's Bharat Mandapam and flyovers which contains artwork from across the country. He requested art and culture lovers to work more on public art. National Handloom Day will be celebrated in the country on the 7<sup>th</sup> of next month. Prime Minister was pleased to note that artisans in different parts of the country are engaged in making handloom popular. Shri Modi stated that many people who never used Khadi products before are today wearing Khadi with great pride. He said, the turnover of Khadi Village Industry has crossed 1.5 lakh crore rupees for the first time, which is an increase of four hundred percent. He pointed out that this rising

sale of Khadi and handloom, is also creating a large number of new employment opportunities. He urged listeners who have not bought Khadi clothes to start buying from this year. He added that with August being round the corner, there cannot be a better time to buy Khadi. Prime Minister said, Paris Olympics are the flavour of the season in the whole world right now. He said the Olympics give Indian players a chance to hoist the tricolour on the world stage. He asked people to encourage the players and Cheer for Bharat. ### Around 1,950 beneficiaries referred under AB-PMJAY Scheme to empanelled hospitals at mainland so far

Port Blair, July 28 Ayushman Bharat - PMJAY, a flagship scheme of the Government of India is the world's largest health assurance program under the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, GoI. This scheme is launched to ensure financial assistance of Rs 5 lakh per family per year against secondary and tertiary hospitalization care. The beneficiaries get an

AB-PMJAY Card that is used to avail the service at empanelled hospitals, private or public. This Card is a single document containing details of the beneficiary with nationwide portability. Presently, 25,140 families (72,257 members) have been registered under the AB-PMJAY scheme in this UT and are entitled for cashless treatment of Rs. 5 lakh. The beneficiaries are

referred to hospitals at the mainland under AB-PMJAY for the treatment of diseases pertaining to the specialities of Cardiology, Neurology, Oncology etc. which are not available in this UT. Till date, around 1,950 beneficiaries have been referred under the AB-PMJAY Scheme to empanelled hospitals at the mainland from this UT. Ayushman Bharat - PMJAY has a Central Grievance Redressal

Management System (CGRMS), an online portal - <https://cgrms.pmjay.gov.in> where beneficiaries can register grievances related to the scheme. At the national level, an AB-PMJAY support team is present to address the queries, one can directly contact the team at Toll-free no. 14555/1800111565. In the Women's 10m Air Pistol final event, she scored 221.7 to win a Bronze Medal in the Paris Olympics. This also marks India's first Olympic medal in the ongoing games. against Korean shooters, Kim Yeji and Oh Yeh Jin. Bhaker's win is a significant milestone for Indian shooting, marking the country's growing prowess in the discipline on the international stage.

International Mathematics Olympiad held recently. In this Olympiad, Indian team won four Gold and one Silver Medal and reached the top five. Youth from more than a hundred countries participated in the International Mathematics Olympiad. Prime Minister expressed happiness that public participation is proving very useful in tiger conservation. He stated that it is on account of such efforts that the tiger population in India is increasing every year. He took pride in the fact that 70 percent of the tigers in the world are in India.
